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# OFFICIAL ORDERS and NOTIFICATIONS

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## **JUSTICE UMA NATH SINGH APPOINTED AS LOKAYUKTA OF NAGALAND**

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In exercise of the powers conferred on the State Government under Section 3(1) and (2) of the Nagaland Lokayukta Act 2017 (Act 1 of 2018) read with the Nagaland Lokayukta Act (Amendment) Ordinance 2019 (No.1 of 2019), the Governor of Nagaland appointed Justice Uma Nath Singh, former Chief Justice of Meghalaya High Court as the Lokayukta of Nagaland.

Justice Uma Nath Singh, the first Lokayukta of Nagaland shall hold office for a term of 5 (five) years or till he attains the age of 70 years, or whichever is earlier.

The other terms of office and conditions of service shall be as stipulated in Section 7 (1) to (4) of the Nagaland Lokayukta Act 2017 (Act 1 of 2018).

Governor P. B. Acharya administered the Oath of Office to Justice Uma Nath Singh as the Lokayukta of Nagaland on 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2019 at a programme held at Durbar Hall, Raj Bhavan Kohima.

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## **CREATION OF SDO (SOIL CONSERVATION) OFFICE AT SEYOCHUNG**

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The Department of Soil & Water Conservation in a notification informed that the Government of Nagaland has issued order for creation of Sub-Divisional Office (Soil Conservation) Office at Seyochung, Kiphire district under the Soil & Water Conservation Department, Nagaland. The new Sub-Divisional Officer (Soil Conservation) Office will be manned by deployment of existing officers/staff and there will be no creation of posts for the new office.

This was issued with the approval of Personnel & Administrative Reforms Department vide their U.O. No. 542 dated 17-09-2018 and concurrence of the Finance Department vide RFC/ESTT.No. 49/03 dated 28-09-2018.

This has the approval of the Cabinet vide OM No.CAB- 2/2013(Pt) dated 27-11-2018.

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## **DDOs DIRECTED TO STRICTLY FOLLOW GUIDELINES**

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Chief Secretary, Temjen Toy IAS, in an office memorandum, has informed that in order to facilitate smooth and correct release of payment, including GST to the contractors and suppliers, all the concerned DDOs have been directed to strictly adhere to the following conditions before releasing any payments for supplies, including works contract:

1. Contractors or suppliers (the word 'supplier' includes works contractors), who are supplying taxable goods and services to:
  - a. A department or establishment of the Central Government or State Government;
  - b. Local authority
  - c. Governmental agencies

- d. Such persons or category of persons as may be notified by the Government on the recommendations of the Council shall submit Tax Invoice with a consecutive serial number not exceeding 16 characters, in one or multiple series, containing alphabets or numbers or special characters - hyphen or dash and slash symbolized as “-” and “/” respectively, unique for a financial year, as prescribed under Rule 46 of Nagaland GST Rules 2017 for preparation of bill and release of payment.
2. Every DDO shall ensure that the GSTIN of the supplier is genuine and active. In order to confirm the activeness of the GSTIN, DDO can verify by logging in to <https://www.gov.in> and go to Search by GSTIN/UIN in the Search Taxpayer Menu.
3. Every DDO shall ensure that the supplier has filed previous period of GST Return. In order to confirm filing of GST Return, DDO must insist upon a printout copy of GSTR-3B, GSTR-1 and challan in form PMT - 06 with watermark impression on the body of those documents as “FINAL,” in the case of consolidated payment challan, comprising of more than one transactions, challan pertaining to the supply made against which the payment is to be released, should be separately created end payment made accordingly.
4. Before initiating any payment, every DDO shall ensure payment of all outstanding liabilities, where the suppliers have signed an undertaking in Annexure “A” of Office Memorandum No.FIN/REV-3/GST/I/03/450 dated 11<sup>th</sup> September 2017. If any suppliers of goods and services had failed to pay any outstanding liabilities under GST and filed returns, all subsequent payments against those suppliers must be withheld till such tax liabilities are discharged.

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## **DIRECTION ON MAKING ALL PUBLIC PLACES ACCESSIBLE AND BARRIER FREE**

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Pursuant to the judgement of the Supreme Court dated 15<sup>th</sup> December 2017 in the Writ Petition (Civil) No.243 of 2005 with Writ Petition (Civil) No.228 of 2008 on making all public places accessible and barrier free, the management of all Government Schools, Government aided Schools and Private Schools in Nagaland have been directed to adhere to the judgement order and make their respective schools barrier free and accessible for children with special needs through construction of ramps/stair lifts/lifts/others. Simultaneously, all school establishments should ensure that children with special needs are not denied admission to schools.

## LRD BIDS FAREWELL TO OUTGOING DIRECTOR

The Department of Land Resources organised a farewell programme in honor of the outgoing Director, Hoto Yeptho on 31<sup>st</sup> January 2019 at Directorate of Land Resources, Kohima.

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## **NBSE organizes One Day Seminar on Cyber Safety**

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The Nagaland Board of School Education (NBSE), Kohima organized a one day seminar for the Heads of Institutions on Cyber Safety on 31<sup>st</sup> January 2019 at Baptist High, Kohima.

Rakshit Tandon, Cyber Security Expert Consultant - Internet and Mobile Association of India said that India's youth might be hailed as 'digital citizens' given their addiction to technology but ironically most of them are unaware of the existing cyber laws. He

emphasized on the urgent need of the schools and parents to teach and adopt steps to protect students from any foreseeable harm associated with the use of technology.

Tandon also spoke on the need to limit youngster's recreational screen time for healthy lifestyle. Parental ignorance can be one of the biggest

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threats when children use the internet without supervision. It is important for parents to be aware of the dangers of cyber defamation, cyber bullying, data breach, social media scams, morphing of photographs by cyber criminals, hacking, cheating

by impersonation and the negative psychological effects of violent games. He suggested several safety measures of ensuring age appropriate use of internet, for instance, social media age restrictions and strict monitoring of the contents of online games.

## STREET FOOD FESTIVAL AND JOB MELA LAUNCHED

Shehri Samridhi Utsav-Street Food festival and Job Mela construed as 'Urban Prosperity Festival' was organised by State Urban Development Agency in collaboration with Food Safety, Nagaland under Health & Family Welfare and Kohima Municipal Council from 1<sup>st</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> February 2019 at Kohima. The fortnightly programme was launched by Minister, Urban Development and Municipal Affairs, Metsubo Jamir on 1<sup>st</sup> February 2019 at the Directorate of Urban Development, Kohima.

Metsubo said that 'urban and rural' are complementary to each other and stated that urban prosperity actually depends on rural prosperity. He said requirements in urban areas are mostly provided by the people domiciled in rural areas for which, he strongly emphasized the importance of having proper markets in towns for the people of rural areas to sell their products.

He also stressed on the importance of forming SHGs in every ward or colony as they represent the people who can assist the government and community when it comes to maintenance and protection of public assets and disposal of waste.

Advisor, Rural Development, Dr. Neikiesalie Nicky Kire stated that the scheme should percolate down even to the extent of wards and colonies so as to get maximum benefit from it especially by poor and downtrodden urban dwellers to earn their livelihood.

Principal Secretary, UDD, Abhishek Singh, IAS while highlighting about the functions and aims of the department said that the prime focus is to provide basic amenities and urban facilities access, extending outreach to poorest of the poor. He also pointed out the issues of the SHGs as well as the problems faced

by the street vendor categories which we often tend to ignore. He briefed about the various schemes, programmes and loans provided at a subsidized rate for self-employment ventures and establishing shelter for the homeless by enhancing sustainable livelihood opportunities offered by the Urban Development Department. Furthermore, he urged the Municipal Council to facilitate the recognized street vendors and provide identity cards to the identified families and give designated places and timings for their venture.

Workshop was also conducted by Food Safety (Health & Family Welfare), AYUSH (Health & Family Welfare) and Urban Development (SUDA) and job mela by IJIT, Kohima, AICSM, Wokha and Zynorics Initiative, Kohima.

The two week long Shehri Samridhi Utsav 2019, a Street Food Festival began with the theme, 'Eat safe, eat healthy and eat fortified' at High School junction Kohima on 4<sup>th</sup> February 2019.

The two-day XIV Annual Conference Association of Oncologists of North East India (AONEI) inauguration programme was held at Hotel Japfu, Kohima on 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2019.

Himato Zhimomi who was the special guest at the inaugural function said that our state has the highest record of patients with pharyngeal cancer in the Northeast and the world, according to Indian National Cancer Registry data and he urged the doctors in this

field to fight the disease together. He also stated that the Tertiary Cancer Centre (TCC) will operate at Naga Hospital Kohima by the end of 2019 and assured that the goal of the government is to upgrade the TCC to a State Cancer Institute in the next two or three years. Himato also said that the State's first Medical College will come up in two years and assured that Oncology will be a department which will be of prime importance. Under Prime Minister's scheme Cancer Care programme, special care will be given to the People Below Poverty (PBL) and PBL cardholders will be given benefits such as reimbursements and free cashless cancer treatment of upto Rs. 5 lakh.

Former Chief Secretary, Banuo Z. Jamir (IAS) who shared a special message said that she was diagnosed with cancer 2<sup>nd</sup> Stage in the year 2001 and it took her four years to recover. She said in those days, so little was known about this disease in our state and families were reluctant to talk about it. She shared the agony, mental and physical pain she underwent during her illness as there were no proper facilities available in our state. Banuo suggest that counselling should be given to cancer patients and their family since it is an important part of the healing process and doctors should also give time and answer queries from the patients. She encouraged the AONEI to have more conferences in future as discussions and talks

lead to advancement and also spread awareness about cancer care.

In the keynote address, Dr. A. K. Kalita, President of AONEI said that the AONEI was founded to share a platform where oncologists from all parts of Northeast India come to meet and discuss about the different profiles of cancer in their respective states and what advancement can be done for its treatment and also share ideas and knowledge. He also said that for setting up Cancer Institutes, government assistance is needed.

Dr. Vikas Jagtap, Secretary AONEI, in his speech said that during such annual conferences, oncologists exchange knowledge, community problems faced in North East, patients' profiles in each state, spread awareness programmes etc.

Dr. Thorhusie Katiry, Organising Chairman, AONEI 2019 said that Nagaland has recorded the highest number of nasopharyngeal cancer patients in the country with 15.3% male and 10.8% female and holding AONEI conference in our state will serve as a catalyst for strengthening the transfer of scientific knowledge and improve the standard of oncology practice in the north east, he added.

Principal Secretary, Health & Family Welfare, I. Himato Zhimomi also released the AONIE 2019 Souvenir during the function.

## 1<sup>st</sup> PHASE OF NDD 2019 LAUNCHED

With the initiative of Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India, a state level programme of National Deworming Day (NDD) was launched at Mezbur Higher Secondary School, Kohima under the aegis of Health & Family Welfare Department, Nagaland on 8<sup>th</sup> February 2019.

Programme Officer (RMNCH+A), Dr. Atoshe Sema in his keynote address said that NDD is a fixed day approach where all children between 1-19 years of age should receive treatment for parasitic intestinal worms, STH (Soil Transmitted Helminthiasis) through the platform of schools and anganwadi centres.

Dr. Atoshe said the World Health Organization (WHO) recommends deworming of all school age and pre-school age children, with the global target aiming to eliminate morbidity due to worms (soil-transmitted helminths) in children by 2020. The Government of India aims to cover at least 90% of all children through the NDD programme. WHO further says that 65% of children in India between 1-14 years are at

risk of worm infestation. Worm infection in children leads to anaemia, weakness, nutritional impairment, loss of appetite, vomiting, diarrhoea, weight loss etc. A simple intervention in the form of one tablet of albendazole (safe and proven) avoids all these and indirectly helps children in improving concentration and learning capacity.

Dr. Atoshe further said that this programme will be carried out in coordination amongst three departments in convergence namely, Health & Family Welfare, School Education, and Women & Child Development (ICDS). With the target of 6,36,161 in August 2018, the state could deworm 5,97,739 children across the 11 districts with an achievement rate of 93.96%. In February 2019 state target is the same as August 2018 i.e. 6,36,161 children.

Mission Director, NHM, Health & Family Welfare, Dr. Kevichusa Medikhru launched the 1st Phase of NDD.

Union Minister of State for Social Justice & Empowerment, Ramdas Athawale paid his maiden visit to Nagaland and held a press conference at Raj Bhavan, Kohima on 18<sup>th</sup> February 2019.

Ramdas said there are more than two crore people with disabilities in the country and claimed that the Central Government is fully supporting the disabled people. He said the Government has announced a hike of old age pension from Rs. 300 to Rs. 3000 in the 2019-2020 Union Budget.

The Minister was scheduled to visit Mon for distribution of appliances for empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) under the RVY scheme, however, bad weather prevented his chopper from landing

causing his return to Kohima. He, however, added that wheel chairs were distributed to PwDs in Mon in his absence.

## Governor Addresses 3<sup>rd</sup> Session of the 13<sup>th</sup> NLA

The Third Session of the Thirteenth Nagaland Legislative Assembly began on 21<sup>st</sup> February 2019 at NLA Secretariat, Kohima.

While delivering his address, Governor, P. B. Acharya mentioned that early resolution of the Naga political issue was top priority. He also said that a Joint Legislators Forum (JLF) was unanimously reconstituted to facilitate in bringing about a solution that is honourable, inclusive, sustainable and acceptable to the people. On Citizenship Amendment Bill (CAB) 2019, he appreciated the Gol for listening to the voice of the people with regard to the proposed Bill, which was opposed and rejected by Government of Nagaland civil societies, tribal Hohos, NGOs and political parties.

To tackle corruption and ensure fair play and justice, Governor said that Lokayukta has been appointed for the State. The CM dashboard which gives real time information about key works of various departments was awarded by the Indian Express Group as one of the best use of technological applications. He stated that the government plans on extending this and will ensure that all Village Councils and VDBs will have their own websites in the next one year.

Acharya also mentioned that at present, all districts in Nagaland have Women Police Stations and this has ensured that Nagaland remains one of the safest states for women in the country.

The Governor ensured timely release of scholarships to students even when there is delay in release of instalments from Government of India. He cited that the Government has introduced Ex-Gratia scheme for students who are studying outside the State. Under the Ex-Gratia scheme, an amount of Rs. 5 lakh is given as financial assistance to the family of the deceased student. For the welfare of SSA and RMSA teachers, pay scale has been approved even though funding for the same has been restricted to fixed amounts by the Government of India. SCERT and Department of School Education have introduced Nagaland Heritage Studies (NHS) text book for classes 1 to 5. SCERT has also introduced a 9-month Diploma Course on School Counselling.

Governor said that the Health Department will carry out vigorous checks on quality of food products, adulteration and use of harmful chemicals for preservation by vendors. The Municipal Affairs department also organised Street Food Festivals in Kohima and other urban areas as part of Shehri Samridhhi Utsav.

Acharya added that for better health care, the State Government has signed a MoU for establishment of a National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) Branch at Dimapur. The Measles Rubella Vaccination Campaign achieved 97.80% of the target due to coordinated efforts of the Health & Family Welfare Department personnel and positive support of the public and institutions. The upgraded new hospital at Kiphire was inaugurated on 9th November 2018 and two integrated AYUSH Hospitals - 30 bedded at Noklak and 10 bedded at Dimapur were made fully functional in 2018. Another two AYUSH Hospitals at Razha Chedema in Kohima and Sabangya under Mokochung are under construction. The work order for construction of Medical College at Kohima has already been issued and all necessary steps will be taken to ensure that the aspirations of people for a medical college will be a reality.

Acharya stated that the key focus has been to ensure doubling of farmers' income with special

thrust on organic farming, horticulture, animal husbandry, coffee production and sericulture. On 19<sup>th</sup> January 2019, FOCUS – Fostering Climate Resilient Upland Agriculture System Project in association with International Fund for Agriculture Development (IFAD) was launched with the objective of improving farming in the State.

Governor said that the National Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe Hub (NSSH) launched on 5th February 2019 by the Department of Industries & Commerce provides professional support to SC/ ST entrepreneurs under the Central Government Procurement Policy Order, 2012.

Governor mentioned that Software Technology Park of India (STPI) is at an advanced stage of completion and once it is completed, it will encourage local entrepreneurs and also help promote and boost Software Exports. A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) has been signed with e-Governance Academy of Estonia for setting up of eGovernance Academy of Nagaland (eGAN).

Under Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme, the Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India has approved Rs. 127 lakh person days for the State of Nagaland amounting to Rs. 315 crore. Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana – National Rural Livelihood Mission has been taken up in 639 villages under 43 Blocks in 9 Districts. 4545 Self Help Groups are actively engaged in income generating activities covering 42,200 households. Under Phase-III RURBAN Mission, Kohima Sadar cluster, comprising of Kohima village, Chedema and Chedema Model has been taken up during 2018-19. Administrative fund for Rs. 35 lakh has been released for preparation of Integrated Cluster Action Plan (ICAP).

Governor said that a Cabinet Meeting was convened on 9<sup>th</sup> November 2018 in the Aspirational District of Kiphire wherein it decided to extend the model of better monitoring and supervision of government and schemes to all districts by identifying one Aspirational Block in each of the remaining 10

districts. For Kiphire district, a corpus of Rs. 1 crore has been set up for taking up projects to meet developmental gaps.

Acharya said that road communication is essential for boosting socio-economic development of the State. He added that projects are being taken up through Special Road programmes, like NABARD-RIDF, PMGSY and Gol funding under Ministry of Road Transport & Highways. Also stressing on the importance of Air and Rail connectivity, he said that the State Government is pursuing with Gol for approval of the Greenfield Airport at Ciethu, Kohima. Also in order to augment air services for the State, three new routes were taken up under the Regional Connectivity Scheme (UDAN) and very soon Dimapur will be connected with Guwahati, Imphal and Dibrugarh. He added that approvals for two helicopters in all district headquarters are better connected now which is beneficial for the citizens. Also for rail connectivity, in the Union Budget 2019-20, a sum of Rs. 500 crore has been allocated for connecting Dimapur with Kohima.

In the Power sector, augmentation of power supply to bridge the critical gaps between demand and supply of power has been taken up by upgradation of existing 100 MVA to 200 MVA at Dimapur, Acharya said. 100% household electrification in rural and urban areas under Saubhagya Scheme was completed in December 2018 and augmentation of Water Supply to Wokha town and New Peren District HQ has been commissioned. The Zaru Project for augmenting the Water Supply to Kohima is ready for commissioning.

Governor mentioned that to commemorate the birth centenary celebrations of Dr. T Ao, installation of Astro Turf at I.G Stadium, Kohima, was completed and inaugurated on 28<sup>th</sup> January 2019. The stadium will soon be equipped with floodlights and will host the prestigious Dr. T. Ao North East Football Tournament this year. Sports infrastructure facilities have been augmented by construction of outdoor stadiums at Pughoboto and Mon. Nagaland Sports Policy is also being finalised that will create a culture of sports from grassroot level.

In tourism sector, Governor said that the government has taken up several innovative concepts and ideas with the aim of promoting the state's tourism in a sustainable manner. He further added that Mini Hornbill Festivals coinciding with respective tribal festivals has been a huge success. Other festivals such as Dzukou Valley Festival, Amur Falcon Conservation Week and Festival at Doyang, the

People's Festival at Khezhakeno have the potential of making Nagaland a top tourist destination in the country.

He called upon the elected members of the House to come together in a constructive manner and leave behind narrow political interests and work hand in hand for the welfare of the State.

## OBITUARY REFERENCES MADE DURING THE 3<sup>rd</sup> SESSION OF THE 13<sup>th</sup> NLA

Deputy Speaker, Zhaleo Rio made obituary references to former Deputy Speaker, Imtikumzuk Longkumer who passed away on 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2018. He was 51 and is survived by his wife, one son and four daughters. Zhaleo said Imtikumzuk entered electoral politics in 2008 and in 2013, he became a MLA for the first time. Since then, he had served as Deputy Speaker of the NLA and as a Parliamentary Secretary for Information & Public Relations in the 12<sup>th</sup> NLA. He contested the state assembly elections 2018 on the Nationalist Democratic Progressive Party ticket and was re-elected and appointed as Advisor for Excise and Sericulture till he breathed his last. Imtikumzuk joined politics as General Secretary of the ACYC in 1993, and he was PS to Chief Minister, S. C. Jamir during 1998-2003.

Making obituary reference to former Minister and four-time MLA, K. Yamakam who passed away in Dimapur after a brief illness at the age of 89 and survived by his wife, four sons, four daughters and 19 grandchildren, Zhaleo said Yamakam was consecutively elected four times from 1989-2003 from 58 Shamator-Chessore assembly constituency. Hailing from Sangphur village under Tuensang district, he had served as Minister for Soil & Water Conservation, Sericulture (1993) and Minister for Horticulture, Sericulture, Relief and Rehabilitation (1998). Late Yamakam founded the Sangphur Students Union in the 1950s. He also served as an executive member in the Yimchunger Tribal Council (YTC) and

later as Advisor, YTC. He served as a Dobashi and later went on to become Head Dobashi in the 1970s.

The members present observed a two minute silence for the two departed souls.

## Starred Questions raised on the second day of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Session of 13<sup>th</sup> NLA

On the second day of the Third session of the Thirteenth Nagaland Legislative Assembly i.e, on 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2019, during the starred question hour, MLA Yitachu asked the Minister in-charge of CAWD to furnish the names and places of all the administrative office and GA Rest House in the state under construction and give details of the amount earmarked against each work during 2018-2019. Replying to the starred question, Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio and Minister in-charge of CAWD said that GA Rest House were constructed in Mokokchung, Akuluto, Sakshi, Khuza, Satoi, Aboi, Changtonya, Dhansiripar, Nuiland, Pfutsero, Zuketsa, V. K. town, Tuli, Chessore, Wakching, Khonsa, Meluri and Sanis. He further commented that other works will be taken up as per the provision availability.

Chotisuh Sazo, MLA questioned the Minister in-charge of Tourism on the total expenditure for Hornbill Festival 2018 and Mini Hornbill Festivals to which the Minister replied that the total expenditure was Rs. 800.2 lakh, and with regard to the district wise

expenditure, the total allocation was Rs. 250 lakh out of which Rs. 150 lakh has been utilised and remaining balance is Rs. 100 lakh.

Dr. Imtiwapang Aier, MLA questioned the Minister of Environment, Forests & Climate Change on the total revenue generated by the Department and its utilization for the year 2018-19 and also the details of activities initiated to protect the environment from global warming. C.M. Chang, Minister, Environment, Forests & Climate Change said the total revenue of the department is Rs. 6,42,64,926 and the revenue collected is remitted to the government treasury under the following heads - revenue, house tax and professional tax and that the revenue is not utilized by the department. On the activities to protect the environment from global warming, he said that the department has designated a nodal department on climate change. The Nagaland State Action Plan was approved by the Government of India in 2014. He also said that the department has carried out plantation activities and has also initiated community conservation areas across the state to encourage preservation of compact forest areas.

Replying to Kuzholuzo Nienu, MLA on whether the amount of Rs. 96 crore allocated by HPC to meet backlog of VDBs GIA 2014-15, 15-16 and 2017- 18 has been released to all the 11 districts, the Minister-in-charge of Rural Development said that it has been allocated.

Responding to MLA C.L. John on the total number of MBBS and BDS seats allocated to the state in the last three years, Minister for Health & Family Welfare stated that a total of 159 MBBS and 36 BDS seats were allocated to the state. On increase in the number of seats, the Minister said that three additional seats were allocated during 2018-19.

Minister in-charge of Home, Y. Patton replying to MLA, Dr. Chumben Murry on the proposal to create a police outpost in Wozhuro under Wokha district said that the proposal was sent to the Government on 30<sup>th</sup> May 2016. However, the Government conveyed that post creation is not possible and were asked to

re-submit the proposal as to how the police outpost can be manned without post creation. Replying to supplementary question raised on creation of Police outpost in Wozhuro, the Minister replied that it will be created only after Wokha district is upgraded to SP strength.

Replying to MLA Yitachu on the number of Government High Schools in the state, the Minister-in-charge of School Education, Temjen Imna Along stated that there are 246 GHSs in the state. On GHS without HM and both HM and AHM, the Minister said that there are 38 GHSs without HM and 32 GHSs without both AM and AHM. He also stated that rationalization of HM and AHM is under process.

Replying to MLA Er. Picto Shohe on the status of upgradation of Khelhoshe Polytechnic Atoizu, the Minister for Higher & Technical Education, Temjen Imna Along stated that AICTE guidelines and regulation, accreditation from National Board of Accreditation (NBA) New Delhi is mandatory for upgradation of existing diploma programme to degree course. In this regard, the Directorate of Technical Education and the Institute (KPA) are jointly working for getting accreditation from NBA. Self-Assessment Report (SAR) is under preparation by the institute and will be submitted to NBA within the year 2019. The process of upgradation from diploma to degree course will be initiated only after getting accreditation from NBA, New Delhi.

Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio, while replying to a starred question on MGNREGA, said that a total amount of Rs. 1,38,86,48,000/- was received in two installments during 2018-19, Rs. 56,64,48,000/- as the first installment and another sum of Rs. 82,22,00,000/- as the second installment from the Government of India. He also added that 127.01 lakh man-days were allotted (approved labour budget) under MGNREGA during 2018-19.

Replying to a started question on construction of Nagaland Medical College, Minister of Health & Family Welfare, S. Pangnyu Phom said out of the total of Rs. 27.50 crore received and Rs. 25.00 crore in CD,

Rs. 1,21,74,000 has been incurred till date against the Nagaland Medical College, Kohima. The Gol has released Rs. 153 crore of the total project cost of Rs. 189.00 crore to the state treasury so far. He clarified that the project includes all the basic criteria of construction of college including hostels for boys and girls.

Replying to a starred question raised by MLA Yitachu on pension payment, Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio said that the Account General, Nagaland has made records available only upto December 2018, and as per records furnished, the total amount spent on account of pensions and other Retirement Benefits from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2018 to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2018 is Rs. 1112.72 crore. He further added that the anticipated expenditure for pensions and other retirement benefits for the months of January, February and March 2019 is estimated to be Rs. 612.14 crore.

Minister for Roads & Bridges, Tongpang Ozukum, while replying to a question raised by MLA Dr. Chumben Murry, informed the House that Task Force has already been set up in the division and maintenance is part of the classification of road maintenance operation in the road maintenance policy. He maintained that he has already directed all the Executive Engineers of the department to ensure

clearing of roadside jungles and that he has also directed the Additional Chief Engineer in-charge of Task Force in order to ensure that periodical checking is conducted. The Minister also stated that during 2018-19, vital road connectivity from NH-29 at Burma Camp to Lahorijan river with a major bridge of 30 meter span has been completed and 6 additional road of 795 km stretch have been approved 'in principle' to be brought under National Highways and another two laning of NH-02, Botsa-Wokha, Yisemyong to Unger and various improvement works at Kohima and Dimapur city portion road are taken up on war footing.

In an unstarred question on the details of revenue earned by CEO Dimapur Municipal Affairs, Minister for Urban Development and Municipal Affairs, Metsubo Jamir replied that the total revenue earned by CEO Dimapur Municipal Council for the year 2017-2018 was Rs.13,99,98,429/- and for 2018 -2019 was Rs. 10,29,06,773. To the other query regarding the expenditure incurred by Dimapur Municipal Council for undertaking various development activities in Dimapur, the Minister replied that the expenditure incurred for the year 2017-2018 stands Rs.12,35,45,293 and for the year 2018-2019, the expenditure incurred was Rs.12,14,39,789.

## DISCUSSION ON THE AMENDMENT TO GOVERNMENT RESOLUTION ON CAB 2019

On the third day of the Third session of the Thirteenth Nagaland Legislative Assembly, i.e. on 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2019, the Citizenship Amendment Bill (CAB) 2019 was discussed at length in the August House and after which, the House adopted the resolution as follows:

Whereas the Citizenship Amendment Bill, 2019 (CAB) is being pursued by the Central Government for enactment, despite opposition and rejection by Governments, political parties, tribal organizations, civil societies and others in the North East India including the State of Nagaland, who are deeply

concerned with the protection and preservation of indigenous tribes from being demographically overwhelmed by conferment of citizenship on illegal immigrants as envisaged by the said Bill:

1. To sternly oppose and outrightly reject the CAB which shall not be implemented in Nagaland as it will impact the unique history and status of the Nagas under the Constitution of India;
2. To express solidarity with the states and communities of the North East India in their struggle against the implementation of the CAB since it has the potential of changing the

- demographic profile which will be against the interest of indigenous tribes in the NE states and can divest them of their constitutionally guaranteed political, cultural and economic rights;
3. To re-affirm the constitutional guarantee given by Article 371A which is part and parcel of the historic 16 Point Agreement that led to formation of Nagaland State and protects, defends and safeguards the customary way of life of Nagas, our right to land and its resources etc. without interference by parliamentary enactments like the CAB, though it is yet to become a law;
  4. To reiterate the constitutional position as aforesaid that, except the indigenous population in Nagaland, nobody is entitled to own land and resources in our state, that has been guaranteed not only by Article 371A(l)(a) of the Constitution of India but also by the Inner Line Permit Notification issued under the Bengal and Eastern Frontier Regulations, 1873, which was included and reiterated as Point No. 16 of the 16 Point Agreement; and
  5. To authorize the Speaker to communicate the aforesaid resolutions to the Union Parliament.

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## CM PRESENTS 2019-20 BUDGET FOR THE STATE

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Chief Minister and Minister in-charge of Finance Neiphiu Rio presented the budget for the year 2019-2020 on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of the Third session of the Thirteenth Nagaland Legislative Assembly at the NLA Secretariat, Kohima on 25<sup>th</sup> February 2019.

Delivering the budget speech, Chief Minister, Rio said that the current financial year 2018-19 will close with an estimated deficit of Rs. 1,661.68 crore. The current year's transaction is estimated to result in a positive balance of Rs. 49.70 crore, however, he said that because of the negative opening balance of Rs. 1,661.68 crore, the year 2019-20 is estimated to close with a negative balance of Rs. 1,611.98 crore. He also said that it has been a difficult year confronted with many outstanding liabilities and court cases in connection with many ongoing projects, which had been left unattended for several years.

Rio added that the Political Affairs Committee (PAC) of the Government carried out a consultative meeting with civil society organizations, tribal hohos, and NGOs on 11<sup>th</sup> May 2018 and a resolution was adopted to reconstitute the Joint Legislators' Forum (JLF) on the Naga political issue. He further said that the JLF cuts across party affiliations and political ideologies as all of us come unitedly under one banner to resolve the decades old issue in the greater interest of our people.

Rio said that his Government decided to place first priority on improvement of town roads after seeing and experiencing the acute state of neglect, and the hardship the public are facing on a daily basis. He added that the duty of any Government of the day is to ensure that people have a reasonable standard of road infrastructure and will continue to work to provide good roads in all parts of the State.

Rio said that the adverse financial position is mainly due to the huge number of Government employees, whose salary requirements consume much of the funds that could otherwise have been used for developmental activities. He called upon the Government servants to perform their duties conscientiously and enhance their productivity for the benefit of the people

Rio expressed hope that from April 2020 onwards, the financial position of our State will see a marked improvement once the award period of the Fifteenth Finance Commission begins and this will enable the state government to invest more funds in developmental activities.

As announced in 2018 regarding the introduction of Holy Land and Pilgrimage Tours, Rio said that tours within the state to places and sites of historical and religious significance like Molungyimsen, Molungkimong, Impur etc will be added.

On the policy of promoting music as an industry, Rio said the revamped Music Policy of the State will engage the real stakeholders of the industry and undertake new initiatives of promoting all aspects of the music industry including capacity building, mentoring, promotion of bands and musicians, training music teachers and taking music and musicians from Nagaland to national and international platforms. The Hornbill International Rock Contest was a resounding success with record participation from within the State as well as from different parts of the country and abroad.

The tourism sector is a crucial cog in the economic wheel of Nagaland and added that it has the potential to significantly contribute towards the economy and generate employment across the State.

Commenting on the Commonwealth War Memorial which lies in the heart of Kohima as a standout landmark of the State Capital, Rio said to commemorate its 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, it has set up a State Level Committee and Working Committee. A year-long commemorative calendar of activities has been planned and we will be holding events, functions, services, seminars and festivals in partnership and collaboration with Governments and NGOs of Great Britain, Japan, Myanmar, the United States, the Defence and Home Ministries etc, he said. The events will also engage war veterans, students, families of those buried here and local communities. The aim is to convert this milestone year as an opportunity to tap the potentials of war and heritage tourism in a manner that will give a thrust to the tourism economy of the State.

Rio reaffirmed to take administration and governance to the doorsteps of the people and that the development plans will be inclusive. He added that as a first of its kind, a State Cabinet Meeting was held in the Aspirational District of Kiphire with Union Minister of State, Kiren Rijiju as special invitee. The Cabinet Ministers and Advisors and State machinery led by the Chief Secretary and Heads of Departments camped in Kiphire, interacted with all sections including civil

society, visited Government establishments and took a first-hand review of the ground situation in Kiphire district for the development of the district and the State as a whole.

The Chief Minister said that with saturation of employment in the Government sector, we need our youth to focus on other areas for gainful employment. He said that the Government has already approved the Nagaland Start-up Policy with the vision to establish Nagaland as a model start-up leader in the region, by creating a culture of entrepreneurship that nurtures creative and innovative youth, allowing them to build successful start-up companies, become job creators and contribute towards building a healthy and sustainable economy. The objective of the policy is to facilitate the growth of at least 500 start-ups in the next five years, with a focus on establishing innovative "Made in Nagaland" products and services, he added.

Rio stated that new policies to be introduced are Nagaland Innovation Fund, Nagaland Investor Network, create Entrepreneurship Incubators and set up Entrepreneurship Development Centres in schools. In addition, several exercises in the field of skill development in both the rural and urban sector are to be undertaken. Capacity building exercises form an important part of the activities of all the major government departments, and skill development initiatives under customized P3 programmes are creating significant employment opportunities, especially in the construction sector, he added.

In the field of sports and youth affairs, Rio said that the new astro-turf football pitch at the Indira Gandhi Stadium (IGS), Kohima and the addition of telecast quality floodlights and a synthetic track for athletics will make the IGS a top level sports facility. He added that in April 2019, Nagaland will be hosting the Dr. T. Ao North East Football Championships at Kohima to celebrate the energy and vibrancy of the region's youth in a festive atmosphere where there will be convergence of music, culture, food and art through the platform of football under the aegis of the All

India Football Federation. The development of football from the grassroot level upwards will be kick started in collaboration with the Bhaichung Bhutia Football Academy, the country's premier football institution. The Nagaland Marathon will be held in partnership with the All India Athletic Federation. Nagaland has become an international motor and adventure sports destination and the World War II Peace Rally will take the shape of an International Jeep Jamboree this year. The biennial Nagaland Olympics under the aegis of the Olympic Movement will be held later this year, it was disclosed.

On the commitment made by the government, the Chief Minister stated that it has established the Investment & Development Authority of Nagaland (IDAN) with a policy of single window clearance so that we can create a congenial environment to make Nagaland an investment destination.

Rio also commented that our State is rich in rubber, bamboo, tea and coffee, for which there is a lot of demand from all over the world. He also said that with the emergence of innovative entrepreneurs who are collaborating with and procuring directly from local farmers to create innovative products from chocolates to spice blends to sauces and jams. The Department of Women Resource Development empowers our local women farmers and artisans, selling innovative products under the brand Myki.

Rio also announced that the Government is introducing special schemes and programmes directly aimed at benefiting the youth, especially students from schools and colleges to empower them for gainful careers in future new programmes directly aimed at the students and the youth namely, the Chief Minister's Good Governance Fellows (CMGGF), the Chief Minister's Meritorious Students Fellowship (CMMSF), the Chief Minister's Awards for Civil Service Aspirants (CMACSA) and the Chief Minister's Young Leadership Programme (CMYLP).

Rio also said that students clearing UPSC preliminary examinations would directly receive cash incentives for training, mentoring and coaching in order to clear the mains. Also the Chief Minister's Young Leadership Programme will be a unique programme that will bring young students under a state level leadership exchange programme that would mould leaders in various sectors. Modelled on the International Visitor Leadership Programme (IVLP) scheme will be a life changing experience for every participant and IVLP alumni of the United States will mentor the project.

Welfare of students has been amongst the top priorities of the Government and Rio further ensured timely release of scholarships to students even when funds are not released by Government of India.

Rio also stressed that schools in Eastern Nagaland lack sufficient number of trained candidates who can be appointed as teachers, and to bridge this gap, the Government has decided to introduce 4 year B.A. B.Ed, Programme in all government colleges across the state under the Integrated Teacher Education Programme which has also been approved by National Council for Teacher Education.

The Fourth Estate in Nagaland, i.e media has grown from strength to strength in the past years, becoming more vibrant and have made positive contributions towards the strengthening of democratic foundation, Rio said. He disclosed that operational subsidy to accredited journalists has been enhanced, and ex-gratia relief for journalists has been doubled.

Rio also stated that due to implementation of 7<sup>th</sup> RoP for the State Government employees, the resources available for development could not improve much. As a result, only Rs. 609 crore was provided for developmental activities during 2019-20.

Chief Minister Rio called upon all to find solutions that will not only win awards but also transform our economy and impact the lives of our people in a positive way.

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## REPLIES TO STARRED AND UNSTARRED QUESTIONS DURING THE 3<sup>RD</sup> SESSION OF 13<sup>TH</sup> NLA

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On the fourth day of the Third session of the Thirteenth Nagaland Legislative Assembly i.e, on 25<sup>th</sup> February 2019, replying to the starred question raised by MLA Vikheho Swu on details of the RD Blocks and criteria requirement for creation of a new RD Block, Minister for Urban development and Municipal Affairs, Metsubo Jamir informed that under Kohima-7 RD blocks, Dimapur-6, Kiphire-5, Longleng-3, Mokokchung-9, Mon-8, Peren-4, Phek-8, Tuensang-9, Wokha-7, Zunheboto-8 for which the grand total is 74 RD Blocks. He informed that the number of household for Kohima district is 25108, Mokokchung-24947, Mon-28711, Tuensang-23483, Zunheboto-19214, Wokha-16712, Phek-21671, Dimapur-34489, Kiphire-14834, Longleng-14314, Peren-14471 and the grand total number of household block is 2,37,954. He further stated that the total number of Job Card holders in Dimapur is 73,798, Kiphire-23684, Kohima-54040, Longleng-21439, Mokokchung-35653, Mon-39911, Peren-27099, Phek-34152, Tuensang-48455, Wokha-36163, Zunheboto-37785 and the grand total stands at 4,32,179.

Replying to the query by MLA Yollow Konyak, the Minister in-charge of Soil & Water Conservation and

Geology & Mining, V. Kashiho Sangtam informed that Nagaland has its own Coal Policy of 2006 which was amended in 2014.

On the question put forward by MLA Vikheho Swu on the total number of doctors, their posting place, Minister of Health & Family Welfare, S. Pangnyu Phom stated that there are 422 sanctioned post of doctors of various grades comprising of 389 Allopathic/Modern Medicine and 33 dental surgeons, and 6 sanctioned post of AYUSH doctors. The details of total number of doctors under the H&FW department with names of the doctors, their present posting place and duration of stay was laid in hard copy for the members of the August House.

Replying to questions by MLA Moatoshi Longkumer on fund sanction for Nagaland including 10% Lumpsum provision for development of NE states 2018-19, Minister for Urban Development and Municipal Affairs, Metsubo Jamir replied that the fund sanctioned for Nagaland during 2018-19 were ADB - Rs. 921.68 lakh, SBM (U) - Rs. 1339.69 lakh, AMRUT - Rs. 814.00 lakh, DAY-NULM - Rs. 343.42 lakh, 10% Lumpsum on UDD - Rs. 1203.7 lakh (6 projects), MAD - Rs.1838.28 lakh (6 projects), TPT - Rs.576.61 lakh and PMAY-HFA - Rs. 6384.71 lakhs.

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## MORE STARRED QUESTIONS RAISED DURING THE NLA SESSIONS

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Replying to the starred question on the total number of doctors in Primary Health Centres (PHCs) under the Department of Health & Family Welfare raised by MLA Yitachu, the Minister in-charge of Health & Family Welfare, S. Pangnyu Phom informed the August House that there are 115 doctors posted in the PHCs. He stated that there is no sanctioned post of doctors in 23 PHCs. He said the Department has created numerous posts to make 100% posting

of doctors in rural areas. Pangnyu said that the Department has formed the roster posting policy in order to ensure posting of doctors in all the remote areas, and in order to fill the posting gaps, NHM (National Health Mission) has provided 9 specialists, 77 GDMOs, 37 AYUSH MOs and 18 Dental Surgeons.

Replying to a starred question raised by MLA, C. L. John on the status of sanctioned strength of all the health units, the Minister in-charge informed

that there are 25 Community Health Centres (CHC), 138 Primary Health Centres (PHC), 1 Subsidiary Health Centre (SHC), 2 Big Dispensaries (BD) and 559 Sub Centres (SC) in the rural areas. He pointed out the Indian health standard specified the norms of requirement of health units based as per the requirement and added that there is 1 SC unit for every 3000 population, 1 PHC for every 20,000 population. He said that villages in remote and underserved areas are still not adequately covered as there is still overall shortage of 101 SCs in the state. In order to improve the health facilities in remote and underserved areas, the Minister highlighted that the Department under National Health Mission has expanded the network of health units and pointed out that since 2012 till date, the number of CHCs has increased from 21 to 25, PHCs from 126 to 138 and SCs from 396 to 559.

Replying to a starred question put forward by MLA Amenba Yaden on the amount sanctioned under the scheme of Article 275 (I) of the Constitution of India during 2018-19, Minister-in charge of Planning & Coordination Department, Neiba Kronu said that the amount is Rs. 8377.84 lakh. Further in response to the supplementary question asked by opposition members on question of additional fund received and which exceeds the earmarked amount of the target of Rs. 28 crore, he stated that most of the states could not make use of this fund and taking the advantage, the additional fund was issued to state of Nagaland.

Replying to a starred question put up by MLA, Yitachu on total number of voters in the State and the steps taken to curb proxy entry, Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio stated that the total number of voters in the State is 12,096,13 and preparation of the electoral rolls for all elections to the parliament and legislature of every State is done under the superintendence, direction and control of the Election Commission of India by powers vested under Article 324(I) of the Constitution of India.

On the direction of the Election Commission of India, the steps taken to curb proxy and ineligible entries in the electoral rolls:

1. BLO conducts house to house visit and collects information eligible for inclusion, multiple entries, dead electors, permanently shifted electors
2. During summary revision of electoral rolls, any ineligible entry in the role can be objected to and appropriate actions are taken following due procedure of law for their removal.
3. Booth Level Agents (BLAs) appointed by the political parties are allowed to file applications for deletions of ineligible entries in the roll.
4. During continuous updation, applications received for deletion and correction up to the announcement of elections are processed for appropriate necessary actions.
5. Software generated Demographically Similar Entries (DSEs) and reported multiple entries in the electoral rolls are processed for appropriate action.
6. Registered death entries are collected from the concerned authority and processed for appropriate actions.

Responding to the starred question raised by MLA Kezhienyi Khalo on the details of the number of Graduate and Primary Teachers who are pending regularisation in the state, Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio replied that 496 Graduate Teachers and 1464 Primary Teachers are yet to get regularized.

Starred question was raised by MLA, Muthingnyuba Sangtam, on the total number of teachers appointed during 2018-2019 and whether they were appointed through open interview, also on the total number of vacancies left unfilled in backward linguistic area and the reason for filling up these vacancies, to which the Minister in-charge responded that there is no notified backward linguistic area in Nagaland and there are 162 vacancies left unfilled in Backward Tribe area. He also said that the vacancies could not be filled up due to non-availability of trained/qualified candidates. He further furnished that 32 Primary Teachers (PT) were appointed in Adhoc and need basis, 85 Graduate Teachers (GT) (Maths) and 52 GT (Science) were appointed through open interview,

3 GT and 37 PT were appointed on compassionate scheme.

Responding to Starred question raised by MLA Yitachu on the total amount spent in salary from 31<sup>st</sup> March 2018 to 31<sup>st</sup> January 2019 and the amount anticipated for salary for the month of January,

February and March 2019, the Minister in-charge of Finance, Neiphiu Rio replied that expenditure on salary during the period is Rs. 4176.62 crore and the anticipated salary for January and February 2019 is Rs. 1216.22 crore and March 2019 to be drawn in April 2019 is Rs. 476.72 crore.

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## UNSTARRED QUESTIONS RAISED DURING THE 3<sup>RD</sup> SESSION OF THE 13<sup>TH</sup> NLA

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MLA, Moatoshi Longkumer, raised a question on fund released during the year 2018-2019 under the Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (CSS), to which the Minister in-charge of Horticulture, Mhathung Yanthan furnished the total allocation of fund is Rs. 3555.56 lakh under MIDH for the year 2018-2019, out of which Rs. 1111.11 lakh was received as 1st installment.

MLA, Y. Vikheho Swu raised a question on the details of the total number of CDPO under Social Welfare Department district wise with names of all the children, old age persons and handicapped per block, to which Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio responded by furnishing the details stating that there are 60

CDPOs and at present, there are 47 due to retirement and promotion. Number of children (0-6) is 3,64,867, old age pension is 57,400, widow pension is 4464, scholarship to handicapped people is 201, totally blind persons is 1625 and infirmed invalids person is 3276.

MLA, Yitachu, raised a question on the number of new highways taken up through open e-tendering and roads projected under Bharat Mala, to which the Minister in-charge, National Highways, Y. Patton replied by furnishing the details that five consultancy services for preparation of feasibility study and DPR were taken up.

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## CM BRIEFS MEDIA AFTER PRESENTATION OF BUDGET FOR THE YEAR 2019-20

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Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio while holding a press conference with media after presentation of budget stated the budget for 2019-20 is a people friendly budget as the budget did not impose any new taxes or placed any additional burden on the common people in order to generate revenue.

On Tourism sector, Rio mentioned that the impact of the Hornbill Festival 2018 indicated that the 10 day festival had generated revenue of about Rs. 62.88 crore and created 8715 jobs. Keeping this in mind, the Chief Minister said that the festival has been extended in all the districts through the Mini Hornbill Festivals so that the economic benefits from

tourism will percolate down to every nook and corner of the state.

On Nagaland Start-up policy, Rio said the policy will create a culture of entrepreneurship, promote creativity and innovation among the youth with a target of at least 500 start-ups in the next five years. Under this, eligible start-ups will get concession such as GST reimbursement for three years up to Rs. 5 lakh per year, 50% reimbursement of broadband costs, power subsidy up to Rs. 10 lakh a year, reimbursement of patent filing costs up to Rs. 2 lakh for domestic patents and Rs. 5 lakh for international patents and assistance of Rs. 5 lakh for marketing

and promotion for each start-up. Incubators will be supported with financial assistance of Rs. 25 lakh as capital grants.

On Youth Resources and Sports, Rio mentioned that a comprehensive sports policy has been framed where development of football at the grassroot level in collaboration with the Bhaichung Bhutia Football Academy will be engaged in imparting training to our young boys. He also mentioned the four new programmes directly aimed at the students and the youth:

- i. The Chief Minister's Good Governance Fellowship (CMGGF)
- ii. The Chief Minister's Meritorious Students Fellowship (CMMSF)
- iii. The Chief Minister's Awards for Civil Service Aspirants (CMACSA)
- iv. The Chief Minister's Young Leadership Programme (CMYLP)

The government is also introducing 4-year B.Ed. course in all the government colleges of Nagaland with the approval of the National College of Teacher Education, Rio stated. He also stated that the government is taking up measures to improve revenue collection through various measures such as increasing the registration of dealers under GST,

implementing the system of online payment of power bills, including introduction of pre-paid power meters and better monitoring of revenue collection in the transport sector.

On Employment sector, the Chief Minister reiterated that job opportunity in our state has already reached the saturation point. However, new appointments still continues in spite of 'no post creation' and to check this, the government has introduced PIMS to record every employee in the state and detect bogus appointments.

The budget for 2019-20 has provided an allocation of Rs. 112.74 crore to the social sector which comes to 18.51% of the total developmental outlay under State Resources (untied), Rio stated. Prior to introduction of GST in July 2017, the State's tax revenue stood at Rs. 510.76 crore which is 19.60% over the previous year. After introduction of GST, tax revenue increase was Rs. 638.29 crore during 2017-18, a growth of 25% over the previous year. The estimated target for 2018-19 (RE) is Rs. 711.05 crore, a growth of 11.4% over the previous year.

For the year 2019-20, the government is estimating a growth of 9.72% over 2018-19.

## CS HOLDS MEETING ON PLASTIC FREE STATE

Chief Secretary, Temjen Toy, IAS convened a meeting with AHOs, HoDs and other departments pertaining to Plastic Free State at the Chief Secretary's Conference Hall, Kohima on 21<sup>st</sup> February 2019.

While addressing the member participants, the Chief Secretary clearly said that the main objective of the meeting was to carry forward Plastic Free State and how to give a further push on it. He said the present rate of policy implementation on Plastic Free in the state is not satisfactory due to poor implementation and non compliance of government policies besides lack of proper mechanism to control the use of plastics. An 'Empowered Committee' comprising of different

departments has been entrusted to workout a roadmap on action plan.

Development Commissioner, Sentiyanger, IAS said that order was issued but no follow up action has been taken. Therefore, he reiterated that the Home Department should issue an order and give directives to all Deputy Commissioners for strict compliance.

Retd. Commissioner & Secretary to the Government of Nagaland, Thangi Mannen while sharing her concerns on the issue, stated the importance and necessity to have coordination between Government and NGOs in order to tackle the issue of Plastic Free in the state. She said the

policy for restricting the use of plastics in Nagaland has already been in force but the use of both plastics and other non-perishable products continues in spite of restriction. For that reason, she opined the government should come out with a firm decision on how to go about banning of plastics since clear indication is not given by the government. She also emphasised on imparting trainings on how to make non plastic bags in order to replace the use of plastic bags.

Manen urged all the municipalities to issue orders so as to control the use of plastics in their own respective municipalities. She also mentioned the importance of timeframe to dispose all plastics and other non perishable products as plastics not only pollute the environment but also affect the human health. NGOs and church organisations should be engaged to work hand in hand with the government, she added.

Commissioner & Secretary, Urban Development, Abhishek Singh, IAS stressed on the importance of mechanism for controlling the use of plastics, wherein, local authorities should be vested with the powers and responsibilities though violation will continue to happen in spite of strict regulations. He urged the Kohima and Dimapur municipalities to take the lead in controlling the use of plastics.

Commissioner & Secretary, PHE, Maongwati Aier suggested that the state needs to have an act on the usage of plastics.

The Chief Secretary formed an 'Empowered Committee,' headed by Principal Secretary, UD, Abhishek Singh, IAS, to be assisted by officers from departments such as Home, Kohima Municipal Council, Environment, Forests & Climate Change, Public Health Engineering, Rural Development and Information & Public Relations.

Joint Secretary, Power and National Level Master Trainer, Sara S. Jamir, in her power-point presentation on 'paid news' said that money used through media in elections has assumed alarming proportion and major junk of media malfunction in recent times as a serious electoral malpractice. She said paid news is still not made an electoral offence by law but has been causing concern to the Election Commission in conducting free and fair election. Paid news misleads the public and hampers their ability to

form correct opinions and cause undue influence on voters and also affect their Right to Information.

The Commission has issued the Media Certification & Monitoring Committee at district and state level whose major three functions are pre-certification of political advertisements on electronic media including social media; monitoring and action on paid news cases and monitoring the media violation cases during election process, Sara S Jamir added. The media has been among the most powerful ally of the Election Commission of India, the most eager supporter of the Commission's constitutional function and the Commission's strength and an ally in election management and essential in the conduct of the elections. She added that media is considered extremely essential to a democracy as a healthy democracy cannot exist without a free and responsible media.

Assistant Chief Electoral Officer and National Level Master Trainer, R. Mhathung also demonstrated and briefed the media on EVM/VVPAT administrative procedures.

The Board after lengthy deliberations recommended the following agenda for approval by the government - Upgradation of Alisopur Health Sub-Centre to Primary Health Centre under Chare Circle; setting up of college at Longkhim; creation of SDO (C) Office under ADC Administrative HQ Shamator town;

upgradation of SDO (Electrical) from Junior Engineer (Power) at Shamator; creation of Sub-divisional Water Resources Department at Shamator and posting of EAC at the newly created Mangko EAC Office under Shamator sub-division.

The Board recommended the proposal for new helipad instead of the Army helipad and also for a new Convention Hall which should be centrally located with smart modern amenities which was proposed and presented by the Minister.

Also participating in the event, Sievituo Solo, Team Leader of the Project 72 hours expressed his appreciation to the people of Kiphire for banning the use of plastic in Kiphire and called for proper maintenance of the dustbins in Kiphire town to properly manage the waste.

During the camp, both Government as well as private drivers availed various tests provided by the organisers. The District Administration, Kohima led by ADC Kohima, Lithrongla Tongpi Rutsa along with SDO (C) Shaying Sheu also visited the camp.

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## Observance of National Deworming Day at Wokha

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The National Deworming Day was observed in all the schools and Anganwadi centres under Wokha district on 8<sup>th</sup> February 2019. St. Peter's School, Longsa also observed the NDD, wherein Dr. Khokholie MO RBSK spoke on the importance of deworming the children, a mission initiated by the Government of India MoHFW which aims to reduce the cases of worm infections among children from 1-19 years.

The major goal of this campaign is to deworm all the children to improve the overall health for a better cognitive development among children. Infection through parasitic worms (STH-Soil Transmitted

Helminthes) is one of the most common infections in children. According to WHO, around 220 million children in India are at risk of STH infection. It has emerged as one among the world's largest public health campaigns preventing children from intestinal parasitic worms, as worm infection can make children anaemic, malnourished, weak, sick, and tired with poor concentration. ICDS supervisors visited all the AWCs in the urban areas to supervise the activity.

The mass deworming programme aims to reach all children at schools and AWCs with the deworming treatment.

## ***Sensitization on Women Health issues at Wokha***

Under Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (BBBP), a camp for fathers on “Sensitization on women health issues” was held on 9<sup>th</sup> February 2019 at Wokha Town Baptist Church with Medical Officer, Dr. R. Zechano Ezung and UBSI Longkumonen Pongen as the resources persons.

Dr. R. Zechano Ezung (AYUSH) District Hospital Wokha dwelling on the topic of women health issues, stated some health issues affect women differently and pointed some of the common problems and diseases concerning women health like breast cancer, pregnancy issues, cervical cancer etc. She also stated women suffer higher heart attack deaths compared to

men, and depression and anxiety exhibits more often in women.

UBSI Wokha Police Station, Longkumonen Pongen, speaking on ‘Dangers of social media on teenagers,’ said it is very important for parents to talk with their kids about how to use social media wisely and about the danger and consequences of social media. He also added social media can be sometimes dangerous, but if used in a good way, it can be an opportunity for learning new ideas and improvement of communication skill and technology skills. He also emphasized on ‘Prevention of children from sexual offences.’

The DFO Kohima said the nursery was constructed in January 2019 to raise saplings through

root trainers and that for this year, the saplings will be distributed in bare rooted form in carton boxes to minimize the use of plastics within and outside the nursery.

The PCCF & HoFF highlighted on the importance of using biodegradable containers for raising saplings in the nurseries and appreciated that such initiatives will have a durable impact in future in order to decrease the use of polybags.

APCCF also said that though costly and labor intensive, an alternative to polybags should be encouraged to fulfill the objectives of the department.

The Kohima Central Nursery has a capacity of around 60,000 saplings and with the addition of the new nursery, it aims to lessen the pressure of seedling demand.

## HWC LAUNCHED AT MERIEMA SUB-CENTRE

The launching programme of Sub-Centre Health & Wellness Centre under Ayushman Bharat was launched by Principal Secretary for Health & Family Welfare, I. Himato Zhimomi at Meriema Sub-Centre, Kohima on 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2019.

Launching the programme, Himato said that under Ayushman Bharat, there are two pillars i.e. National Health Protection Scheme (NHPS) and Health & Wellness Centre (HWC), and Nagaland State has launched the HWC with 56 Centres across the State. He stated that the main objective of Ayushman Bharat is not only to stay healthy but also to maintain healthy mind and spirit. Under the NHPS, a person who has been registered with the schemes will get Rs. 5 lakh cashless benefit in the event of ailments, he said.

Mission Director, National Health Mission, Dr. Kevichusa Medikhru chairing the programme said that the MoHFW envisages upgradation of all 1.5 lakh SCs to HWCs in the country for provision of comprehensive primary healthcare by December 2022. Keeping in line with this, Dr. Medikhru said that the Department of Health & Family Welfare has upgraded three Urban Primary Health Centres (UPHCs) and two Primary Health Centres (PHCs) and the upgradation of 56 Sub Centres (SCs) in Nagaland, which will be upgraded in a phase manner. The Centre will be equipped with comprehensive laboratory, (19 test HWC-PHC and 7 test in HWC-SC) Pharmacy, robust IT system, essential drugs and supplies and proper infrastructure with provision for wellness activities.

The Mission Director also said that Community Health Officers (B.Sc. Nursing/GNM with field experiences) who have undergone six months intensive training will be posted in the Centre to deliver the package of services. He also requested the community to extend their full cooperation with the department in general and the staff posted in the village in particular to implement the Comprehensive Primary Health Care through HWCs successfully.

HWC includes 12 package of services such as care in pregnancy and child birth, neonatal and infant health care service, childhood and adolescent health care services, family planning, contraceptive services and other reproductive health care services,

management of communicable diseases, national health programmes, general out-patient care for acute simple illnesses and minor ailments, screening, prevention, control and management of non-communicable diseases, care of common ophthalmic and ENT problems, basic oral health care services, elderly and palliative health care services, emergency medical services including burns and trauma and screening and basic management of mental health ailments.

State Programme Officer NHM, Dr. Thangoi Lam delivered the vote of thanks, which was followed by a volleyball match between the Medical Staff and Meriema Youth to promote wellness in the community.

National Mission on Government e-Marketplace (GeM) was launched on 5<sup>th</sup> September 2018 to accelerate the adoption and use of GeM by major Central Ministries, State Governments and their agencies. The aim of this National Mission is to promote inclusiveness, transparency and efficiency in public procurement and to achieve cashless, contactless and paperless transaction which will increase overall efficiency and lead to cost saving on government expenditure in procurement.

During the six weeks' special drive beginning from 6<sup>th</sup> September up to 15<sup>th</sup> October 2018, the mission was launched at all the state headquarters by the Chief Ministers and will cover important sectors and flagship programmes, launch of IEC campaign along with training on usage of GeM for both buyers and sellers, buyer registration drive on board with government agencies and vendor registration drive will have a special focus on MSMEs.

The GeM after its launch has crossed Rs. 10,800 crore in value terms and 6.96 lakh in volume of transactions through the platform and more. More than 1.35 lakh sellers had offered 4.43 lakh products on the GeM platform which has 26,500 organizations as buyers. While all States and Union Territories are buying through GeM, 25 States and UTs have already signed a MoU to make procurement through GeM mandatory. It has led to an overall average savings in cost of procurement to the tune of about 25%.

The GeM platform provides online, end to end solution for procurement of commonly used goods and services for all Central Government Departments, Public Sector Units and affiliated bodies. This National

Mission on GeM is going to cover important sectors and flagship programmes. Government will launch IEC campaign and is going to provide training on 'How to use GeM portal' for buyers and sellers. People can make sign up, login and understand payment procedure at gem.gov.in

Some of the special benefits of Government e-Marketplace (GeM) are:

1. Direct purchase on GeM can be done in a matter of minutes and the entire process is online, end to end integrated and with online tools for assessing price reasonability.
2. For procurements of higher value, the bidding/RA facility on GeM is among the most transparent and efficient, in comparison to e-procurement systems in vogue within the government sector.
3. For creating a bid/RA, the buyer does not need to create his/her own technical specifications as they have been standardized on GeM. These would make GeM an extremely powerful tool in the hands of government organizations to plan and procure.

GeM is a completely secure platform and all the documents on GeM are e-Signed at various stages by the buyers and sellers. The antecedents of the suppliers are verified online and automatically through MCA21, Aadhaar and PAN database. For high value bids/RA on GeM, an e-Bank Guarantee is also being introduced. GeM is by far a better system which relies more on financial instruments (EMD in case of tenders for large procurements only) to guarantee good conduct by the suppliers. In the existing system, there is zero check on the antecedents of the suppliers and for small value procurements, it is up to Rs. 1 lakh).
