Official Orders and Notifications

P&AR DEPARTMENT CLARIFIES ON ST/II/B.T CERTIFICATES

The department of P&AR in a clarification, informed that S.T/I.I/B.T certificates are to be signed only by officers in the rank of Additional Deputy Commissioner and above. This is in compliance of the Home Department's Memorandum NO.HOME/SCTA-6/2006 dt. 21.03.2011 and P&AR Department O.M dt 15.10.2008. Therefore, it is informed to all the candidates who had applied to the CESE-2016 advertised vide No.NPSC-1/2016 dated 20.06.2016 to submit the proper S.T/I.I/B.T certificates signed by the competent authority on or before 28th of November, 2016. The application of the candidates failing to do so shall be summarily rejected.

GON NOTIFIES ON CREATION OF DEDICATED SDRF

The Government of Nagaland has notified the creation of a dedicated State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) with 240 personnels drawn from the Civil Defence & Home Guards for providing timely and effective response to any Disaster which may affect the state. The 240 personnel's would be posted in groups of 30(thirty) each at eight strategic locations across the state.

The dedicated Nagaland State Disaster Response Force shall carry out community awareness and training programmes on Disaster Management during peace/normal times.

The SDRF shall be placed under the control of the Commandant General of Civil Defence & Home Guards at the State level and District Commandant of Home Guards & Civil Defence at the District level.

The Nagaland State Disaster Management Authority (NSDMA) shall in co-ordination with Commandant General of Home Guards & Civil Defence requisition and utilise the services of SDRF at the State level.

At the district level, the Chairman of District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA) shall requisition the services of SDRF as and when required with due intimation to the NSDMA. In an event of emergency the SDRF shall act as a first call of response in the search & rescue operations.

The Civil Defence & Home Guards shall co-ordinate with NSDMA in developing annual community awareness program and familiarization exercise (FAMEX) for SDRF and submit the same for approval of State Executive Committee (SEC).

At the district level the District Commandant, Civil Defence & Home Guards shall co-ordinate with the Chairman of DDMA to carry out community awareness program and familiarization exercise (FAMEX) approved by State Executive Committee (SEC) during normal times and Search & Rescue operation in the event of Emergency.

GOVERNMENT RE-CONSTITUTES COMPLAINT COMMITTEE FOR THE STATE LEVEL COMMITTEE

In supersession of this Department's notification of even number dated 27th February, 2014, the Government of Nagaland has re-constituted the Complaint Committee for the State Level Committee consisting of the following for the redress of complaints relating to sexual harassment of women employees of the State Government at their work place.

Terms and conditions of the Complaint Committee

1. The Committee shall receive complaint from any woman who is a victim of sexual harassment at her work place and cause an enquiry into the complaint and suggest measures to redress the complaint.

2. The Committee will take measures to create awareness of the rights of female employees in this regard by prominently notifying the guidelines in a suitable manner and other suitable awareness campaigns.

3. Complaint Committee will be deemed to be an inquiry authority for the purposes of Central/State Civil Services (Conduct) Rules and the report of the Complaint Committee shall be deemed to be an inquiry report under the Rules. Thereafter the disciplinary authority will act on the report in accordance with the rules.

4. The Complaint Committee shall submit an annual report to the Department of Personnel and Administrative Reforms with details of the complaints, if any made to it and the action thereof.

COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION IS THE NEED OF THE HOUR: T.R. ZELIANG

Community participation is the most affective form of wildlife protection and conservation, stated Chief Minister of Nagaland, T.R. Zeliang while speaking as the chief guest during the program on Human-Animal Conflict Mitigation Awareness Campaign and release of satellite tagged birds at Beisampeukam village on 4th November 2016. He emphasized that, we have intruded often into the abode of the animals. Not realizing the inter dependency of man and animal, we tend to think we are doing what we have to do and thereby forest and animals have diminished greatly. We are now in a stage of diminishing return.

He urged the gathering and special emphasized to the villagers of Beisampeukam to protect and preserve the Intangki National Forest, which is adjacent to their village, as has been agreed upon as per the MOU with the government.

The National Forest has the potential to be the hotspot of tourist in India and further added that, we should rededicate ourselves for the protection of wildlife. He also said that, the year 2017 will be declared as 'The Year of Plantation' in order to revive our ecosystem. He lauded the efforts of the Hungarian Scientist. It should serve as an example to us all, he added, and call upon the people of Nagaland to make

our state the true capital of Amur Falcon.

Minister for Forest, Dr. Nicky Kire who was the guest of honour in his speech complemented the word of Dr. R.S.C. Jayraj Director Rain Forest Research Institute Gol who stated that the word Human-Animal conflict should be replaced by Human Animal co-existence henceforth.

Earlier, a keynote address was given by Chairman and PCCF & HOFF, I. Panger Jamir who is also the chairman of the programme. Speeches were also delivered by S.P. Tripathi Chief Wildlife Warden, B.S. GOVERNOR P. B. ACHARYA GRACES NATIONAL SEMINAR AT NIELIT, MERIEMA, KOHIMA

The Governor of Nagaland, P. B. Acharya graced the inaugural function of National Seminar on 'Geology, Geochemistry, Tectonics, Energy and Mineral Resources of Northeast India and AGM of India Society of Applied Geochemists as the Chief Guest at the Conference hall of National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NIELIT), Meriema, Kohima on 9th November, 2016. The Seminar was organized by the Department of Geology, Nagaland University, Kohima Campus, Meriema, Kohima.

Speaking at the inaugural function, the Governor of Nagaland and Chief Rector, Nagaland University, P. B. Acharya said that Nagaland State has fine University however, students from Nagaland pursue their studies in the mainland. He appealed to the University and the faculties to teach the young people on what is required to the society in the University and to disseminate the knowledge into action and further hoped that the sessions would be a fruitful to come up with applicable knowledge to the society.

Nagaland Governor, P.B. Acharya urged the scholars and researchers not to limit their knowledge for academic purpose alone but it should be applicable and beneficial to the society. The Governor also released a book

on "Recent Trends in Earth Science Research with Special Reference to NE India" during the occasion.

Delivering the welcome address, Prof. B. V. Rao the Convener of the National Seminar said that the Department of Geology, Nagaland University has organized National Seminar and AGM of the Geological Society of India for the first time in November 2005 and the present one is the second National Seminar in the series since 1994.

Head of Geology Department, Nagaland University, Prof. G. T. Thong giving a brief profile of the Department said that the department was established under NEHU in September 1983 and was taken over by the Nagaland University in 1994. The Department was granted the DST-FIST Level-I Program in 2000 and again in 2013. The faculties have completed eight major Research Projects funded by the DST and ISRO and three minor. Presently five major Research Projects have been underway where three projects are on the verge of completion. Faculties of the Department helped formulate Nagaland's State Disaster Management Plan' and 'State Action Plan



and Taekwondo. Infrastructure and facilities like best coach need to take up at the earliest to facilitate those young upcoming talented youth in the state. Parliamentary Secretary hopes that by 2020 and 2024 Olympic the youth from the state will represent the country. The Parliamentary Secretary was accompanied by Kuolie Mere PRO Nagaland House New Delhi.

CONSULTATIVE MEETING ON NAGALAND MUNICIPAL ACT, 2001 AND AMENDMENT ACT

A consultative meeting on Nagaland Municipal Act, 2001 and Amendment Act was held on 16th November, 2016 at the Capital convention Hall, Kohima. The meeting was to discuss the issues which have been raised by the different Hohos and to bring about a solution to the issues. The Chief Minister, Chief Secretary and Members of the Legislative Assembly and the Tribal Hohos attended the meeting.

The Chief Minister in his speech thanked the different Hohos for their positive response to the meeting which was held in such short notice. He stated that the meeting was based on the suggestions given by the Angami Public Organisation (APO) and Ao Senden. The first proposal was to omit or delete the provision for reservation of seat for Schedule Caste in the Municipal Department. As per the Nagaland census report 2011, there is no recorded Schedule Caste in Nagaland and also there is no Presidential Order under the Constitution of India that specifies who are the SC of Nagaland. Therefore, in practice there will be no reservation for SC in the Municipal bodies. He further added as a preventive measure

and to clear the doubt, the government is open to the idea in removing the reservation of SC as suggested by the APO.

The Chief Minister also mentioned the two suggestions given by the Ao Senden on 33% reservation for women and taxation of land and buildings. On women reservation, he stated that a series of meetings were held with the Naga Mothers' Association and other women organizations but they have decided to wait for the verdict of the court. Therefore, on this issue the state cabinet has already decided to go by the existing provisions of Nagaland Municipal Act 2001 as amended in 2006.

The second suggestion on taxation of land and buildings, the Chief Minister said that the government has taken serious thought on the pressing issue and have brought a few options. He further added that the state government appears to have taken upon itself most of the powers and responsibilities on tax.

Municipalities bring elected bodies of the people may be given the power and responsibilities to decide what taxes or fees they want to impose to raise their own resources and at such rate as may be proposed by them subject to the approval of the rate by the government. Therefore, the government is thinking to take the following lines of action: Section 120 clause 3 may be amended and replaced by the following proposals. The taxes provided in the sub-section clause 1 and the taxes which may be levied under sub-section clause 2 shall be levied at such rate as may be proposed by the municipality and with the approval of the government to be conveyed to government notification and shall be collected in accordance with the provisions

of this Act and the rules and provisions made under Section 120 clause 4 and Section 120 clause 5 may be deleted. In Section 121 clause 7 and Section 121 clause 8 the word sanction may be substituted by the word approve. This is because of the tax proposal submitted by the tax community will only be approved and not sanctioned by the government. Similarly in Section 123 clause 2 the word determine may be replaced by the word approve. This is because of the rate of taxes on land and buildings as may be proposed by the municipality will only be approved by the government and not determined by government.

He also added that auction for sale of land may be open only to the Naga indigenous people of the state. He concluded the programme by saying in view of the 33% reservation for women, unless the petitioner (the women organization) agrees, there is no question of compromising. Hence, the cabinet decided to agree with the reservation of women. In regard to taxation, according to the Act the government will determine the rate of the taxes and the Municipal will collect, but they have reversed it, Municipal will propose and the government will agree. He also assured that the government will always protect the land holding system or the customary system. He further added that if the Municipal elections will keep getting held back neither the men or women will benefit from it and we will be losing ground in development.

The Naga Hoho, ENPO, Ao Senden, APO, Konyak Union, Chakhesang Union, Lotha Union and Rengma Union were present for the meeting and had given their views and suggestions about why the 33% reservation is not required in our society.

NATIONAL PRESS DAY OBSERVED IN NAGALAND

Commemorating the National Press Day a befitting programme was held on 16th November 2016 under the theme, "Professional ethics in Journalism." The programme organized by Dimapur Press Club in collaboration with the Department of Information and Public Relations, Government of Nagaland was held at Elim Hall, DABA, Duncan Basti Dimapur.

Publisher and Editor, The Morung Express Dr. Aküm Longchari who was the theme speaker observed Journalism not just a profession but a social service that embraces rights, duties and obligations as a pillar of democracy. "Truth is the touchstone of journalism and getting the facts right us is the cardinal principle of journalism. Journalists need to strive for accuracy, give all the relevant facts and ensure that they have been checked and cross-checked," he exhorted. During the fourteenth session of the Twelfth Assembly held on 22nd November 2016, the house revoked the resolution passed by it under Article 371 A (1)(a) of the Constitution of India on the 22nd September, 2012 exempting Nagaland from the application of Part IX A of the Constitution of India.

On the recommendation of the Governor of Nagaland, P.B. Acharya to consider the amendment pertaining to the name St. Joseph Catholic University to St. Joseph University in order to avoid opening university in the name of any religion, the house passed the amendments to St. Joseph University (Nagaland) Bill, 2016. The bill shall come into force on the date appointed by the State Government by notification in the official gazette.

The Leader of the House, T.R. Zeliang moved the consideration and passing of the Nagaland Municipal (Third Amendment) Bill,

2016.

With regard to 33% women reservation in Municipalities, Parliamentary Secretary for Housing Er. Levi Rengma, sought a clarification on whether the absence of women candidates will allow male candidates to fill the vacancy, to which the Leader of the House clarified that in the case of wards which are vacant and void of women candidates, the government will issue fresh notifications and as such, men cannot represent the reserved seats. "If the Town council does not want to hold elections, the government will not force them," the Leader of the House further clarified.

Parliamentary Secretary for Higher & Technical Education, Deo Nukhu, Minister for School Education & SCERT, Yitachu, Parliamentary Secretary for Jails, Science & Technology, Hukavi Zhimomi, MLA Kaito Aye, MLA Mmhone Lumo Kikon also voiced their opinions regarding the resolution passed by the House.

Er. Levi Rengma further sought clarification from the House on the non-issue of permit to other oil fields in Nagaland apart from Wokha and Peren districts to which the Leader of the House clarified that other than the two mentioned districts, the rest did not fulfill the formalities as per the rules and regulations of the Nagaland Petroleum & Natural Gas Act, 2012.

Earlier, Independent MLA, Thomas Ngullie raised objections in the revoking of the resolution with regard to 33% women reservation in Municipalities and opposed the move.

AHoD and HoD MEETING DELIBERATES ON HIV PREVALENCE IN THE STATE

The monthly AHoDs and HoDs meeting was held at the Civil Secretariat Conference Hall, Kohima on 28th November, 2016.

The House discussed on contribution from Chief Secretary Welfare Funds for AIDS control in Nagaland, State Consultant, Nagaland Legislators' Forum on AIDS(NLFA), Dr. Vinito Chishi in his powerpoint presentation highlighted the prevalence of HIV in the state and also the functions of NLFA, NACO, NSACS and other organizations associated with AIDS. He mentioned that till September 2016, out of 899158 adult blood screened 20601(2.29%) people were tested positive with HIV and for below 14 years of age, out

of 28468 blood tested 849 (2.98%) were positive and 91% of infection was transmitted through sexual route. He also said, with 43% of the total infection, the age group of 25-34 years has the highest number of people living with HIV and among the Districts, Dimapur has the highest number of HIV infection, he however added that this may be due to people coming from other districts for HIV test in Dimapur. Dr. Vinito mentioned that quarterly report will be given if contributions are made for AIDS control.

Commissioner, Sentiyanger, IAS said that Church may not be the right forum to combat AIDS as the Church has its own limitations. Secretary & Director ATI, Lithrongla also raised the issue of funding the right forum to combat AIDS. The house concluded the issue with an agreement to contribute however a committee was formed to study it further.

Reviewing the last meeting minute, Principal Secretary to CM & Finance Commissioner, Temjen Toy said the big departments such as School Education, Police, Housing, H&FW, R&B, Veterinary & Animal Husbandry, District Administration, Agriculture and some others have been failing to credit New Pension Scheme into the Employees' account on time. Departments were also directed to open the accounts of those employees who have no bank account.

Chief Secretary said the Induction Training for other services like engineering will soon be introduced in ATI, apart from NCS and allied services mid-career service training for other services will also be introduced. He also asked the departments to convey their training requirements to ATI.

Labour & Employment department

also highlighted the Employees' State Insurance Scheme, an autonomous cooperation which covers the insurance of non-governmental sectors with employees above 10 people. Contribution, Benefits, Facilities and Basic requirements of the Scheme were highlighted.

Discussing on an NIA case, the chief secretary said that any government servants found involved in extortion case will be strictly dealt with. He asked the departments to cooperate in case the NIA needed but also cautioned the departments to give information which are related to unlawful and anti-national activities only.





COLPOSCOPE, SCREENING OF CERVICAL CANCER INSTALLED AT IMDH MOKOKCHUNG

Imkongliba Memorial District Hospital (IMDH) Mokokchung is now equipped with Colposcope, a sophisticated machine to screen women for possible cervical cancer and to study the cervical cells under high magnification and identifies abnormal and precancerous changes in them. First of its kind in the hospital, the colposcope machine was formally inaugurated by Nagaland Governor, P.B Acharya on his 2-day visit of Mokokchung on 17th November 2016.

Medical Superintendent, IMDH, Dr Medem and Senior Gynaecologist, Dr Ademla said the Colposcope Machine, worth Rs. four lakh was purchased from IMDH Welfare fund to help reduce morbidity and mortality associated with the disease,

cervical cancer. When inquired about the colposcope machine, which looks like a Handy cam with broad stand, Dr. Ademla said that Colposcope is a machine that uses an intense source of light through a system of lenses that magnify the image (Max-52x). It is used in screening of women for cervical cancer and studies the cervical cells under high magnification and identifies abnormal and precancerous changes in them. She said cervical cancer is a leading cause of death in women in North East India especially in Mizoram, Nagaland and Tripura. 'If detected in early stage and if proper intervention is applied, the condition can be successfully treated,' Dr Ademla said.

This is not the first time, the IMDH Mokokchung is purchasing urgent need machine but has been engaged in acquiring machines from their own fund to provide better health care in the hospital.
