






- i. For Chartering atleast 48 hrs requisition in advance to be submitted to NST GM's Office Dimapur and additional 10 Minutes Flying Time shall be added for flying from Hanger to Apron & vice-versa for chartering cases.
- ii. The passenger carrying capacity for every sector will depend upon the load/weight of the passengers and maximum baggage of 5 kgs per passenger.
- iii. Operation of the State Helicopter Service is subject to weather & technical conditions.
- iv. Atleast 80% load factor shall be maintained in every sortie.

# OFFICIAL ORDERS and NOTIFICATIONS

## HIGHLIGHTS OF HELICOPTER SERVICE IN NAGALAND

- The first Helicopter service in Nagaland started operating its services with effect from 26<sup>th</sup> October 1987 with subsidy from the Central Government and was operated by M/s Pawan Hans Helicopter Ltd. unfortunately, the helicopter let with an accident on 7<sup>th</sup> February 1989 and thereafter the service was discontinued.
- With the consent and approval of the Central Government, the Helicopter service in the state was re-introduced for the 2<sup>nd</sup> time we'd 1<sup>st</sup> December 2007 with the M/s Pawan Hans Helicopter and the service continued till 31<sup>st</sup> January 2010.
- From 1<sup>st</sup> February 2010 till 31<sup>st</sup> April 2014 M/s King Rotors and Air Charter Pvt.Ltd. operated the Helicopter service having won the bid for operating the service in Nagaland.
- Again we'd 1<sup>st</sup> May 2014 M/s Pawan Hans Ltd operated the service till 12<sup>th</sup> December 2016.
- The service we'd 13<sup>th</sup> December 2016 till 7<sup>th</sup> January 2019 was operated by Global Vectra Helicorp Ltd.
- In between 8<sup>th</sup> January 2019 to 26<sup>th</sup> January 2019 M/s Thumbby Aviation was allowed to operate as an interim arrangement pending finalisation of the MOU with the operator.
- M/s Thumbby Aviation formally started operating the Helicopter service we'd from 27<sup>th</sup> January 2019 for 2 years.
- 75% subsidy is entitled only to the common passengers and Medical evacuation cases. VIPs and bureaucrats/government servants are not entitled for subsidies as per directives from the Ministry of Home Affairs.
- Prior to 2018, the Annual flying hour sanctioned by MHA for the State Government was 480 hours which has been enhanced to 1200 hours.
- After induction of the 2<sup>nd</sup> helicopter, the Helicopter services will be operating on 19 routes from the present 10 routes.
- Construction of helipads has already been completed at Kohima, Tizit (Mon) Satoi (Zunebhoto) and Mokokchung.
- Ongoing construction works of Helipads are undertaken at Wokha, Zunebhoto, Phek and Secretariat Plaza (Kohima).

## STATE GOVERNMENT IMPOSES “TOTAL BAN ON ALL SINGLE-USE PLASTIC IN NAGALAND”

---

In continuation to State Government's Notification dated 29.11.2018 on the “Policy for Restricting the Use of Plastics in Nagaland”, the State Government has imposed “Total Ban on all Single-Use Plastic in Nagaland” with a view to eradicate the menace of plastic and the serious environmental and ecological challenges posed by rampant use of plastics.

The following single-use plastic products shall be totally banned in the State:

- a. All plastic carry bags, with or without handles, irrespective of thickness and size;
- b. Plastic cutlery including plates, plastic cups, straws, stirrers etc.;
- c. Cutlery and other decorative made of Styrofoam (Thermocol);
- d. Polythene;

- e. Nylon;
- f. Poly-Vinyl-Chlorides (P.V.C.);
- g. Poly-Propylene; and
- h. Poly-Styrene.

“Single-use plastics, often also referred to as disposable plastics (use-and-throw items), are commonly used for plastic packaging and include items intended to be used only once before they are thrown away or recycled. These include, among other items, carry bags, food packaging, bottles, straws, containers, cups and cutlery”.


Any individual, institution/commercial establishment (educational institutions, offices, hotels, shops, restaurants, religious institutions, industrial establishments, banquet halls etc.) shall abide the aforesaid total ban and any breach shall be liable for penalties.

The District Administration/Local Bodies shall decide and levy penalties against the defaulters in their jurisdiction.

A District Task Force already constituted in respective District shall strictly monitor and function as Squads for vigilance purpose and ensure imposing of total ban on stocking, distribution, selling and use of all single-use plastics.

The total ban on all single-use plastics shall be made effective after 3 (Three) months from the date of publication in Official Gazette in the entire State of Nagaland in the public interest and for the manufacturers, stockiest, shopkeepers to dispose off their stocks and no financial loss is caused to them.

This is issued with the approval of State Cabinet in its meeting held on 10.06.2019 communicated vide O.M. NO.CAB-2/2013(Pt) dated 12.06.2019.

was tagged as the 'Player of the League' and was awarded a sum of Rs. 10,000/-

Rtd. DGP, Nagaland and Former President Nagaland Badminton Association, K. Kire, IPS congratulated the club for organizing the 1<sup>st</sup> Badminton League in the State and mentioned that 'League tournament' gives more opportunity to the players to take part, expose their talents and experience the game. He also urged and encouraged the NBC to continue this kind of event every year.

## DIPR DECLARED PLASTIC & TOBACCO FREE ZONE

The Directorate of Information & Public Relations, Nagaland, Kohima has been declared 'Plastic free and Tobacco free zone.' A short programme was held at the DIPR Conference hall today, the 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2019 where all the employees headed by the Director, IPR voluntarily and unanimously decided to ban single use plastics in the office premises and also declare the zone as tobacco free. Every officer and staff of the Directorate resolved to take it upon themselves to

implement this decision and impress upon visitors to cooperate with the initiative.

To facilitate the decision, Aquaguard water purifiers have been installed in all the floors of the office building where employees are encouraged to bring their own water bottles. The staff also volunteered to abstain from bringing and using plastic bags in the office.

## SENSITIZATION PROGRAM ON WASTE MANAGEMENT HELD AT RD DIRECTORATE

A sensitization program on Waste Management in Nagaland was held on 3<sup>rd</sup> June, 2019 at the Conference Hall of Directorate of Rural Development, Kohima.

Principal Secretary Urban Development, Abhishek Singh, IAS during his 'way forward' message, said the banning of single use plastics is not for following any directive, but it is for our own lives, land, environment and for the future of our children. It's a global problem and we need to follow guidelines, innovate solutions. He said the source of plastic pollution is mainly from the city life and over dependence on packaged food. Plastic menace was not as big as it is now some years back, it is a sign of consumerism.

He further mentioned that plastic needs to be banned irrespective of the thickness because nobody knows what 50 micron is. He also expressed the need to do away with mineral water bottles and set up large water purifiers and containers in offices which is cost effective also.

Rtd. Commissioner & Secretary, Thangi Mannen said that during the clean Himalaya campaign, the volume of waste found mostly consisted of plastic bags, packaged bottles, Talab & Guthka waste. She expressed concern on the findings since sale of

tobacco products are banned in the State and also the need to take decisive action and consider alternatives to solve the plastic menace. She added that the plastic bags below 50 microns are to be banned as set by the Government rules but there is no mechanism to identify the thickness, the manufacturer are making and dealers are selling all kinds of plastics. Therefore, the only solution is to totally ban the one time use of plastics in our State.

Mannen said the Concept of "my ways my responsibility" should be taken up for segregation of waste so that people can be a part in handling the waste. She mentioned that with the initiative of clean Himalaya campaign the practise of zero waste protocol, which had come up, should be made available to all the departments to follow. She expressed that the departments should be the first ones to set example in following the rules and notification in reducing the waste management.

Member Secretary, NPCB, Rusovil John speaking on the overview of the various waste management rules and NGT orders, pointed out that under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, seven rules were created in all the States with clear standards for appropriate segregation, storage, handling, transport and disposal.

## ONE DAY SEMINAR ON FINANCIAL MARKET MANAGEMENT COURSE

A one day seminar with the Heads of Institutions for Financial Market Management Course cum Certificate distribution for Financial Market Management Course was held on Monday the 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2019 at Capital Convention Centre, Kohima with Menukhol John, Principal Secretary to the Government of Nagaland, School Education & SCERT as Special Guest.

John said that Naga Society lacks in Financial Literacy and yet to realize the importance of Financial Market Management (FMM). Therefore, he urged the students to take up Financial Literacy at young age to be successful in life.

Abhilash Misra, Chief Executive Officer, NSE Academy Limited in his address as Guest Speaker said that everyone should know the basic skill of Financial Literacy as it has become essential for foundation skill. He called upon the students to acquire financial skill even though they may not be from commerce background. Misra also encouraged

the students to be skillful beyond the textbook and also stressed on the need to possess the knowledge of earning, saving, securing future life after retirement and others. He also opined that there appears to be a gap between academics and skills. Financial Literacy skills to a great extent can bridge this gap.

Chairman NBSE, Asano Sekhose in her keynote address said that Financial Literacy and Foundation in Financial Management is an essential life skill which should be acquired by everyone irrespective of jobs, profession, rich and poor. She said without the knowledge of economy or finance, one would be handicapped.

Understanding the need to inculcate and promote the knowledge of finance amongst the students, the Board in collaboration with NSE introduced the course for Class IX from the academic session 2016 on a pilot basis in some selected schools in Kohima, Mokokchung and Dimapur districts.

## OLD BOYS ASSOCIATION OF SAINIK SCHOOL, IMPHAL CLEANS UP CIHSR

In commemoration of World Environment Day 2019, the Old Boys' Association of Sainik School Imphal (OBASSI), Nagaland Chapter in collaboration with CIHSR, Dimapur conducted a Clean-Up and placement of Waste Bins at CIHSR on 5<sup>th</sup> June 2019.

In a short programme held before the clean-up exercise, Chief Engineer, PHED, Cadet Er. Y. Tep, who attended the event as special alumnus guest, called the participants to join hands towards making a sustainable world. Reminding the quote "we do not inherit the earth from our ancestors; we borrow it from our children". He urged not to focus only on the present indulging in own immediate needs, but to think about how current actions will affect the planet

where the future generations will live on.

Zale congratulated the SAYO volunteers for taking the responsibility to make Dzükou plastic free. With Dzükou being one of the most sought after destination in the state, he exhorted the Angami Youth

Organisation and all stakeholders to be united and make efforts to preserve and protect Dzükou. Zale also reminded that it is the duty of every stakeholder to abide and preserve its flora and fauna.

Director Tourism, Akhale Vizol lauding the SAYO for making Dzükou plastic free zone said that strict checking at entry point will ensure that plastics carried into Dzükou are not disposed off in the valley. She added that Dzükou has the potential to be designated a UNESCO World Heritage site if it is properly maintained and preserved.

## FIRST EVER WORLD FOOD SAFETY DAY CELEBRATED AT KOHIMA

---

Under the theme "Food safety, Everyone's business", the Food Safety Nagaland, Department of Health and Family Welfare (H&FW) celebrated the first ever World Food Safety day on 7<sup>th</sup> June 2019 at its Directorate, Kohima.

Speaking on the occasion Minister H&FW, S. Pangnyu Phom said that we are observing the first ever world Food Safety Day in Nagaland along with the rest of the country. Food is one of the essentials of life, he said the paramount requirement for the nation is the availability of safe food in sufficient amount but equally important is the fact that the food we eat, must be wholesome free from contamination or adulteration so that the consumption does not cause any ill effects on health.

He also said Government of India passed a comprehensive integrated Food law called "The Food Safety and Standards Acts 2006". He said this is the first time the Government has taken the initiative to seek the cooperation of consumer organisation and through them the individual consumer. Consumer is an important stakeholder in the services their active cooperation and support implementation of the new Food Safety Act cannot be truly effective. Food manufacturers, transporters, whole sellers, distributors and retailer are also have a great responsibility than those in other industries

because any factor that is harmful for the health of the consumer is an insult to human, he stated.

Minister also informed that the existing state public Health Laboratory in Kohima is now fully renovated and upgraded with sophisticated high-end equipment, and through government initiative Food Safety on Wheel was also launched for on the spot testing of any food item. Recently, the Food safety of wheel Team detected formalin in fish and other chemicals in fruits products, which is one of the mile stones that we have achieved. And the department is committed to protect the rights of the citizens at any cost. He said that this is the beginning but much more to be done, and each one of us be the consumer, government, food manufacturer or seller should need to realise the need for healthy working partnership, the need to recognise and respect each other's right and responsibilities and what is expected of each one of us, if we are to accomplished the goal of assuring safe Food and reliable quality of Food. He appealed all to come together and pledge to be responsible citizens and live a healthy life.

In his keynote address, Principal Secretary cum Commissioner, Food Safety Commissioner H&FW Department, Himato Zhimomi said that food safety is everybody's business and it is very important, particularly for the young because they are the most

vulnerable group in the society. He also mentioned that food safety is not only about administration but about governments, producers, civil societies, enforcement, sellers and buyers. It is estimated that because of food safety issues and other expenses that arise, about \$95 billion of food productivity is wasted. He appealed to everyone from the producers to the sellers and buyers to come forward and join hands with the government to work together to make the state healthier and safer place, everyone should join hands to ensure that everyone gets safe and nutritious food and also that none goes hungry in the state, and people should have zero tolerance on food waste in private and professional lives. He acknowledged the Department of organising this first ever world food safety day.

H&FW Department stressed on three major health challenges faced by the world; the first challenge is the food borne diseases where illness is caused by food contaminated by bacteria, viruses, parasites or toxins. The second challenge is the non-communicable diseases and the third challenge is malnutrition. He mentioned that all these challenges can be prevented by securing food safety, good nutrition and healthy eating habits. He further said that the main objective of Food Safety Standards Act 2006 is to ensure the availability of safe and wholesome food for human consumption. Thus, the Food Safety and Standard Authority of India has tried hard to shift the enforcement and detection based opposed to a more self regularity paradigm which can be achieved through cooperation and partnership among all the stake holders.

## STATE LEVEL COORDINATION COMMITTEE ON 7<sup>th</sup> ECONOMIC CENSUS MEETING HELD AT KOHIMA

A meeting of the State Level Coordination Committee (SLCC) for 7<sup>th</sup> economic census was held at the Conference Room of the Chief Secretary on 11<sup>th</sup> June 2019 under the chairmanship of Chief Secretary Nagaland, Temjen Toy, IAS who is also the Chairman, SLCC. The meeting discussed matters concerning the payment of honorarium to the supervisors and enumerators and the logistic support on arrangement of manpower for implementation on the 7<sup>th</sup> Economic Census.

At the outset, Chief Secretary, Temjen Toy, pointed out that, economic census is very important as through this, GST are calculated and are taken into account for everything from loans right up to finance commission. He asked the field officers not to take it as a routine thing but to give a true picture after enumeration is done and appealed to the field officers to have constant check and to work out a mechanism in monitoring every household.

Commissioner & Secretary Information Technology, K.D. Vizo, ITS while highlighting the conduct of the 7<sup>th</sup> Economic Census said that, Economic Census is conducted on all India basis covering all the States and UTs in the country. The Economic Census is known to be one of the most complex and massive administrative exercises in which all establishments “whether households or non-households, big or small, in the Private or Public sector - are enumerated.

He also added that the main objectives for conducting the 7<sup>th</sup> Economic Census were to provide detailed information on operational and other variables, activity wise, of all the establishments (excluding crop production, plantation, public administration, defense and compulsory social security) of the country including their distribution at all- India, State, district, village/ward levels for comprehensive analysis of the structure of the economy (macro, micro, regional levels) and for

benchmark purposes; to provide updated Directory of Establishments up to the village/ward level for local level planning purposes and use the same as an input for the development of National Business Register, which would be useful for estimation of District Domestic Product and to provide an up to date frame (list) from which samples could be drawn for collecting detailed information.

Commissioner & Secretary, Economics & Statistics, Kelei Zeliang, IAS during the discussion in the meeting said the payment of honorarium to the supervisors and enumerators fixed at Rs. 3 per household in the country should be increased to Rs. 10 per household due to the inconvenience faced by the supervisors and enumerators since our state is a terrain area. He also added that the work would be carried out by three stakeholders, Common Service Centre, Department of Economics & Statistics and National Sample Survey Organisation (Field Operation Division).

## COMMUNITY MOBILIZATION AND SENSITIZATION TRAINING CONDUCTED AT KOHIMA

The community mobilization and sensitization training on role and responsibilities of SMC, RTE ACT 2009, Quality (LEARNING OUTCOME, PINDICS and others), social audit, Account Maintenance, Record Keeping and Shagunotsav, Mid-Day Meal (MDM), Special training (OoSC), Shaala Shidi etc was conducted on 11<sup>th</sup> June 2019 at AMK Hall, Kohima.

Addressing the participants, State Mission Director, Samagra Shiksha, Kevileno Angami said that the Government has constituted the school management committee (SMC) under Nagaland communitization of public institutions and services Act, 2002 at the village, ward, town and urban education for the purpose of the Nagaland Right of children to get free and compulsory education. While highlighting on the role and Responsibilities of SMC and RTE Act 2009, Associate Professor (Reader), SCERT, Thungchibemo Lotha said that universalization of Elementary Education (UEE) is a constitutional commitment to provide free and compulsory education to all children of the age group of 6 to 14 years school drop- out children are increasing every year at all the level due to different reasons and urged the SMC , as a responsible member to let the enrolled in the school and to ensure that free and compulsory education are given to all the categories of children

## MINISTER PAIWANG FLAGS OFF 2<sup>ND</sup> STATE HELICOPTER SERVICE

---

Minister for Transport, Civil Aviation, Railways and Land Resources, P. Paiwang Konyak officially flagged off the 2<sup>nd</sup> State Helicopter service on 12<sup>th</sup> June 2019, from Dimapur Airport.

The high end configured Air conditioned helicopter with medical facilities has a sitting capacity for 13 passengers.

With the induction of the additional helicopter, the Helicopter service in Nagaland will now be operating on 19 routes from the present 10 routes. 75 percent subsidy would be entitled only to common passengers and Medical evacuation cases. VIPs and bureaucrats/ government servants will not be entitled for subsidies as per the directives from the Ministry of Home Affairs.

During the 2<sup>nd</sup> helicopter induction programme, Secretary Transport, Kenilo Apon said that the state Government has faced a lot of problems during the massive landslides last year, and had to engage 2

numbers of Indian Air Force choppers to meet the challenges of evacuation and relief, as the state chopper service was not sufficient. Taking note of the matter, Minister, Paiwang had taken up the issue with the Home Ministry, GOI, where MHA agreed to enhance the flying hours from 480 hours to 1200 hours, he informed. Apon expressed gratitude to CM Nagaland, Neiphiu Rio and Minister Paiwang for their initiatives taken for the welfare of the people of Nagaland. The Secretary also urged upon the Managing Director Civil Aviation for ensuring that all pilots deputed in the state follows the standard operating guidelines so that the good image, trust and confidence of the people would continue to grow.

After the flagging off programme, Minister along with Secretary Transport, Rev. Chumben, DPRO Dimapur and other officials went for a short chopper ride with captain Mukesh and Captain Nair.

## REVIEW MEETING ON URBAN MISSION HELD AT KOHIMA

---

A review meeting on implementation of Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act, 2016 (RERA) and Urban Mission in the states of Nagaland, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya and Sikkim was held at Hotel Japfu on 11<sup>th</sup> June 2019.

Economic Adviser, Ministry of Housing & Urban Affairs, GoI, Anupam Mishra elaborated on the implementation of RERA and mentioned that construction industry is the largest employer after agriculture and housing is the fundamental requirement. He said till 70 years of independence, there was no regulator in the real estate sector, however a Landmark Central Act- Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act, 2016 (RERA) was passed in March, 2016 to encourage greater transparency, accountability and financial discipline in Real Estate Sector, RERA is applicable to all the

States and Union Territories (UTs) except Jammu & Kashmir, RERA protects the interest of home buyers by promoting greater transparency, citizen centricity, accountability and financial discipline, he added.

Secretary Ministry of Housing & Urban Affairs, GoI, Durga Shanker Mishra gave a review on the presentation of RERA, Smart City Mission, PMAY, Swachh Bharat Mission, Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana- National Urban Livelihood Mission (DAY-NULM), Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT), MoHUA. He deliberated on the status of the NE states and urged them to speed up the progress of the different projects and schemes for completing the urban flagship mission. He also advised them to take examples from other states by visiting and learning their technologies they are implementing.

In his review of Real Estate Act, 2016 (RERA), he

mentioned the importance of RERA, the relationship between the builder and the buyer, whether they are commercial or home buyers. RERA makes it mandatory for all commercial and residential real estate projects where the land is over 500 square meters, or eight apartments, to register with the Real Estate Regulatory Authority in order to provide greater transparency in project marketing and execution. He also added that this act does not conflict with land holding system of the State as provided under the constitution of India. He further said that the Act

provides benefit for consumers. Mishra asked the concerned departments that their major focus should be basic amenities, databases, power and electricity, social security of the State which can be achieved and monitored once they have installed Smart Command Control Command Centre. He also mentioned that the Centre has been proactively following the 'Look and Act East Policy' for transformation of North East India and that the Prime Minister has given a high priority for the development of NE region in the country.

## ZHIMOMI ATTENDS GRAMEEN MEETING AT NEW DELHI

Minister of PHED, N. Jacob Zhimomi along with Commissioner & Secretary Water Resources, Nagaland attended the meeting convened by Union Minister for Jal Shakti, Government of India with the State Ministers on Water Conservation, Rural Drinking Water Supply and Swachh Bharat Mission (GRAMEEN) which was held on 11<sup>th</sup> June 2019 at Vidyan Bhawan, New Delhi. All the participating Ministers from the states had congratulated the Union Minister, Gajendra Singh Shekhawat for convening the meeting within a short span of time after formation of the new Government and also creation of new ministry called Jal Shakti Mantralaya (Drinking Water & Sanitation) and gave assurance to work together under his able leadership.

In his speech, he mentioned that only 48.76% of water supply connectivity had been covered in Nagaland, and 51.3% remains partially covered. He also mentioned that the Department of Drinking Water and the Department of Water resources have been amalgamated to the Ministry of Jal Shakti Mantralaya. The meeting ended with a brief note from the Secretary Jal Shakti Mantralaya Government of India.

## WORLD BLOOD DONOR DAY CELEBRATED AT KOHMA

Along with the rest of the country, World Blood Donor Day was celebrated on 14<sup>th</sup> June, 2019 at Mount Olive College, Kohima under the theme "Safe Blood for All". The programme was organised by Naga Hospital Authority Kohima (NHAK) in collaboration with Red Ribbon Club and Mount Olive College, Kohima.

Every year on the birth anniversary of Karl Landsteiner on 14<sup>th</sup> June, World Blood Donor Day is celebrated to raise awareness of the need for safe blood and blood products, and to thank blood donors for their voluntary, life-saving gifts of blood.

Medical Officer Blood Bank, Dr. Avila Sangtam, speaking on the importance of Blood donation, highlighted that one should not only look at one side of giving blood to the patient but it is also very important to know the safety of the donor. She

informed that there are three categories that a donor can donate and cannot donate- Temporary deferral- where a donor will not be able to donate for a certain amount of time. eg:- related to women's menstrual cycle period, breastfeeding, under medication, T.B , Typhoid.

Permanent deferral- where donor will not be able to donate for a life time eg:- cancer, AIDs, heart disease, diabetes, mental illness, hepatitis-B

Self deferral- where donor is aware of the situation and will not be able to donate eg:- the donor is aware of the sickness and deferred from donating. She also added that, it is mandatory for screening five diseases in India - HIV 1and 2, Hepatitis -B, Hepatitis-C, Syphilis and Malaria.

She apprised that, one who has the risk factor of such associated diseases should not donate, as the blood, one is going to donate is going to a sick person. Hence, urged them to make themselves always aware of the situation and criteria before donating.

Avila also notified on certain criteria for donating blood - the donor should be of age between 18-60 years, should weight 45kg or more, pulse should be 60 to 100 beats per minute, Haemoglobin should be minimum 12.5gm/dl. She further informed that, Donor counselling and screening through questionnaire before donation is an important process not only to ensure blood safety but also to recruit and retain regular voluntary non remunerated donor.

The programme was chaired by Ajanbeni Oving. Invocation was done by Chaplain, MOCK, Khekali Aye. Welcome address was delivered by Principal, MOCK, Dr. N. Tiwary. Special Number was presented by Jatphoa Konyak. While vote of thanks was delivered by Medical Officer Blood Bank, Dr. Avila Sangtam.

Altogether, 28 donors including teachers, VBDAK members and students donated their blood to mark the World Blood Donor Day.

**WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY 2019**

World Environment Day is the United Nation's principal vehicle for encouraging awareness and action for the protection of the environment and is observed on 5<sup>th</sup> of June every year. It was established by the UN General Assembly in the year 1972 and was first observed in the year 1974. Since then, it has been a flagship campaign for raising awareness on emerging environmental issues such as marine pollution, human overpopulation, global warming, sustainable consumption and wildlife crime and has become a global platform for public outreach with participation from over 143 countries annually.

The theme for World Environment Day 2019 is "Air Pollution" with China as the global host. Approximately 7 million people around the world die prematurely each year from air pollution with about 4 million of these deaths occurring in Asia-Pacific. World Environment Day 2019 will urge governments, industry, communities, and individuals to come together to explore renewable energy and green technologies, and improve air quality in cities and regions across the world.

The Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change (MoEF&CC), Government of India has finalized and launched the National Clean Air Program (NCAP) on 10<sup>th</sup> January 2019 as a time bound national level strategy for pan India implementation to tackle the air pollution problem across the country in a comprehensive manner. Under the NCAP, the air quality levels 102 cities of India have been identified to have exceeded the prescribed National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS). These cities have been classified as non-attainment cities and Dimapur and Kohima are included under the same. In this regard, an action plan has been prepared and shall

be implemented by the state in coordination with the Nagaland Pollution Control Board and various stakeholder departments such as Department of Environment, Forests & Climate Change, Department of Industries & Commerce, Urban Development Department, Transport Department, Municipal/Town Councils, Traffic Police, Department of New and Renewable Energy, Department of Legal Metrology & Consumer Protection, Town Planning, Border Roads, PWD and District Administration.

Air pollution in Nagaland can be traced to sources such as road dust from poorly maintained roads, vehicular emissions further enhanced by traffic congestion, burning of waste, emissions from small scale industries and construction and demolition activities. While all stakeholders have their own role to play in controlling the level of air pollution, the theme for this year's World Environment Day is also a call to all citizens to come forward and play their part in dealing with air pollution.

Deforestation occurring especially with increasing urbanization has been a rising concern in recent decades especially since the recognition that it is the cause of climate change. It is also common knowledge that trees provide us with the oxygen we breathe, absorb carbon dioxide which is a greenhouse gas (and thus a major contributor to global warming) and also add aesthetic value while lowering the temperature of a place by providing shade and through transpiration of water. With all these benefits in mind, it is important to encourage the protection of existing trees as well as to plant more of them for a healthy environment.

Let us all join hands in minimizing air pollution and work for a greener, healthier and better Nagaland.
