







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# OFFICIAL ORDERS and NOTIFICATIONS

## **GOVERNMENT APPOINTS DAN CHAIRMAN**

Urban Development Department has notified that in accordance with Section 8A of the Nagaland Town & Country Planning Act, 1966 and in pursuance to Cabinet Secretariat (Cabinet Cell) Notification No.CAB-1/2008 dated 27-03-2018, the Government of Nagaland has appointed A. Nyamnye Konyak as Chairman of Development Authority Nagaland (DAN) with immediate effect.

## **DoSE INFORMS INSTITUTIONS**

All the schools under the Department of School Education have been informed that Ministry of Human Resources Development, Department of School Education and Literary 2005 has already recommended Physical Education, Sports and Health as compulsory subjects from Class 1 to 10.

Therefore, all have been directed to allocate adequate period to the concerned teachers. The Department has a handbook for this purpose, which has been distributed to all the Physical Education teachers.

## **PRE-MATRIC SCHOLARSHIP FOR SCHEDULE TRIBE STUDENTS STUDYING IN CLASS IX AND X**

The Director (HoD), School Education, Wonthungo Tsopoe has informed all concerned students belonging to Schedule Tribe studying in Class IX and X (both private and government schools), pursuing studies in the state and the annual income of whose parents/guardians from all sources does not exceed Rs.2 lakh, to apply (both Fresh & Renewal) for Pre-Matric Scholarship for Schedule Tribe students studying in class IX and X.

### ***The guidelines are as follows:***

1. Student should belong to Schedule Tribe.
2. He/She should not be getting any other centrally funded Pre-Matric Scholarship.
3. He/She should be a regular student studying at government/private schools recognized by Government.
4. The tenure of scholarship is subject to good conduct and satisfactory progress in studies including promotion from class to class every year.

### ***Application procedure & activity schedule:***

1. One copy of passport sized photograph with signature of the student.
2. A photocopy of Schedule Tribe certificate duly signed by an authorized officer not below the rank of SDO(C).
3. Certificate of self declaration of family income under Pre-Matric Scholarship for Schedule Tribe students studying in Class IX and X should be enclosed.
4. Photocopy of first page student's bank passbook.
5. In case of parents' account, students should enclose their Birth Certificate along with the photocopy of their parents' bank passbook.
6. Students must keep their given bank account active for smooth transaction.
7. Invalid information related to bank account & IFSC code shall be summarily rejected.
8. The last date of submission of application form to the District Education Officer from the head of the institution is 31<sup>st</sup> May 2018.
9. The last date of submission of application forms both hard and soft data along with the application to the Directorate from the District Education Officer is 30<sup>th</sup> June 2018.
10. Submission of any proposal after the time schedule shall be summarily rejected
11. Application form should not be sold at any level and no additional fee under any circumstances or for any reason shall be charged from the beneficiaries.

## SWACHHTA PAKHWADA (FORTNIGHT) 2018 LAUNCHED

‘Cleanliness is important for a healthy living,’ said Minister for Health & Family Welfare, S. Pangnyu Phom while launching the Swachhta Pakhwada (Fortnight)-2018 at NHAK MD Conference Hall on 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2018.

Pangnyu Phom maintained that cleanliness is important for environmental development besides health and spiritual development. Cleanliness should start from the kitchen, the family and the individual, he stated, urging all to maintain personal hygiene in order to defend and keep oneself away from viruses and infections. The Minister also encouraged doctors and nurses to start cleanliness drives at hospitals, dispensaries and health centres, maintaining that the

same will set a good example for the public to live a healthier and cleaner life. He concluded his speech by reading out the 12 Swachhta Pledge.

National Health Mission, Nagaland celebrated Swachhta Pakhwada (Cleanliness Fortnight) for 15 days (1<sup>st</sup>-15<sup>th</sup> April 2018) with an aim to promote cleanliness fortnight, said Nodal Officer, Swachh Bharat & Additional Director, H&FW, Dr. Tokuhu Chishi. ‘Swachhta Se Siddhi’ would be the tagline of Swachhta Pakhwada, 2018 under National Health Mission Nagaland, he noted. Through Swachhta Pakhwada, NRHM will consider setting up permanent mechanism through various programmes and schemes, he added.

## CM ADDRESSES AHOds/HODs MEETING

AHOds and HoDs meeting was held on 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2018 at Secretariat Conference Hall, Kohima under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary, Temjen Toy, IAS.

Addressing the AHOds & HoDs, Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio called on re-inculcating work culture and maintaining punctuality, working with accountability and transparency to fulfill the commitment and promises of the Government.

On the 91<sup>st</sup> Amendment of downsizing and restricting the appointments of Parliamentary Secretaries and the question of office of profit, Rio said Advisors were appointed in various departments after thorough consultation with legal luminaries. Their talents, expertise and experience, he added,

will contribute towards the development of the departments.

Non-settlement of some symbolic issues has been prolonging the Naga Political Issue even after dialogues and peace process for over 23 years, Rio said. Sooner or later, settlement will come, he said, calling on the unity of the Nagas for the same to

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happen. He further apprised that the Centre for Peace and Non Violence will be created for the same purpose. The centre will be headed by non-governmental intellectual, experienced, unbiased, someone who will come above individualism and tribalism.

Every department should set a target and follow the same as a challenge, Rio called, touching the issue of good governance. He urged all government servants to link their service with their Aadhaar card to do away with ghost employees or double or triple employees. On removing the VIP culture, he expressed happiness that the elected representative and government officials including the churches and civil societies have been cooperating with the Government.

Road is the face of the state, Rio stated, commenting on road repairs and potholes. He said that Rs. 50 crore has been sanctioned for immediate repair of roads in Kohima and Dimapur which will be done by the concerned department.

Rio also stated that very soon, the common minimum program of the PDA government will be released. Rio also highlighted on many other issues including the Investment and Developmental Board, public grievances cell, economy, women issues

etc. He mentioned that more importance should be given to sports to engage more of our youth in sports activity. Also to recognize and respect legendary T. Ao, foundation stone will be laid in Dimapur.

Rio said that UPSC qualified written candidates will be given professional coaching. Also excursion tour to Delhi for selected students will be organized every year. He also said that for students studying outside will be given Rs. 5 lakh in the event of unfortunate death.

Rio emphasized that with the help of Civil Aviation Policy and Regional Connectivity of Northeast, Kohima will soon build a short runway for connectivity. He also said that Australian Private Company Cooperate Social Responsibility is going to provide aircraft and build a short runway of 500m free of cost. He mentioned that in the near future, short runway connectivity will be provided in all the districts.

Rio also stated that JNRUM will be transformed to transport and will be used as town bus in Dimapur particularly from Chumukedima to Dimapur. He also stated that the departments taking up the projects in ENPO area should be highlighted so that the departmental activities will be known.

## HORTICULTURE FELICITATES NEW ADVISOR

A felicitation-cum-introductory programme was held at the Conference Hall, Directorate of Horticulture on 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2018 with Advisor, Horticulture, Mhathung Yanthan as the Chief Guest. The programme was chaired by Secretary, Horticulture, Alan Gonmei, IAS.

Mhathung Yanthan in his speech informed that Nagaland has a lot of potential to develop in the field of horticulture and called upon all the officers to sincerely work for the farmers. He mentioned that the need of the hour is change in approach, thinking, planning, and added that it is important to keep pace with technology. He mentioned that in many villages,

people have already given up farming, so the role of the department is to identify and research what went wrong. He questioned the aspect of the market chain or lack of technical knowledge and added that all funds should reach to those working in the grassroot level and emphasis on the importance of skill development and training should be given.

Welcome speech was delivered by Joint Director, Horticulture, Qhutovi Wotsa. Highlights of the departmental activities were presented by the Director & Mission Director (MIDH), Dr. R. Elithung Lotha. Vote of thanks was proposed by Deputy Director, Horticulture, Jerry Patton.

## KOHIMA ENLISTED FOR LIVEABILITY ASSESSMENT

Kohima has been enlisted on the assessment of Liveability Index and rate cities as one amongst 117 cities across India.

A state orientation workshop was held on the 4<sup>th</sup> April 2018 on assessment of liveability indices in Chief Secretary's Conference Hall, Kohima which was attended by the 21 line departments and stakeholders concerned under the chairmanship of Chief Secretary, Temjen Toy, IAS.

The Chief Secretary in his keynote address in inaugural session said, 'Liveability Standards Index' is a mission and a project which basically is to improve the liveability of a particular city in the event of the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA), Government of India. Stating that GOI decided to quantify 117 cities over the country undertaking this exercise into Liveability Index, Toy urged the Heads of the Departments for coordination towards the fulfillment of the mission. He also said that the

state is going to have planning and called upon the attention of all line departments and stakeholders subsequently.

Secretary, Urban Development, Motsuthung Lotha who delivered the welcome address, informed that the state is a little behind the schedule particularly due to the state assembly election. However, he requested all the stakeholders and departments to give due emphasis on the activities of the mission.

Nodal Officer for Northeast, Dr. Natashori K gave a powerpoint presentation on the overview of the Liveability Index, data entry portal progress monitoring dash board, key timeline and milestones and role of the coordinators. She further emphasised on the composition of the cities, understanding the stakeholders' responsibilities, formulation of comprehensive city plan/master plan thereby serving as a concrete plan in achieving erstwhile Sustainable Development Goals.

The NSF Speaker as per the roll call declared the quorum formed and proceeded with the 3<sup>rd</sup> Federal Assembly. Wabangkumzuk Longkumer pronounced the invocation, welcome speech was delivered by S. Pur Longkumer, Tatar, Mokokchung village while, a special song was presented by Yapangtola.

### IMCT holds Co-Ordination Meeting with WDDMA

Inter Ministerial Central Team (IMCT) from Delhi led by Joint Secretary (Judicial) Ministry of Home Affairs, V.B. Dubey along with three other officers held a co-ordination meeting with Wokha District Disaster Management Authority (WDDMA) at DC's Conference Hall, Wokha on 5<sup>th</sup> April 2018. The IMCT visited the district for assessment of damage caused due to floods/landslides during the year 2017.

During the meeting, DC and Chairman WDDMA, Dr. Manazir Jeelani Samoon, IAS highlighted disaster scenario, vulnerability and hazard analysis of Wokha district. The DC also highlighted that the district is not only compounded to natural calamities

but is also facing human and animal conflict which needs to be given special attention as the rural people depend on agricultural and its allied production as their mainstay. Disaster Management Officer, Wokha, Mercy also presented damage assessment and utilization of funds report.

Briefing about Human Elephant Conflict in the District, DFO Wokha, Zuthunglo Patton said Wokha district holds more than 2/3 of Nagaland's elephant population which is the second highest density per Sq. Km after Karnataka. Patton also highlighted some mitigation measures and challenges which lies ahead with the WDDMA, and suggested role-following points such as convergence, relief/compensation for crop damage, property damage, injury or loss of life, awareness (village to village, door to door) in high conflict areas and various low cost techniques for early warning as well as during crop raiding/elephant presence in village.

Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio graced the State Games 2018 closing ceremony Khelo India for Persons with Disabilities (PwDs), Nagaland as the Chief Guest on 6<sup>th</sup> April 2018 at Old Showba Baptist Church, Dimapur.

He appreciated the commendable exemplary commitment and patience undertaken by the coaches and various organisations spending hours and hours in nurturing the potentials and talents of PwDs. Dealing with them needs special care and extra attention with love not only from parents and coaches but the society as a whole, Rio maintained. On the occasion, Rio informed that Nagaland will be announcing Special Fund for sports and assured

that the Government would include Special Olympic Nagaland (SON) under the ambient of Olympic Association Nagaland. Rio suggested to the Advisor Youth Resources and Sports, Er. Zale Neikha, who was also present to undertake further study in promoting sports for both abled and disabled persons. The Chief Guest also gave away the medals and certificates to the winning athletes.

SON Area Director, Arenla Tzudir Ezung appealed to the Government of the day for SON recognition by Nagaland Olympic Association and Sports department, cash award to all national and international medalists which includes 131 medals thus far, and for earmarking yearly budget for SON mission for five years starting from financial year 2018-19.

## ***Intensive Cultivation the Only Future: Mhathung Yanthan***

Advisor, Horticulture, Mhathung Yanthan emphasised on the importance of intensive cultivation with minimum space and maximum productivity by using hi-tech farming. He said this during his maiden visit to the State Horticulture Nursery (SHN) Dimapur on 6<sup>th</sup> April 2018, after taking over as Advisor of the department.

The 4<sup>th</sup> Regional Workshop on Technical Education for North Eastern States which began from 7<sup>th</sup> April 2018 culminated at Hotel Vivor, Kohima on 9<sup>th</sup> April 2018.

‘Ministers of Higher & Technical Education of various states and faculty students should be invited for workshop in future,’ said Minister for Higher & Technical Education, Temjen Imna Along while delivering his valedictory address, adding that the respective State Ministers and students should understand the effort of the faculty, directors and principals or else success will be slow. He advised to look for possibilities where Class-VIII or X dropped out students should be absorbed in the technical education, stating that the energy of the younger generation could be harnessed. The Minister asserted that technical education being a practical department, should not have criteria but should give the best opportunity to the students from poor economic background. He also urged polytechnic teachers to

go extra mile and go beyond their duties and build the students, considering as personal endeavour, else he said the policies and programmes meant for the students would not be achieved.

Director, NITTTR, Kolkata, Prof. Phalguni Gupta gave the following recommendation during the valedictory program: Preparation for accreditation by NBA, feasibility study for establishment of new polytechnics and for introducing new programme in existing polytechnics, provision for skill based short term training for faculty members and technical staff of polytechnic institutes, the role of AICTE in enhancing polytechnic education system in North Eastern states, internship of polytechnic students in NITS, long term contractual faculty recruitment through MHRD for north eastern states, course file development for diploma programme, internet connectivity through satellite communication for north eastern states and industry exposure to passed out polytechnic students through BOPT/BOAT.

## **Toshi Wungtung Visits SCERT**

He also pointed that the institution of VDB is a 1238 strong organization looking into the mandate of village development and the 74 Blocks strong network has contributed immensely to the development of the villages across the State.

Rio expressed happiness that Pete Village Level Organisation (VLO) of Jakhama Block has been selected out of 2,30,158 VLOs in the country for the Ten Best Performing VLOs under NRLM National Award which he said, is a very big achievement and encouragement to others under various flagship programs in the State.

Rio announced that the Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, Government of India chaired by the Prime Minister has given its approval for new restructured scheme of Rashtriya Gram Swaraj Abhiyan (RGSA) with a total outlay of Rs. 7255.50 crore implemented from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2018. The scheme shall be extended to all states and Kiphire was identified as the

aspirational District by NITI AAYOG out of 115 districts in India, which will focus on sectoral interventions to be aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals, he added.

Highlighting the Grant-in- Aid to the VDBs, Rio said the objective of the grant is intended to be used in rural areas to support and strengthen the delivery of basic civil services including water supply, sanitation, septic management, sewage and solid waste management, storm water drainage, maintenance of community assets, maintenance of roads, footpaths, street lighting etc. Informing that the State Government was unable to provide the Grant-in-Aid for the year 2014 to 2018, he said that the government will be releasing all the backlog funds of three years to all the 1238 VDBs, Matching Cash Grants and Micro Finance Grants, incentives to performing VDBs and also funds to the communitised departments of School Education, Power, Health and PHE.

Advisor, Rural Development, Dr. Neikiesalie Nicky Kire in his keynote address, said that the origin of the institution of the VDB was first setup in December 1976 at Ketsapomi Village in Phek district and on the success of the Ketsapomi VDB, a mass campaign was launched in 1980 to expand the coverage of this unique institution throughout the state and with the enactment of VDB Model Rules, 1980. He pointed out that the actual concept of rural development began to

take shape during the 7<sup>th</sup> Plan period and in 1980-81, the idea of grass root level planning and development became a reality following with the enactment of “The Nagaland Village and Area Council Act 1978” and the constitution of the Village Development Boards (VDBs) in all the recognized villages of the state.

Dr. Kire apprised that, keeping in view the importance of Gender Budgeting, the Department has provisioned for setting aside 25% of total funds available for every village already in-built for women’s scheme under Grant-in-Aid to VDB. In addition, in implementation of MGNREGA at least 40% of women workers are being engaged in all the villages. He stressed on the Pradhan Mantri Awaas Yojana-Gramin (PMAY-G) scheme where the Department aims to implement the programme through the VDBs by providing durable shelter in the rural areas. Under convergence, the beneficiary can avail wage of 95 man days from MGNREGA for construction of house.

The programme was chaired by Principal Secretary for RD, Lhoubeilatuo Kire, IFS. Invocation pronounced by Senior Pastor, BMC, Kohima, Rev. Moa Longchari. Other highlights included greetings by President, Nagaland VDB Association, Thoshe Awomi, folk song and special presentation by Veketoule & Friends and Ameü Üsou Zao & choir. Vote of thanks was delivered by Director, RD, Imlimeren Jamir followed by thematic session.

## PAIWANG KONYAK CALLS ON RAJNATH SINGH

P. Paiwang Konyak, Minister for Transport & Civil Aviation, Railways, Land Resources met the Union Home Minister, Rajnath Singh at his residence New Delhi on the 24<sup>th</sup> April 2018.

In the meeting, Paiwang apprised the Union Home Minister on the helicopter service in the state, since demand of chopper service is increasing day by day and the present MHA

sanction of 480 hours of flying hours per annum is not enough to cater to the needs of the state, in which the Minister requested the Union Home minister to increase the helicopter service from 480 hours to 1500 hours annually.

The Union Home Minister gave assurance him that he will look into the matter at the earliest possible time and consider the request of the state.

## NAGALAND LEGISLATORS CALLS ON JAGAT PRAKASH

Deputy Chief Minister, Y. Patton along with his Cabinet colleagues and Advisors comprising of S. Pangnyu Phom, Minister; Jacob Zhimomi, Minister; Kashiho Sangtam, Minister; Dr. Longriniken, Advisor; Tovihoto Ayemi, Advisor and Kazheto Kinimi, Advisor paid a courtesy call to the Union Minister for Health & Family Welfare, Jagat Prakash Nadda at his official residence in New Delhi on 24<sup>th</sup> April 2018.

During the discussion, Y. Patton appraised the Union Minister on the ongoing state top priority project of the Medical College Kohima, Nagaland and requested him to extend all his help towards the early completion of the said medical college. The delegation members also expressed their gratitude to the Union Minister for his concern towards the state especially the rural health sector.

### ***Not to start and stop with ramp for PwDs: CEO***

Taking forward the 2018 NVD theme 'Accessible Elections,' the CEO, Nagaland, Abhijit Sinha held a consultative meeting on 'Inclusion of Persons with Disabilities in electoral process' for devising a comprehensive strategy for the Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) at Hotel Japfu on 25<sup>th</sup> April 2018.

Chairing the meeting, Abhijit Sinha highlighted over the recently conducted election relating to PwDs. Efforts were made for providing easy accessibility for the PwDs, providing wheel chairs, temporary ramps etc. in selected locations and in spite of the herculean challenge they faced, progress were seen, he stated.

Abhijit Sinha also appreciated and acknowledged the DC & DEO, Wokha for initiating the first of its kind 'Polling station comprising 100% entirely of PwDs,' besides some more innovative steps. However, he expressed regret over the outdated survey data of the number of PwDs enrolled till date which is very less for various reasons. Our society at many levels side step PwDs for some reasons but he said we still have a good time enough to utilize for the improvement of the PwDs.

Additional CEO, N. Moa Aier elaborated on SVEEP and Electoral Participation.

Deputy Mission Director, SSA, L. Khukiye Sema highlighted some of the consolidated statement of schools with and without barrier free access under SSA, he said 2066 schools including higher secondary are availing facilities like ramps, water, toilet, electricity, etc till date.

State Disability Commissioner, Dr. Atha Vizol emphasized his views on the facilities, provisions, aid and appliances, fund constraints, scholarships and monthly pensions for the PwDs.

DC & DEO, Wokha Manazir Jeelani Samoon shared his experience and presented a slideshow on the last election manning the polling station and introducing the 100% PwDs polling station with the motto 'No voters to be left behind' in which all categories of voters have to be engaged in electoral participation.

State Icon for PwDs, Diethono Nakhro in her suggestion for better inclusion of PwDs in electoral process, stated CEO/DEO websites must strictly comply with Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.0 – Level AA by the W3C; All documents/circulars, audio visuals, apps, etc. concerning election/voter matters need to meet accessibility standards; Voter Facilitation Centres need to be in accessible formats; Assistants /scribes for filling up forms for persons with disabilities should also be considered; Besides Braille script and sign language, multi-media accessible awareness material on election process needs to incorporate captions (text versions) as well according to Web Accessibility Guidelines; More special camps must be held for enrolment and sensitisation of PwDs, training of all personnel involved in the process needs to be stepped up. Voter ID cards must be issued in Braille for people who are blind or have low vision, engagement of dedicated teams of volunteers such as NCC, Guides & Scouts, youth organisations, etc. to assist voters with disability or senior citizens on polling day.

After much deliberation, points were noted for a fresh specific survey to identify and enroll the PwDs, extra posters and pamphlets for awareness, mapping of electoral roll for PwDs, emphasis on more workshops, special camps and trainings for both BLOs and PwDs, user friendly websites for the PwDs.

## NSSA BIDS FAREWELL TO SENIOR OFFICIALS

During 2018, 23 officials of various rankings from Secretary to Under Secretary of the Nagaland Secretariat Service Association retired from service on completion of 35 years of service, among whom one retired on attaining the age of superannuation as per an order of State P&AR Department.

A farewell programme in honour of the NSS officers, organized by the President and the Executive Council of NSSA was held on the 25<sup>th</sup> April 2018, at the Secretariat Conference Hall, Kohima. The

Dr. Meguosielie Kire, Principal Director & Additional Food Safety Commissioner, Health & Family Welfare, Kohima issued a directive to the food testing team, State Public Health Laboratory to conduct food testing activity on the spot under Central Sector Scheme Food Safety on Wheels - Mobile Food Testing Laboratory starting from April 2018 in phase wise manner in all the districts.

In this regard, Dr. Kire has informed all the concerned authorities to co-operate and assist the food testing team under its jurisdiction for proper

implementation of the food testing activities in checking adulterants in food items in the interest of public health. The action plan shall be carried out in co-ordination with the District Administration, Police, Designated Officer (CMOs), Food Safety Officers and Food Business Operators.

This was informed by Dr. Akuo Sorhie, State Programme Officer, Food Safety & Standard Authority, Health & Family Welfare with regard to the implementation of "Food Safety on Wheels" in Nagaland.

## SEMINAR ON GLOBAL EDUCATION

A one day seminar on “Global Education” was organized by the Nagaland Board of School Education in collaboration with Madhubun Educational Books for the Heads of Registered Institutions of the Board in two places. On 24<sup>th</sup> April 2018, the seminar was held at Greenwood School, Dimapur and on 25<sup>th</sup> April 2018, it was held at Capital Convention Centre, Kohima. A total of 402 Heads of Registered Institutions attended the seminar.

The resource person, G. Balasubramanian said education is all about re-discovering ourselves. Today, educators need to open up and absorb the new skills, new knowledge, new opportunities and schools should impart knowledge to the students to face the challenges. A school is basically about energy management. Children are more knowledgeable than the teachers in today’s context. Therefore, as heads, one need to update themselves, re-learn and be ready to change.

Balasubramanian dwelt on the seven future challenges of education viz. Expanding spectrum; Automation unlimited; Sensors and chips; Amazonisation of education; Virtual and Augmented reality; Big data and Internet of things; Multi disciplinary learning and Intent learning (convergence of knowledge). He asked the Principals/Headmasters to create a friendly environment for the students to develop their abilities and skills.

Asano Sekhose, Chairman, NBSE shared certain important concerns of the Board which she felt was important and necessary for the heads of institutions to know. She urged them to read and follow the guidelines, regulations and notifications issued from the Board for a smooth academic and administrative functioning of the schools.

Additional Secretary, Rangumbing Nsarangbe welcomed the participants and proposed the vote of thanks at the end of the seminar.

## ***Delegation led by Y. Patton calls on Rajnath Singh***

The delegation led by Deputy Chief Minister, Y. Patton appraised Rajnath Singh that the State of Nagaland from its inception has been lacking economic viability because of which from the day one, it was provided in the historic 16 point agreement that the State of Nagaland shall need central grants both for administrative expenses as well as development. The development needs for Nagaland for many years were met by liberal grants under State Plan whether by way of additional central plan assistance or by way of special plan assistance which were stopped with the replacement of Planning Commission by NITI Aayog. Furthermore even enhancement of devolution by 14<sup>th</sup> Finance Commission did not have additional positive impact on finances in the State because of it being revenue deficit. The State is receiving share in central taxes at much lower rate than what was computed by 14<sup>th</sup> Finance Commission due to much lesser realisation of central taxes vis-a-vis what was estimated by Finance Commission, because of which there is a huge budgetary deficit. There are no resources available to meet state share for availing centrally sponsor schemes and for doing the development of state.

Therefore, the delegation requested special central assistance to Nagaland in the form of one

time grant of Rs.1400 crore to wipe out the budgetary deficit and for providing the long due and pending amount of Rs. 863 crore for completion of pending SPA projects sanctioned by erstwhile Planning Commission and also recommended by NITI Aayog. The delegation also requested that the state share towards CSS, NEC and NLCPR should be waived off in case of all revenue deficit because they do not have any resources to provide the State share and therefore do not get any money under the so called centrally sponsored schemes.

The delegation also requested that two immediate special packages of untied funds must be sanctioned to meet development needs of most backward areas of Eastern Nagaland and also for creating an Airport in Kohima.

The delegation further stressed that the Central Government must realise that a revenue deficit State like Nagaland cannot develop at all if the central assistance is not provided. The delegation prayed for an immediate solution to the "Naga Political Issue" because the people of Nagaland had agreed to an election this time only in anticipation of a quick solution to this long lasting problem which also hinders the state's development.

## **MEGA MOCK DRILL EXERCISE CARRIED OUT ACROSS THE STATE**

### ***Kohima:***

Nagaland Emergency Preparedness Exercise (NEPEX) was organised by Nagaland State Disaster Management Authority (NSDMA) in collaboration with National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), on 26<sup>th</sup> April 2018.

The mock drill started off with ringing of the siren in the State Capital at 10:00 am. All the disaster management forces across the State Capital geared up to contain the damages caused by 8.7 Magnitude Earthquake. After the siren sounded, immediately

people in schools and institutions/ offices responded by method of Drop, Cover and Hold for two minutes until the siren was sounded for the second time. Similarly, the stakeholders vacated to safe places (Pre-Identified Safe Zone) covering their heads with their hands or any hard object.

The state staging area of the mock drill was at Solidarity Park below Civil Secretariat and the district staging area was at Kohima village ground below Don Bosco School, Kohima. The simulation exercise was conducted at 56 selected locations

including hospitals, shopping malls, schools, offices, market area, churches, post office, high rise residential buildings and major hazardous units in all the 11 districts to improve the administration's capacity in mobilising resources and reaching out to the affected communities. The consolidated Incident Report of NEPEX from the 11 districts, where total death reported was 133, seriously injured 234, minor injured was 417. Senior officials from all the important departments such as NDRF, Health, Police, Fire fighting, Information & Public Relations, Transport etc attended the exercise.

NEPEX is the State wide emergency exercise of NSDMA. Nagaland lies under Seismic Zone and is vulnerable to many natural calamities such as Earthquakes, Landslides, Flash floods, Thunderstorms, Windstorms, Forest fire etc. NEPEX is organised annually during different seasons of the year to acclimatize and build resilience to different extreme weather throughout the year. The mock drill will support the development plans for rescue and relief measure, developing local warning and evacuation plans, mobilizing and organizing resources in building practical Standard Operation Procedure (SOP) for disaster management in the State.

### **Zunheboto:**

Mega Mock Drill was held in Zunheboto under the chairmanship of ADC, Zunheboto, Vekhoyi Chakesang. The programme was organised by Zunheboto District Disaster Management Authority (ZDDMA) under Nagaland Emergency Preparedness Exercise (NEPEX).

Departments which took part in the drill included Administration, District Planning, Rural Development, District Agriculture Office, District Welfare Office, Police, Medical, Food and Civil Supplies, NIC, NST, Treasuries and Accounts, Land Records and Survey, Election, Home Guards and Civil Defence, State Disaster Response Force, District Transport Office, DPRO Office, 111 BSF, 5<sup>th</sup> Assam Rifles Zunheboto, Fire Services, PHED and PWD (R&B),

Project Colony youth volunteers, Government Higher Secondary School, Olympic Higher Secondary School.

Khenito Chishi, District Commandant, Home Guards & Civil Defence was the Operation Section Chief and Observers Report was given by Lhokiye Yepthomi, DESO Zunheboto. The drill was exercised simulating the 8.7 magnitude earthquake and its aftermath at five locations in Zunheboto town.

### **Phek:**

An Emergency Operation Centre (EOC) consisting of logistic section, planning section, operation section and incident command post was set up at Phek Local Ground for the exercise.

Mock drill demonstration was conducted at different locations, namely Bible Hill Colony junction, Church junction Bethany-I Colony, Mission Compound Colony, Government Higher Secondary School and Deputy Commissioner's Office compound, Phek, where emergency response team were sent to carry out procedural search and rescue evacuation of casualties to the nearest medical centre.

### **Wokha:**

Wokha district also conducted mock drill at four locations, namely Mt. Tiya College, Wokha (Building collapse), Police point (Building collapse), Little Angel School (Evacuation drill) and WTC Shopping Complex (Fire incident).

Siren was sounded at 10:00 AM to signal the starting of the drill, after which the Community First Responders (CFRs) reported about the incidents to the officers present at the Emergency Operation Centre. Personnel from SDRF team and Fire & Emergency Services department reached at all the pre-identified location to carry out rescue and operation works assisted by the police, Assam Rifles, Medical team, CFRs and Trainers of Trainees (TOTs). 24 numbers of SDRF and eight personnel from F & ES Department were present at the different locations to carry out the rescue and evacuation operation. Emergency Operation Centre was set up at DC's Conference Hall, staging area at Wokha Local Ground, incident command post at ground rostrum, operation section, planning section and logistic section were also set up at the local ground.

Chairman, Wokha DDMA & Deputy Commissioner, Wokha, Dr. Manazir Jeelani Samoon, IAS during the debriefing, thanked all officers, personnel and individuals who were assigned with different tasks and for carrying out their responsibilities with sincerity and making the mock drill a grand success.

### **Longleng:**

Despite shortage of manpower and machineries, Longleng district conducted NEPEX (Mega Mock Drill) on earthquake and outbreak of fire. The mock drill was conducted at St. Joseph School and Phom Lampong School for earthquake, and Treasury Office for outbreak of fire.

After the siren alarm was sounded off, the line departments along with required machineries, equipments, items and manpower rushed to the local ground to take note of the prevailing situation. They set up their respective emergency camp to provide relief, shelter and first aid to the fire and earthquake victims. The Incident Commander & ADC, Longleng, Temsuwati gave an emergency briefing to the rescue team and informed them about the three locations badly affected by the disaster. The Fire & Emergency

Service along with ambulance rushed to Treasury Office to dose off the fire and liberated the fire victims while the Police and 12<sup>th</sup> NAP (IR) rushed to Phom Lampong School and St. Joseph School and rescued the student victims. The rescue operation teams rushed back to the staging area setup at local ground to provide all necessary facilities to the victims.

John Tsulise Sangtam, Deputy Commissioner briefed the media and the gathering about the disaster and its effects on human lives and properties. He also highlighted about shortage of manpower, medicine and machineries and appealed to the concerned authorities to provide the facilities for emergency.

### **Peren:**

The Peren District Disaster Management Authority successfully conducted mega mock drill of Nagaland Emergency Preparedness Exercise (NEPEX) at Peren town.

The programme was conducted under the supervision of District Administration, Peren where ADC, Chuba Wati Chang in his briefing dwelt on the importance of NEPEX in the state. Further, he said that Nagaland being vulnerable to many natural calamities, it is imperative to establish a scientific

approach in responding and managing disaster. Both the government and the public need to prepare themselves for any disaster which usually strikes without any warning.

The mega mock drill enacted an 8.7 magnitude earthquake. The incident response system, operation, section, the planning section and the logistic system swung into action after a briefing by the responsible officer at the ADC Office. The Emergency Operation Centre (EOC) was set off at the Local Ground, Peren. The enactment show road blockade from Jalukie to Peren, Peren to Tening and Jalukie to Athibung. The total casualty as per the enactment and mock drill was - severely injured 62, minor injured 39 and the death reported 50. Relief section distributed 200 bags of rice and 400 bottles of mineral water.

### **Tuensang:**

District Disaster Management Authority, Tuensang successfully conducted Nagaland Emergency Preparedness Exercise (NEPEX) on 26<sup>th</sup> April 2018 with the government agencies, school and collages and public. The mock drill was carried out by simulating an earthquake of 8.7 magnitude Richter scale with a scenario of mass causality at bazaar area, Fire and building collapse at Agri Office, high rise building rescue at Youth Resource Office, search

and rescue at residential area and school evacuation drill. After the compilation of drill, a debriefing session was held at staging area and chaired by EAC (Development) Tuensang, Tsidi while, closing remarks was delivered by Deputy Commissioner and Chairman, DDMA, L. Jamithung Lotha.

### **Mokokchung:**

As part of the Nagaland Emergency Preparedness Exercise (NEPEX), mock exercise was carried out in Mokokchung in simulating an earthquake of 8.7 magnitude resulting collapse of building and number of casualties in different locations.

Stationing at Imkongmeren Sports Complex as Emergency Operation Centre (EOC), mock drill on rescue operation was carried out in four locations in the town - Edith Douglas Higher Secondary School, Longkumer Kilem, Alempang Ward and Post Office Area.

ADC, Mokokchung W. Manpai Phom, who was the Responsible Officer (RO), during the debriefing thanked all the departments, response teams, student volunteers, ward authorities, stake holders and the Assam Rifles for their contribution in making the mock exercise a success. Around 500 individuals comprising of personnel from SDRF, Police, Assam Rifles, students, stalk holders, volunteers from different wards and government officials participated in the preparedness exercise.

### **Mon:**

Scenario of Emergency Preparedness Exercise was initiated by the District Administration and the entire line departments under Mon. Earthquake with 8.7 magnitude on Richter scale struck the state of Nagaland including Mon district and Mon town in particular.

The following location and place were conducted: Government Higher Secondary School, St. Mary School, District Hospital, Lucy's Shopping Complex, Police Church, NST garage, Wangkhao

College, DRDA Office and Phomching & Aboi Sub-division.

Staging area was set up at Local Ground, Relief Camp at Badminton Stadium, Helibase at Helipad and at DBs court. Incident Command Post, Operation Section, Planning Section and Logistic Section were set up.

20 volunteers from GHSS, 20 from St. Mary School, 50 from KBCM and 20 volunteers from Walo, Jahjon, Wagiem and Tanlao wards were Community First Responders. This Mega Mock exercise is to test the capability of the district to responds, manage and timely response during the time of disaster and to minimize loss of lives and properties.

### **Kiphire:**

The NSDMA in collaboration with DDMA (Kiphire) and concerned departments successfully conducted the NEPEX Mock drill at helipad ground.

The mock drill was conducted in four locations, Loyola Higher Secondary School, District Agriculture Office, Kiphire Town Council building and in private residential building. The mock drill began with an emergency siren at 10:00 am, where people responded by way of Drop, Cover and Hold for two minutes and the exercise lasted for two hours. About 200 SDRF personnel and 200 volunteers from various schools, departments, Bharat Scouts & Guides and volunteers from NCC Zisaji Presidency College participated in the mega mock exercise. The mock drill concluded with a vote of thanks from ADC, Kiphire, Kumar Ramnikant, IAS.

### **Dimapur:**

Dimapur district conducted mock drill exercise simulating 8.4 on Richter scale with the involvement of Dimapur DEMS and all the stakeholders.

Improvising upon last year's NEPEX exercise which was basically pre-planned, this year the mock drill exercise in Dimapur was done on the spot projecting real live happening situation. No prior

traffic arrangements were made and the SDRF/rescue teams were also assigned their tasks on the spot from the staging areas, where all the resources were kept ready.

Earlier, as soon as the siren sounded at 10 am, DC, Dimapur, Sushil Kumar Patel, IAS called an emergency meeting at the Emergency Operation Center (EOC) located at the Deputy Commissioner's Office, Dimapur and briefed all the officials and stakeholders for carrying out their tasks in the staging area where ADC, Dimapur, Sara Jamir was the Incident Commander. The mock drill was conducted to assess the level of preparedness of the district in the event a disaster strikes.

Later, after the conduct of the exercise, debriefing was held in DC's Conference Hall, Dimapur, where ADC, Dimapur, Sara Jamir observed that the mock drill was better than expected yet remarked that the level of preparedness was not up to the mark when compared to a real live situation. She was of the opinion that the wireless system needs upgradation in certain areas. She also advised all the departments for updating the available resources and machineries so that planning and coordination could be worked promptly in the event of a disaster.

## DEBRIEFING AFTER MEGA MOCK DRILL

A press debriefing with the observers, officials and media was held at State Emergency Operating Centre at Keziekie, Lotha Hoho Ki, Kohima on 26th April 2018.

Speaking at the press conference, Advisor, NSDMA, Pukhai Sumi expressed gratitude to all the government machineries, officials from Assam and neighbouring states who participated in the emergency preparedness exercise. 'Today's exercise is to see how prepared we are when such disaster struck and how well equipped we are to save lives,' he added. He further suggested the state machineries to manage a strategic point to put up siren in a place like Science College where it can cover the entire Kohima city when the siren alarmed is sound. He also suggested on setting up a control room at a central location.

Chief Secretary, Temjen Toy, IAS chairing the press debriefing, said that the mega exercise is to test the preparedness of the state and that similar drill was done last year. Commenting on the observation during the mock drill, he said that traffic is one area of concern which needs to be looked into and proper study has to be carried out so as to reduce the traffic congestion during disaster or in normal

circumstances. He raised concern on issue of sirens in the state capital. He stated that there is only one siren for the whole of Kohima which is installed in PHQ but, is not audible in many parts of the city. He directed the NSDMA to install more sirens at the appropriate location in Kohima and that this siren should be use only during disasters.

The other constraints Temjen Toy highlighted were communications via walkie talkies and other means of communications used during the mock drill which needs to be upgraded. Toy further said that communications gap between various agencies like Assam rifles, CRPF, NDRF, SEOC and the staging areas which need to be examined and improved. He also reiterated that lack of communication between the SEOC and the staging areas need to be improved so that there will be no confusion in future and that SEOC should be the one point information centre during emergencies.

Also on availability of resources, Toy said that proper inventory of resources available in the battalion headquarters and with all line departments and how best these resources can be utilise or deploy during emergency needs to be re-examined. He said that refuelling of various transport vehicles such

as ambulances, fire truck, helicopter etc. should be kept in mind and reminded that facility of refuelling should be taken into consideration. He also called upon the media to play a big role in terms of creating awareness among the people.

Observers and officials of different agencies shared their observations on the mega mock drill held at Kohima.

During the meeting, with Kiren Rijiju, the Advisor highlighted the important role of Village Guards in the state especially in the interior parts of the state bordering with Myanmar. Union Minister Prajash Javadekar conveyed to the Advisor that all the schools will be re-strengthened and upgraded for example class 4 will be upgraded to 6, class 8 to 10

and class 10 to secondary, RMSA, SSA will be under SCERT, all the DIET institutes will be re-strengthened and also wherever need arise in any district, it will be taken up with all support from the centre. While meeting Dr. Mahesh Sharma, Toshi Wungtung who is also a member of Wild Life Protection briefed the Union Minister in regard to endangered animals in the state and shared his serious concern on shifting cultivation (jhum field) in the state. The Minister said that awareness programme for the community participation, NGOs and individual must be conducted to preserve the endangered animals and forest; he also mentioned that the Ministry will look into the matters for compensation and help to the farmer/villagers to protect the forest as well as those endangered animals in the state.

## GOVERNOR ADDRESS REGIONAL SEMINAR AT JOTSOMA

Youth are in demand across the globe but the knowledge acquired should be applicable to the demands and therefore universities and educational institutions should take the responsibility to make students job givers and not job seekers, stated Governor, P.B. Acharya while addressing a regional seminar on "Natural Resources, Skill Manpower and Development of Northeast," organised by Kohima Science College (KSC), Jotsoma on 30<sup>th</sup> April 2018 at KSC Auditorium Hall.

Governor Acharya stated that institutions should include skill courses in their curriculum so that students are employable and can take up entrepreneurship. He further stated that the Government of India has introduced Mudra schemes targeted for helping students, especially from the weaker section of the society to become entrepreneurs. He called on the institutions to inform students on the various schemes so that they can take make use of them.

Resource persons during the regional seminar were Professor Sapu Changkija, Department of Genetics & Plant Breeding, SASRD, Medziphema, Neichute Doulo, Chief Executive Officer & Co-ordinator, Entrepreneurs Associates and Amba Jamir, Founder & Executive Secretary, Sustainable Development Forum, Nagaland. The topics discussed ranged from natural resources of Northeast India with special emphasis on Nagaland, skilling manpower for Nagaland and various development issues.

The panel discussion was moderated by Wenyitso Kapfo, Assistant Professor, Department of Botany, KSC while the programme was chaired by Dr. Seyiekhrielie Whiso, Assistant Professor, Department of English, Kohima.

Reviewing the previous DPDB meeting, the house forwarded to the government the proposal for registration of Highway Area Sumi Sports Association, Ikishe village and upgradation of Spring Valley School, Chekiye village, as all the criteria were found to be in place. Further, the house also forwarded to the higher authority for registration of House of Friendship Old Age Home Society, Landmark Home, Diphu Road and Act of Kindness Society, Dimapur. With regard to registration of Cleaning Brothers Foundation, East Police Colony, Dimapur, the house forwarded the matter to DMC Chairman, Dimapur for

further verification. For registration of Pine Firewood Dealers Union, the house entrusted SDO (C) Sadar for verification. Proposal for registration of some more societies was decided to be taken up in the next DPDB meeting.

In the meeting, DC, Dimapur advised the Power department to mobilise staff and ensure for regular checking of transformers, stating that more load would increase due to onset of summer season. While appraising the Power Department that in some areas, the trees are seen touching the wires, he suggested them to tie up with respective Village Councils and to take corrective action in order to avoid untoward incidents. Sushil Kumar also expressed concern on the stretch of road from Commissioner Police Office to Nagarjan and Circuit House. Official from PWD informed the house that the particular stretch of road would be maintained at the earliest probably before monsoon.

## **Kiphire DPDB Meeting**

Monthly meeting of District Planning and Development Board (DPDB) Kiphire was held on the 5<sup>th</sup> April 2018 at the Conference Hall of the Deputy Commissioner, Kiphire. The meeting was held under the chairmanship of V. Kashiho Sangtam, Minister, Soil & Water Conservation and Geology & Mining. The Deputy Commissioner & Vice Chairman, DPDB at the outset, welcomed all the members, various NGOs, apex tribal organisations of the districts, the new DPDB Chairman, V. Kashiho Sangtam, Sanjay Kumar IAS, Joint Secretary, MHRD and Prabhari Officer of Aspirational District Kiphire for their presence in the meeting.

In the meeting, various apex tribal organisations of the district highlighted the shortcomings and the problems faced by the people of Kiphire. They mentioned that the district is facing poor maintenance and functioning of hospitals and the present educational system.

V. Kashiho Sangtam also requested the Prabhari Officer to kindly frame specific programmes that would be acceptable by the Government of India as he knows the districts well. He assured that, with the initiation of the Prabhari Officer and officers of the districts, Kiphire could be declared as one of the most advanced districts by 2022.

The Prabhari Officer encouraged the people of the Kiphire district to join hands and work together so as to move forward together. He also highlighted that there are certain areas that cannot be taken care of from the state level alone such as roads, drinking water etc. He requested the departments to make radical gap analysis and learn from the best practices which can be implemented.

Brief report presentations by various departments like Health & Family Welfare, Zisaji Presidency College, Education, PWD (Roads & Bridges), Agriculture, DRDA, Lead Bank and Horticulture were carried out. The board also deliberated on the following agendas submitted through the Senior Sub-divisional Education Officer, Kiphire and agreed to

recommend to the government for necessary action, namely registration of St. John School, Kiusam village and setting up of Primary School at Okhe village.

## **Training on Scientific Methods of Crop Production**

Training on “Scientific methods of crop production” was organized by KVK and sponsored by ATMA, Kohima district at Nerhe Pezha on 6<sup>th</sup> April 2018. In the first technical session, resource person Imtisenla, ACTO, KVK shared on the System of Rice Intensification (SRI). In this system, rice seedlings should be transplanted when young, within 10-15 days old with just two leaves and carefully transplanted to avoid trauma to roots and to minimize transplant shock. Through this system, 30 percent more yield is obtained over traditional practices.

In the second technical session, Michael Pienyu, ACTO, KVK discussed on the topic Integrated Pest Management (IPM). Successful IPM combines several methods such as cultural, mechanical and biological use of chemicals. The programme was followed by interaction session. Altogether 37 farmers participated along with ATMA & KVK staff.

## **Mangkolemba SDPDB Meeting**

The Mangkolemba Sub-Divisional Planning and Development Board meeting was held at ADC Office Mangkolemba on 6<sup>th</sup> April 2018 under the chairmanship of ADC Mangkolemba, Razouvolie Dozo.

## **Sensitization Programme on Harmful Effect of Tobacco**

To spread awareness and sensitize the shopkeepers/traders in and around the school premises, a sensitization programme was organized on 10<sup>th</sup> April 2018 at Lotha Tribal Council Hall (LTC), Wokha.

Dental Surgeon, Sanis CHC, Dr. Mhonthung Tungoe while delivering the keynote address, said there are more than seven thousand poisonous chemicals found in tobacco products and every six seconds, a person dies globally which is the direct result for use of tobacco products. Everyone knows that tobacco use can have disastrous consequences on our health but many ignore the risks and use it, he said, and urged all to discourage the use of tobacco products for healthy life.

Psychologist at NTCP Wokha, Abeni speaking on the harmful effects of tobacco on health and COPTA Act 2003, said the main aim in organizing the programme is to sensitize the shopkeepers not to sell tobacco products within 100 yards from the school premises. She also emphasized on the section and rules of any violations of the provision under the Act and added that violation may lead to imprisonment of two to five years or more with penalty in the form of imposition of fines in accordance with the offence committed. She also stated that very shortly, checking will start in collaboration with the enforcement agencies.

The programme was chaired by Social Worker, NTCP Wokha, Mharoni R. Ezung.

### **Phek DPDB Meeting**

The monthly meeting of Phek District Planning & Development Board (DPDB) was held on 10<sup>th</sup> April 2018 in the DPDB Conference Hall under the chairmanship of DC & Vice Chairman, DPDB, Phek, Shanavas C, IAS. The house welcomed the new member, Dr. Tiala Longkumer, M.S (D.H).

PWD Executive Engineer, Abija Khing said that his department is ready for such occurrence by convergence with the PWD Mechanical Department as the later has enough machinery at their disposal, for which the board decided to write to the departments for help during needs.

The Chairman suggested on rain water harvesting of water during dry/lean season. Er. T. Imtiakum said that comparatively, the source and the quality of water will be compromised, but in the case of supply, it might be a little short to meet the needs of the growing population in the headquarters. He added that rain water harvesting is not at their department's disposal as there is no regular fund provided. The DSCO was requested to send proposal in this regard on rooftop water harvesting as well as ring well.

As the power cuts frequently occurs during

monsoon season, the Chairman also made special emphasis to rectify this problem. Er. Aron Sema highlighted the situation of power being fed from Meluri Sub-division which has many obstacles like the trees and landslides that disturb the regular supply of electricity and secondly, the insulators are outdated and it breaks down, where installation of power in short time is not possible in spite of the efforts made by the department. In this connection, the department has been requested to send proposal for early remedy with the recommendation of DPDB.

As entrusted, the Forest Department & CMO, Medical gave powerpoint presentation of their respective departments.

## **MFTT Inspects Dimapur Super Market**

Mobile Food Testing Team from State Public Health Laboratory (SPHL) Kohima and Food Safety Officials (FSO), Dimapur carried out food analysis on loose species sold at Super Market area, Dimapur on 25<sup>th</sup> April 2018 where the items were dyed with cancer causing synthetic colours.

According to the team, they found Kesari Dal sold as food item which is prohibited under the Food Safety Act as it causes paralysis and also leads to loss of lives. The SPHL also claimed to have found Metanil yellow which causes degenerative changes in the lining of stomach, kidney and liver and also affects ovaries and testes. Rhodamine dye which

breaks down Red Blood Cells and adversely cause growth retardation and damages the liver and kidney, and the Sudan dye which is highly toxic to liver were also found by the testing team.

Highlighting some notable achievements of the department in recent times, Tovihoto said the department has implemented Restructured Accelerated Power Development and Reforms Programme (R-APDRP), making the eight towns IT enabled, except Mokokchung. He also announced that the department is contemplating to gradually implement CCC and Point of Sale swipe machines for cashless payment in others districts too, besides Kohima and Dimapur.

Tovihoto also said that the department is currently taking up CSS of Integrated Power Development scheme (IPDS) and Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Gram Jyoti Yojana (DDUGJY) for providing electrification to all the households both in rural and urban pockets by 2018. Despite the improvements and better revenue earning by the department, Tovihoto pointed out that the state still purchases power from outside for distribution to the consumers. Towards this, he urged upon the Village Councils and GBs to monitor power theft and defaulters within their jurisdictions. Presenting a brief note on CCC, Additional CE (D&R) and nodal officer, R-APDRP, Er. Keviletuo Yiese explained that the main objective of CCC is to improve customer service by processing and resolving consumer requests/queries/complaints in minimum possible time, by taking up at the appropriate place and level through single window

computerized system. He informed that CCC is one of the most important modules implemented under R-APDRF and said that consumers could now dial toll free number 1912 (Pan India Electricity Complaint)

## **AUGMENTATION OF WATER SUPPLY TO KOHIMA TO BE COMMISSIONED WITHIN 45 DAYS**

Minister for PHED, Jacob Zhimomi inspected the project site of augmentation of water supply to Kohima town at Mima village on 17<sup>th</sup> April 2018.

Jacob Zhimomi also said that the project will be commissioned within 45 days; it is part of the Smart City plan, which will provide safe drinking water to the citizens of Kohima town. Zhimomi said that the government is concerned about the health of the people and the project will not only provide safe drinking water to the people but would solve the water scarcity problem in the city. He informed that in Wokha, the same project will also be commissioned within 45 days. He also said that for rural areas, a project is on the verge of completion at Chiephobozou RD block under Kohima district which will cover 21 water scarce villages and stated that very soon, similar projects will be implemented in other districts.

This project is a two staged pumping system, whereby the water will reach the pressure

break tank and through gravity, the water will flow down to the main reservoir located at Kohima town. This reservoir overall pumping for design takes 20 hours and design capacity is 3.8 mld. The process

of this pumping goes diversion wise, desilting tank, sedimentation tank, hydraulic jump, clarifloculator, rapid sand filter, disinfection, and pumping. The intake point of this project is Zarü river.

## MAHSEER HATCHERY PROJECT INAUGURATED AT LONGKONG VILLAGE

In collaboration with ICAR-Directorate of Coldwater Fishery Research (DCFR) Bhimtal, Uttarakhand, Nagaland State Fishery Department successfully developed a Mahseer Hatchery Project at Suteplenden of Longkong village under Mokokchung district. The project, first of its kind in the state, has been set up at a cost of Rs. 15 lakh, aiming to propagate and to replenish the dwindling number of the species in the major rivers in the state. The project was inaugurated by Minister for PWD, Tongpang Ozukum in the presence of senior officers, scientists from ICAR-DCFR and high officials from the Nagaland State Department of Fisheries on 25<sup>th</sup> April 2018.

In his inaugural speech, Tongpang Ozukum said that with the setting up of a mahseer hatching centre, the dwindling number of the species would be replenished. Expressing concern over the use of chemicals and other means in fishing which leads to extinction of this wonder fish, the Minister urged the department to be more vigorous in bringing public

awareness to preserve this species in the rivers. He also said adequate knowledge should also be given to public about the feeding and breeding of this species. He also thanked the owner of the Suteplenden Multi Farm, Imnutoshi and asked the department to extend all possible help.

Director, ICAR-DCFR Bhimtal, Dr. Debajit Sarma; Dr. R.S. Haldar, Nodal Officer, ICAR-DCFR and Dr. Sudhir Raizada, ADG (Inland Fishery) who also spoke at the function, shared their happiness over the success of the project and said that they are always looking forward to undertake such projects for the benefit of the people of Nagaland. Dr. Sudhir Raizada who was the Guest of Honour at the inaugural function said ICAR-DCFR has taken up another Trout Hatchery Project at Tzulaki in Kohima district.

The inaugural function was chaired by Secretary, Department of Fisheries, T. Mhabemo Yanthan while, vote of thanks was proposed by Kevisa Kense, Director, Fisheries.




