DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS & STATISTICS NOTIFIES ON BIRTH AND DEATH CERTIFICATES

The Department of Economics & Statistics in a notification has made additions in the Birth and Death certificate format, i.e. Form No.5 & 6 and Form No.1, 2, and 3 in the Birth, Death and Still Birth reporting forms of Nagaland. The following are incorporated as shown in the table below.

The Department of Economics & Statistics has also notified the following amendments made under Rule 6(1) and Rule 6(2) and incorporated in the Nagaland Registration of Births & Deaths (Amendment) Rules 1999.

- (a) In the Rule 6(1) the word 'Deaths' stand omitted and all the other contents remain unchanged,
- (b) The following sub-clauses are incorporated under Rule 6(2) of the Nagaland Registration of Births & Deaths (Amendment) Rules 1999.
 - i. If death occurred in a moving vehicle, it cannot be treated as institutional death, despite the fact that patient was taken to a nearby hospital and declared brought dead by the hospital. The Medical Officer is not responsible for reporting such deaths. Exact place of death shall be mentioned while reporting. It cannot be the hospital name and address or the way to hospital, etc. It will be registered by the Registrar in whose jurisdiction the event occurred.
 - ii. In case of natural death in a moving vehicle/or on a long journey, in addition to vehicle in charge, if deceased was accompanied by relatives or attendant, they may report the event to the concerned Registrar in whose area the event occurred. In case deceased was not accompanied by any one, the vehicle in charge should report the event to the concerned Registrar in whose area the event occurred.

iii. In case of accident, murder etc (where inquest is held) it will be covered under Rule 6 (2) and will be reported on the basis of the inquest report. The place of death will be the same as mentioned in that report.

DC KOHIMA BANS INSTALLATION OF HOARDINGS

With a view to beautify and develop the area between Classic Island and Box cutting Junction, Kohima town, the Deputy Commissioner Kohima, Rovilatuo Mor, IAS has banned installation of hoardings/banners/advertisements within the said area with immediate effect and added that all hoardings/advertisements/banners presently installed shall be removed.

The order also stated that the area from Classic Island till box cutting junction has been entrusted to Kohima Municipal Council (KMC) to take up aesthetic/beautification works. In this connection, any NGO/Organization willing to voluntarily beautify the area shall henceforth obtain a clearance certificate from the KMC.

The DC further stated that the concerned agency cannot claim ownership of the said portion of land basing on this order as it is not a land allotment Order.

DEPARTMENTS NOTIFIED TO ENSURE JUVENILE JUSTICE

All concerned Departments have been notified to take necessary measures to ensure implementation of the following provisions under the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015 which prohibits misuse of children from activities specified as per the provisions of law under:-

- (a) Section 77. Whoever gives, or causes to be given, to any child any intoxicating liquor or any narcotic drug or tobacco products or psychotropic substance, except on the order of a duty qualified medical practitioner, shall be punishable with rigorous imprisonment for a term which may extend to seven years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend up to one lakh rupees.
- (b) Section 78. Whoever uses a child, for vending, peddling, carrying, supplying or smuggling any intoxicating liquor, narcotic drug or psychotropic substance, shall be liable for rigorous imprisonment for a term which may extend to seven years and shall also be liable to a fine up to one lakh rupees.

State Round Up

AHODs AND HODs MEETING HELD

The AHODs & HoDs meeting was held on 4th July 2016 under the chairmanship of Chief Secretary, Pankaj Kumar, IAS. Various agenda of the government plan and policies have been discussed for the development of the state.

The daylong meeting began by reviewing the last meeting minutes in which many important matters have been reiterated and deliberated. On Personnel Information Management System (PIMS), the Chief Secretary reiterated that it was inaugurated on the Civil Services day 2016. Speaking about the system, he said that there has to be no discrepancies and if any department has excess employees, clarification needs to be done. He further said that suitable action has to be taken in such cases.

The P&AR department gave a short presentation on PIMS from 1st April to 31st May 2016 where it said that 45 departments have been authenticated and was found satisfactory. It also said that 38 departments are yet to be authenticated. It was reported that some middle and small departments are yet to access the PIMS. The Chief Secretary expressed his gratefulness to all the officers who have been working on the PIMS diligently.

The Commissioner & Secretary IT & C, K.D. Vizo gave a presentation on Biometric attendance system of the officers and staff

in the Civil secretariat. From the attendance record of the top 50 users from 16th May to 24th June 2016, he said attendance at the rank of Secretary and above have been improving. However, the overall attendance has been decreasing since June.

The Power department apprised the meeting with 'Bill Digitally', where Kohima and Dimapur districts would soon be introduced with on-line payment of bill. The Chief Secretary expressed his happiness to Power department as the 'Bill digitally' could soon be operationalized. He also said that the department has planned to introduce the system in the remaining districts as well in the near future. Meanwhile, the Chief Secretary asked the PHED also to initiate on-line operation and encouraged them to take up such innovative issues. By and large, the Chief Secretary credited Commissioner & Secretary, K.D. Vizo for the success of e-governance system in the state.

The Draft guidelines of the Chief Secretary's welfare fund has been read out by the Chief Secretary himself of which a high level committee headed by the Chief Secretary have been constituted. The other members included the Additional Chief Secretary & Development Commissioner, Financial Commissioner, Commissioner and the Home Commissioner. Under this high power committee programs for utilization will be formulated and annual reports will be monitored.

The meeting elaborately discussed

upon the issue pertaining to HIV/AIDS by all government departments as a corporate social responsibility. The Chief Secretary on this issue decided to make a consensus contribution from the welfare fund towards controlling the alarming increase rate of its spread in the state.

In regard to the Republic day celebration 2017- selection of Tableaux would be done by an expert committee from the ministry basing on important episode of the State history, social and economic achievement, Mission for the future etc. He therefore called upon the department to come forward with their activities, vision, plan or mission on or before 29th July 2016. He also informed the department to intimate the Secretary, Home department who is assigned to co-ordinate with the matter.

The CEO, Sanjay Kumar, IAS speaking on SVEEP III Project plan 2016-2020 under which all departments should constitute SVEEP cell where a place for registration is mandatory. In this regard, the Chief Secretary directed all the departments to depute one nodal officer and an assistant, their names and designations and submit the details to the CEO on or before 15th July. The Chief Secretary also said that matters relating to election process would be taken separately.

The CEO also informed that the ECI has given direction to P&AR to depute its personnel to assist CEO in election process. He also said the activities of election machinery in the state like Block Level Officers (BLO) report should be given to ECI weekly. The officers have to pay attention and respond on time on the accuracy of voters list where it has failed, the CEO lamented. He therefore, requested the CEO

to organize a special meeting to discuss the details on election matters.

The Taxes department gave a power point presentation and informed the house that every department should access their websites for availing the e-services being provided such as PAN number, e-registration, e-road permits, CST/C form, e-payments and e-challan module. The e-mail address of the Taxes department is www.nagalandtax.nic.in. Further, the department informed that all the departments should submit their tax transactions within one month in the prescribed form VAT-9.

The meeting discussed the issue of mandatory affidavits required by various departments from the public. In this regard, the Finance department informed the bank clearance certificates/affidavits are no more mandatory except from those with liabilities. However, to bring out a list by the Home department on mandatory affidavits, the departments have been informed to submit the specific requirements for affidavits to the Home departments within a month. The Punjab case study was also shared in the meeting.

Over the CAG & PAC Reports, departments have been instructed to submit their report to Finance Department on time as specified. The members shared that the responsible nodal officer/programme officer of the PAC/CAG queries would be required to be present during the reply to the queries.

The New Pension Schemes that has come to effect since 2010 needed to be addressed by all the Departments urgently. It was pointed out that many NPS members have been created but still with zero deposits. This situation was considered to be highly

objectionable on the parts of the DDOs who are supposed to make timely and monthly deposits as it would negatively affect the employees during their pension process.

The Department of Planning highlighted the functioning system of NITI Aayog and reminded that Plan and Non-Plan financing are no more separate. The Department also encouraged the possibilities of collaboration with Corporate Houses in joint ventures for development of the state.

WORKSHOP ON DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AT KOHIMA

A two day workshop on Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) in the Context of Climate Change got under way on 7th July 2016 at the Capital Convention Center with Chief Minister Nagaland T.R Zeliang during the inaugural programme as the Chief Guest.

Addressing the workshop the Chief Minister said that due to climate change the frequency and intensity of natural disaster are increasing rapidly which is worrying. He was of the view that with the major earthquake in the region and the freaky and adverse weather condition recently all bring home the fact that natural hazards are becoming part of our existence and felt that we need to be better prepared to face them. He said that while we cannot prevent natural hazard from taking place, we can certainly reduce its scale of destruction to life and property and in their context the concept of Disaster Risk Reduction had emerged. He explained that DRR is relatively a new concept in formal terms, which may be defined as a systematic approach to identifying, assessing and reducing the risk of disaster which aims to reduce socio-economic vulnerabilities

to disaster, as well as the environment and other hazards that triggers them.

The CM also stated that since climate change is greatly contributing to disasters in recent years, there is a need to closely link our DRR plans and our climate change adaptation strategies. He also said that DRR should become part of our sustainable development plans, incorporating how to make better choices relating to many livelihood issues much as how we grow our food where and how we build our homes and even what we teach in schools. Unsound development policies and plans will invariably result in increased disaster risk and disaster losses he remarked.

The CM also commended at the community response in the recent cyclonic storms that affected a substantial number of districts in the state. He also mentioned that the Nagaland government has also taken several steps to strengthen the states disaster preparedness.

T.R Zeliang also called upon the legislators of Nagaland to come together and establish a 'Legislature Forum on Disaster' that will not only help in creating awareness among the people, but also promote peoples action to ensure that natural hazards do not become disasters.

Delivering the key note address MP (Lok Sabha) from Sikkim, PD Rai said that disaster effects everybody and should be better prepared. He also requested the elected representatives to take DRR with seriousness and need to move the focus to the grass root level. The MP also felt the need to set up community based disasters management agencies.

Advisor, SDFN, Alemtemshi Jamir, IAS (Retd) while giving a brief introduction

on the workshop stated that disaster is not whether it will happen or not; it is when it will happen. He said that mountain areas are becoming more affected by natural disasters and being in remote areas makes us more fragile. Disaster involves everyone and everyone is responsible for being prepared for disaster he commented.

A short presentation on DDR and NSMDA in Nagaland was made by OSD, to NSMDA Johnny Raungmei, while Director General, NECTAR, Sanjiv Nair, IAS gave the remarks from NECTAR.

Chief Secretary, Nagaland, Pankaj Kumar, IAS who chaired the programme delivered the welcome address and also the concluding remark of the inaugural session.

The Nagaland State Disaster Management Authority (NSDMA), Home department in collaboration with the Sustainable Development Forum Nagaland (SDFN), Integrated Mountain Initiative (IMI) and North East Centre for Technology Application & Research (NECTAR) is organizing a two day workshop on Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR).

The two day workshop will see intensive group discussions and thematic/sessions on topics like 'Opportunities for community centered DRR strategies in Nagaland', 'Data information and knowledge information for DRR', 'Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) for departments and agencies vis-a vis DRR', 'Emergency mass disaster response strategy' etc.

2 DAY WORKSHOP ON DISASTER RISK REDUCTION IN THE CONTEXT OF CLIMATE CHANGE

The two day workshop on "Disaster Risk Reduction in the Context of Climate Change" concluded at Capital Convention Centre, Kohima on 8th July 2016.

Nagaland Chief Secretary, Pankaj Kumar in his concluding remarks stated that the two day workshop has brought a relief, a sense of thoughts to move a step further and further plan in order to reduce the vulnerabilities of disaster as the State has been so far taking certain steps of action to deal with disaster is reactive. "Through this workshop, now we realised that in order to face disaster better, we have to start working with the communities in a different ways" said Pankaj Kumar and added that "We have to sit again with the communities and make them understand about the disaster and find solutions to prevent or reduce the vulnerabilities of disaster. The Chief Secretary further appealed all the participants to reflect upon the challenges and be a key person wherever they are and utilise the knowledge gained during the workshop in a much greater ways. He hoped that the enthusiastic participants would certainly look forward in tackling the issue of disaster preparedness and vulnerabilities reduction in a better way.

Sushil Ramola from Integrated Mountain Initiative (IMI) in his address on reflections of workshop recommendations and ways forward said that coming together from various organizations right from the Chief Minister and his Colleagues, Chief Secretary along with AHoDs and HoDs and various supported organisations to understand the issue of DRR and Climate Change was a major step undertaken by Nagaland. He said that the understanding risks and vulnerability of disaster is the key for a prepared community. In support to the Chief Minister's suggestion to establish Nagaland Legislature Forum on DRR, he said if that happen in reality it would become a role model in the whole country. On community, he said that "we are building community, not only creating a response for today but also preserving our assets, our heritage for the future so that great task could be achieved through DRR and climate change. Ramola hoped that the participants would carry forward the understanding on DRR and climate change in their respective areas and commit it into action to see the improvement of this workshop.

Amba Jamir from SDFN also shared suggestions on the emerged group work outputs which needed to be implemented at the block, village and district levels. The four thematic groups have been developed and designed keeping in mind the ground realities and so their outputs are practical and usable or applicable in the State. They were assigned the following topics, "Opportunities for community centered DRR strategies in Nagaland"; "Towards Urban risk reduction in Nagaland"; "Data/information and knowledge information for

DRR"; "Emergency mass disaster response strategy and Standard Operation Procedures (SOP) for departments and agencies vis-a-vis DRR". Accordingly, the groups emerged with outputs on their discussion which were presented by their groups representative on the concluding session.

Commissioner & Secretary, Department of Youth Resources & Sports, Government of Nagaland, Menukhol John earlier gave the opening remarks on the output and concluding session.

NAGALAND LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY 12th SESSION

The 12th session of the Twelfth Nagaland Legislative Assembly began on 12th July, 2016. NLA Speaker Chotisuh Sazo made an obituary reference to the passing away of Lt. R, Lisen, former member of NLA where he gave a brief profile of R. Lisen and his immense contribution to NLA during its present stage. He said that Lt. R. Lisen was born on 27th November 1933 and passed away on 3rd May 2016 at Dimapur. He passed his Bachelor of theology from Eastern Theological College Jorhat thereafter he began his political career by contesting the general election from Jangpetkong Constituency in 1964, he stated.

Chief Minister of Nagaland, T.R Zeliang presented the supplementary demand for grants for regularization of excess expenditure for the year 2011- 2012.

NAGALAND POLICE TEAM UNDERTAKES CROSS BORDER EXPOSURE

Two member team representing the Nagaland Police has returned from a

Cross Border exposure and learning trip to Myanmar and Thailand in connection with Human Trafficking issues. The trip was organized by the Impulse NGO Network based out of Shillong, Meghalaya. The other delegations included Police Officers, Lawyers and members of the Civil Societies from the various states of North East India. Impulse NDO Network has been working towards addressing human trafficking in the North East India and its neighboring countries in Nepal, Myanmar and Bangladesh.

While combating human trafficking, the Organization has developed the 'Impulse Model'. The Impulse Model is a holistic approach which brings stakeholders from Law enforcement agencies, lawyers, CSOs' public and private sector; under one umbrella to respond to human trafficking cases effectively and efficiently through a software –The Impulse Case Info Centre (ICIC). The model has received the Silver Prize for Japanese Most Innovative Development Project from Global Development Network (GDN) under the Japanese Social Development Fund, Government of Japan. Nagaland Police is also a user of the software and training has been imparted to all the Anti-Human Trafficking Units (AHTU) of the District Police.

A release by PRO, PHQ, M.Tungoe IPS stated that the trip comprised of the entities that supported the Impulse Model and the agenda primarily aimed at sharing of experiences with the Model to build linkages between the Anti-Human Trafficking Unit of the North East India and the Anti-Trafficking Taskforce of Myanmar for efficient repatriation of Human trafficking survivors from both countries. Consultation were held at Nay Pyi Taw on developing Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) in

addressing cross border Human trafficking between India and Myanmar. The trip included imparting of training on the use of the Impulse Case Info Centre Software to the Anti Trafficking Taskforce of Myanmar for efficient co-ordination between AHTU of North East India for combating cross border Human trafficking . The team also visited the Thai-Myanmar border in Myawaddy to observe the on-ground operation between Thailand and Myanmar in checking Cross border human trafficking. The trip ended in Bangkok, Thailand on 22nd June 2016 after meeting with Anti Trafficking in Person Division, Royal Thai Police to understand their approach towards human trafficking and explore the support mechanisms they adopt from implementing the MoU signed between Thailand and Myanmar to prevent human trafficking . The concluding meeting was with the United Nation Officer on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) which has been long term support of the Impulse Model.

Shouka Kakheto, Addl Dy. Commissioner of Police (Crime), Dimapur and Igwangheing Hemang, Addl.SP, Kohima along with Chenithung Humstoe, the Chief Functionary of the Bethesda Youth Welfare Centre, Nagaland represented the team from Nagaland. It may also be mentioned that Nagaland shares borders with Myanmar extending to 215 Kms.

Addressing the gathering the Governor lauded Bhanubhakta Acharya, the poet who translated Ramayana from Sanskrit to Nepali. He also expressed happiness to Gorkha community for organising such functions and further appealed to work for all round development of the society.

Governor also stressed on importance of skill development. He said that the people of North East are second to none and are known for its rich cultural traditions. He however felt the need to build image in other fields also. Governor called on the gathering not to have the notion that only people in metro cities can progress. He also reminded

During the programme social workers from Gorkha community who are working tirelessly for the upliftment of the community and meritorious students were also felicitated.

Highlights of the programme also included lighting of the lamp by chief guest, presentations, welcome dance, welcome speech by President GSUD, Sunil Limbu, and special song. A memorandum on skill development for Gorkha community was also submitted to the Governor during the function.

ASSEMBLY SESSION ADJOURNED SINE DIE

At the second day of the 12th session of the 12th Nagaland Legislative Assembly this morning, the Chief Minister laid a copy of the Nagaland Department of Under Developed Areas (DUDA) Rules, 2016.

Minister for Social Security & Welfare & Parliamentary Affairs, Kiyanelie Peseyie passed the Nagaland salaries, allowance and other facilities of the Chief Minister, other Ministers, Speaker, Leader of Opposition, Deputy Speaker, other Member of the Nagaland Legislative Assembly/ Parliamentary Secretaries & Pension for Ex-Members Act, 2005 (Fifth Amendment)

bill, 2016. This was followed by passing of St. Joseph Catholic University (Nagaland) Bill, 2016 by Parliamentary Secretary for Higher & Technical Education, Deo Nukhu. He also highlighted that the location of the university is at Ikishe village in Dimapur. Involvement of the government in the university will be according to the UGC norms since the university is solely a private organization. Nukhu also stated that more universities are needed since education is a major instrument for human development.

Discussion and voting on supplementary demand for grants for regularization of excess expenditure for the year 2011-2012 was held. The demand/appropriation, service and purposes of the discussion included Pensions and other retirement benefits, School Education, Youth Resources and Sports, Art & Culture and Gazetteers, Medical, Public Health & Family Welfare, Rural Development, Animal Husbandry & Dairy Development, Fisheries, Mineral Development, Power, Roads & Bridges, Home guards and Technical Education. The Chief Minister introduced the Nagaland Appropriation (No.3) Bill 2016.

The Assembly sessions which began on 12th July 2016 was adjourned sine die by the NLA Speaker, Chotisuh Sazo.

CHIEF MINISTER ADDRESSES PRESS CONFERENCE

Chief Minister, T.R. Zeliang while justifying the short duration of the Assembly proceeding said that the MLAs were asked to seek clarifications during the Assembly session. Addressing a press conference this morning after the assembly sessions, he also

mentioned that the public can file RTI if they feel important issues were left out.

On being asked about the allegations in the Departments like Health & Family Welfare, Social Security & Welfare, Education etc., the Chief Minister replied that some petitioners have filed cases in the court against some departments and that the Government cannot decide on such issues unless the court gives its verdict.

T.R. Zeliang, while seeking the co-operation of the people on implementation of Food Security Act in Nagaland, said that it will directly benefit the needy people. He added that the past allegations and rackets should not hamper the progress of the Food Security Act. He also stated that the Police had registered a case on the Oil Adulteration issue and it is under investigation.

On construction of Highway projects in Nagaland, the Chief Minister said the court has directed the government to accept the updated DPR of Mytas-Gayatri and it has also nominated a commissioner to look after the Highway project. He also mentioned that the updated DPR has increased to Rs. 3500 crore from around Rs. 1200 crore.

T.R. Zeliang mentioned that no local contractors were found to be qualified for the construction of NH-29 that was why the central government allotted the project to outside companies. Citing the example of Japanese companies undertaking road constructions in Delhi where the companies also maintain the roads by collecting taxes, the chief Minister said in order to have good roads the attitude of the landowners and the local contractors have to be changed.

On the extension of the Disturbed

Area Act in the state, Zeliang said that Cabinet have written to the Home Ministry regarding the issue. While acknowledging the leadership of Late Isak Swu, he said that talk on Naga Political solution is still going on and that solution talk cannot be disturbed.

The Chief Minister said that the cabinet discussed the issue of backdoor appointment on 6th June and decided to totally ban it from 6th June, 2016. He stated that appointments done before 6th June will follow the previous system where a contract appointee could be regularized on completion of three years of service. He also mentioned that NPSC and the departments should look after the retirements of the government employees beforehand and requisition the posts for recruitment even before the retirement date. He also maintained that the non-NPSC jobs will follow proper channel of recruitment.

While addressing the issue of delay in payment of salaries under central scheme like RMSA and SSA, T.R. Zeliang said unless the centre provide funds for the central schemes in time, timely payment cannot be done. He also added that employees under those central schemes are bound to co-terminate along with the end of the projects and schemes.

On the issue of women reservation in local bodies in Nagaland, Zeliang mentioned women organizations rejected 25% reservation offer and have gone to the court. He added that the cabinet will contemplate on the issue and decide soon whether to hold election or wait for the Supreme Court verdict "a lot of funds is not reaching us because of delay in elections" he said.

SSA AWARENESS DRIVE LAUNCHED

Sukanya Samriddhi Accounts Awareness Drive under Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (BBBP) campaign with the theme ‘Secure our Girl Child’s Future’ was launched today, the 15th July 2016 at the Chief Secretary’s conference hall, Kohima.

Gracing the occasion as chief guest, Nagaland Minister for Social Security & Welfare & Parliamentary Affairs, Kiyanielie Peseyie expressed his happiness that in Nagaland the activity of Beti Bachao Beti Padhao is going strong under the State Resource Centre for Women and also with the District Administration of Longleng in particular. Stating that girl’s education is the key to empowering their future, he said that we should take advantage of the scheme to ensure that we empower as many girls as we can with their education.

Joint Director & Director of State Child Protection Society Department of Social Welfare, Z. Nyusietho Nyuthe gave the keynote address. Speaking about the national wide campaign on Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (BBBP), which is being carried across the country, he reiterated on the Government of India’s emphasis with the message to save and educate the girl child, thereby giving them equal opportunity in the society by reducing female foeticide and increasing literacy among women.

Chairperson, Nagaland State Social Welfare Board, Bano Vinito gave a note on collaboration and convergence. She said that Nagaland is not lagging behind with the national flagship wide campaign under the slogan message to Save and Educate

the Girl Child. She said ever since BBBP scheme has been launched, the Project Management Unit, the State Resource Centre for Women, under the aegis of the NSSWB, has been putting endless efforts to strengthen the convergence mechanism to take the campaign forward.

Director, Department of Posts India Nagaland Kohima, R.M. Patel in his speech said that SSA small saving scheme is designed by the Government of India for girl child from 0-10 years. The scheme has a strong fabric to ensure social and financial security of girls. The method of depositing money is designed keeping in mind affordability of people of all sections of society. He also said the rate of interest and maturity period is matching with financial need of girls for higher education and development of career on attaining maturity.

An introduction on Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (BBBP) and Sukanya Samriddhi Accounts (SSA) was presented by the Assistant State Coordinator, SRCW, R. Juliana Medom and an introduction on Sukanya Samriddhi Accounts (SSA) was presented by the System Administration Department of Post, India Nagaland, Kohima.

The programme was chaired by Mission Director, State Resource Centre for Women (SRCW), P. Daisy Mezhur who also called upon for collaboration and convergence of the departments for success of the mission in the State.

The programme was attended by Government Departments, civil societies and NGOs such as NBCC representatives and the President Nagaland Mothers Association (NMA).

GOVERNOR INITIATES E-LEARNING PROJECT

With the initiative of P.B. Acharya, Governor of Nagaland & Assam and Indian National Fellowship Centre (INFC), an NGO from Mumbai, the Department of School Education, Government of Nagaland, in collaboration with the Rotary Club Mumbai (North) worked out a project to start E-learning in 28 selected Government Higher Secondary Schools in Nagaland.

The Project aims to strengthen education in Government Schools, with the assistance of NGOs and Rotary Club, Mumbai (North).

Dr. Tausif Jalal, General Manager, Wockhardt Foundation, a multi-national Pharmaceutical and Biotechnology Company which is the Prime Donor, headquartered in Mumbai visited Kohima for three days from 13th to 15th July and had discussions at Raj Bhavan with the officials of Education Department in the presence of Governor. He has also visited four selected Schools in and around Kohima district and held discussions with the school authorities about the modalities for implementing of E-learning programme.

The Government and the NGOs have agreed to extend the E-Learning Scheme to more deserving Government Schools on request.

E-learning in Schools will increase access to learning opportunities, to enhance general quality of teaching/learning and to develop skills and competencies need needed in this century. The Wockhardt Foundation has also agreed to enhance the number of schools in the State if the criterias are fulfilled. They are also planning

to start e-learning in selected schools this academic year itself. Government Schools of Nagaland, most probably, are the premier institutions to introduce E-Learning amongst the 8 North Eastern States.

GITI OBSERVES WORLD YOUTH SKILLS DAY

Government Industrial Training Institute, Kohima observed the World Youth Skills Day on 15th July 2016 at Government ITI Kohima. The programme was chaired by Principal Government ITI Kohima, Er. K. Wati and Deputy Director, Directorate of Industries & Commerce, Er. Lipongse Thongtsar delivered a speech on skilling.

In his speech, Er. Lipongse Thongtsar said that in India, out of the total work force only 10% are skilled and that too only 2% are trained skilled whereas the remaining 8% are informal/self-trained skilled. But on the other hand, in the developed countries like Korea & Japan 80-90 % is skilled workers.

He further emphasized that in addition to one's formal education he/she should be skilled in one or the other trade and in skilling, simply knowing how to make things done is not enough but the main thing is how efficient is one in the trade in which he/she has been trained.

He also said that in the developed countries out of the total work force hardly 10% are Government servant and the remaining are either self-employed or in the private sectors. Hence, we should change our mindset because here in our state when we say employment we only mean white collar job.

In conclusion, he encouraged the gathering that in order to survive in this fast

changing and competitive world one must have "Dignity of Labour".

GOVERNOR GRACES SEMINAR ON MITHUN REARING FOR ENHANCED LIVELIHOOD & FOREST CONSERVATION

With the initiative of the Entrepreneurs Associates and support by Sir Ratan Tata Trust, Mumbai a seminar on Mithun Rearing for Enhanced Livelihood and Conservation of Forest was conducted at Hotel Vivor on 22nd July, 2016 with the Governor of Nagaland, P.B Acharya and Commissioner & Secretary, Veterinary & Animal Husbandry, M.K Mero as the chief guest and guest of honour respectively.

Addressing the participants, the Governor said that Mithun is known as the 'Cattle of Mountain' is an important bovine species of North-eastern hill region. He expressed happiness that the National Research centre on Mithun (NRCM) ICAR based in Jharnapani, Medziphema is the only Mithun research centre in the world. He said that the mithun is also a cultural resource of many folktales, beliefs, rituals and cultural practices besides being elevated to the emblem of our State. He said that the State provides a habitat for mithun rearing as a promising green industry thereby getting attention from both the public and private sectors. He extended his appreciation to Entrepreneurs Associates for providing adequate support physically and economically and urged the educated unemployed youth to take up entrepreneurship as a profession since employment opportunity from government sector has already reached the saturation point.

The Governor also announced cash award of Rs 10000/- each and a citation for three categories such as 1. The Healthiest mithun 2. The farmer rearing the largest number of mithun and 3. The most Progressive village in rearing mithun. This will be decided by the Directorate of VAS & Entrepreneurs Associates. He challenged the participants to set a target of enhancing the mithun's population of present 35 thousand to 100 thousand in a year.

Commissioner & Secretary M.K Mero highlighted the scenario of Veterinary & Animal Husbandry in the state. He said as of now 300 villages are rearing mithuns whereas the other 200 villages are yet to start.

Director, NRCM-ICAR, Dr. Abijit Mitra gave a brief presentation on mithun while Coordinator (CEO), EA, Neichüte Doulo shared on mithun - The State Animal for Enhanced Livelihood & Forest Conservation. Lead Trainer EA, Ela Susan James chaired the inaugural programme. Mithun farmers club Pholami village presented folk tune while Vikhrutu Rume exhibited his talent in the form of Art show.

KIYANILIE RELEASES BUDGET FOR CHILDREN IN NAGALAND 2015-16

Minister for Social Welfare & Parliamentary Affairs, Kiyaniilie Peseyie released the budget for children (BFC) in Nagaland 2015-16 on 22nd July 2016 during an interface held at the Secretariat conference hall, Nagaland.

Speaking on the occasion, the Minister said that the state government is trying to uplift the status of children in the state as a

lot of issues are covered by the Social Welfare Department and its aligned branches such as Integrated Child Protection Society, State Resource Centre for Women and others. He said that the state government also plans to give priority to health, nutrition and education of children which could create an environment where children can grow up safe, healthy and secure. The Minister said that budgeting is very important to achieve the action plan and expressed that the handbook will help a lot for the children in fund allocation.

Programme officer, HAQ centre for Child Rights, New Delhi, Farhana Yasmin in her presentation on study of findings said that children below 18 years comprises 41.46 % of the State population. Nagaland is doing much better than the other states in Northeast in terms of budget for children where she said that the funds need to re-examine prioritizing, expenditure and implementation of fund for children.

Budget for children is not a separate budget, it is merely an attempt to disaggregate from the overall allocations made and to assess the policy and programmes meant for children is translated into action, she stated.

Dr. Melvil Pereira, Director, North Eastern Social Research Centre, Guwahati spoke on Preliminary Observations while Introductory Remarks was delivered by Enakshi Ganguly Thukral, Co-Director, HAQ, Centre for Child Rights, New Delhi. Welcome address was delivered by Bano Vinito, Chairperson, Nagaland State Social Welfare Board. Meilemla Pongener, Chairperson, Nagaland State Commission for Protection of Child Rights also spoke on the occasion. The programme was chaired by P. Daisy

Mezhur, Mission Director, State Resources centre for Women Nagaland.

Earlier the Minister also released the hand book on budget for children in Nagaland.

WORKSHOP ON CABLE TV DIGITIZATION FOR NODAL OFFICERS FROM N-E STATES HELD AT IMPHAL

A workshop on Cable TV digitization for all Nodal Officers from North Eastern States was held at Hotel Classic Grande, Chingmeirong Road, Imphal on 20th July 2016.

The workshop was organized to review the progress implementation of cable TV digitization Phase III & Phase IV in the NE States. In the workshop, the Ministry Information & Broadcasting Advisor, Yogendra Pal spoke as the resource person. He gave a brief highlight on the introduction of Digitized Addressable System (DAS) in India where Nagaland State is under phase III. He said that Cable TV Digitization has many positive sides which would provide good quality of picture and sound with Electronic Program Guide (EPG) including multiple choices of channels where it gives choice to consumers. It would bring in transparency as the signals of the cable operator are encrypted and can be received only through a set top box after due authorization from the service provider, he added. He also added that one important feature of digitization was the broadband service through the digitized cable operators.

Pointing out some of the cable TV networks (Regulation) Act 1995, the Advisor,

Yogendra highlighted some major provisions and further emphasized on the Section-3 (Registration); Section-4 (DAS); Section-5 (Program Code); Section-6 (Advertisement Code); Section-8 (Compulsory Channels); Section-9 (Standard of equipment) and Section-10 (Inspection). He said that the Act mandates the following Authorized Officers namely: District Magistrate or Sub-Divisional Magistrate or Commissioner of Police within the local limits of jurisdiction for implementation who has power to seize equipment being used by cable operators if the given provisions have being contravened. He also highlighted the roles and responsibility of the nodal officers of the State and further informed that a toll free helpline No. 1800 180 4343 has also been launched to facilitate any queries in eight languages in regard to the cable TV digitization.

During the workshop, discussions were taken up on various provisions of the Cable Television Network Act including penalty for violating the Act or for running unauthorized channels etc.

Joint Director, IPR Tokishe Sema who led the IPR team highlighted the status of Cable TV Digitization Phase III being carried out in the urban areas of Nagaland State where he informed that almost 50% of digitization has been completed. He also informed that the Department of Information and Public Relation, Nagaland has conducted a workshop on cable TV Digitization in the month of November 2015 where all the Multi System Operators (MSOs), Local Cable Operators (LCOs) and District Nodal Officers within the State had attended the workshop.

Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, Government of India for Nodal Officers of North Eastern States was attended by Nodal Officers from Nagaland and Manipur.

The first lady of Nagaland, Kavita Acharya, who graced the programme, underlined the need for women empowerment to the fullest. She stressed on empowerment of women educationally and financially.

In her address, the main speaker of the programme, Sushri Gunde, Trustee of Stree Shakti, emphasized on women empowerment which she said is the key to all-round development. Earlier, Medonuo Pienyü, Assistant Professor and Head of Department, History at St. Joseph's College, Jakhama presented a report on women empowerment. The programme was chaired by Tasile Zeliang, coordinator, Nagaland.

CHIEF MINISTER ADDRESSES ENSF GENERAL SESSION

The 3rd Roundtable on Regulatory Regime and Transit Access of Bamboo in North East India was held at the conference hall of Nagaland Bamboo Resource Centre Dimapur on 26th July 2016, with Minister for Forest, Environment & Wildlife of Nagaland Nicky Kire as the chief guest.

While delivering his address, he highlighted that Nagaland has 5% of the total bamboo growing area of the country with 52% species of bamboo. He added that bamboo, as compared to other industrialised processes allows the rural communities to partake in a larger proportion of value addition. It is a natural vehicle for rural development because rural people generally have adequate access to it and it can be easily grown and harvested. He also added bamboo can be as important component of development and effective means to improve the livelihoods of the people on saying that he stress that all weather roads is a must for successful plantation as well as extraction and relaxation of entry fee on transit from one state to another, will enhance the movement of bamboo and reduce transportation cost.

Parliamentary Secretary for Industries & Commerce, Amenba Yaden was the guest of honour in the programme. He said that bamboo is a rich natural resource available

in the region and economic potentials as also its beneficial environmental attributes. These form the backbone of rural economy and if properly planned and facilitated, it can bring economic prosperity in the region.

STERN WARNING AGAINST PRE-ACTIVATED SIM CARDS BUSINESS

Despite repeated warnings, unscrupulous elements continue to indulge in pre-activated SIM cards business. A release by SP(Crime)& PRO, Nagaland Police, M. Tungoe, IPS stated that rules clearly prescribe the procedures to be adhered to before a SIM card is issued and activated. These include filling up the Customer Acquisition Form (CAF), providing proofs of Identity and Address, photographs etc. Only after these norms are followed and authenticity established,

a SIM card can be issued to a customer. All service providers are also required to follow a call back verification procedure before phone/SMS/internet services are activated on a new SIM card. Therefore any pre-activated SIM card available in the market is illegal. Tele-verification for new SIM card before activation is mandatory.

However, the PRO stated that in Nagaland, pre-activated SIM cards are being sold all across the State. Taking a serious note of this unhealthy practice, the Police has warned that strict action as per law will be taken against those people found indulging in this illegal activity. All Service Providers operating in Nagaland have been directed to allow sale of SIM cards only in the authorised Points of Sales. In this connection, Law Enforcing agencies have already had meetings with Representatives of all Mobile Operators that have presence in the state of Nagaland and have been made aware of the menace. Therefore, those in-charge of Zones, Districts and Regions will also be held accountable if the problem persists. All citizens have been requested to refrain from buying these pre-activated SIM cards as our own Society is at risk and therefore it is the responsibility of every Stakeholder to keep it safe and secure.

The Police also requested that if anyone comes across any shop that sells Pre-activated SIM cards, the matter may kindly be reported to the nearest police station or emailed tospcrime-ngl@nic.in. Anonymity will be maintained. Action will be taken against the defaulters.

In regard to the proposed agenda for construction of EAC office building in Alongkima, EAC, Alongkima, apprised the members on the deplorable condition of the office which is unsafe and beyond repair and

WORKSHOP FOR ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS & ANTI-TOBACCO SQUAD ON COTPA 2003 AT KOHIMA

A one day workshop for enforcement Officers and Anti-tobacco Squad on Harmful effects of tobacco and COTPA 2003 was held at Conclave Conference Hall, LCS Building, Kohima on 12th July 2016.

State Nodal Officer (NTCP) and Joint Director, Health & Family Welfare Department, Dr. H. Hotokhu Chishi said that the workshop is important for the enforcement officers in order to equip them about the harmful effects of tobacco so as to act as a role model while implementing the enforcement activities in their respective areas. Speaking as resource person on the topic "Hazards of tobacco" Dr. Hotokhu stated that tobacco is the only legal product available in the market that kills 50% of its users globally where India is the third largest producer in the world next to China and Brazil and the second largest consumer in the world next to China which leads to largest number of oral cancer in the world

resulting 2200 of its population dies every day and 10 lakh of its population dies every year due to tobacco use.

As per GATS 2010 released by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Dr. Hotokhu informed that Nagaland Tobacco Statistic shows an overall 57% prevalence of tobacco with 26.3% of cigarette, 11.8% of Bidi and 45.0% of smokeless. He highlighted the burdens of tobacco in term of health, economy and environment and what it offers to our body and the consequences one has to pay off and also highlighted on the district wise tobacco profile.

Legal Aid Counsel, JJB Kohima, Akumla Longchari speaking on "Tobacco Control Act (COTPA 2003) as resource person highlighted the main provisions of the Act which included prohibition of smoking in public places, prohibition of advertisement of tobacco products, prohibition on sale of product to and by minor and specific health warnings on tobacco products.

Deputy Commissioner Kohima and Chairman of DLCC, Rovilatuo Mor, IAS expressed his optimism that the members have taken serious note of it and understand clearly about the harmful effects of tobacco through this workshop. To control the harmful effects of tobacco, the DC informed that the first step taken by the DLCC was to make the Kohima City a Smoke Free City which was declared on 28th April 2016 followed by the guidelines and action plan laid by the DLCC for effective Implementation of Smoke free Kohima city. He therefore requested all the enforcement officers to create awareness on the guidelines and take active part and initiative in their respective areas for the successful implementation of the smoke free city and create a healthy

environment with equal participation.

Dr. Arenla Walling the District Nodal Officer earlier welcomed all the enforcement officers from different departments to the workshop

Their participation as members of Village Council is likely to be more active, practical oriented and more logical in formulation of policy matters and accurate on the part of implementation of schemes.

In this tenure of Village Council, the ladies are represented from six villages only, therefore, the effectiveness of their participation and making the Village Council a difference in performance is expected. In no case, the inner political quality and social zeal of ladies shall be avoided in a backward community like the people of Phek District. But the better quality of leadership irrespective of men or women in the district shall be selected as members of Village Council even in the years to come, the release stated.

GITI MOKOKCHUNG OBSERVES WORLD YOUTH SKILL DAY

Government ITI Mokokchung observed World Youth Skill Day on 15th July with a special event on the theme "Skills Development to Youth Employment".

Speaking on the occasion, the Principal stated that various commercial market surveys conducted by ITI in Mokokchung

Town reported that the average salary of sales person was Rs.2500 per month in the 1808 shops registered under MMC, 60% are with educational qualification of 12 passed & above. Out of the work force in 64 RCC houses under construction and 48 different Workshops surveyed, 10% of skilled workers comprised of locals which shows skilled workers were very few among the locals. 90% of skilled related works were done by non-locals; however unskilled works were mostly done by locals. It was also observed that all skilled workers were earning an average monthly income much higher than unskilled workers.

The findings reveal that shortage of skilled workers among locals is not due to lack of interest but it is due to non-availability of skill imparting sectors; Despite of massive labor demand in the market, skilled workers could not find avenue to work daily. It was concluded that to bridge the gap between labour market demands and labour it was necessitated to give more importance to vocational training with skill placement center.

AWARENESS CAMPAIGN ON HUMAN-ANIMAL CONFLICT AT PHEK

An awareness campaign on Human-Animal Conflict Mitigation was held at Phek Town council conference hall, Phek on 18th July 2016 which was organized by the Department of Forest in collaboration with Fingerprint & Castle Group and sponsored by MoEF & CC, Government of India.

MARKETING SHED INAUGURATED AT IMPUR LEMJEM, NH-2


