## VOTER VERIFIABLE PAPER AUDIT TRAIL (VVPAT)

(Temjenkaba, IA, DIPR)

**V**oter Verifiable Paper Audit Trail (VVPAT) is an independent system attached with the Electronic Voting Machine (EVM) that allows the voters to verify that their votes are cast as intended.

The VVPAT is attached to the Ballot Unit (BU) of the EVM and both the BU and the VVPAT are placed in the voting compartment. The VVPAT has a small transparent glass window on it. When a voter comes to vote and presses the blue button on the BU to vote for the candidate of his/her choice, the glass window on the VVPAT lights up and a printed paper slip containing the serial number, name of the candidate and election symbol of the candidate is visible to the voter behind the glass window. The voter witnesses all these details on the paper slip and is satisfied that his/her vote has been cast as intended.

The printed paper slip remains visible to the voter through the transparent glass window for seven seconds. After seven seconds, the printed paper slip gets automatically cut and falls into the sealed printed paper slip compartment/drop box of the VVPAT below, followed by a beep sound. Thereafter, the light goes off behind the glass window.

During counting, after the votes have been counted using the Control Unit of EVM and the result sheet is prepared and announced by the Returning Officer (RO), the candidate/election agent/counting agent may apply in writing to the RO to count the printed paper slips accumulated in the drop box of the VVPAT in respect of any polling station (s) giving the reasons for such requests. In such a case, the RO shall, pass a speaking order on whether the counting of paper slips shall be done or not. While deciding the matter, the RO shall give consideration to factors like the total number of votes polled in that polling station and the margin of votes between the winning candidate and the candidate making the application; whether the EVM met with any defect and was replaced during the poll at that polling station or whether there was any complaint about the VVPAT at that polling station during poll. In case the RO decides to allow counting of the printed paper slips of any polling station, the same shall be done and the printed paper slips count shall be considered in the result sheet.

The Election Commission of India has directed that henceforth, VVPAT shall be used with EVMs at all the polling stations in all the future elections to the Parliament and State Legislative Assemblies. The VVPAT is thus going to further enhance the transparency and verifiability in poll process.

1. Ensure working days in compliance to RTE Act, 2009.
  - i. Class 1 to 5 - 200
  - ii. Class 6 to 8 - 220
2. Split the whole syllabus into three equal sections (Elementary), one section for each Term Exam in the teachers' scheme of works (covering 1-2 lessons) in a week with all academic exercises and class test as per CCE for elementary section.
3. 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturdays of every month shall be utilized for class tests/co-curricular activities/life skills/social works etc.
4. All general holidays indicated in the State Government Calendar are to be observed as State/ National holidays compulsorily along with three local restricted holidays.
5. Every school is to enforce Code of Professional Ethics for teachers as per NCERT norms.
6. To cope up with the changing world, the schools are directed to develop physical, moral, social, spiritual well-being of the students throughout the academic year.
7. The performance of students in all the three term exams (Elementary) shall be taken together to determine the promotion of the students to the next higher class and the weakest students shall have to repeat the same class in the next academic session.

### NBSE REVISES EXISTING TEXTBOOKS OF CLASSES IX & XI

The Nagaland Board of School Education has revised the existing textbooks CI-IX & XI with the syllabi of all subjects remaining unchanged except for CI-IX Science, which is based on the NCERT syllabus.

Chairman, NBSE, Asano Sekhose in a notification on 19<sup>th</sup> December 2017 has stated that this exercise was taken up to accommodate and address the needs of the students through updated information, thereby to promote quality learning.

The new textbooks will be used effective from the academic session 2018. NCERT books for CI-IX Mathematics & Science and CI-XI Physics, Chemistry, Biology & Mathematics shall be used in order to cater to the needs of the students while pursuing science studies. The NCERT books will also be followed in CI-X & XII in a phase manner.

At Secondary Level, Laboratory Manual for Mathematics, Science and an Atlas (Map work book) have been developed for use by the students from the 2018 academic session. By introducing Laboratory Manual, it is hoped that it will support and help the teaching- learning of science and mathematics at the school level. Therefore, all students must possess the manuals and the Atlas.

All registered institutions of the Nagaland Board of School Education have been informed to strictly follow the syllabi and the textbooks prescribed by the Board.

The Heads of registered schools have also been reminded that qualified teachers must be appointed to teach the concerned subjects.

### **STATE GOVERNMENT NOTIFIES**

In exercise of the power conferred under Section 6 of the Payment of Wages (Amendment) Ordinance, 2016, the Government of Nagaland has declared the following establishments as industrial or other establishment, wherein, the employer shall pay to every person employed, their due wages only by cheque or by crediting the wages in his/her bank account.

# STATE ROUND UP

## HIGHLIGHTS OF HORNBILL FESTIVAL 2017

### PRESIDENT OF INDIA ADDRESSES HORNBILL FESTIVAL AT KISAMA:

The celebration of the 18<sup>th</sup> edition of the Hornbill festival, also known as the 'Festival of festivals' began at Naga Heritage Village, Kisama on 1<sup>st</sup> December 2017 with the President of India, Ram Nath Kovind as the Chief Guest. The Governor of Nagaland, P. B. Acharya and the Chief Minister of Nagaland, T. R. Zeliang were the Chief Host and Host respectively. The Hornbill festival is organized by the Department of Tourism in collaboration with other departments.

Addressing the people of Nagaland, the Chief Guest, Ram Nath Kovind said that he was honored to be a part of the Hornbill festival which also coincides with the Statehood Day. He said that the Hornbill festival and the Hornbill International Rock Contest represents the diversity of the Naga society and is also the perfect platform to showcase the Naga culture and tradition. He said that Naga people has been endowed with talents and that Nagas are progressing in all fronts. While addressing the public, he congratulated all the Naga people particularly the Naga soldiers who had sacrificed their valuable lives for the nation.

On tourism sector, Ram Nath Kovind mentioned that the State has the potential to become the hub of tourist attraction since it is blessed with abundant natural resources. However, he added that the State needs development in the field of infrastructure and connectivity. He categorically mentioned that 'without the development of Nagaland, development of India would be incomplete.'

The Governor of Nagaland and the

Chief Host of the Hornbill festival, P. B. Acharya said that this festival is a platform to showcase our folksongs, traditional dances and indigenous games and way of life. He mentioned that Nagas have great potential in agriculture, horticulture, floriculture and tourism. He described Nagas as hardworking people and said that Naga youths are among the best in performing arts, hospitality and service sectors. He appealed to all the Naga brothers and sisters that all the guests coming from outside the State go back with fond memories of the festival.

The Chief Minister of Nagaland and the Host of the Hornbill festival, T. R. Zeliang said that Hornbill festival which was initiated in 2000 by the Government of Nagaland to showcase our ethnic cultural identity has gained much popularity over the years. He mentioned that our customs, dialects, culture and traditions are the hallmark of our identity. He also stressed on the importance of roads and air connectivity for which he urged the Government of India to be more sympathetic so that it would not be a hindrance for the tourists from mainland and different parts of the world.

Earlier, Chief Secretary of Nagaland, Pankaj Kumar, IAS delivered the welcome speech. The Village Chief/Head GB, Tuensang village, L. Sangkumwongto Chang Naga offered traditional blessings for the festival. The opening song titled 'Hallelujah' was presented by Handel's Messiah while, G. Rio School, Kohima and Police Band presented the National Anthem. 'Enculturation' presented by Sky Entertainment marked the opening ceremony. The Governor of Nagaland and the Chief Host, P. B. Acharya also released the book titled 'The Konyaks: Last of the Tattooed Headhunters,' during the inaugural function.

State Chaplain, Kuzierang Thou pronounced the invocation prayer.

### **HORTISCAPE 2017:**

Chief Minister, Nagaland, T. R. Zeliang inaugurated the floral gallery and farmer's mela at Hortiscape at Naga Heritage Village (NHV), Kisama on December 1, 2017. Farmers from 11 districts participated in the exhibition-cum-sale of flowers, fruits, vegetables and spices. The stalls consisted of different associations, self help groups, and flowers growers from within and outside the State, exhibiting locally grown indigenous and horticulture products which were also on sale.

In the flower exhibition section, various flowers were on display such as annuals, biennials, perennials, orchids (hybrids & indigenous), cactus, succulents, bonsais, and flower arrangement (dry and fresh) etc. In the fruit and vegetable section, varieties of indigenous and organic vegetables and fruits such as oranges, pumpkins, chilies, yam, pineapples, banana, lime and lemon, papaya etc. were on display.

Secretary, Horticulture, Alan Gonmei, IAS graced the function as the Chief Guest at the prize distribution for state level flowers, ornamental plants, fruits, vegetables and spices which was held on 4<sup>th</sup> December 2017.

The President of India, Ram Nath Kovind also visited the Hortiscape at Kisama on the first day of the Hornbill Festival.

### **CRAFTS BAZAAR 2017:**

Crafts Bazaar 2017, organized by the Directorate of Industries and Commerce and NHHDC Ltd. was inaugurated at the Bamboo Pavilion, NHV, Kisama by Parliamentary Secretary, Amenba Yaden on 1<sup>st</sup> December 2017. It was funded by DC (Handicrafts), Ministry of Textiles, Government of India.

The Craft Bazaar consisted of 103 stalls opened by local entrepreneurs and five stalls from other neighbouring States. This year, the pavilion had a number of young

entrepreneurs taking part, such as Chum Chum's Bakers (Kohima), Smokey Joes Restaurant and Grill (Dimapur), My Bamboo Story (Kohima) by the Youth Net, etc.

Under the banner of the Bamboo Story, a team from St. Joseph College, Jakhama participated in the Youth Net's intercollegiate entrepreneurship competition and set up a stall selling indigenous goods and crafts.

### **HIPFEST 2017:**

Hornbill International Photo Fest (HIPFEST) 2017, a photography and art festival/exhibition was inaugurated by Parliamentary Secretary, Information & Public Relations and SIRD, Imtikumzuk on 1<sup>st</sup> December 2017 at NHV, Kisama. HIPFEST 2017 was jointly organised by the Department of Information & Public Relations and Eastern Art Council, supported by the Department of Tourism.

HIPFEST featured various aspects of photography such as acrylic/oil painting, sketching, sculpture and photos. This year's HIPFEST featured a special art exhibition (watercolour and pencil on paper) by Heather Layton, Senior Lecturer of Art in the Department of Art & Art History at the University of Rochester, with vast experience as an interdisciplinary artist.

In the general category of HIPFEST 2017, the first prize was bagged by Parvej Akhtar from Kolkata who was also the winner of HIPFEST 2014. Priyojit Akoijam from Manipur and Metsungnakba Longchar from Nagaland won the second and third prizes respectively. The consolation prizes went to Maong Longkumer from Mokokchung and Dr. Longri Kichu from Kohima.

In the children's category (13 years and below), Kehunülü Theyo, a student of CI-6 from G. Rio School, Kohima bagged the first prize, and the second and third prizes were bagged by Abi Mor, a CI-9 student from Kohima and Sinlo Seb from G. Rio School, Kohima respectively. Rangala Songduimei, a CI-4

student from St. Anthony School, Manipur and Thungja, a CI-5 student from Dimapur won the consolation prizes.

Altogether 45 participants took part in the Photography Contest under the theme 'Colours of Nagaland,' of which nine participants are in the children's category (13 years and below). The judges for the competition were Heather Layton and acclaimed Naga photographers, Rokovor Vihienuo and Merimvu Doulo.

Another feature of the HIPFEST was the Glocal Film Fest held at 'The Heritage' on 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> December, 2017, featuring short films from North America and Nagaland.

Highlights of the carnival included games, performances and experiences in different fields like Tram polling, Zip liner, Sky walk and many more. The kids could also showcase their talents through Mini Olympics, The Voice Kids and Beauty Pageant, where they were awarded with certificates and prizes.

### **ARTISTS' CORNER 2017:**

Artists' Corner 2017 at NHV, Kisama displayed various art works, paintings and sculptures at the Hornbill festival which began on 1<sup>st</sup> December 2017. The art exhibition was organized by Art & Culture department in coordination with the Nagaland Art society.

20 artists participated with about 100 art works for the exhibition which were also for sale. Promotion of Visual art, Portrait, Cartoon, Sketch, Drawing etc. and spot painting competition for students were the main highlights during the 10 day long festival at Kisama.

A painting competition on Clean Election Nagaland campaign was organized by the Department of Art & Culture on 8<sup>th</sup> December 2017. Every year, the department conducts the exhibition where it encourages the local artists and at the same time, promote the artefacts of the State to take it to higher level.

### **HORSE RIDING AND PONY CART TRANSPORTATION 2017:**

The second edition of the Horse Riding and Pony Cart Transportation was flagged off by S. Chuba Longkumer, Parliamentary Secretary, Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services at NHV, Kisama on 1<sup>st</sup> December 2017.

Craftscape, a portfolio on Naga craft traditions was inaugurated by Secretary for Tourism, Angau I Thou on 1<sup>st</sup> December 2017 at NHV, Kisama. It was organized by Tribal Weave in collaboration with the Department of Tourism and Art & Culture.

Inaugurating the Craftscape, the Chief Guest encouraged the participants to continue to improvise the culture and traditions of the Nagas.

The exhibition presented landmark distributions of tribal craft specialties by skilled artisans who embark dignified livelihoods in keeping alive the intangible heritage. The Naga artisans used rudimentary tools and bare hands, dexterously hand craft cane and bamboo basketry, engaged in woodcraft, metal work, material fiber textiles, beadwork and pottery, giving shape from the past to the present.

The craft items displayed at the stalls were Anghya Nyekok (The Queen's Bag) Thevora (Nettle Shawl), Pottery of Runguzu Nasa village, metal craft (a Konyak Naga Gunsmith), Rakdi (Head Gear), Henachi Tei (Banana Necklace), traditional earrings, Nyek (beaded necklace), cotton processing in the

Naga textile grammar, Khiamniungan traditional headgear etc.

### **HORNBILL INTERNATIONAL MUSIC FESTIVAL 2017:**

Parliamentary Secretary for Youth Resources & Sports and Music Task Force Advisor, Khekaho Assumi declared the Hornbill International Music Festival open on 1<sup>st</sup> December 2017, at the Dimapur District Sports Complex.

The music festival started off with high spirit where music lovers from all parts of the town and the country gathered at the venue, despite the chilly winter. The appearance of Padma Shree Kailash Kher, one of the most popular Bollywood singers sent the crowds into frenzy and loud cheers.

This social media cell would primarily work with three tools: Through Whatsapp at phone number 8258829982, through Facebook - DGP Nagaland (D <space> G <space> P<space>Nagaland) and through Twitter - @DGP Nagaland (DGP<underscore> Nagaland)

The concept of having this platform of connection is to give a proactive and dynamic platform of responding to the concerns of the public. Further, it is felt that digital means of communication has the advantage of transparency and accountability besides speed which would also augment the essence of e-governance that the government has been actively promoting.

One can forward their complaints, grievances and suggestions under any of the following heads – (i) Election offences: Proxy voting, vote buying, booth capture (ii) Anti-social activities impacting law and order: Extortion, demands, arms related issues, human trafficking, drug trafficking or any

other form of organized crime (iii) Public peace and tranquility: Unlawful assembly and rioting, social disharmony (Inter-tribal, inter-village, inter-community), bandhs and protests, matters where police intervention may be required (iv) Economic offences: Syndicate system, fake currency, chitfund cases, MCM schemes, cyber offences or frauds, recruitment related scams etc (v) General offences: Offences against human body, property offences (vi) Miscellaneous: Contempt of lawful authority, offences affecting public health and safety.



Three-day media workshop on climate change reporting was conducted from 11<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> December at Hotel Japfu, Kohima. It was jointly organized by the Indian Himalayas Climate Adaptation Programme (IHCAP) of the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC) and Department of science and Technology (DST), GOI in collaboration with Department of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, GoN, State Climate Change Cell, NASTEC and Centre for Media Studies (CMS). The programme was graced by the Secretary to the Government of Nagaland for Science & Technology, Dellirose M. Sakhrie IAS as the Chief Guest.

Addressing the workshop, the Chief Guest said that climate change projection for Nagaland indicates that between 2021 and 2050, it will experience an increase in annual average temperature between 1.6° C and 1.8° C. She said an intensive scientific study by India's North East Climate Change Adaptation Programme in 2012 confirmed that the region is suffering from the impact of climate change and its impact on people, fields and livestock is devastating and set to get worse. Due to its unique location and topography, the study found that the region has distinct precipitation and drainage patterns. She also said the Government of Nagaland has taken a very systematic and proactive approach towards the formulation of the state action plan to address climate change. Informing that the Nagaland State Climate Change was

established in April 2017 to specially undertake the project of establishing and strengthening the State Climate Change Cell of Nagaland with the objectives of the National Mission for Sustaining the Himalayan Ecosystem under NAPCC.

Communication Officer, IHCAP, Shimpy Khurana who gave the introduction and objective of IHCAP said that mountain ecosystem around the world are particularly vulnerable and affected by climate change. This critical situation is also affecting the Himalayas, which constitute a vital ecosystem for the Indian subcontinent, with a large population depending on them.

Chief Conservator of Forest, State Nodal Officer for Climate Change, Supongnukshi, IFS apprised on how climate has been changing in the State, which has affected the production of foodgrains. He encouraged the two important institutions- the Media and the Church to educate the people and impart awareness campaigns on how to make strategies.

Welcome address and introduction of the workshop was addressed by the Head Advocacy, Centre for Media Studies. The programme was followed by technical session presented by Managing Editor, India Science Wire on Media and Climate Change, 'Impact of Climate Change on Agriculture in Nagaland' by DEO, Longleng, Dr. Dipak Chetri, DPO, Land Resources, Nagaland and others resources persons shared on the importance of climate change.

The Nagaland Essential Services (Maintenance) Act, 1978 (First Amendment) Bill, 2017 moved by Parliamentary Secretary for Transport & Civil Aviation, P. Paiwang Konyak was also introduced. There were debates on various topics such as the Nagaland Lokayukta Bill, 2015, Nagaland Municipal Act, 2001 etc.

The August House in its winter session, also resolved the following:

2. To urge the Election Commission of India not to announce the General Elections to the 13<sup>th</sup> Nagaland Legislative Assembly until the Government of India arrives at an honorable and acceptable solution to the Naga political issue in order to enable all Nagas to enjoy their due democratic and other rights and

function as a more empowered electorate during the elections that may be held after the solution.

3. To call on Civil Societies, Tribal Hohos, Church and other organizations concerned, to cooperate with the vision of the State Government in this regard.

4. To call on all political parties and Independent candidates to implement the demand for "solution before election" in the field, whenever necessary, so that utmost unity is displayed before the Government of India and the Election Commission of India.


Other highlights of the programme included an inter-section choral competition, which was followed by entertainment session, karaoke session, bonfire and Christmas feast.

### **PANKAJ KUMAR HOLDS STATE LEVEL MEETING ON GST**

The Chief Secretary of Nagaland & Chairman of GST, Pankaj Kumar, IAS held a review meeting of the State level Monitoring Cell for implementation of GST and PIMS on 19<sup>th</sup> December 2017 at Chief Secretary's Conference Hall, Kohima.

Additional Commissioner of Taxes, Mhathung Murry who gave a powerpoint presentation in the meeting mentioned the migration status of GST as on December 17, 2017 where the total PIDs issued & PID activated till date are 5605 & 3940 respectively, whereas the total PID migrated is 3042. He said under the new registration within the same period, the migrated tax payers and new registration are 2992 & 3379 respectively. The total number of tax payers under CE & ST above 1.5 crores is 31 whereas below 1.5 crores is 350 and the total number of tax payers under VAT above 1.5 crores is 188 whereas below 1.5 crores is 2662 respectively. The division of tax payers between Centre and State above 1.5 crores is 110 & 109 and below 1.5 crores is 302 & 2710 respectively. He added that the department is one among the first five states to pilot the implementation of 'E-waybill.' He said refresher course on GST was held on 18<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup> December, 2017. He also mentioned some of the future plans to augment revenue by way of educating all the stakeholders of the benefits of timely GST compliance besides intensified TDS registration drive.

As of now, only 23 departments have registered with GST, as such, he asked all the remaining departments to get registered at the earliest. During the meeting, different departments such as PHED, Forest, Health, Works & Housing, Agriculture and Police presented their respective PIMS reports.

### **FOREST DEPARTMENT APPEALS FOR PROTECTION AND CONSERVATION OF WILDLIFE IN THE STATE**

Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Wildlife) & Chief Wildlife Warden, Nagaland, , Satya Prakash Tripathi, IFS in an appeal letter stated that the survival of human beings and animals, both directly and indirectly, depends on forests, as their basic needs in the form of food, water, and shelter are met from forests. In addition to these tangible benefits, forests

play key role in carbon sequestration, amelioration of environment and climate change.

With passage of time and increasing population, biotic pressure on forests has significantly increased. In the State of Nagaland, lion's shares (88.3%) of forests are under the control of individuals and communities and remaining 11.7% of the forests are under the control of the Government. The Government has very limited regulatory role in management of private forests. Since time immemorial, administration and people of the State had/have played an important role in protection and maintenance of forests in the form of Community Conservation Areas. Communities had/have bigger role to play as compared to the Government for protection of forests and wildlife in the State.

The existence of wildlife is a good indicator of good forests and subsequently availability of timber, firewood, medicinal plants for human beings. The State of Nagaland has been traditionally a hunting state since time immemorial. Now, people are coming forward for protection of wildlife and they are rescuing wild animals and donating wild animals and birds which are kept in Nagaland Zoological Park, Rangapahar and Tragopan Breeding Centre, Kohima.

With the efforts of the administration, people and different agencies of the Government, NGOs etc, Amur Falcons (Migratory Birds) were well protected in the State during their migration in 2013 and onwards. This brought laurels, both nationally and internationally, to the State and the world community recognized Nagaland as the capital of falcons. With getting protection in the State, both the number of Amur falcons coming/migrating to/from Nagaland as well as the number of their roosting sites in the State has significantly increased in subsequent years.

On behalf of the Forest Department,

the Department has appealed to the public, Government officials, Village Councils, army and para military personnel, students, NGOs and other stakeholders for protection of wildlife. It also appealed Village Councils to make resolution for banning hunting of wild animals throughout years, instead of seasonal banning of hunting. Taking the importance of forests and wildlife in our life, the Government of Nagaland adapted the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972.

In case of observing any danger for human beings with the sighting of wild animals in human habitations, the Wildlife Warden, Dimapur can be contacted for tranquilizing the animal. In case of damage of crops/ killing of domestic animals by wild animals, the nearest forest/ administrative office may consulted. The Wildlife Wing, Nagaland Forest Department will try its best to make compensation against the damage on the recommendations of the assessment committee under the Chairmanship of the concerned Deputy Commissioner.

He also said it is high operating life with low maintenance, operating cost and this advance technology can remove impurities like bacteria and suspended organic matters upto 99.99 percent.

Earlier, the Parliamentary Secretary inaugurated Arkong Ward Community Hall which was constructed at an estimated cost of Rs. 27 lakhs. During the inaugural function, Arkong Ward Chairman, R.
