NBSE NOTIFIES

The Nagaland Board of School Education (NBSE) has notified for information of all concerned that the following steps needs to be taken for availing the Central Sector Scholarship Scheme (CSSS) as directed by the Ministry of Human Resources Development, National Scholarship Division, Government of India.

1. Application for fresh as well as renewal of scholarship must be submitted through the National Scholarship Portal (NSP) during July-September 2018. For the actual date of submission, go to the portal <http://scholarship.gov.in>
2. Aadhaar seeding is mandatory for disbursement of all scholarships.
3. Every beneficiary needs to have a separate bank account and get their Aadhaar number linked with their bank account number.
4. Principal/Head of the Institutions must register their institution first in the National Scholarship Portal (NSP) (<http://scholarship.gov.in>). They are requested to inform and sensitize their eligible students for CSSS to apply through the NPS portal within the time frame.
5. The Head of the institution must verify the application of the CSSS beneficiary students (new and renewal) before forwarding to the given portal. The beneficiary students must be advised to submit the application within the stipulated time notified in the portal.
6. The beneficiary students/applicants in preceding years are directed to check whether their given bank account is still active and Aadhaar linked. The NBSE must be informed on this status at the earliest through mail at nagaboard@gmail.com

FINANCE DEPARTMENT NOTIFIES ON GST

The Finance Department (Revenue Branch) in a notification stated that in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 164 of the Nagaland Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017 (4 of 2017), the State Government hereby makes the following rules further to amend the Nagaland Goods and Services Tax Rules, 2017, namely:

1. These rules may be called the Nagaland Goods and Services Tax (Twenty First Amendment) Rules, 2018.
2. They shall be deemed to have come into force with effect from the 12th day of June, 2018. In the Nagaland Goods and Services Tax Rules, 2017:
 - In Rule 125, for the words “Directorate General of Safeguards,” the words “Directorate General of Anti-profiteering” shall be substituted;
 - In Rule 129, for the words “Directorate General of Safeguards,” wherever they occur, the words “Directorate General of Anti-profiteering” shall be substituted;

- In Rule 130, in sub-rule (2), for the words “Directorate General of Safeguards,” at both places where they occur, the words “Directorate General of Anti-profiteering” shall be substituted;
- In Rule 131, for the words “Directorate General of Safeguards,” the words “Directorate General of Anti-profiteering” shall be substituted;
- In Rule 132, in sub-rule (1), for the words “Directorate General of Safeguards,” the words “Directorate General of Anti-profiteering” shall be substituted;
- In Rule 133, for the words “Directorate General of Safeguards,” wherever they occur, the words “Directorate General of Anti-profiteering” shall be substituted.

RATES FOR EX-GRATIA PAYMENT TO PERSONNEL

The Home Department in a notification has prescribed the rates for Ex-Gratia payment to the personnel or the Next of Kin (NOK) of Assam Rifles/Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF)/Indian Armed Forces & soldiers belonging to Nagaland who suffer fatal and non-fatal casualties during counter insurgency operations within and outside the state as indicated below:

A. Casualties within Nagaland:

- I. Soldiers from outside the state:
 1. Assam Rifles
 2. Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF)
 3. Indian Armed Forces
- II. Soldiers belonging to Nagaland:

P&AR NOTIFIES ON APPOINTMENTS WITHOUT SANCTIONED POSTS

The Department of Personnel & Administrative Reforms in an office memorandum stated that the State Government has issued instructions that all appointments at all levels shall be made only against existing vacant posts that have been created in accordance with the rules in force and

no appointment of any sort shall be made in the absence of a vacant post vide this Department's Office Memorandum vide No.AR-5/ASSO/98 (C) dated 26th February 2001.

Despite clear instructions, it has come to the notice of the Government that a number of unauthorized appointments without sanctioned posts have been made by certain Heads of Departments. The Government has viewed seriously such violation of standing rules/procedures and it is hereby reiterated that the erring officials shall be penalized as per the rules. Criminal prosecution of the erring officials shall be taken up by filing FIR in the Vigilance Commission and also all payments of pensioner benefits should be withheld till criminal case is disposed off.

This instruction has been issued with the direction of the Cabinet vide O.M. No.CAB-2/2013 dated 5th July 2018.

H&TE NOTIFIES TRAINING INSTITUTES

The Directorate of Higher & Technical Education has notified to all the Training Institutes/ Centre running Computer Software/Hardware courses & all IT related courses, that any training institutes/centre found awarding Diploma Certificate without the approval of the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) New Delhi, and with training duration of less than 3 years shall not be granted further extension to run the institute and the students obtaining certificates from such institute shall be treated as fake.

Training duration less than 3 years can use the word "Certificate Course" and not as 'Diploma.

NAGALAND WATER POLICY, 2016 APPROVED

The Government of Nagaland has approved the Nagaland Water Policy, 2016 under the First Schedule, Section 22 of the Nagaland Rules of Executive Business, 2016 with immediate effect.

This Notification is issued with the approval of the Cabinet conveyed vide No.CAB-2/2013 dated 28.06.2018.

FISHERIES DEPARTMENT CHANGED TO DEPARTMENT OF FISHERIES & AQUATIC RESOURCES

The Department of Fisheries has notified that the Government of Nagaland has changed the nomenclature of the Department of Fisheries to that of Department of Fisheries & Aquatic Resources with immediate effect.

Henceforth, all communication and correspondence shall be addressed as "Department of Fisheries & Aquatic Resources."

Newsletter was released by Ikuto Zhimo, Director of Agriculture in presence of Viliehu Nguzhu, Additional Director & HoD, Soil & Water Conservation.

Director of Agriculture, Ikuto Zhimomi highlighted that the farmers of Nagaland in the mid 60s practiced mono cropping but with the intervention of Agriculture and Allied departments, the farmers are mostly practicing mixed cropping and are making a handsome profit. He said that documenting should be done not only at the block level but it should come up at the state level.

The programme was chaired by Avitoli Yeptho, Deputy PD, ATMA, Zunheboto. Keynote address was delivered by K. Khekiho Shohe, PD, ATMA, Zunheboto. Words of encouragement to the ATMA functionaries was given by Vielichu Nguzhu. The programme was attended by senior officers of Agriculture and Soil & Water Conservation and officials from ATMA Zunheboto.

EXCERPTS OF CABINET MEETING MINUTES

The following are the decisions taken during the Cabinet meeting held on 4th July 2018.

- Draft Nagaland Water Policy, 2016: The Cabinet discussed and approved the Nagaland Water Policy, 2016.
- Ex-gratia payment to the next of kin of Central Armed Police Forces/Army Personnel/Assam Rifles/Nagaland Police who suffer fatal and non-fatal casualties during counter insurgency operations: The Cabinet discussed and approved for enhancement of ex-gratia payment to the next of kin of Central Armed Police Forces/Army Personnel/Assam Rifles/Nagaland Police who suffer fatal and non-fatal casualties during counter insurgency operations, as proposed by the Home Department.
- Review of granting incentives to government employees who have acquired higher qualification by availing Study Leave: The Cabinet discussed and approved to exempt medical doctors in partial modification of the P&AR Department O.M. NO. AR-3/Gen-204/2009 dated 17th June 2014 and restore grant of incentives to the medical doctors for acquiring higher qualification. The Department was further asked to examine the issue of grant of study leave for specialisation and bring it before the Cabinet.
- Appointment against sanctioned posts only: The Cabinet discussed appointment to various posts in all the departments and directed the Chief Secretary to reiterate afresh the earlier order banning appointments without sanctioned posts. Action should be taken on the erring officers and they should be penalised as per rules.
- Recruitment Policy of the State Government: The Cabinet discussed the recruitment policy of the State Government and directed the P&AR Department to frame a policy for holding combined recruitment of Grade-C and Grade-D posts in all the departments simultaneously and

submit to the Cabinet for decision. Further, the P&AR Department was also directed to reiterate its earlier order that appointment of Grade-D posts in the districts will be filled by the respective indigenous inhabitants of the districts only. All departments should be directed to review all such cases of appointment and consolidate the proposal by the P&AR Department and submit to the Cabinet for decision.

- Issue of Indigenous Inhabitant Certificate in the State of Nagaland: The Cabinet discussed the issue of Indigenous Inhabitant Certificate in the State of Nagaland and directed the Home Department to issue a clarification immediately on the orders issued by the ADC Dimapur which should be in line with the Notification issued vide No. AR-08/08/76 dated 28-04-1977 clearly defining the criteria to qualify as an indigenous inhabitant of the State of Nagaland. The Home Department was also directed to submit a proposal to the Cabinet on the issue of Inner Line Permit (ILP) streamlining for decision.

ONE DAY ORIENTATION PROGRAMME FOR TAXI ASSOCIATION

The Department of Tourism held a one day orientation programme for Taxi Association on 5th July 2018 at the Directorate of Tourism, Kohima.

Secretary, Tourism, Mhabemo Yanthan in his introductory note pointed out that Nagaland has become an important tourist destination and therefore, the people have to maintain the highest standard of responsibility, commitment and devotion. He stated that when Tourism Department is given such an opportunity, one should take advantage of it by uplifting the local economy to a higher level. He added that economic upliftment can happen in villages and every nook and corner where there is important tourist destination.

Yanthan further appealed to the Tourism Department, taxi, bus and other drivers union and

associations to have co-ordination as tourist guides and drivers because their duty is not only to take them to their respective destination but also to highlight to the tourists about the best places to eat, stay and show important tourist spots. He pointed out that the first contact the tourist make is the taxi driver and they play a very important role by either leaving behind a memorable impression on the tourist or the worst experience of their lifetime.

CHIEF COMMISSIONER FOR PwDs BRIEFS MEDIA

A press briefing was called by Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities, Dr. Kamlesh Kumar Pandey on 9th July 2018 at Hotel Vivor, Kohima to highlight on adoption of Divyangjan (Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities) in Nagaland.

Dr. Kamlesh stated that, to reach out to Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) and grievances pertaining to availability of the benefits, Mobile Courts in different parts of the country have been organised along with the Commissioner for PwDs of the concerned State Governments. Till date, the office of the CCPD has organised 42 Mobile Courts

in 22 states and many are in pipeline. There are 29361 PwDs in Nagaland. He mentioned that the Department of Empowerment of PwDs (Divyangjan) has conducted several camps for distribution of aids and appliances under ADIP Scheme and about 10 lakh PwDs got benefitted in this distribution camp. Government of India (Gol) has also selected 59 cities under accessible camp and under Skill Development, Gol, and has made a target to train 5 lakh persons with disabilities up to 2018 and 25 lakh persons with disabilities up to 2022. It is also in the process of providing UDID to persons with disabilities which will have universal recognition.

Dr. Kamlesh said that Nagaland being a small state, has a better opportunity but not many are aware of the government schemes. Therefore he appealed to the media to create awareness to the people to avail the opportunity given by the government and added that it is not only the duty of the government and NGOs but duty of the whole society. He also said that Nagaland being placed in

the 3rd category (preliminary stage), pension scheme is Rs. 300 only but expressed hope that one day Nagaland will become the role model for all the states.

Deputy Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities, Nagaland, Dr. Atha Vizol briefed said that Nagaland adopted this Act on 27th June 2018 and approval is to be done on 18th July 2018. He appraised that in Nagaland, beneficiaries are given only Rs. 2000 by the Social Welfare Department. He also informed that the New 2016 Act has included 'dwarfs' in the list of PwDs.

Along with the Chief Commissioner, Deputy Commissioner, Sanjay Kant Prasad and other officials and staff of Department of Social Welfare attended the press briefing.

MEETING ON STATE TASK FORCE FOR EXTENDED MI HELD

The State Task Force meeting for extended Mission Indradhanush under Gram Swaraj Abhiyan was held at the Conference Hall, Office of the Commissioner & Secretary, Health & Family Welfare, Kohima on 9th July 2018.

While presenting powerpoint on review of preparedness for Extended MI-SIO(UIP) & SMO, WHO, Visasieü Kire said that the main objectives of Mission Indradhanush is to rapidly saturate the identified 115 aspirational districts and sustain thereafter through routine immunization. All children and pregnant women should receive all due vaccines with special focus on children up to 2 years of age. She said three rounds of Mission Indradhanush will be conducted in aspirational districts where the first round is scheduled from 16th July 2018. Inter-departmental coordination will be the key to succeed, she added.

In Nagaland, Kiphire district has been identified as Aspirational District by NITI AAYOG wherein the first round will start from 16th July and continue for 17 days. In this regard, 16 villages have been selected by MOHFW and training of medical officers, BPMs and FLWs were conducted. Headcount in all villages were completed on 6th July 2018.

Mission Director, NHM, Kevichiisa Medikhrü delivered the opening remarks while Commissioner & Secretary, Health & Family Welfare, Himato Zhimomi gave the closing remarks. Allied departments also participated in the State Task Force meeting.

GOVERNOR INTERACTS WITH NAGAS IN SHILLONG

Advocacy & Publicity Workshop on MSP at Kohima

The Advocacy and Publicity Workshop on Minimum Support Price for Minor Forest Produce scheme conducted by Tribal Cooperative Marketing Development Federation of India (TRIFED), Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India and Department of Under Developed Areas (DUDA), Government of Nagaland was organised on 20th July 2018 at Hotel Vivor, Kohima.

Minister, Environment, Forests & Climate Change, C.M. Chang in his welcome address said that Nagaland has been endowed with very rich and unique biodiversity and falls within the Indo-Burma Biodiversity Hotspot bordering the species rich Indian and Indo-Chinese Sub-region, it is estimated that the state supports approximately 2,431 species belonging to 963 genera and 186 families, out of which he believes that more than half will be important medicinal and of other economic value species. With the introduction and implementation of the Van Dhan scheme in Nagaland, the rural farmers will benefit a lot and he hope that the department of DUDA and TRIFED would take up the scheme to the doorsteps of the farmers who have now taken up cultivation of medicinal plants as a source of livelihood and also to supplement their income.

Advisor, DUDA, N. Bongkhao Konyak in his short speech highlighted about the departmental activities and DUDA being the implementing agency of the state, its main objective is to implement people centric developmental programmes for Eastern Nagaland region. With this objective, the department is working tirelessly to bridge the gap with regard to economic and livelihood opportunities and bring the backward region at par with the rest of the state. There are 337 villages in Eastern Nagaland and because of the lack of proper road and basic infrastructure in place, it is still an uphill task for the department to successfully impact the region.

Bongkhao added that lack of job opportunities and proximity to commercial districts, the people of the region cannot effectively initiate self-employment venture other than dependency on government jobs or government fundings. In addition to having Minimum Support Price (MSP) for the Minor Forest Produce (MFP) there is need for storage facilities, organic certifications, value addition, market linkages and for study and documentation of the ethno-botany of the important plant species of the State.

MD-TRIFED & Principal Secretary, DUDA, L. Kire expressed his concern about the operational guidelines and requirements of the schemes as geographical area and added that biological environment varies from state to state. Therefore, it should be taken into consideration while framing the guidelines and policies of the schemes, he said.

Powerpoint presentation for introduction & presentation on MSP-MFP & Van Dhan Schemes was presented by Executive Director, Sangeeta Mahindra, while powerpoint presentation by implementing agency was presented by Joint Director, DUDA, Dr. Anungla Imdong Phom. Vote of thanks was proposed by RM-TRIFED Guwahati.

COOPERATION LAUNCHES ICD PROJECT AT KOHIMA

The Department of Co-operation officially launched Integrated Cooperative Development Project (ICDP) for the districts of Kohima, Tuensang, Kiphire, Longleng and Peren in the presence of Minister for Agriculture and Cooperation, G. Kaito Aye on 20th July 2018 at Hotel Japfu, Kohima.

Launching the 2nd phase of ICDP programmes, Minister G. Kaito Aye said that the ICDP is one of the most important schemes of the National Co-operative Development Co-operation (NCDC). He stated that under ICDP, an integrated area based approach is adopted for development of co-operative societies in selected districts where the scheme promotes various economic activities through co-operatives in the sphere of agriculture, agro-based industries, cottage and household industries, agri and allied sectors of fishery, dairy, handloom, horticulture and rural industries in the selected districts.

Kaito also mentioned that the department has implemented ICDP in eight districts in the recent past and added that the outcome of the programme has been discouraging despite enormous resources in different areas to create success stories and an example even in the national level. He extended his appreciation to the Registrar of Co-operative Societies for his efforts and for taking initiative in procuring the vehicles in the five districts for ICDP programmes. After the programme, the Minister handed over the Project Vehicles to the CPOs of the five districts.

Highlighting the ICD Project, ARCS, Kohima, Imsunungsang said that the ICDP was introduced in Nagaland in 1989 and funds involved consist of 70% loan component and remaining as share capital or subsidy. He informed that ICDP program would run for 4 years covering all major Agri and Allied activities supported by storage, transportation and marketing facilities which was initiated basing on a set of modalities laid down by the state government and Project Implementing Team (PTI) personnel are constituted only from the Co-operation Department unlike previous ICDPs where deputation and open interview was considered; every step of DRP preparation was guided and finalized by the department. For the first time, Aadhar is to be used for identification of society officials and members; loan guarantee is to be obtained from VDB or Village Council; all payments are to be made through bank accounts only and the whole implementation process is structured with major focus on recovery of the loans.

The function was chaired by RCS, Wepe Ritse, Short speeches were delivered by Vice-Chairman, MARCOFED Ltd. Dr. Aotoshi; Kohima District Weavers and Artisans C.S. Ltd. M.D. NSTCB Ltd. Lipoktoba Aier and Secretary, Cooperation, K. Libanlung Lotha. Special song was presented by Vision Women Weaving Handloom and Handicraft C.S. Ltd. and vote of thanks was pronounced by Joint RCS, Temjen Longkumer.

Rio informed that a request has been made to the Ministry of Defence to set up an Army Public School in the village in memory of the Lt. Captain Kenguruse, adding that having a Public School in the village will benefit and motivate the children to join the army and also the attitude of the youth will be transformed.

YSM, IGAR (N) Major Gen. P.C. Nair addressing the gathering, said 19 years ago in the Kargil War, what Captain Niekezhakuo Kenguruse did on the eventful day is something to be proud of. He appraised the people that every year on Vijay Diwas, he is honored so that his memory is not lost and sacrifice not gone in vain. He encouraged the young people to take inspiration from Captain Kenguruse's act of bravery and sacrifice and urged them to join the forces to emulate and live up like him for the people and for the country.

Captain S. Dwivedi, narrating a Recap of Act of Valour of Lt. Captain Kenguruse, said Captain Kenguruse, Maha Vir Chakra was born in Nerhema village on 15th July, 1974. He was commissioned into 2nd Rajputana Rifles on 12th December 1998 and was fondly addressed as 'Nimbu Sahab' by the soldiers serving under him. He said that his moment of valour came when he was part of 'Operation Vijay.' He was the Ghatak Platoon Commander during the attack on area 'Black Rock' on the night of 28th June 1999. Without thinking of his own safety, he volunteered to undertake a daring commando mission of attacking a well-sited enemy machine gun post on a cliff face. At a height of 16000 feet and a freezing temperature of 10 degrees, he took off his shoes to get a good grip and scaled the rock wall along with the rocket launcher and fired at bunker. Unmindful of his personal safety, he charged at the enemy and personally killed two men with his rifles and another two with his commando knife in hand to hand combat before succumbing to his injuries. He single handedly neutralized the enemy bunker which held up the battalion's progress. Captain Kenguruse displayed conspicuous gallantry, indomitable resolve, grit and determination beyond the call of duty and supreme sacrifice in the face of enemy, in true tradition of the

Indian Army, for which he was honoured with the Maha Vir Chakra posthumously.

The programme was chaired by Captain S Dwivedi. The occasion also witnessed laying of wreaths on the memorial by Maj Gen. P C Nair, YSM, IGAR(N) and Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio. Two minutes silence was also observed in remembrance of soldiers who laid down their lives during Kargil War 1999. Offeratory prayer was pronounced by Pastor, Dziesetuolie Chadi, Baptist Church, Chiephobozou.

Aadhaar based biometric System installed in PHQ

Deputy CM, Y. Patton inaugurated Aadhaar Based Biometric System installed in the Police Head Quarters, Kohima on 27th July 2018.

Y. Patton mentioned about the issues relating to maintenance of law and order which needs to be improved. He also stressed on the investigation of pending high profile cases which should be brought to a logical conclusion at the earliest and monthly progress report to be submitted to the government. He also stressed on the traffic management and regulation and raised his concern on the encroachment of police land by civilians where strict action should be initiated against the encroachers. He also stressed upon the cleanliness drive to be initiated in every Police stations/Police reserve to make Nagaland Plastic Free State.

Director General of Police, T. J. Longkumer, IPS stated that as Police Officers, privileges are enjoyed, so it is also the duty of every police officer to shoulder all responsibilities to provide "Security, Service and Sacrifice" to the denizens of Nagaland. He cautioned the officers not to cross the limits of authority as Police Officers.

Home Commissioner, Ramakrishnan, IAS reiterated the need of the hour is to be vigilant and pro-active in the matters of mob lynching and to keep on working for the welfare of the jawans. He also appreciated the dedication and good works done by the Police forces in the state.

STATE GOVERNMENT ISSUES ADVISORIES

In connection to the final Draft Citizens Roll under the National Registration of Citizens exercise by the Government of Assam, the following advisories have been issued by the State Government through an office memorandum of the Home Department.

- a) All the Village/Town/Municipal authorities are to take measures to strictly monitor influx of people from outside the state in violation of the existing rules/norms.
- b) Any unusual influx of outsiders should be promptly brought to the knowledge of the District Administration & Police.
- c) The antecedents of any new incoming tenants should be properly checked and verified by the District Administration & Police.
- d) All entry points/check gates manned by the Police should be strengthened to thwart any influx of illegal immigrants and mobile patrolling in vulnerable locations should be activated in the respective jurisdictions.
- e) ILP regulations should be strengthened with effective monitoring and checking from time to time.

MEETING OF RCs OF NE STATES

Dr. D. Bhalla, IAS, Chief Resident Commissioner, Nagaland House, New Delhi called for a brainstorming and intellectual lunch session of all the Resident Commissioners (RCs) of North East (NE) states of India at Nagaland House, R. K. Puram, New Delhi on 27th July 2018. The session was called in order to brainstorm over different policies and options for the development of northeast.

The first and the most important point which was discussed in the session was that, most of the NE states are deficient in the generation of the monetary resources and this point was stressed upon as to how the states be made more self-sufficient so that they don't have to only depend upon central funding for various activities. It surfaced up in the discussion that there could be a possibility, under which all

corporate houses may be mandated to spend their CSR funds for developmental activities in NE and it will allow corporate sector to explore various avenues of development and nation building in NE states.

NE states of India are known for their best flora and fauna, biodiversity etc. This can be used for revenue generation by developing tourism activities in a sustainable way without disturbing ecosystem of the area. Tourism can be of various varieties like medical tourism, golf tourism, anthropological tourism, ecological tours, adventure tourism etc. These tourism projects can be planned on PPP model, under which state government can put in their share by providing land and other natural resources and private players in collaboration with Gol can infuse capital resources for projects. It was further discussed that 15th Finance Commission should be requested to keep in view that NE states act as natural sink for the rest of nation and hence NER should be given even higher devolution of funds to keep it more green.

On the job creation front, the issue that was raised by various Resident Commissioners was for bringing various mega projects to the region and various strategies to fund small projects on farming sector and horticulture. Separate defined economic entities could be created for the region like NE bank, Special loan assistance agencies and a dedicated insurance agency only for NE. Horticulture and agro based food processing industries offer a huge scope for development in NER.

Resident Commissioners of all NE States welcomed the initiative. The meeting concluded with the suggestion that an aide memoir should be developed by all RCs together for presenting it to the Prime Minister for expediting the NE agenda of the government.

CS & FC NOTIFIES ON LINKING OF AADHAAR

Chief Secretary and Finance Commissioner, Temjen Toy, IAS has in a notification informed that Aadhaar linking of beneficiaries would be done to the extent possible, for all Direct Benefit Transfer under

State Schemes and Centrally Sponsored Schemes. Also, all cash and kind benefits should be provided to the beneficiaries through Aadhaar linkage and Direct Benefit Transfer.

Therefore, all Departments/Agencies implementing such schemes are requested to regularly assess the progress of Aadhaar seeding with the beneficiary Bank Account and complete the process at the earliest.

However, no beneficiaries would be deprived of benefit for want of Aadhaar number. Until such time the beneficiaries obtain Aadhaar number, other relevant documents, namely voter identity card, PAN card, Ration card etc. may be used for authentication of the beneficiary.

NAGALAND TO PRE-EMPT FALLOUT OF NRC EXERCISE IN ASSAM

Nagaland is set to take all preventive measures against influx of illegal immigrants from Assam due to the National Register of Citizens (NRC) exercise in that state from 31st July 2018. The Nagaland Police is deploying additional forces to the border areas to check and prevent influx of the illegal immigrants. Additional IRB units are being deployed and flying squads are to be sent. The Government is also writing to the Village Councils to be vigilant and not to allow the illegal immigrants to enter their jurisdictions or to employ them in any manner.

Instructions to Deputy Commissioners have also been given to take appropriate measures in this respect and to issue necessary advisories to house owners in the towns to verify the identity of the tenants from the concerned authorities and not to let out their premises to doubtful and suspicious people. These preventive measures to be undertaken was decided at a meeting of the Home and Police Departments under the chairmanship of Chief Secretary, Temjen Toy, IAS, who stated that the Government of Nagaland is contemplating to carry out exercise on enrolment under NRC.

CS HOLDS HIGH LEVEL MEETING ON DEVASTATION CAUSED BY INCESSANT RAINS

Chief Secretary, Temjen Toy, IAS called an emergency meeting of high officials on 31st July 2018 to take stock of the alarming situation arising out of unremitting monsoon rain in the state. The incessant heavy rain over the past one month has devastated the state as there were reports of heavy damage to major roads, loss of properties and agriculture. As a result, many major roads connecting District Headquarters and other major towns have been cut off in different parts of the state.

Addressing the meeting, Chief Secretary said the state is under emergency-like-situation and many district headquarters including the state capital Kohima is threatened to be cut off completely. As such, he called on the high officials attending the meeting to gear up more efforts to see that major roads connecting all district headquarters are not completely cut off. He said concerned department should ensure that at least one lifeline should be maintained to connect the towns. He also discussed

threadbare with the officers about impending danger of shortage of essential commodities and fuel.

Reviewing the road connectivity between Kohima and Dimapur, Temjen Toy urged the NPWD officers to deploy adequate manpower and machineries to fight against fury of the nature such as landslides and sinking of the roads caused by the incessant rains. He called upon the NSDMA to do necessary action to see that there is no loss of lives or to at least minimise the damage by way of taking adequate pre-emptive measure in the event of the worst happening.

Commissioner, Nagaland, M. Patton apprised of the meeting about the current road connectivity of all the district headquarters and other major towns. He said, as per report from DCs, the situation is very alarming and coordinated action is the need of the hour. He also said that he is updating the situation with district administration round the clock.

DGP, Nagaland, John Longkumer informed the meeting that information has been sent to all SPs and Battalion Headquarters to remain on the move to extend all assistance when called for.

The meeting was attended by Ramakrishnan, Home Commissioner, Menukhol John, Principal Secretary, School Education, Himato

Zhimomi, Commissioner & Secretary Health & Family Welfare, Bendangkokba, Commissioner & Secretary, Works & Housing, Limadongdang, Chief Engineer, PWD (R& B), Lima Akum S.E (NH) and Talisunep, Additional SP, Kohima, besides other officials from various departments.

TRIPARTITE AGREEMENT BETWEEN POILWA-KHONOMA AND GoN

A programme for signing of the Tripartite Agreement on 'Augmentation of Water Supply to Kohima, between Poilwa-Khonoma and the Government of Nagaland was held at State Banquet Hall, Kohima on 31st July 2018.

Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio speaking at the programme said that signing the tripartite agreement between Khonoma-Poilwa village and the GoN is a red letter day for all. Rio expressed gratitude to the villages of Poilwa and Khonoma for being large hearted and showing support and cooperation to give water supply from Teupuiki river and Dzupfu river.

'The first need of life is water, and without water nothing can exist on earth,' Rio said. He stated that in 1977, the population of Kohima was around 21547 and in 2011, it has come up to 123114 and by 2050, it is expected to cross 3 lakh population in Kohima town. He further added that the need for water will continue to increase and after 20 years, 30 million litres per day will be required whereas till now, water supply from Jotsoma and Southern villages cannot even suffice the need.

Also stressing on conservation of rich biodiversity of Nagaland, Rio said once we start conserving our rich virgin forests, it will be the main attraction for tourists and such initiative will leave behind a legacy for the next generation.

Speaking at the programme, Chairman, Poilwa village, I Daniel Zeliang said that the Tripartite Agreement on Augmentation of Water Supply to Kohima, between Poilwa- Khonoma and the GoN will see a new beginning of prosperity and faster development. He stated that the Paimi Baudi Nagaland and Poilwa Village Council signed the Tripartite Agreement to bury the differences between Poilwa and Khonoma and make use of the God given water resources for the greater cause and interest of the state of Nagaland as a whole.

Deputy Chief Minister & Minister for Home & National Highways, Y. Patton, expressing happiness over the agreement, hoped this tripartite agreement would turn into a reality as it is agreed by the two villages together with the state government. He asked the state government to be firm and stand on the assurances that they have committed to the two villages.

Advisor to the Chief Minister of Nagaland, Viketol Sakhrie and Huzo Meru on behalf of Khonoma Village Council also delivered speeches on the occasion.

Chief Secretary, Temjen Toy, IAS chaired the programme, while State Chaplain, Rev. Kuzierang Thou invoked God's blessings.

Medziphema departmental meeting

Medziphema Sub-Divisional Departmental Co-ordination Meeting was held at ADC's Office on 2nd July 2018 under the chairmanship of ADC, Medziphema, Thsuvisie Phoji.

Addressing the meeting, the ADC called upon the officers to work together and to give full co-operation to the government as well as public. He urged all the Heads of Offices to highlight their departmental setup and activities and also to discuss issues and problems concerning Medziphema Sub-Division during such co-ordination meetings.

Governor meets Dimapur district officials

Governor, P. B. Acharya held a meeting with Dimapur District officials to review the performances of different government departments at Deputy Commissioner's Conference Hall, Dimapur on 2nd July 2018.

Dimapur DC Cautions on transaction of left out portion of four lane road

Deputy Commissioner, Dimapur, Sushil Kumar Patel, IAS, in a Public Notice dated 3rd July 2018, has stated that land transaction between individuals/village councils, of the left out portion of existing road along the proposed 4 lane road along Chumukedima to Medziphema has come to his notice. Whereas the lands are government property acquired for general public use of the state of Nagaland and this development is likely to disturb the construction of 4 lane road along the said stretch since the left out portion shall be used for public utility service in future. The DC therefore, informed the general public neither to sell nor purchase those land as such transactions if brought to his notice shall be made null & void. The DC further cautioned that failure to comply with the order will attract severe legal actions as per the Nagaland Eviction of Persons in Unauthorized Occupation of Public Land (Amendment) Act 1978.

Kiphire district aspiration review meeting

The Kiphire District Aspiration Review meeting was held at Conference Hall, Deputy Commissioner's Office on 3rd July 2018. DC, Kiphire Mohammad Ali Shihab, IAS called upon the officers to be serious in their work and sought cooperation in order to take Kiphire district forward.

SDO (Civil), Kiphire, Wilfred gave a powerpoint presentation and highlighted on the aspiration of the district. He also shared about the indicators, monitoring and computation of backward index to follow the developmental work programme.

Wilfred said that District Five Years Action Plan is the strength of the community.

DISTRICT MEASLES-RUBELLA VACCINATION CAMPAIGN WORKSHOP

KOHIMA:

The District Measles-Rubella Vaccination Campaign workshop was held on 5th July 2018 with all the medical officers, nurses and health workers of five blocks under Kohima district at Conference Hall of Para Medical Training Institute, Kohima.

During the inaugural programme of the training session, EAC, Kohima, Changsang Soted suggested the medical fraternity to enlighten about the diseases on how to be treated and to avail the

medical procedures and facilities available at various health centres. He stated that the vaccination campaign has been carried out in order to achieve the target of the government to completely eradicate the Measles-Rubella (MR) disease. He also encouraged them to create more awareness in the village level on healthcare intervention that has been provided free by the government.

Briefing on the objective of workshop, Chief Medical Officer, Kohima, Dr. Ritu Thurr said that the

main objective of the workshop is to acquire complete knowledge about MR disease profile, disease definition, geographical distribution of measles, its preventive measures, and technical knowledge on how to inject MR vaccine. He encouraged the participants to rededicate themselves to achieve the goal of Government of India with a vision to eradicate MR by 2020.

Emphasizing on the Basic Strategic Operational Plans for MR vaccination campaign, WHO RRT, Dr. Seema Singh said that the MR vaccine would be introduced through a campaign in a phased manner across the country without sub-phasing within the states. She said that, for vaccination sessions in educational institutes, schools, institution authorities, school teachers and parents will play a key role in ensuring that targeted students are well informed and immunized during the campaign, adding that in campaigns, all children in the target age group are vaccinated irrespective of previous immunization status or history of MR disease.

WOKHA:

As part of national strategy to eliminate Measles and control Rubella in the country, Wokha organized a district level workshop on 7th July 2018 at Deputy Commissioner's Conference Hall, Wokha.

DC while addressing the gathering, lauded the noble initiative by the Government of India and added that for the success of this programme, every stakeholder must get involved and have multi-sector

participation. He also said to achieve the Measles Rubella (MR) target to cover 80% of the total population, consultative meetings with the DEOs and CDBOs is very necessary and also involving religion sector (churches), village functionaries and educational institutions for the successful implementation of the MR campaign.

During the programme, Seema S. Koshal RRT-WHO dwelled on the objectives of the workshop, MR country updates, elimination strategies, epidemiology and rationale for MR campaign, basic of micro planning for MR vaccination campaign, school micro planning for MR vaccination, MR vaccine and cold chain and logistics management. While Dr. Khelito Zhimomi, DPO-UIP/RCH dwelled on planning, recording, reporting and monitoring tools and rollout plan with timelines & other guidelines, Dr. Chibenthung, MO, Humtso PHC spoke on AEFI treatment/management during MR campaign and organizing vaccination session sites including injection safety & waste management in MR campaign and Dr. Kuokholie Savino, RBSK-MO Wokha emphasized on the importance of FAQs on MR vaccination campaign including routine immunization and advocacy communication and social mobilization for MR vaccination campaign.

42 participants including units, Medical Officers, representatives from CHC, PHC Army hospital, NEEPCO hospital, BACs and BPMs attended the one day workshop. Earlier, Chief Medical Officer, Wokha, Dr. Robin Lotha delivered the welcome address.

Inaugurating the workshop, Temsuwati said that in order to ensure cent percent coverage of the Measles-Rubella (MR) vaccine to all the children from 9 months to 15 years of age in the district, he appealed to the medical workers to discharge their assigned duty with utmost sincerity and responsibility. He further urged them to tie up with the concerned departments, stakeholders and utilize the service of the administration in the blocks and sub-divisions. He also suggested to create a WhatsApp group of the medical workers including the stakeholders, concerned departments and the administration for better coordination and to do away with communication gap.

Deliberating on the objectives of the workshop, Dr. S. Imnameren, DIO, Longleng said that the purpose of the district level workshop is to train all the doctors, nurses, ANM/Supervisors and health workers to impart the same training at the block & village levels and health centers to mobilize and supervise the MR vaccination campaign as scheduled. Dr. Imnameren also stressed on MR facts and micro planning tools. Asserting that the goal of the government is to eliminate Measles & Rubella by 2020, he advised the health workers to have micro action planning and homework to achieve the targeted goal.

Report on human-elephant conflict in Wokha district

As per the report received from District Forest Officer (DFO), Wokha, Zuthunglo Patton IFS, Human-Elephant Conflict (HEC) in Wokha district is on the rise and increasing year by year. As per the nationwide Synchronized Elephant Population Estimation 2017 report by the Ministry of Environment,

Forests & Climate change, Gol, Nagaland has an elephant population of 446 and elephant density/km² of 0.45 which is the second highest density/km² after Karnataka.

Due to increasing reports of incidences of HEC, a joint assessment was carried out in April 2018 by the District Level Committee for assessment of the loss of human life/domestic animals/crops/properties by wild animals for compensation in the district.

The assessment showed that this year alone, 165 families belonging to eight villages of New Changsu, Ekhoyn, Old and New Riphym, Wokha village, New Wokha, Seleku and Koio were badly affected by the presence of elephants in these areas/ fields. The crops or property damaged were paddy, banana, pineapple, orange, sugarcane, vegetables, yongchak, betel nut, rubber, papaya, jackfruit, granary, farm huts, piggery, poultry, etc. amounting to more than Rs. 17 lakh which could only be

partially reimbursed by the wildlife wing of the Forest Department this year.

The most recent reports of HEC in the month of June and July 2018 is from the villages of Old Riphym, New Riphym, Old Changsu and Mungya, affecting 97 farmers and the GMS building at Mungya which have been verified by the department. The crops/property damaged included paddy fields, vegetables, banana, farm huts, rubber, etc.

With an ever-increasing human population leading to increasing fragmentation of habitat for the elephants, incidences of human injury or deaths, crop raids, poaching/hunting of elephants will only increase. Wokha district having a total geographical of only 1628 sq. km and supporting a staggering 150-180 elephants all over the district, it not only indicates a bleak future for the farmers and rubber cultivators but also for the survival of these heritage animals in Wokha unless these issues are seriously addressed.

BAS installed in DC office, Zunheboto

The launching programme of Biometric Attendance System-cum-department meeting was held at Deputy Commissioner's Conference Hall, Zunheboto on 13th July 2018.

SDO (C), Zunheboto, Temjennaro while delivering the inaugural remarks said that this system being a government mandated programme, every employee need to adhere to the guidelines. She also said that being an employee at the Administration Department, they should be the first to set an example for others to follow.

DC, Zunheboto, Shanavas C, IAS stressed on the importance of being a responsible government servant, maintaining basic government servant protocols and duties. Usage of machine was highlighted by SDO(C), Zunheboto, Namang Chang. Administrative Officers of Zunheboto and staff of Zunheboto District Administration attended the launching programme.

Sampling test of fishes conducted at Wokha

A random sampling test of formalin content in fishes in and around Wokha district was conducted on 13th July 2018 by representatives of Food Safety Nagaland led by Khrukutolu Veswuh, Food Analyst State Public Health Laboratory from Kohima comprising of five members team, Food Security Officer, Wokha, Pelerienuo Kehie; Deputy Chief Medical Officer, Wokha, Dr. Zuben Kikon; Media Officer (CMO) Office, Wokha and EAC HQ, Tumben P. Tsanglao.

Out of the six samples, one tested positive for presence of formalin which was collected from in and around Wokha district from various fish kiosks. Earlier, samples taken from the same area tested positive as per report from received from the State Public Health Laboratory. The contaminated fishes were seized for destruction.

The team also visited Doyang the same day to collect samples from the fish depots. At Doyang, six species of fishes were tested from the local fish

storage where freezers containing ice were also tested but found to be negative. Investigation for source of formalin contamination in the district is underway by the concerned authority.

All fish imported or local, which is treated with formalin is banned in Wokha district as per the standing prohibitory order issue by Food Safety Commissioner-cum-Commissioner & Secretary, Nagaland, I. Himato Zhimomi IFS. Further the concerned department informed that random spot testing will be carried out in the district and defaulters will be penalized and legal course of action will be taken as per the provision under Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006.
