

# OFFICIAL ORDERS and NOTIFICATIONS

## PROCEDURE FOR APPOINTMENTS TO EVERY CATEGORY OF POSTS BY ANY DEPARTMENT

P&AR Department, through an office memorandum issued by Commissioner & Secretary, Dinesh Kumar, IAS, reiterated the standing policies of the State Government:

It has come to the notice of the Government that some departments are still resorting to exigency appointments; for e.g. Mali, Chowkidar, Peon on contingency basis which are untenable as the normal office can function even without the said staff. Such contingency appointments, without publicly inviting applications, whether on regular basis, ad-hoc, fixed, casual or work-charged are irregular and illegal.

No appointment of any sort without sanctioned/vacant posts shall be made and appointment on contract basis is banned as laid down in the P&AR Department's OM No.AR-5/ASSO/98(C) dated 26/2/2001 and OM No.AR-5/ASSO/98 dated 6/6/2016.

In view of the circumstances stated above, the proposals for any new/fresh appointments by any

departments for every category of post may be submitted to the Administrative Heads of Department for prior approval for due process of recruitment by the NPSC/Departmental Recruitment Board (DRB). The AHoD shall be responsible to verify the availability of the sanctioned post and duly authenticate each post vacancy against the unique employee code generated by the Personal Information Management System (PIMS) or the post creation order in case of new post. Any appointment order issued without following the due process and without the unique employee code from PIMS shall be considered invalid, null and void.

Hence, the PIMS Cell P&AR Department shall not register any appointments made without observing the due process as laid down and the Finance Department shall not grant fund provision on salaries head against the particular department during the Revised Estimate.

## ORDER ON STATE TAX

Finance Department in an order has stated that sub-section (1) of section 44 of the Nagaland Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017 (4 of 2017) (hereafter in this Order referred to as the said Act) provides that every registered person, other than an Input Service Distributor, a person paying tax under section 51 or section 52, a casual taxable person and a non-resident taxable person, shall furnish an annual return for every financial year electronically in such form and manner as may be prescribed on or before the thirty-first day of December following the end of such financial year;

For the purpose of furnishing of the annual return electronically for every financial year as referred to in sub-section (1) of section 44 of the said Act, certain technical problems are being faced by the taxpayers as a result whereof, the said annual return for the

period from the 1<sup>st</sup> July, 2017 to the 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2018 could not be furnished by the registered persons, as referred to in the said sub-section (1) and because of that, certain difficulties have arisen in giving effect to the provisions of the said section.

The State Government, on recommendations of the Council has hereby made the following order, to remove the difficulties, namely:

1. Short title: This Order may be called the Nagaland Goods and Services Tax (Seventh Removal of Difficulties) Order, 2019.
2. In section 44 of the Nagaland Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017, in the Explanation, for the figures, letters and word "31<sup>st</sup> August, 2019", the figures, letters and word "30<sup>th</sup> November, 2019" shall be substituted.

# OFFICIAL ORDERS and NOTIFICATIONS

## GOVERNMENT NOTIFIES ON PROMOTION AFTER RETIREMENT

The State Government in an office memorandum has referred to the P & AR Department's OM dated 25.1.2016 which deals with the grant of notional promotion to a Government servant exonerated in a disciplinary proceedings after retirement. However, the cases of Government servants who are found fit by review DPC after their retirement on account of revision of seniority list of the feeder cadre, upgradation of below benchmark APARs etc are not covered under the said OM. These cases have now been examined procedures has been laid down for dealing with such cases.

A Government servant who is not recommended in the panel by the original/supplementary DPC but later on is recommended in the panel by a review DPC but has since retired may be given the benefit of notional promotion wef the date of promotion of his immediate junior in the reviewed panel and fixation of notional pay subject to the fulfillment of the following conditions:

- a. That the officer who is immediate junior to the retired Government servant assumed charge of the higher post on or before the date of superannuation of the retired Government servant.
- b. That the said retired Government servant was clear from vigilance angle on the date of promotion of his immediate junior.
- c. A retired Government servant who is considered for notional promotion from the date of promotion of his immediate junior on the recommendation of a review DPC would also be entitled to fixation of pension on the basis of such notional pay.
- d. The notional promotion, notional pay fixation and revision of pension shall be further subject to extant rules on promotion, pay fixation and CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972. Actual increase in pension shall be given only from the date of approval of reviewed panel by the competent authority. No arrears shall be paid.
- e. The provisions contained in this Office Memorandum shall become operational from the date of issue of this Office Memorandum. Past cases settled in accordance with the earlier provision shall not be reopened.
- f. In so far as persons serving in the Indian Audit & Accounts Department are concerned, these orders issue after consultation with the Comptroller & Auditor General of India.

## HOME DEPT INFORMS ON RECOMMENDATIONS FOR GOVERNOR'S AWARDS

The Home Department (Political Branch) has informed that, the Deserving cases for award of Governor's Gold Medal/Governor's Commendation Certificate's on the occasion of Republic Day, 26<sup>th</sup> January 2020 are invited. Citations/Recommendations of deserving cases may be forwarded to Special Secretary (Home) Nagaland, Kohima latest by 30<sup>th</sup> November 2019.

While forwarding the Citations/Recommendations, the following guidelines are to be strictly observed:

1. Details of candidates recommended should be submitted according to format given in Annexure- "A".
2. Citations/Recommendations should be submitted by the Head of Department for Non Gazetted Staff.
3. Citations/Recommendations in respect of Gazetted Officers working under various Departments/Directorates should be submitted through proper channel as under: Head of Department to Administrative Head of Department to Special

- Secretary, Home
4. In the case of Police, Home Guards, Prison and Fire Services the recommendations should come through their respective Director Generals/Head of the Department to Special Secretary, Home.
  5. 6(Six) copies of the Citations/Recommendations duly signed by Head of Department in respect of Non Gazetted Staff and Head of Department & Administrative Head of Department for Gazetted Officer along with soft copy may be forwarded.
  6. Citations/Recommendations should be precise highlighting the performance and achievements of the individual recommended.
  7. Integrity Certificate to be signed by forwarding authority.
  8. For NGO's/Individuals and employees working under the Establishment of the Deputy Commissioners' deserving candidates should be submitted through proper channel as under:  
Dy. Commissioner of the District Concerned to Commissioner, Nagaland to Special Secretary, Home.
  9. No Citations/Recommendations will be accepted from the Deputy Commissioner directly.
  10. Citations/Recommendations received after the last date i.e, 30<sup>th</sup> November 2019 and any deviation from the above guidelines will be summarily rejected.

## **PROCEDURES FOR FILING AFFIDAVIT BEFORE LOKAYUKTA, NAGALAND**

The Department of Justice & Law has notified that affidavit in the Lokayukta has to be filed in the same way as documents are being filed in the proceedings before the High Court and the Supreme Court. The Departments are not acquainted with the procedures to be followed in the matters pending and filed before the Lokayukta, particularly on account of absence of Rules to be framed by the State Government in consultation with the Lokayukta and as such they do

not refer the matter to the Department of Justice & Law for legal advice and vetting.

Therefore, all such proceedings where the Lokayukta organisation issue notice to the Government Departments, the Department concerned has to refer the files to the Secretary, Justice & Law, Nagaland for legal advice and vetting before it is filed in the Lokayukta.

## FOREST OFFICE COMPLEX KOHIMA DECLARED PLASTIC FREE

The Forest Office Complex, Kohima under the Department of Environment, Forests & Climate Change was declared as Plastic Free Office on 1<sup>st</sup> October. As part of the “Swachhata Hi Seva-Cleanliness is Service” under the Plastic waste Shramdaan, the department initiated the ban on plastic items in and around the office.

During the program, DFO Kohima, Rongsenlemla Imchen, IFS highlighted on the importance on ban of single use plastic. Dr. Kenei Miachieo, IFS, Conservator of Forest encouraged the staff to be a

responsible citizen in reducing the use of plastic not only in the office but also in our everyday affairs. He said Forest department being the nodal department for protection of environment, it is a fitting initiative by the department to raise awareness on the hazards of plastic pollution. Ngampie administered the pledge to the gathering on “Not to Use Plastic”. ## STATE GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCES SCHOLARSHIP FOR YOUTH

CM Nagaland, Neiphiu Rio has announced scholarship worth 82 lacs for 100 Youth under Chief Minister Corpus Fund creating an opportunity for deserving and talented IAS Aspirants of Nagaland to undergo free of cost coaching from ALS IAS.

ALS IAS which is India's largest IAS Coaching Network has more than 75 centers across India including 30 in North East along with 2837 selections in UPSC till date including 154 selections last year. ALS has also been honored with similar sponsorship for IAS Training from Government of Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya, Tripura, Mizoram and Manipur in the past.

Application Forms will be made available from 3<sup>rd</sup> October in all Deputy Commissioner office with last date of form submission being 10<sup>th</sup> October. Results of the examination will be generated on 16<sup>th</sup> October and batches will commence from 21<sup>st</sup> October.

Students selected will undergo training at any of the six ALS Authorised Learning centers in Kohima, Dimapur, Mokokchung, Zuhenboto, Wokha and Mon via cutting edge VSAT Technology where LIVE Transmission of classes being conducted in ALS Delhi campus would be given and students will learn from Best IAS Mentors of the country. Dedicated Academic Mentors from Delhi shall also be sent by ALS to Nagaland to monitor, motivate and guide the students during their training along with monthly visits which will be made by IAS/IPS officers serving in Nagaland to inspire the candidates.

ALS hopes that this path breaking initiative taken by the Chief Minister of Nagaland will be able to transform the youth of Nagaland and produce results in Civil Services in the coming years.

## NOKE GRACES INTERNATIONAL DAY OF OLDER PERSONS CELEBRATION AT KOHIMA

The International Day of Older Persons 2019, organised by the Department of Social Welfare Nagaland was held at Hotel Japfú, Kohima on 1<sup>st</sup> October 2019.

## STATE LEVEL PROGRAMME ON URBAN MISSION HELD AT KOHIMA

---

State Level Programme on Kohima Smart City Mission; Swachh Bharat Mission and Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana was held on 2<sup>nd</sup> October, 2019 at NBCC Convention Hall, Kohima.

Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio, in his address, said urban areas are centres of economic activities and engines of growth and are crucial to the economy of a State for poverty alleviation and inclusive growth. He advocated that climate change perspectives have to be integrated within the broader framework of sustainable urban development, and a holistic approach to participatory governance, urban environmental planning and management.

He further informed that the Government of India has launched various missions such as the Smart City Mission, Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana-Housing for All (HFA-Urban) and Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban) to address the problems of the urban areas.

Rio said "Kohima was selected as one of the 100 smart cities on 20<sup>th</sup> September 2016. Implementation

of projects have begun in full swing and we are currently ranked 1<sup>st</sup> among the 10 North East Smart Cities." He added that under this project, Kohima, along with the smart cities in the country, launched the 100-day Smart City Special Initiative Campaign on Sanitation focussing on Awareness Creation on Plastic Pollution and Waste Management with special emphasis on Waste Segregation and moving towards the practice of Zero Waste.

He said the Ministry has initiated angikaar, a 3 (three) month campaign that aims to mobilize PMAY (U) beneficiaries for social behavioural change, focusing on issues such as water & energy conservation, waste management, health, sanitation and hygiene converging with various Urban Missions and Schemes/Services through a series of IEC activities covering 12,389 beneficiaries which will culminate on the 10<sup>th</sup> December 2019.

The Chief Minister released the Anti Plastic Theme Song and the 100 Days Promotional Video along with

distribution of Cloth bags to the tax paying households under Kohima Municipality.

Five Water ATMs were launched for public use. The Water ATMs are placed in strategic locations with the maximum foot fall with the sole intention of discouraging bottled drinking water. 11 ULB Sanitation Vehicles were flagged off for 11 Town Councils in the State.

Advisor Urban Development & Municipal Affairs, Dr. Nicky Kire stated that under the "100 days Smart City Special Initiative Campaign on Sanitation" Kohima Smart City (KSC) in collaboration with the Green Team Kohima has taken awareness program on

plastic pollution and waste management to numerous schools and colleges. KSC also held consultations with Apex Civil Societies including the business community.

100 days Challenge Award for the best Sanitation was awarded to Ward 11 PWD and 100 days Challenge Award for the best Eco Activity was given to Kros College Kohima.

Principal Secretary Urban Development & Municipal Affairs Department, Himato Zhimomi chaired the program. Ministers and elected Members, senior Officers, Ward and Colony Authorities and students attended the function.

Commemorating 150<sup>th</sup> Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi, Jal Shakti campus & Jal Shakti Gram and Swachh campus was launched at Kohima College, Kohima on 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2019. The programme was organized by the Department of Higher & Technical Education in collaboration with the Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education, Ministry of HRD, Gol.

RN Ravi speaking at the event said that the two manuals prepared by the Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education is a practical document and will help in keeping the campus clean and in conserving water. The Department of Patent Information Centre & Biotechnology Hub Nagaland Science & Technology Council (NASTECC) and Department Of Science & Technology Nagaland conducted one day State level workshop on Geographical Indication & Intellectual Property Rights (IPR)- Traditional Knowledge, Textiles & Crafts at Hotel Japfü, Kohima on 4<sup>th</sup> October 2019. The theme of the programme was “Protecting Indigenous & Traditional Heritage through Intellectual Property Rights”.

While inaugurating the workshop, MLA & Advisor, Science & Technology, IT & NRE, Nagaland, Mmhone Kikon mentioned that the stakeholders and rights holders should be properly consulted on patent issues to conserve traditional knowledge and also for the preservation of rights of intellectual knowledge. He also said that the idea that emerged for years from experimenting with our creative minds is also linked to our identity. Nagas base identity with the three facets; land, people and culture. There has been conflicts in the past on the basis of these notions of identity. Therefore, he said that the need to protect our identity in the age of globalization is of utmost importance. He also added that for any good purpose and good policy intention, there should be proper consultation with the stakeholders. Kikon further stated that this workshop is to understand each other's mind, opinions and respectfully ensure that these opinions are collected and informed to the government in policy making. Traditional knowledge, whether it is of medicinal plants and its uses or designs are important. Therefore, the Geographical

Indication (GI) process will protect Naga traditional knowledge for the sake of our region and it will ensure that our products are not marketed and benefited commercially by others. He asked the audience to make use of the GI and the processes given by the government for protection to preserve the state's cultural vibrancy.

Chief Scientific Officer, Department of Science & Technology, Dr. Zavei Heise, while delivering his keynote address, said the Nagas are facing one important crisis that is the identity and heritage of the Nagas. Through the GI process, we need to preserve the uniqueness of the Naga culture because unless we're able to protect and preserve this uniqueness we will be nowhere. Therefore, the Nagas should also adopt the international and national patent laws. He said that proof of documentation in preserving natural resources, designs and culture of the Nagas is necessary and it is through IPR that this would be possible.

Joint Secretary, Department of Science & Technology, Nagaland, Wonchio Odyuo was the chairperson of the programme and Dr. Chitra Arvind, Patent Attorney, Partner LEX IP Care, New Delhi was the resource person.

## “Kohima” leading the way for a Plastic Free Nagaland

In what can be described as a decisive move towards banning of all single use plastics in the State Capital, the Kohima District Task Force on total ban of single use plastic conducted a checking and

confiscation exercise covering the whole of Kohima town on 4<sup>th</sup> of October 2019. The Kohima District Task force on total ban of single use plastic comprising of members from the district administration and various other departments and NGOs conducted the checking exercise with the objective of sensitizing the general public on the total ban imposed on all single use plastic products and also to restrict all shops within the Kohima jurisdiction from selling and using plastic bags, mineral water bottles below 2ltrs, Styrofoam cups and plates, plastic cups, forks and spoons and a number of other single use non-biodegradable plastic products.

The Task Force conducted the checking exercise with its members divided into four teams, each covering different areas and was assisted by various public organizations. The teams also distributed paper bags and even approached pedestrians and

shoppers using plastic bags and made them aware of the ban imposed and handed out paper bags as replacement for their plastic bags. Future defaulters would be facing more severe penalties which would involve fines and even cancellation of trade licenses.

With the Government of Nagaland working tirelessly to make Nagaland a plastic free state, the efforts of the Kohima District Task Force on total ban on single use plastics is indeed a welcome sight and hopefully that the rest of the state would follow suit. While highlighting the functions of the commission, he said the commission investigates and monitors all matters relating to the safeguards provided for the Schedule Tribes under the Constitution or under any order of the Government and to evaluate the working of such safeguards, to inquire into specific complaints with respect to the deprivation of rights and safeguards of the Scheduled Tribes, to participate and advise in the planning process of socio-economic development of the Scheduled Tribes and to present to the President, annually reports upon the working of those safeguards.

Chairperson NCST Dr. Nand Kumar Sai addressing the press conference said that the visiting commission had reviewed the various activities and steps taken by the state government for the welfare of the tribal people of Nagaland. He stated that the commission called the regional head of national highway NHIDCL

on the poor condition of the ongoing four lane road between Kohima and Dimapur and commission has further directed the agency to make the road motor able so that travelers can travel conveniently.

Commission also stated that Nagaland State has a high scope of herbal and traditional medicine and has accordingly directed the state government and the concerned department to make a list of traditional medicinal practitioners so that their knowledge can be retained and passed on to the next generation.

The commission also suggested that due to damage of crops by animals and natural calamities, farmer in many villages are facing numerous problems and in order to tackle and resolve such issues the commission had instructed the government to pay the crop damage compensation to the farmers immediately.

following agendas: On monsoon damage reports of line departments, E.E, PWD (NH) Kohima Division, Er. Vikeshe Yepthomi gave a PowerPoint presentation on landslides occurred at different locations within the last few months. He said the landslides at three different locations near Old KMC Dumping area has been restored in two areas and one was in progress for restoration. Necessary widening and restoration work at Khuzama major landslides near Police Check Post were in progress while restoration works at three minor landslides areas, two at Phesama and one at Viswema were carried out for smooth flow of traffic. He also informed that the department has been involved in taking up necessary pavement, restoration works, widening and fresh cutting of road at the affected areas for the flow of traffic.

E.E (Power), Er. Rokongutuo Suohu briefing on the monsoon damage stated that power supply has been affected in some areas under Kohima division due to power line interruptions occurred at various locations. He also informed that the department has been putting in all efforts to restore and repair the damaged lines and posts and also started jungle clearance activities for preventive measures.


## **AO SENSO TELONGJEM KIPHIRE CELEBRATES GOLDEN JUBILEE**

## **Zunheboto district bans Gutka and Pan Masala**

In view of the escalating trend of tobacco use leading to addiction among the local youth and the ever-increasing number of tobacco related diseases in our society. Further, in pursuance of the Supreme Court interim order of 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2016 and the State Government notification vide letter no HFW-23/B/FSSA/2010(PT) dated 19<sup>th</sup> May 2017 which prohibits manufacture, storage, distribution or sale of Gutka, pan masala (containing tobacco or nicotine) and other products marketed separately but having nicotine or tobacco in the final product.

The office of the Deputy Commissioner, Zunheboto has issued a notification on 29<sup>th</sup> October 2019 stating that the sale of Gutka and all twin pack pan masala (containing tobacco and nicotine) conjoined or packaged as a separate product is prohibited in Zunheboto District with immediate effect. Non-compliance of the notification would be an offence punishable under section 59 of Food Safety and Standards Act 2006.

## PHEK SHOWS THE WAY HOW EDUCATION SYSTEM CAN FLOURISH THROUGH COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION

While the education system faced challenges in the recent years with strikes, delay in supply of materials, the all too familiar scenario of proxy teachers; in the midst of it all the community in Phek proves that with strong community partnership, the education system can flourish to its full potential. This was evident when a team of officials from Samagra Shiksha, School Education Department headed by Mission Director, embarked on an inspection tour.

The Communitization Act 2002 was launched with the vision that with community participation, sectors such as education, health care etc would experience development through accountable partnership. Sadly, in most cases the endeavor failed to translate into reality. However, there are some pockets in our society that stands tall in displaying the core of our culture- a community bond that promotes the welfare of the society.

Visiting the schools in Pfutsero and Zapami, the impact of community participation can be translated in its success. GHSS Pfutsero with classes from 6 till 12 and with an enrollment of a commendable 660 students, the school gleams in the façade of an admirable community support. And rightly so because the school would be the first Government school in the state with CCTVs in the classrooms, an equipped Atal tinkering lab, a modern computer lab with more than 25 computers, projectors and other gadgets,

sick room, reading room, clean toilet complex, drinking water facility, hand wash area with water from a rain water harvesting tank, organic vegetable and flower garden and more. All these facilities/amenities gives tough competition to the private schools in the area during admission time as most parents rush for admission to GHSS Pfutsero. These added facilities in the school are purely through community contribution and participation.

Ownership and accountability can be contagious and in Zapami, not very far from Pfutsero is a cosy village that reflects the same ideology. The additional 5 rooms of the lone GMS in the village was constructed solely by the community. Infact, the school even maintains a community supported teacher for the past 10 years to address the acute shortage of teachers and to add to their shared goal of quality education. Science practical classes are conducted by using simple equipment procured by the community to motivate and interest students in science subject. A hostel for the school children of the GMS is also managed by the community as a way of extending quality intervention since most of the parents of the children are farmers and are not well read and do not have the ability or time to teach their children after school hours. Through the hostel, habits of hygiene and cleanliness, maintaining study hours and other etiquettes are taught. The Church sponsors the salary of the

hostel warden and Village Council sponsors the salary of the cook, while the parents contribute firewood and rice. The enrollment in the GMS has since gone up. The school also organizes picnics, activities, ensures meals are provided to the students and even mobilized funds towards an exposure trip. The village community also shared their plans to construct assembly hall for the GMS through community mobilization.

The members of the community have undoubtedly managed to create a scholastic environment for

the students that target a holistic approach to education.

It can be rightly stated that the success of a school is a social and communal endeavor. The community spirit in these schools are indicators that the state has the potential to meet the increasing pressures for greater community support towards academic outcomes. With a strong partnership and an accountable community participation, success is only the next step.
