NATIONAL SOCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMME IMPLEMENTATION IN KOHIMA DISTRICT (RUOPFÜLENUO, DPRO KOHIMA)

The National Social Assistance Programme (NSAP) introduced by the Government of India on Independence Day 1995 is a fully funded Centrally Sponsored Scheme. The NSAP has been introduced targeting the destitute, defined as any person who has little or no regular means of subsistence in their own sources of income or no support from the family members with the objective of providing a basic level of financial support.

Under NSAP sponsored by the Ministry of Rural Development, the Social Welfare Department is presently undertaking following schemes which included Indira Gandhi National Old Age Pension Scheme (IGNOAPS), Indira Gandhi National Widow Pension Scheme (IGNWPS), Indira Gandhi National Disability Pension Scheme (IGNDPS), National Family Benefits Scheme and Annapurna Scheme – Implemented by Food and Civil Supply Department.

The performance and coverage of welfare scheme implemented under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme NSAP in Kohima district during the year 2014-2015 are as follows:

Indira Gandhi National Old Age Pension Scheme (IGNOAPS): A person who has attained 60-79 years of age and living below poverty line is entitled for a sum of Rs. 200/- per month where a total number of 6506 beneficiaries have been covered. A person of 80 years and above is also entitled for a pension of Rs. 500/- per month where 422 beneficiaries have been covered.

Indira Gandhi National Widow Pension Scheme (IGNWPS): Under the scheme, a Widow between 18 to 59 years of age is eligible for the pension of Rs. 300/- per month where 510 beneficiaries were benefited during the year.

Indira Gandhi National Disability Pension Scheme (IGNDPS): Deserving BPL persons with severe and multiple disability are eligible under the scheme of amount Rs. 300/- per month where 170 beneficiaries have been provided during the year. The Dwarfs are also eligible for the pension.

National Family Benefits Scheme: Under the scheme, a one-time grant of Rs. 20,000/- was given as assistance to the bereaved household in the event of death of the bread-winner BPL. The eligible age of the person is 18 years to 59 years Widow where 50 households have been provided during the year.

Annapurna Scheme – Implemented by Food and Civil Supply Department: The food grains weighing 10 kilograms (wheat or rice) is given per month per beneficiaries free of cost. The scheme aims to provide food security to meet the requirement of those eligible old age person who have remained uncovered under the IGNOAPS. The scheme is totally implemented by Food and Civil Supply Department, Nagaland.

Eligible of NSAP Scheme :

- Indigenous inhabitance of Nagaland of 60 years and above for OAPS.
- No beneficiaries shall be eligible for more than one pension.
- On no circumstances a Government pensioner shall be eligible for pension under the rules.

- Grant of pension to both husband and wife simultaneously shall be considered only in the most deserving cases under the relevant schemes.
- It is classified that only BPL person from the eligible categories would be considered under NSAP except a Widow suffering from AIDS and does not hold Government jobs.
- Professional beggars shall not be eligible for pension.

The Department of Social Welfare, Nagaland has been undertaking an important role – share in delivering the National Social Assistance Programme to a large scale at present by assessing the eligible vulnerable groups below poverty line under Kohima district. However, as the District is vast in areas, still a lot of efforts need to be emphasized for procuring funds from the Ministry of Rural Development to intensively go forward by providing avenues to the uncovered section of the scheme. The Department has targeted at least 1053 uncovered eligible Senior Citizen for 60-79 years category, 188 for 80 years and above in OAPS, 253 beneficiaries for Widow and 137 beneficiaries in the category of IGNDPS with proper documents to be fitted under NSAP during the current year, for which the process has been initiating for providing allocation of funds.

The Department is of the opinion that as the initiating process has completed and submitted the requisite requirements, the Department is of high hope expecting the positive result with sanction order as sought with sanguine.

1. Type in the short code *#06# on your mobile phone and press the call key.
2. Remove the battery from your mobile phone and look for the code on the back of your device.
3. Check the purchase receipt or warranty paper or the box containing the device.

SENSITIZATION WORKSHOP ON HIV/AIDS & HARM REDUCTION

A District Level Sensitization workshop on “HIV /AIDS and Harm Reduction with law Enforcement Agency” was held on 2nd September 2016 at SP Conference Hall, Zunheboto. The program was organised by Kripa Foundation, District Administration, Police Department, NSACS and FHI360.

Resource persons for the seminar were Director, Kripa Foundation, Abou Mere, Program Coordinator, Kripa Foundation-Project Sunrise, Ketho Angami and DPO, DAPCU, Atokali Assumi.

Director, Kripa Foundation, Abou Mere speaking on the topic, “Understanding Drug Use /Abuse” said, “drugs in itself is good and necessary for our health”. However, Nagaland is passing through a turbulent period in the history of HIV/AIDS

due to communication gap among parents and children. He further said HIV prevalence among general population in India is highest in Nagaland with 1.16% followed by Mizoram with 0.97%. Adding that drug abuse/users is affecting the State viz, health, increase in school and college dropouts, loss of working hours and productivity, increase in crime and huge loss in economy, the Director said that addiction affects one’s mentality, physical, spiritual and emotional well being.

The Kripa Director also spoke on Nagaland Drug Abuse and Prevention Policy 2016, Narcotics Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act 1985, its objectives and provisions and role of Police force in the said Acts.

District Program Officer (DPO), DAPCU, Zunheboto Unit spoke on the ‘Current Scenario of HIV/AIDS in Zunheboto District’

wherein she said between April 2015- July 2016, 33 persons were tested HIV positive in Zunheboto district out of which six were pregnant mothers. She further said 31 persons were registered at ARTC. Atokali also highlighted the NACP facilities under Zunheboto district.

Program Coordinator, Kripa Foundation-Project Sunrise, Ketho Angami spoke on 'Harm Reduction' which relates to Drug related problems with legal harm, psychological harm, financial harm, occupational harm, social and physical harm. He also spoke on drug abuse management and its strategies viz, Demand Reduction Strategies, Supply Reduction Strategies and Harm Reduction Strategies.

Superintendent of Police, Krodi Rhetso, SDO(C), Shanavas IAS, and Addl. SP, Relo Aye also spoke in the workshop. Earlier, welcome address was delivered by Program Coordinator, Ketho Angami while vote of the thanks was proposed by Program Assistant, Kripa, Meghraj. The program was attended by Police Officers and all ranks and files of DEF Zunheboto.

YITACHU ADDRESSES STATE LEVEL TEACHERS DAY CELEBRATIONS

State Level Teachers' Day 2016 was celebrated at NBCC Convention Centre, Kohima on 5th September 2016 with Minister for School Education & SCERT, Yitachu as the chief guest.

Addressing the gathering, Yitachu said that many nil-result schools were converted to success stories because of good teachers. He, however, mentioned that despite of

so much efforts, the education system has many shortfalls and cited some instances like slow promotion for teachers, inability to pay salaries on time for teachers of Centrally Sponsored Schemes etc. "It pains me to see all those problems and I take responsibility. There are areas where we need cooperation and I am with you, I shall see to it that such kinds of inconveniences do not happen to our teachers" he said.

Yitachu said some primary teachers and graduate teachers get meager salaries yet the kind of patience and the dedication shown to our students is marvelous. Every individual should know the sacrifices of our teachers and they deserve to be saluted and honoured, he added.

To tackle the various challenges the education system faces, Yitachu suggested two things; firstly to give quality education to the students where he emphasized on the need to focus on primary education. Primary students are the most deprived group of students with no proper clothes, proper sanitation knowledge and they find very hard to adjust and learn, he maintained. Yitachu asked all the teachers and the School Education Department to rededicate themselves and focus on primary education and educate those who does not know anything to go ahead in life. Secondly, he said unless we fear God nothing will come out right, be it teachers or students irrespective of religion.

Yitachu also deliberated on the shortage of Science and Math teachers. He mentioned that some of the posts for Science and Math were converted to other posts when there was a shortage of Science and Math teachers but he expressed hope that with the recent recruitment of RMSA

teachers, the solution will get materialized.

F.P. Solo in his greetings stated that teachers deserve respect and due recognition. Society is what it is today in the form of human resource and social development because of teachers. Teachers in return, should realize the enormous responsibility that parents and society have on them. But many parents, especially poor and illiterate parents solely depend on teachers to provide education for their children and therefore their trust should not be betrayed, he stated.

General Secretary ANPSA, Nini Sekhose in her speech mentioned that to be a teacher is a divine assignment and cannot be compared to any other duties. More than 80% of students in Nagaland are from private school, she said and added that continuous in-house training is an indispensable component of every private school. She also stated that private schools are producing best results because of the low fee charged by most of the private schools who run their institution with missionary zeal. A teacher's profession is one that demands everything that one has, and therefore it should not be entered into lightly, she stated.

Other highlights of the programme included welcome address by Additional Director, School Education, Wonhungo Tsopoe, special songs by St. John School, Merhulietsa Kohima, Minister's Hill Baptist Higher Secondary School Kohima, North Field School Kohima and Tabitha

Enabling Academy Kohima. Life sketch of Late Dr. S. Radhakrishnan was presented by Ruzhukhrie Government Higher Secondary School Kohima and Honouring of Teachers by T.M. Government Higher Secondary School Kohima. Vote of thanks was proposed by General Secretary ANSTA, Visato Koso. 24 teachers from across the state were honoured for the year 2016.

THONGDI CHANG WINS HALF MARATHON

Acharya lauded MLA Azo Nienu for the developmental works in his constituency and for adopting Kutsapo village under SAGY. The Governor had recently appealed to the Naga legislators to adopt a village in their respective constituency.

Earlier, Chakhesang Public Organization (CPO) and Pochury Hoho submitted memorandum to the Governor and prayed for his intervention for the overall development of the district.

Minister for School education & SCERT Yitachu hoped that the visit of Governor to Phek district will bring about positive change in the district.

Late Ngullie was laid to rest at the Naga Cemetery Dimapur where Associate Pastor LBC Purana Bazaar Y. Zubemo led the committal service.

GOVERNOR VISITS LOZAPHUHU, PHEK & CHIZAMI VILLAGES

Governor of Nagaland, P.B Acharya visited Lozaphuhu, Phek and Chizami villages under Phek district on 13th September, 2016.

While addressing the citizens of these villages, Acharya said the Naga society has been plagued by corruption which he termed as the biggest disease in our society. As such, he urged upon the leaders of NGOs and all the stakeholders to raise their voices against the menace of corruption in our society. He also asked the villagers to build

cordial relationship among themselves and also with neighbouring villages in order to become a vibrant society.

He emphasised the importance and scope of mithun rearing especially in these villages and asked them to promote the rearing of mithun on large scale. At the same time, the Governor also stressed on the importance of wildlife and forest preservation which he said was a necessity at the present context.

He asked the villagers not to discriminate women based on their gender on any issues as they are no less than men in all fronts. He also expressed his appreciation over the State cabinet's decision on reservation issue which he said was a bold step taken by the state govt.

During his visit, the Governor received various representations from villages of which the Tizu river hydro project was one of them. In this connection, he said water is very important for generation of electricity stating that "when there is light there is industry and when there is industry there is employment".

Therefore, he called upon the villagers to tap the abundant natural resources bestowed upon them for the welfare of its people instead of jeopardising it. Minister for school education, Yitachu and MLA, Kuzholuzo Nienu accompanied him besides a number of dignitaries and district officials.

CHIEF SECRETARY STRESSES ON NPSR RECRUITMENT

The monthly AHOds and HOds meeting was held on 14th September, 2016 at the Secretariat Conference Hall, Kohima. Chief

Secretary, Pankaj Kumar IAS chaired the program.

The meeting started with review of minutes of the previous meeting like the usage of Biometric Attendance System in the Secretariat and Departments, online payment of electricity bills in Kohima and Dimapur. PHED informed that online payment of water bill has been introduced in Kohima and Dimapur is also expected to have the facility by early part of 2017. Chief Secretary reiterated on the deduction of NPS for all the state government employees on time since there is penalty for late payment. Secretary LRD, Kikheto Sema IAS highlighted on the problems that could crop up in NPS system in the near future to which Chief Secretary recommended for the review of benefits and problems of NPS system. On Corporate Social Responsibility, Pankaj Kumar emphasized on the need to get ready with the list of companies and co-operations which will fall under CSR. Pankaj Kumar asked all the Departments to set up SVEEP Cell by October.

The House also discussed on the instructions of P&AR Department on ban of contract appointments, requisitions to NPSC and revised Rules of Executive Business. The chief secretary said no vacancies should be filled up except through NPSC, he asked the departments to calculate the vacancies for one year in advance and requisition the posts to NPSC. He also mentioned that the civil service aspirants have met him twice and complained about the lack of posts in NPSC exam 2016. Pankaj also said there are changes in the system and the departments have to abide by it. The Departments which have not requisitioned any post for 2016 NPSC exam were made to give reasons during the meeting.

In regard to Planning and Finance Departments issues, Secretary LRD, Kikheto IAS suggested the need to pass the salary component of all the centrally sponsored schemes at the earliest and he also recommended the need to stop the creation of new Department and Demands in order to avoid financial problems later.

The meeting also deliberated on Service Rules and Office Memorandum in case conflict arises. Chief Secretary said Departmental Service Rules contains specific criteria and details however Office Memorandum contains the general principles therefore the Departments should compare and if any differences arise it should approach P&AR.

The chief secretary also urged the AHoDs and HoDs to take action on those government servants who defaulted on loan payments since it is against the integrity and accountability of a government servant. The meeting also discussed on the possibility of Cooperation department to operate various central schemes like MGNREGA. Suggestions were made for the Cooperation department to first gain people's trust however there was a consensus that Cooperative banks can play an effective role in the rural areas since major banks often fail to operate in rural areas.

During the meeting, the Chief Secretary released the SIRD Souvenir Book and revised Rules of Executive Business was also distributed.

MP RIO PRESIDES OVER DISHA PROGRAMME AT WOKHA

Combined District Development Co-Ordination and Monitoring Committee (DISHA) Programme was held on 13th

September 2016 at the Hammock Resort, Wokha, with Neiphiu Rio, MP, Lok Sabha and Chairman DISHA presiding over the programme which was attended by heads of offices, officers and their staff from Wokha and Mokokchung districts.

During the programme, presentations of departmental profiles were given by Rural Development, Land Resources, Social Welfare Department, Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban/Rural Local Bodies), NHM (Medical Department), SSA MDM (Education Department), and Agriculture Department along with paper presentations in order to highlight their activities.

Achievements of the above mentioned departments, their potentials, grievances and requirements were deliberated at length thereon.

Addressing the gathering, Rio said that as officers of departments and leaders of the people in different capacities as NGOs and frontal organisations, their good offices and leadership abilities must be put to use for development and progress for all. On sale of land, she emphasized on the ownership of property bought by the buyer; on land mortgage, she highlighted on the rights and limitation of mortgagee and mortgagor and on the Nagaland land (Requisition and Acquisition) Act 1965, she explained on issue of show cause notice to the land owner as to why the land should not be acquired followed by the other legal procedures on the issues.

Thepfulhouvi Solo stressed on the Article 371 of India Constitution where he pointed out that Nagas have rights on the usage of its land and resources. He also pointed out the need to bring out some guidelines in regard to sale of land to the outsider by the Village Council so as to protect our land for the future generations. 
