

# OFFICIAL ORDERS and NOTIFICATIONS

## FINANCE DEPARTMENT INFORMS

General Provident Fund (GPF) Rule 11 provides that the Government shall pay the due interest as per prescribed rate pertaining to each year to the subscriber's account. As per the Government accounting Rules 1990, the accrued interest should be paid from the Consolidated Fund of the State (2049-Interest Payment-01 Interest on PF) and should be transferred to the Public Account of the State (8009-GPF-02-Gr.D). This should be done with prior sanction of the State Finance Department by every Drawing and Disbursing Officer (DDO) who maintains Gr. IV GPF ledger account. Monthly Accounts of the respective Treasuries pertaining to each year should exhibit the total amount debited to 2049-Interest and credited to 8009-GPF and 'Nil' payment voucher accordingly should be furnished by the Treasuries to the Principal Accountant General (A&E) Office for proper accounting.

The Finance Department Budget & Monitoring Cell therefore has asked all Heads of Departments (HoDs) and DDOs to furnish the data to Office of the Principal Accountant General (A&E), Nagaland, Kohima once in a financial year starting from 2019-20 onwards through their respective Treasuries as per above provisions with a copy to the Principal Director, Treasuries & Accounts, Nagaland starting from 2019-20. Further, the HoDs and DDOs should provide the figure pertaining to interest payment made during 2018-19 on GPF Gr. IV account to the Office of the Principal Accountant General (A&E), Nagaland, Kohima immediately for incorporation in the Annual Accounts of 2018-19 of the Government of Nagaland.

## NSDMA NOTIFIES ON VDMA

Nagaland State Disaster Management Authority (NSDMA) has notified that there shall be a dedicated Village Disaster Management Authority (VDMA) which shall be constituted by the Village Council. The VDMA shall be headed by the Chairman along with its members and the Secretary of Village Development Board (VDB) as Member Secretary.

The following are the Terms of Reference (ToR) for the members of the VDMA:

1. The VDMA shall function under the Village Council and shall consist of at least 5 (five) members and not more than 10 (ten) members.
2. No 2 (two) members of the VDMA can be selected from the same household.
3. The members of VDMA should be permanent residents of the village.
4. The VDMA shall comprise of at least 1 (one) woman member or more, depending on the composition of the Village Council.
5. The VDMA may, as and when it considers necessary, constitute sub-committee from the existing key line committees in the village, such as Health, Power, Water & Sanitation and Education committees etc. or any other sub-committee as necessitated.
6. The VDMA shall coordinate and devise a working response mechanism with neighboring villages.
7. The VDMA shall also coordinate with the sub-division authority and district authority on disaster management issues.
8. The term of the VDMA shall be co-terminus with the term of the Village Council. In case of defunct Village Council, VDB Secretary shall be the officiating Chairman of the VDMA.

9. No remuneration shall be paid for the membership of VDMA by the NSDMA/ District Disaster Management Authority.
10. The powers of the Chairman of the VDMA and the powers and functions of the VDMA shall remain the same as per Section 32 and 34 of the Nagaland State Disaster Management Rules 2012.
11. All the VDMAs shall prepare their own Village Disaster Management Plan, which is to be updated when necessary.
12. Any village failing to constitute VDMA shall not be eligible for any scheme/relief under NSDMA. Furthermore, State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) forms received without the signature of the VDMA Chairman/VDB Secretary shall be considered incomplete and devoid of benefit.

## GOVERNMENT CREATES NEW TRIBAL AFFAIRS DEPARTMENT

Department of Tribal Affairs in Nagaland has been created with immediate effect to deal exclusively the following functions and duties as detailed below:

Functions and Duties:

- a. Tribal Research Institute (TRI):
  - i. The scheme "Support to Tribal Research Institutes (TRI) 2017."
  - ii. Scheme of Centers of Excellence.
- b. Livelihood Support:
  - i. Schemes for "Institutional Support for Development and Marketing of Tribal Products."
  - ii. Scheme for "Minimum Support Price for Minor Forest Produce" modified w.e.f. 31/10/2016.
  - iii. Equity support to NSTFDC/STFDCs.
- c. Non Governmental Organization (NGO):
  - i. Vocational Training Centers in Tribal Areas.
  - ii. Scheme of "Grant-in-Aid to Voluntary Organizations Working for Welfare of STs."
  - iii. Scheme of "Development of Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs)."
  - iv. Scheme of "Strengthening Education among ST Girls in a Low Literacy District."
- d. State Grants:
  - i. Special Central Assistance to Tribal Sub Scheme (SCA to TSP).
  - ii. Grants under Article 275 (1) of the Constitution of India.
  - iii. Eklavya Model Residential Schools (EMRSs).
  - iv. Vocational Training Centers in Tribal Areas.
  - v. Establishment of Ashram Schools in Tribal Sub-Plan Areas.
  - vi. Centrally Sponsored Scheme of Hostels for ST Boys and ST Girls.
- e. One (1) post of Assistant Director (Re-deployment).
- f. One (1) post of Office Superintendent-cum-Accounts (Re-deployment from Treasuries & Accounts Department)
- g. Two (2) posts of UDA (Re-deployment from Departments).
- h. Creation of four (4) posts of LDA-cum-Computer Assistant.

- i. Creation of three (3) posts of Office Multitasking Assistant (Grade-IV).
- j. Creation of two (2) posts of Driver.

The Central Division, Kohima under Works & Housing Department will supervise all Civil Works in the Tribal Affairs Department.

In order to discharge the functions of the Department, the Finance Department will provide a separate Demand Number with all Heads of Accounts and RFC number to complete formalities with the Accountant General's Office to facilitate financial transactions.

The ongoing project and the projects already sanctioned will be implemented by the Planning Department. However, for the current year projects, arrangement will be decided by the two departments with approval of the Chief Minister.

This has the approval of the Cabinet vide Cabinet Secretariat (Cabinet Cell) Office Memorandum No. CAB-2/2013 (Pt) dated 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2019.

## MTF RENAMED TASK FORCE FOR MUSIC AND ARTS

According to a notification of the Department of Youth Resources & Sports, the Governor has renamed the Music Task Force under the Department of YR&S which is in the First Schedule, Section 46 (V) of the Nagaland Rules of Executive Business, 2016 as the "Task Force for Music and Arts" with immediate effect.

## GOVERNMENT CONSTITUTES COMMITTEE TO REVIEW THE CASES OF OFFICERS UNDER SUSPENSION

The Government of Nagaland has constituted the State Review Committee to review the cases of officers under suspension with the following members:

- i. Chief Secretary : Chairman
- ii. Senior most Additional Chief Secretary : Member
- iii. Principal Secretary, P&AR : Member Secretary

The Home Commissioner/Director General (Police) be co-opted wherever a case concerning a member of the Indian Police Service is considered by the Committee.

The Commissioner & Secretary/Principal Chief Conservator of Forest be co-opted wherever a case concerning a member of the Indian Forest Service is considered by the Committee.

The terms of reference for the State Review Committee are:

- i. The Committee shall review the cases of officers under suspension in order to determine whether they are of sufficient ground for the continuation of suspension.
- ii. In every case, the review shall be done within 90 days from the date of order of the suspension. In a case where the period of suspension has been extended, the next review shall be un-done within a period of 180 days from the date of last extension.
- iii. The Committee while assessing the justification for further continuation of any suspension shall look into the progress of any enquiry/investigation against the officer by obtaining relevant information from the authorities enquiring/investigating into the charges.

- iv. The Committee while examining a case shall consider the possibility of the officer under suspension tampering with the evidence, his influencing the process of enquiry or investigation and deprivation of his services during suspension.
- v. The Review Committee shall submit a detailed report to the competent authority, while stating its recommendations and the reasons for arriving at the recommendation relating to the continuance of the suspension.

## REMISSION OF PRISONERS' SENTENCES

Home Commissioner, Abhijit Sinha has informed through a notification that in commemoration of the ensuing anniversary of Independence Day 2019, the State Government has decided to remit the sentences against certain categories of prisoners who have been convicted by the courts (other than Court Martial) having criminal jurisdiction in the State of Nagaland and sentenced to rigorous imprisonment.

Therefore, in exercise of the power conferred by Sub-section 1 of Section 432 of the Code Criminal Procedure, 1973 (Act No. 2 of 1974 herein after referred as the said Code), the Governor of Nagaland has granted remission of sentences to the different categories of prisoners as specified below, lodged in the jails of Nagaland and outside, other than those in respect of whom the sentence is inflicted for an offence against the Order referred to in Sub-Section 6 of Section 432 of the said Code passed under any law relating to which the Executive Powers of the Union extends.

The scale of remission of sentence for different categories is specified below:

CATEGORY	SCALE OF REMISSION
1. Prisoners sentenced to 10 years and above	- 30 (Thirty) days
2. Prisoners sentenced to 5 years to 10 years	- 20 (Twenty) days
3. Prisoners sentenced to 1 year to 5 years	- 10 (Ten) days
4. Prisoners sentenced up to 1 year	- 5 (Five) days

Further, the aforesaid remission granted under the order shall not be admissible to the following categories of prisoners:

1. Prisoners convicted under Foreigners Act
2. Prisoners convicted under Passport Act
3. Prisoners convicted under Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act
4. Prisoners convicted under Section 3 to 10 of Official Secrets Act, 1923
5. Prisoners convicted under Section 2 to 3 of Criminal Amendment Act, 1961
6. Prisoners convicted under Section 121 to 130 of IPC
7. Prisoners convicted under Section 107/109 of CrPC
8. Prisoners convicted under Prevention of Corruption Act
9. Prisoners convicted of rape, attempt to rape or assault on women
10. Convicted prisoners found violating jail rules and discipline such as threatening/ intimidation/quarrelling/ beating of fellow prisoners/staff and smuggling of contraband and prohibited articles
11. Foreign National convicted under any Acts.

## RN RAVI SWORN IN AS GOVERNOR OF NAGALAND

RN Ravi was sworn in as the 19<sup>th</sup> Governor of Nagaland at Durbar Hall, Raj Bhavan Kohima on 1<sup>st</sup> August 2019.

Chief Justice (Acting), Gauhati High Court administered the Oath of Office to the Governor – Designate in the presence of the Chief Minister of Nagaland, Deputy Chief Minister, Speaker NLA, Leader of Opposition, Ministers of the State Government, Advisors, MLAs, Senior Officers of the State and Central Government and other dignitaries. The

swearing-in ceremony was also attended by former Chief Minister and Governor, Dr. S.C. Jamir, former Chief Minister K.L. Chishi and MP (Rajya Sabha) K. G. Kenye.

Chief Secretary to the Government of Nagaland, Temjen Toy, IAS read out the Warrant of Appointment. The newly appointed Governor was then accorded Guard of Honour by the Nagaland Police at the Raj Bhavan courtyard.

## RECEPTION IN HONOUR OF THE NEW GOVERNOR OF NAGALAND, RN RAVI

---

The Government of Nagaland held a grand reception in honour of the new Governor of Nagaland, RN Ravi at State Banquet Hall, Raj Bhavan on 1<sup>st</sup> August 2019.

Speaking at the reception, Ravi said he has embraced the duties and responsibilities given to him by Prime Minister Modi on the Indo-Naga peace talks 'as the mission of his life.' 'Five years ago when Modi gave me the responsibility of resolving the long pending Naga political issue, I could sense the touch of the unseen nursing me to fulfill the mission of my life,' Ravi said. In his maiden speech as the Governor of Nagaland, Ravi also voiced out the need to let women become co-partners in the journey towards greater heights.

Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio while welcoming Ravi as the Governor said that the entire Naga community is looking forward to Ravi's tenure with high hopes and expectations. Being an interlocutor, Ravi has become a household name for the Nagas as he has come in contact with all the tribal leaders and has been closely associated with the Naga people for many years, Rio said. Generations have been impacted by the political movement and all sections and conflicting parties have come to the realisation that talks across table

with respect and honour for each other is the only way ahead, Rio added.

Opposition Leader, T.R. Zeliang said Nagaland is fortunate to have a Governor in the person of R. N. Ravi whose name and identity has become synonymous with the Indo-Naga political issue. It was only after over 80 rounds of peace talks spanning several years that the framework agreement was signed with R. N. Ravi as the interlocutor. Therefore, Zeliang was optimistic that the appointment of R.N. Ravi as the Governor of Nagaland will facilitate and speed up the process of negotiation between the Naga political groups and the Government of India.

The reception programme was chaired by Chief Secretary, Nagaland, Temjen Toy, IAS. Ministers, Advisors, MLAs, AHoDs, HoDs and other NGOs attended the programme.

## S&WC DEPARTMENT OFFICIALS ATTEND EC MEETING

The departmental officials of Soil & Water Conservation Department attended EC meeting of the Tribal Sub-Plan Scheme under Science for Equity, Empowerment & Development (SEED), organised

by the Institute of Advanced Study in Science and Technology (IASST), Department of Science & Technology, Government of India that was held on 1st and 2nd August, 2019.

During the session, the Department presented a project proposal on "Low Cost Weather Station," at the Centre of Excellence-State Soil & Water Conservation Training and Research, Sechu for the benefit of tribal farming communities of the surrounding villages practicing both permanent pani kheti as well as traditional agro-forestry kheti.

The proposal is based on judicious, efficient and effective land use practices and adaptation of various practices in the climate change scenario. The

proposal includes installation of two LCWS each for each village, one in the upper and the other in the lower reaches to provide meteorological information online basis, and in return provide immediate advisory SMS information to the farming communities.

This pilot project is being muted to be replicated in other watersheds covering the entire districts of the state especially in the Jhum khetis including abundant fallow jhum fields where the farmers are expected to practice agro-forestry kheti.

The proposal was briefed by the Joint Director and designate OSD, Soil & Water Conservation, K. Khekiho Shohe.

## ROTA VIRUS VACCINE LAUNCHED

---

MD, NHAK, Dr. Thorhusie Katiry administered the 1<sup>st</sup> dose of Rota Virus Vaccine (RVV) to children at Naga Hospital Authority Kohima (NHAK) launching the RVV on 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2019.

Katiry highlighted that in India, available data indicates that Rota Virus is responsible for nearly 40% of moderate to severe diarrhoea in children less than 5 years, and Rota Virus Diarrhoea is responsible for 32,70,000 out-patient visits, 8,72,000 hospitalizations and 78,000 deaths annually. He said the government has taken many steps to reduce diarrhoea disease burden, and the introduction of RVV is a step in that direction. He also mentioned that RVV is the only specific protection against Rota Virus Diarrhoea.

SIO, DHFW, Dr. Ritu Thurr in his introductory note, briefed that this vaccine will be introduced in Routine Immunization Programme and will be given 5 drops orally at 6, 10 and 14 weeks along with Penta-1, 2 and 3 vaccine. He mentioned that RVV, like other routine immunization vaccines, will be provided free of cost, and that this vaccine is available in government run immunization programmes of the country which was earlier available in private market to only those who could afford it.

Rota Virus Vaccine (RVV) launching programme was also held on 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2019 at Conference Hall of CMO's Office, Mon.

## FOURTH SESSION OF THIRTEENTH ASSEMBLY

---

The fourth session of the thirteenth Nagaland Legislative Assembly started on 6<sup>th</sup> August 2019 with the Chief Minister and Leader of the House, Neiphiu Rio making obituary references to the passing away of Late Manohar Parrikar and Late D. Donkumar Roy.

Late Manohar Parrikar, former Defence Minister was serving as the Chief Minister of Goa from 14<sup>th</sup> March 2017 until his death on 17<sup>th</sup> March 2019. Late

Dr. Donkumar Roy, Speaker of Meghalaya Legislative Assembly was holding office until his death on 28<sup>th</sup> July 2019.

Nagaland Speaker, Vikho-o Yoshu made obituary reference to the passing away of Late Rokonicha, former Deputy Speaker of Nagaland Legislative Assembly and former Minister of State. He died on 16<sup>th</sup> April 2019 at the age of 73, having served

as Member of Nagaland Legislative Assembly for six terms.

Other highlights include assent to bill, namely the Nagaland Nursing Council Bill, 2019, Nagaland Appropriation (No. 1 & 2) Bill, 2019 and the Nagaland Lokayukta (Amendment) Bill, 2019; Election of the Deputy Speaker; Introduction of the Nagaland

Protection of Interests of Depositors (in Financial Establishments) (Amendment) Bill, 2018; Amity University Nagaland, Act 2011 (Repeal) Bill, 2019.

Discussions were also held on the Registration of Indigenous Inhabitants of Nagaland (RIIN) and Inner Line Permit (ILP).

## SHARINGAIN LONGKUMER ELECTED UNOPPOSED AS DEPUTY SPEAKER OF THE 13<sup>TH</sup> NLA

---

Sharingain Longkumer, 37 years old from Ungma village was elected unopposed and unanimously as the Deputy Speaker in the fourth session of the 13<sup>th</sup> Nagaland Legislative Assembly on 6<sup>th</sup> August 2019.

He was elected recently in the by-election for the 26<sup>th</sup> Aolenden Assembly Constituency under Mokokchung district.

### QUESTION HOUR DURING ASSEMBLY SESSION

During the question hour in the assembly session, Minister P. Paiwang, replying to a starred question asked by Yitachu, MLA on the status of Waterways Projects over Tizu, said due to the lack of technical expertise, the State Government requested IWAI to prepare Detailed Project Report (DPR) for Tizu-Zungki river. For the development of Tizu-Zungki river between India and Myanmar as an Inland Waterway corridor, IWAI has again awarded the work of preparation of DPR to M/s WAPCOS (Water and Power Consultancy Services India) Limited, Government of India undertaking. The preparation of DPR by WAPCOS Limited is in progress and expected to be submitted to IWAI shortly. Paiwang further stated that on the recommendation of the State Government, the NIWB was re-constituted under the Chairmanship of M.P (Rajya sabha), K.G. Kenye on 03/07/2017.

Deputy Chief Minister, Y. Patton, replying to a starred question on Nightingale Building at Kolkata, said in 1997 a lease agreement was executed between the Government Nagaland and the Civil Engineers Enterprise Private Limited (CEEPL) in respect of Nagaland House Commercial Complex,

Kolkata (Nightingale Building). The said lease was for 20 years with clauses for renewal for another 2 terms (i.e. another 20 years + 20 years). The lease expired in the year 2017 and the Government made a claim of enhanced rent at Rs. 2.2 crore instead of Rs. 5 lakh which the tenant was paying every month. This order was challenged by the lessee who offered to pay a paltry amount of Rs. 7 lakh rent per month for an area of 13736 sq. m. with buildings in the heart of Kolkata. The order of the Government for claiming enhanced rent was challenged by the lessee in the Calcutta High Court. The court on 14.05.2018 directed the Government to receive Rs. 7 lakh per month as rent without prejudice to its rights and contentions till the disposal of the Interim Application GA No. 486 of 2018. The said application GA No. 486 of 2018 came up for final hearing on a few occasions and on 15.07.2018 was argued at length.

The Advocate General pointed out to the Court that the State has the right to pursue other legal remedies like filing a suit for possession etc. It shall avail all the remedies apart from seeking the relief of enhancement of rent compensation.

Patton also stated that the State Government has filed counter affidavit against Civil Engineers Enterprise Private Limited (M/s Ghosal & Co.) dated 16<sup>th</sup> July 2018 and the lessee has filed its rejoinder. He further assured Government is taking all steps to fight the case for its rights and a Joint Parliamentary Committee has been constituted vide AS/LEG27/2018/ 1103 dated 26<sup>th</sup> October 2018. The Cabinet in its meeting held on 29<sup>th</sup> June 2019, seriously deliberated on the matter. The Joint Parliamentary Committee had detailed discussion with the Advocate General on the case on 14<sup>th</sup> July 2019 at Kolkata, and the Committee members also attended the Calcutta High Court hearing of the case on 15<sup>th</sup> July 2019 and

observed that the Advocate General made strong defense in favour of the Government.

The Advocate General strongly contended the right of the Government for enhancement of rent as well as the Government's rights to take possession of the state property.

MLA, Dr. Chotisuh Sazo raised a question on how many posts were sanctioned against Polytechnic College, Tsunazho, Chetheba, and so far how many have been appointed through NPSC and recruitment board. In reply to his starred question, Minister for Higher & Technical Education and Tribal Affairs, Temjen Imna Along said that the appointment has been done as per the need to run the institution through NPSC.

## HIGHLIGHTS OF THE CONCLUDING DAY OF ASSEMBLY SESSIONS

---

On the second day of the fourth session of 13<sup>th</sup> Assembly on 8<sup>th</sup> August 2019, Minister of Higher & Technical Education, Temjen Imna Along laid on the table a statement in fulfilment of the assurance in reply to a supplementary question raised by MLA Dr. Chotisuh Sazo regarding the total number of posts sanctioned against Polytechnic College, Tsunazho and Chetheba.

Consideration and passing of government bills included the Nagaland Protection of Interest for Depositors in the Financial Establishment (Amendment) Bill 2018, Amity University Nagaland Act 2011 (Repeal) Bill 2019. Chairman of the Committee on Estimate (2019-2020), Dr. Longrineken presented a copy each on 132<sup>nd</sup> Report on action taken on the observation and recommendation contained pertaining to School Education, 133<sup>rd</sup> Report on action taken with regard to Health & Family Welfare department, 134<sup>th</sup> Report of the Committee on Estimate of Horticulture and 135<sup>th</sup> Report on action taken pertaining of department of Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services.

During the question hour, replying to a starred

question raised by MLA Yitachu, Deputy Chief Minister, Yanthungo Patton informed the house that there were complaints on the issue of expulsion under Meluri Area Public organization for voting and not voting in the recently concluded Lok Sabha election and added that no authority has the right to expel any citizen for exercising his/her electoral franchise and if found true, necessary action can be initiated under the relevant provision of laws.

Replying to starred question asked by MLA Dr. Chotisuh Sazo on the amount sanctioned for the improvement of District Capital Roads, Deputy Chief Minister (Roads & Bridges), Y. Patton replied that Rs. 50 crore was sanctioned during 2018-19 and no amount has been sanctioned for the improvement of sub-divisional headquarters roads.

Replying to a question on the amount the State Government received during 2018-19 and 2019-20 against the backlog of Rs. 836 crore under SPA, Minister for Planning & Coordination, Neiba Kronu said against the backlog of Rs. 863.94 crore, the State Government received Rs. 226.80 crore during 2018-19 under SPA and no fund was received for the

2019-20. He further replied that the amount of Rs. 226.80 crore was allocated to various departments as sanctioned by the Ministry of Finance as follows - construction of 20 MVA 66/11KV S/S at Sovima with associated Transmission Line at Rs. 2.90 crore; Tsutsung HEP, Mokokchung at Rs. 2.71 crore; construction of additional 25 MVA 132/33 at S/S Kohima at Rs. 2.51 crore; Directorate of School Education, Phase II at Rs. 3.57 crore; establishment of State Sericulture Farmers' Training Centre, Dimapur at Rs. 1.12 crore; 13<sup>th</sup> IR Battalion, Yachang Mokokchung at Rs. 77.79 crore; 12<sup>th</sup> IR Battalion, Chingtok, Longleng at Rs. 82.06 crore; 10<sup>th</sup> NAP (IR) Bn. Hq. Zhadima at Rs. 46.47 crore and installation of Astro Turf at IG stadium, Kohima at Rs. 2.68 crore.

Replying to a starred question asked by MLA Dr. Chotisuh Sazo on the number of Local (Naga) languages approved for taking up in the school upto Class X and above, Leader of the House, Neiphiu Rio replied that four naga local dialects were approved and 18 local dialects were approved upto elementary

school level as a subject. On Tribal Literature Board seeking government approval for their languages to be taken up in the secondary school level, Rio said there are 13 such as Chang, Chokri (Chakhesang), Khezha (Chakhesang), Pochury, Sangtam, Yimchunger, Khamniungan, Phom, Konyak, Rengma, Zeme (Zeliang), Liangmai (Zeliang) and Kuki. He also said that the government is setting up an Institute of Naga Languages (within the Directorate of School Education) to look into such aspects. However, a definite timeframe cannot be made at this juncture, he added.

Replying to a supplementary question raised by MLA Kuzholuzo Nienu on how much funds are being provided by the Government of India for promotion of Tribal Language & Research, Advisor, School Education, K. T. Sukhalu said no fund is provided as such. On inclusion of Tribal Languages, the Leader of the House, Neiphiu Rio assured that those languages which are yet to be included will be studied and included.

## NLA DEBATES ON RIIN

Participating in the discussion on matters of urgent public importance under Rule-50, Minister PHED, Jacob Zhimomi said as far as Registration of Indigenous Inhabitants of Nagaland (RIIN) issue is concerned, all the members are unanimous including the NGOs, Tribal Hohos and Civil Society Organisations and that it will give effective administration and planning since the administrators and planners will get to know the exact data from this exercise, he added.

MLA, Chumben Murry said RIIN and Inner Line Permit (ILP) are two different things which are totally different from each other, elaborating that RIIN will identify us based on certain criteria whereas ILP is more or less like a travel document which enables law abiding citizens to come and stay for a while. Chumben also suggested the Government to observe

World Indigenous Day which is being celebrated every year on 9<sup>th</sup> August.

Advisor ITC & NRE, Mmhoneumo Kikon said implementation of ILP in Dimapur district has necessitated the RIIN. He said RIIN is important at this juncture because of the unemployment problem and on the other, the inflow of illegal migrants is eating job opportunity in the private sector.

MLA, Yitachu said tribal areas have to be protected and its unique customary laws and practices cannot be infringed adding that people and their lands cannot be isolated.

Minister, Agriculture and Cooperation, Kaito Aye said that there is nothing wrong in knowing the exact number of Nagas of Nagaland. Therefore, he urged all the members including the Civil Society Organisations to come forward and support this exercise.

Advisor, IPR, SCERT and HG & CD, Toshi Wungtung said that the exercise of RIIN is to bring accountability and responsibility of the governance in any form of dispensation. It identifies citizens in a proper manner for which the government is taking adequate measures in order to overcome unwanted issues in the course of its implementation. He also added that RIIN will give effective route for implementation of ILP.

MLA, Moatoshi while participating in the debate opined that all trade licenses be cancelled within a fixed period of time and further no issue of fresh license, vendors of bonafide Indian citizens should have license from the competent authority, no tenancy and restriction of employment to illegal migrants.

Leader of Opposition, T.R. Zeliang while summing up on behalf of the opposition stated that the issue should be deliberated at length before implementation. Creation of RIIN with 1963 as the basis of categorisation without indigenous Naga being well defined would only victimise certain sections of people, he said. He also suggested bifurcation of RIIN with ILP and reiterated that proper modalities should be worked out with no hue and cry. He further urged

the government to implement ILP in Dimapur district with the same stringent action as in other districts saying that it is only to identify non-tribals and non-nagas.

Leader of the House, Neiphu Rio while replying and expressing the government's stand on this issue sought opinions and constructive criticisms from all sections of the people including the legislators. He urged all the stakeholders to come forward and support this exercise as it is important not only for our present generation but also for the coming generations as well. Commission has been set up in regard to this issue where the members will thoroughly examine the matter and give recommendations/report to the government. Rio also assured that the Commission will go into the details and make sure that corrective measures over earlier notifications are taken. He also said that in the consultative meeting, all the tribal hohos, NGOs and CSOs endorsed the decision of the government and extended their support on the exercise of RIIN. However, they also cautioned that proper modalities should be worked out based on customary laws and practices practiced by their own respective tribes, he mentioned.

## 'OPEN HOUSE' LAUNCHED AT MON

Chairperson, Nagaland State Commission for Protection of Child Rights, Awan Konyak launched 'Open House,' a pilot initiative of the Task Force for Music and Arts (TaFMA) on 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2019 at the Town Council Hall in Mon.

During the launch programme, Awan Konyak said that the initiative taken by TaFMA will help to handpick, nurture and provide a platform for all the talented people in every nook and corner of Nagaland in the field of Music and Arts. She also said that the TaFMA is the brainchild of Chief Minister of Nagaland, Neiphu Rio and thanked the TaFMA for the privilege given to Mon district for the launch of the Open House initiative for the whole state.

Advisor, TaFMA, Theja Meru stated that the 'Open House' is a new concept to promote musicians at the grassroot level in a mini concert set up, to nurture new talent and also to provide a platform for musicians of all ages and genre.

Deputy Commissioner Mon, Thavaseelan K, IAS in his speech added that TaFMA is a brilliant initiative by the Chief Minister and the Government to boost the morale of the artists in various fields. ## 73<sup>rd</sup> INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATED ACROSS THE STATE

### KOHIMA:

On the occasion of the 73<sup>rd</sup> Independence Day, celebrated at the Secretariat Plaza, Kohima on 15<sup>th</sup> August 2019, Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio called upon the negotiating parties with the Government of India to come together and to rise above all differences and unite, for the sake of the people of Nagaland, adding that now is the most opportune time to unite and expedite the political dialogue for an early, honorable and acceptable solution.

To allow the citizens to safeguard their rights and entitlements, the State Government has been examining with utmost seriousness, the evolving demands for extending the Inner Line Permit Regulations to the entire state by covering Dimapur. The work towards that has started and is in the process of devising the modalities and framing the necessary rules and regulations. The need to put an end to the menace of issuance of illegal or fake indigenous inhabitant certificates to undeserving people as alleged by many is strictly being examined.

Rio said that the State Government's decision to work for the creation of a Register of Indigenous Inhabitants of Nagaland or RIIN has been primarily

guided by the aforesaid reasons. The RIIN exercise, announced on 29<sup>th</sup> June 2019, is to properly identify the indigenous people of Nagaland as well as those domiciled and permanently settled in the State which will also help in the effective implementation of ILP. The Government has set up a Committee under the chairmanship of the Chief Secretary with other senior officers to compile all the customary practices and the Committee has already set in motion the process by holding detailed deliberations with all the tribal bodies of the State on 7<sup>th</sup> of August 2019.

The General Election to the 17<sup>th</sup> Lok Sabha 2019 from 1-Nagaland Parliamentary Constituency was conducted peacefully and successfully. Nagaland security personnel, comprising of 20 (Twenty) companies from the various IR Battalions were also deployed in Tripura and West Bengal on election duty, where they performed well which is commendable, Rio added.

Chief Minister Rio said that to improve the infrastructure and provide other necessities for further enhancing the efficiency and capabilities of our police and security agencies, a multi-storied barrack for 300 constable trainees at PTS Chumukedima has been

constructed. At Kohima, a new Office of the Inspector General of Police (INT) has also been completed and is being inaugurated. The Police Communication System of Dimapur District has now been upgraded from analogue to digital system. A Cyber Crime Prevention against Women and Children Laboratory has also been set up at PTS, Chumukedima which is being inaugurated. A Special Task Force has also been raised on 8<sup>th</sup> of March 2019 comprising of six platoons for containing extortion, illegal activities and for operational exigencies of the State.

The Prisons Department is in the process for digitalization of all Jails in the State in collaboration with the State Legal Services Association (SLSA) and National Informatics Centre (NIC), through the Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs for E-prisons system.

Rio added that the much awaited Nagaland Lokayukta was established on 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2019 with the swearing-in of Justice Uma Nath Singh, former Chief Justice of the Meghalaya High Court. Mayang Lima was sworn in as the Upa Lokayukta on 29<sup>th</sup> March 2019. The erstwhile State Vigilance Commission has been merged with the newly established Lokayukta, Nagaland.

To transform our education system to meet the aspirations of the new generation, the State Government has fortified the education system by release of grants, distribution of free textbooks, uniforms and mid day meals in all Government schools and by providing assistive devices/hearing aids, spectacles, braille books and curriculum adaption for children with special needs. Students of Government Schools in Kiphire, the Aspirational District, were provided with digital tablets to enhance their learning. The Administrative & Academic Building of the newly constructed New Model Degree College at Wakching, Mon was inaugurated by Prime Minister, Narendra Modi on 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2019 through digital launching. Atmospheric Science Research Centre at Kohima Science College, Jotsoma has been established, and the ex-gratia payments for students studying outside

the State has also been launched, Rio added.

Under the Ayushman Bharat Scheme, 55 (Fifty five) Public Hospitals and five Private Hospitals have been empanelled, 76,663 e-cards have been issued, and benefits worth over Rs. 1 crore have already been availed by the beneficiaries till the end of June 2019. The upgradation of State Public Health Laboratory (SPHL) for sophisticated technologies has also been accomplished.

To facilitate agriculture marketing, especially for organic products, construction of an Organic Air Conditioned Market at Agri Expo site, 4<sup>th</sup> Mile, Dimapur is being undertaken.

The Department of Sericulture is setting up three Common Facility Centres, at Phek, Mokokchung and Wokha districts to promote Eri Culture. For the Aspirational District of Kiphire, Eri & Oak Tasar Silk Development Project is being implemented with funding from the Ministry of Textiles, Government of India.

The Rural Development Department through MGNREGS provided employment to 3.36 lakh households covering 4.17 lakh individuals in 2018-19. The Nagaland State Cooperative Bank was conferred with the National Recognition Commendation for outstanding performance in NRLM SHG Bank linkage during 2018-19 by the Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India. Further, Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) has been initiated through the State Government to provide bank facilities in all the unbanked blocks.

Under the Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT), urban service and infrastructure projects such as water supply, sewerage and septage management, storm water drainage, non-motorized urban transport and green spaces and parks have been taken up in the two selected cities of Kohima and Dimapur, the Chief Minister added. Projects like water supply in Dimapur and drainages in Kohima are under implementation. Hundreds of candidates have been trained and provided job placements and numerous SHGs have been given assistance in all the District Headquarters under the

National Urban Livelihoods Mission (NULM).

The Municipal Affairs Department has resumed three major unfinished projects at Kohima, namely the Multi-level Vehicle Parking at Old Medical Directorate and at the Old NST, and construction of Cultural Hall under the Kohima Smart City (KSC) Project.

Rio mentioned that under the State Forest Development Agency Programme, a plantation target of 2085 hectares has been achieved and a German grant-in-aid for Biodiversity Management Project too has been officially launched during the early part of this year. The Forest Department has also initiated the ban on usage of plastic polybags in the nurseries.

Under the Road Sector, in the recent past, 48 (Forty eight) number of projects under Special Road Development Programme (SRDP) were completed and five works with total length of 64.00 Km are in progress under NABARD. Recently, the NEC has sanctioned four roads for upgradation under the North East Road Sector Development Scheme (NERSDS).

Rio shared that the Ministry of Home Affairs has considered for an additional Helicopter Service and will be covering nine new routes in addition to the 10 existing routes. Keeping the needs of Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) on priority, altogether 39 (Thirty nine) Free Passes for travelling in the Department's buses were issued to PwDs during 2018-19, he added.

Rio highlighted that the Power Sector has achieved 100% rural household electrification under Saubhagya Flagship Programme of Government of India. Also, under "Green Village Initiative," a flagship programme of Government of Nagaland, the Department has taken up awareness programmes in 85 (Eighty five) villages to showcase and educate the people on energy conservation and its efficient use, besides free distribution of Energy Efficient LED bulbs, FC Tubes and Streetlights.

Mentioning the Software Technology Park of India (STPI) at Kohima which is ready for commissioning, he said the STPI will encourage local entrepreneurs to set up their software companies and

promote software exports from the State. A MoU has been signed with e-Governance Academy of Estonia for setting up e-Governance Academy of Nagaland (eGAN).

He stated that under the Jawaharlal Nehru National Solar Mission (JNNSM), Solar Power Plants project for School Education (Phase-1) is being taken up in Primary and Middle Schools with a cumulative capacity of 1305 kW at 355 locations and out of which, 283 projects sites have been completed.

Rio mentioned that the State Government has announced a project on 'Plastic Free Nagaland' wherein entrepreneurs will be provided funds under Chief Minister's Corpus Fund to produce alternative bamboo, jute and paper products to replace plastics. During 2019-20, funds under LADP have been enhanced to Rs. 90.00 crore at the rate of Rs. 1.50 crore per Assembly Constituency. The enhanced amount will be utilized for taking up one iconic project in each District headquarters.

Rio also stated that the State Government has put in place a State Startup Policy. Initially the State has identified - Nagaland Tool Room and Training Centre Dimapur, National Institute of Technology Dimapur, SASRD Medziphema, NEILIT and Science College Kohima as incubator institutions for the Startups. The State has completed the construction of marketing sheds and a Guest House at Avangkhu International Border Trade Centre.

In sports sector, the State's 1<sup>st</sup> Astro Turf at I.G. Stadium Kohima was inaugurated on 28<sup>th</sup> January 2019. He informed that the State Government will be partnering with the Bhaichung Bhutia Football Schools to promote and develop the game of football at all levels, especially amongst the youngsters. We will be hosting the T. Ao North East Football Championships and the Nagaland Olympic Association will also be organising the biennial Nagaland Olympic.

In the endeavour to expand the scope of promoting the music and art industry, the Chief Minister said the nomenclature of the erstwhile Music Task Force has been changed to Task Force

for Music and Arts (TAFMA). Open House, a statewide music programme aimed at identifying talents in the grassroots has been launched from Mon district on 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2019.

Stressing on state tourism, Rio said one of the focus areas to increase the inflow of tourists is by increasing events in all sectors of culture and heritage, adventure sports and traditional games, food and cuisine, music and arts, etc. This will ensure tourist inflow not only throughout the year but we will also have tourist footfalls across the State. He added that adventure tourism, beginning with hiking, will be promoted in a bigger way and the Tourism department is partnering with the Haniff Centre in the Himalayas.

Rio further stated that to promote the works of upcoming Naga photographers and filmmakers, the Department of Information & Public Relations organized the Hornbill International Photo 'Fest (HIPFEST), Photo Exhibition during Republic Day 2019 and the GLOCAL International Film Festival during the Hornbill Festival through public private partnership. The morning programme of the 73<sup>rd</sup> Independence Day 2019 celebrations at the Secretariat Plaza, Kohima witnessed 27 parade contingents, one of the largest so far, taking part in the march past which was led by Parade Commander, Denyong Konyak, Deputy Commandant, 4<sup>th</sup> NAP BN and 2<sup>nd</sup> In-charge, K. Lucy Yhome, Assistant Commandant, 4<sup>th</sup> NAP BN. The Angami, Rengma, Zeliang, Pochury and Ao cultural troupes performed various dances and songs. The Nagaland Adolescent Girls Club displayed a dance showcasing their theme for this year, "This is me. The unapologetically you," which was followed by a presentation of National Anthem in sign language by Cherry Blossom School, Kohima, and Taekwondo Display by Sports Academy, IG Stadium.

In the evening, an exhibition football match was played between Secretariat United Football Club and DC Kohima XI, with Home Commissioner, Abhijit Sinha as the Special Guest. Secretariat United Football Club won the match with a score line of 4-1. In the Armed Category, the first prize was awarded

to Special Task Force (STF) and the second prize to 15<sup>th</sup> (NAP) IR Battalion. In the Unarmed Category, 1<sup>st</sup> Naga Girls Battalion was awarded the first prize and Student Police Cadet was awarded the second prize. In the School Category, G. Rio Higher Secondary School bagged the first prize, while Mezbur Higher Secondary School bagged the second place. There was a band display by the Nagaland Police Central Brass Band and 3<sup>rd</sup> Assam Rifles Pipe Band.



permanency about it, infact under Sub-clause 3 of Article 370, it mentions under what circumstances the President can delete the provision. Article 371(A) is the result of over three years of negotiation between the people of Nagaland and the Government of India, it is an agreement derived at, that is why it is a solemn commitment, and sacred to the people of Nagaland; it is not temporary or impermanent as Article 370 is, the Governor stated.

Chief Minister Nagaland, Neiphiu Rio described the new Governor, R.N. Ravi as no stranger to the Naga people because of his role as the Centre's interlocutor for the Naga political issue and whose name is a household name amongst the Naga families.

She further brought to the notice of the Ministry officials that it will not be fair to shift the Office of the Regional Outreach Bureau from Kohima to Imphal as is being contemplated by the Ministry.

The Secretary gave a patient hearing to all the suggestions and grievances put forward and called on the State DIPRs and the I&B media units to work hand in hand towards the common goal of keeping informed on the policies and programmes of the government. Nagaland State was represented by Commissioner & Secretary, IPR, Maria Yanthan and Director, IPR, Limawati Ao.

## 7<sup>TH</sup> ECONOMIC CENSUS 2019 LAUNCHED

The 7<sup>th</sup> Economic Census, 2019 under the aegis of the Ministry of Statistics and in collaboration with CSC eGovernance Service India Limited was launched on 26<sup>th</sup> August 2019 at the Nagaland Civil Secretariat, Kohima by the Principal Secretary, IT & C and Power, K.D. Vizo.

Vizo in his address, said that the Economic Census 2019 is the census of the Indian economy through counting of all entrepreneurial units in the country which are involved in any economic activity. All household establishments engaged in non-agricultural economic activities including construction, except public administration, defence and compulsory social security are proposed to be convened in the 7<sup>th</sup> Economic Census. He said that

the Common Service Centre (CSC) in partnership with Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) has been tasked with the responsibility of data collection and related activities of implementing the 7<sup>th</sup> Economic Census.

The CSC has engaged 1252 Enumerates and 305 Supervisors (total of 1557 manpower) who have undergone training for the deployment on the field as Enumerators and Supervisors for the 7<sup>th</sup> Economic Census which will be covering 2264 Enumeration areas (1481 rural and 783 urban Enumeration areas).

### KOHIMA:

The Deputy Commissioner and Chairman of the 7<sup>th</sup> Economic Census Kohima, Gregory Thejawelie

launched the 7<sup>th</sup> Economic Census for Kohima district on 26<sup>th</sup> August 2019 in his office chamber in the presence of its Committee Members, Supervisors and Enumerators.

During the launching programme, the DC impressed upon the Supervisors and people engaged in the field work to execute their work with sense of responsibility and sincerity so as to have a transparent and reliable economic data of our State. He further said that 7<sup>th</sup> Economic Census exercise will cover a total number of 107 villages with a total of 30,000 household approximately, and under urban areas, there will be a total number of 148 enumeration blocks and six (6) Investigator Units. The activities in

the field will be carried out by a total number of 49 Supervisors and 174 Enumerators.

For this exercise, a series of training for Supervisors and Enumerators were conducted in sub-divisional and district levels by District Manager Kohima, CSC-SPV Nganuo Kielienu and Vikhoto Kapu as resource persons in order to conduct the exercise successfully.

Simultaneous launching programme were also held in other seven districts, namely Phek, Wokha, Zunheboto, Kiphire, Longleng, Mon and Tuensang with the concerned Deputy Commissioners, and it will commence soon in the remaining three districts of Dimapur, Mokokchung and Peren.

## TEMJEN IMNA ALONG CALLS UPON UNION MINISTER FOR TRIBAL AFFAIRS

Minister for Higher & Technical Education and Tribal Affairs, Nagaland, Temjen Imna Along accompanied by Additional Chief Secretary, Tribal Affairs, Lhoubelatuo Kire and officials of the Department of Under Developed Areas (DUDA) on 26<sup>th</sup> August 2019 called upon Union Minister for Tribal Affairs, Arjun Munda at his office chamber, New Delhi.

Temjen Imna Along apprised the Union Minister that the State's Department of Tribal Affairs, which has been a long-felt need, was created recently in

Nagaland after the approval of the Cabinet on 2nd August 2019. The delegation briefed the Union Minister that since the Department was created not even a month back, there is a lot of work to be undertaken for which the Union Minister assured that the Ministry will provide all assistance to the State, including a review of the current year's projects/schemes along with consideration of additional project proposals for 2019-20 which will be carried out shortly.

On the issue of various projects such as Minor

Forest Produce (MFP) and Minimum Support Price (MSP) and development of value chain for MFP which fall under the Tribal Cooperative Marketing Development Federation (TRIFED) – an initiative of the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India to develop the socio-economic conditions of tribals in the country, the Union Minister expressed his happiness over the performance of the DUDA and also assured that the proposals sent by the Department will be taken up by the Ministry. It may be mentioned that the Ministry declared DUDA as one of the State Implementing Agencies for these projects from 2018-19. Under these projects, the department is actively involved in elevating the livelihood of farmers and MFP gatherers. 13 SHGs have also been set up and more SHGs are being covered in a phase-wise manner.

Later in the afternoon, Temjen Imna Along accompanied by DRC New Delhi, Kethosituo Sekhose

and officials of the Technical Education Department called on the Chairman of AICTE, Dr. Anil D. Sahasrabudhe wherein issues regarding upgradation of Khelhoshe Polytechnic Atoizu, Government Polytechnic, Kohima and schemes available with the AICTE for the State were discussed.

The Chairman AICTE stated that approval for upgradation of the two polytechnics will be given by the end of this year and requested that the State Government give its commitment for upgradation of infrastructure and post creation at the earliest. The AICTE expressed its readiness to provide funds for procurement of equipment for these institutes as well as necessary assistance for preparation of DPRs. He also stated that the State Government should avail schemes for ground water harvesting, Internet WAN/LAN/Fibre Optics installation and Solar Power plants from the AICTE for the Technical Institutes of the State.

## CONSULTATION MEETING HELD ON PREPARATION OF DPR FOR REJUVENATION OF RIVER BRAHMAPUTRA

---

A State level consultation meeting on preparation of Detailed Project Report (DPR) for Rejuvenation of River Brahmaputra through forestry interventions in Nagaland was held on 27th August, 2019 at Conference Hall of Chief Secretary, Civil Secretariat, Kohima.

Chief Secretary, Temjen Toy in his address said many Nagas do not realize that water crisis is becoming more and more alarming; rainfall has been declining over the years, only the intensity has increased by way of cloudburst and other weather phenomena. He stated that in such a backdrop, we have the Brahmaputra Rejuvenation Project coming our way and Nagaland is an important part of this project. Speaking on the nine policies of the project, he said it encompasses many important issues including adaptation policies to tackle climate change which involves villagers and land owners of the state.

Scientist-E & Project Coordinator, Dr. Dhruva J. Das gave a powerpoint presentation where he

expressed that the prime aim of the meeting is to sensitize and ensure better cooperation among stakeholders and to develop region-specific strategies for the State of Nagaland. He highlighted that Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF&CC), Gol entrusted Indian Council of Forestry Research & Education (ICFRE), Dehradun to prepare DPR for rejuvenation of 13 major rivers in the country through forestry interventions, namely Beas, Chenab, Jhelum, Ravi, Sutlej, Yamuna, Brahmaputra, Mahanadi, Narmada, Krishna, Godavari, Cauvery, Luni belonging to nine river basins.

Dr. Das also mentioned that accordingly, Rain Forest Research Institute (RFRI), Jorhat under ICFRE was instructed to prepare DPR for Rejuvenation of River Brahmaputra through forestry interventions.

PCCF and HOFF, Nagaland Forest Department, Rajat S Pal said while formulating policies for the project in Nagaland, two things have to be considered: rivers have to be identified whether they are East

or West flowing, and secondly, land belongs to the people. He expressed the need to involve neighbouring states in China and also stressed on the importance of geology of the areas involved.

Open discussion was held focusing on existing reports/works done by departments/organisations, data format, agro-forestry/forestry/other models

developed and tested by various agencies, future plans for forestry intervention and planning for follow up action.

The programme was organised by Rain Forest Research Institute (ICFRE) Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Gol, Jorhat, Assam in collaboration with Government of Nagaland.

## GOVERNOR RAVI RAISES ISSUE OF AIR CONNECTIVITY

The Minister gave necessary instructions to the concerned officials of the Ministry and Airlines and assured the Governor that the flight services on these sectors will begin by October this year.

Following the meeting with the Civil Aviation Minister, Hardeep Singh Puri, R.N. Ravi took an inter-

ministry meeting on 28<sup>th</sup> August 2019 at Nagaland House R. K. Puram, New Delhi in which Ministry of Civil Aviation, Ministry of Home Affairs, Airport Authority of India and flight operators like Air India/ Alliance Air and Indigo participated.

All operational and logistic issues related to improvement of Dimapur Airport as per the standards of the Director General of Civil Aviation as well as early operationalization of better regional air connectivity of Dimapur were discussed. The Governor also impressed upon the flight operators to explore and further improve air connectivity of Dimapur with the rest of the North East Region, Delhi as well as the rest of the country.

## PRESIDENT FINER PROPOSES SETTING UP FINER SECTOR IN NAGALAND

A workshop on Pradhan Mantri Kisan Sampada Yojna organized by the Federation of Industry & Commerce of North East Region (FINER), sponsored by Ministry of Food Processing Industries and supported by the Department of Industries & Commerce, Nagaland was held at the Capital Convention Centre on 28th August 2019.

Chief Secretary, Temjen Toy, IAS in his address mentioned that 70% of the Naga population depends on agri sector for their livelihood but agriculture in Nagaland is conservative and traditional so more attention to increase in productivity should be emphasized, adding that, for a farmer to take their

products beyond the farm gate is a major struggle starting with linkages of marketing outlets, cold storages and maintenance of cold chain linkage. He also pointed out that the government is studying and is committed to remove the obstacles in marketing outlets and other similar problems and further requested the central government and other funding agencies for a cent percent funding, if not on 90/10 basis.

Additional Secretary, Ministry of Food Processing Industries, Government of India, Dr. Rakesh Sarwal, IAS in his address said a large number of population in Nagaland depends on Agriculture, so in this sector,

one can be an entrepreneur in food processing which can help both the farmers get a better price for their products and also the entrepreneur to generate earnings, income and employment for the commercial produces which also increase the state government income.

Dr. Rakesh Sarwal said that the MOFPI have sponsored the workshop to help the local entrepreneur of Nagaland to impart knowledge about the various food processing technologies, the different government assistance for the units and food processing policies. He also added MOFPI has a set of schemes to fund 50% of the project cost of the unit established. He highlighted about the cold storages, marketing outlets and encouraged the state

government to set up more food testing laboratories in the state, and said MOFPI would assist 50% subsidy unit cost to any entrepreneurs wanting to establish a private food testing lab, encouraging the government to set up entrepreneurs training centres in the district headquarters.

President, FINER, Pabitra Buragohain gave a brief introduction of FINER, and also requested 10 to 15 entrepreneurs to share their views and join to become a member of FINER so that a sector of FINER can be set up in Nagaland.

Subsequently, sessions on Processing Technology, opportunities and assistance were discussed in detail summing the workshop.

Starting from 2016-2017 and 2017- 2018, there are altogether 311 medal winners (Gold - 83, Silver - 93, Bronze - 135) from amongst 14 disciplines at the national

and international level; 210 recipients including four Coaches. In the meantime, the Department is also

making necessary arrangements for 'Cash Awards to Meritorious Sportspersons for the year 2018- 2019.

## GOVERNOR TAKES UP STATUS OF ROAD PROJECTS WITH MINISTER

The Governor of Nagaland, R.N. Ravi held a meeting with the Minister of Road Transport & Highways, Nitin Gadkari at Transport Bhavan, New Delhi on 29<sup>th</sup> August 2019.

A review of the status of 14 road projects under NHIDCL in Nagaland was taken during the meeting with special focus on Dimapur-Kohima four-laning project. The Minister assured all possible measures

would be taken to ensure completion of the projects on time.

Governor Ravi will periodically review the status of these projects with all concerned including the senior officials of NHIDCL to monitor the progress. The meeting was also attended by Chairman NHIDCL and other senior officials of the Ministry.

The Government of Nagaland has changed the village name of "Tamkong" to "Tamkoang" village under Tobu Sub-Division in Mon District with immediate effect.

The village name of "Mangkhi" to "Müngankhyun" village under Tuensang district has also been changed with immediate effect.

## ADVISOR ZHALEO CALLS ON UNION MINISTER FOR MINORITY AFFAIRS

Zhale-o Rio, Advisor for Sericulture, Excise and Minority Affairs made a courtesy call on Mukhtar Abbas Naqvi, Union Minister for Minority Affairs at his official residence, New Delhi on 30<sup>th</sup> August 2019.

Various development projects under PMJVK for socio-economic, educational development in the state was discussed. A request was made to the

Union Minister for approval of more minority block centres under qualified districts, which was affirmed, so as to reach the benefits to the targeted groups in the state. The Advisor was accompanied by Zaputuo, OSD to Advisor and Kedichatuo Kense, ALO, Nagaland House, New Delhi.

## INAUGURAL PROGRAMME ON TRAINING AND DISTRIBUTION OF HOME SCALE PRESERVATION EQUIPMENTS UNDER RKVY

Inaugural programme on training and distribution of home scale preservation equipments under Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY) was organized by Department of Horticulture Government of Nagaland, at State Horticulture Nursery on 31<sup>st</sup>

August 2019. During the programme, home scale preservation equipments were distributed to 14 selected beneficiaries.

In a brief programme, Principal Secretary, Horticulture, M.K. Mero encouraged the selected

beneficiaries to be sincere and dedicated in utilising the facilities provided by the department as they are the chosen ones among all other beneficiaries of the state. He spoke on the importance of processed food which can be preserved, thereby encouraging the beneficiaries to experiment from the equipments and make better use of it, and was optimistic that with the help of the equipments, the beneficiaries would opt more on cultivation towards processing and increase production in the state economy.

Director of Horticulture, Dr. R. Elithung Lotha encouraged the beneficiaries on the importance of the various training programmes which were basically conducted to help the trainees in which ever possible ways.

The programme was followed by technical session on scope of fruits and vegetables preservation, objective and technologies of home scale preservation, and dehydration of fruits using solar drier etc. which was conducted by Deputy Director, Meyasashi.

## ETPBS AND SERVICE VOTER: A SUCCESSFUL TURNOUT FOR LOK SABHA ELECTION 2019

Among the many milestones recorded during the recently concluded Lok Sabha Election 2019, Electronically Transmitted Postal Ballot System (ETPBS) is one of its kind in the world's largest democratic election processes. Compared to 5,376 number of registered Service Electors of last General Election to Lok Sabha, 2014 from 1-Nagaland Parliamentary Constituency, a record highest number of 7,490 were enrolled as Service Electors through online registration with the dedicated portal <https://www.servicevoter.eci.nic.in> who were sent postal ballots electronically. For the first time, a full-fledged online registration portal for service electors has been used to save processing time, resources and human errors.

Persons working in Central Forces under Arms Act and government officials deployed in Embassies outside the country are classified as Service Voters and are provisioned for online enrolment. As Nagaland went for poll in the first phase, total 7,490 postal ballots were dispatched electronically using the flagship IT programme of Election Commission of

India, known as ETPBS. Out of which, 5,295 e-postal ballots were received indicating 70.69% turnout, which is a significant improvement compared to 2014 when turnout was only 13.73%.

ETPBS is developed by Election Commission of India for the use of the Service Voters. It is a fully secured system, having two layers of security. Secrecy of voting is maintained through the use of OTP and PIN and no duplication of casted ETPB is possible due to the unique QR Code in the portal <https://www.etpbs.in>. Through this system, the service voters cast their vote on an electronically received postal ballot, from anywhere outside their constituency, thus the chances of losing the voting opportunity has reduced. The purpose of the online system was to create convenient and easy-to-use online system for Defence Personnel to become Service Voters.

With the motto of "No voter to be left behind," Election Commission of India's ETPBS has empowered and ensured all eligible service electors with their constitutional power to vote while performing their duty for the nation.

## AWARENESS ON POSHAN ABHIYAAN HELD AT GHSS MON

Literary programme of GHSS Mon was held at Council Hall Mon on 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2019. CDPO Mon, T. Yanlem spoke on the awareness of Rashtriya Poshan Abhiyaan as part of Information, Education & Communication (IEC) and Advocacy programme.

Yanlem said that the target of National Nutrition Mission is to bring down stunting among children in the age group 0-6 years from 38.4 percent to 25 percent by the year 2022. Nutrition Mission will address malnourishment through convergence and

targeted approach for timely service delivery, he added.

Yanlem further mentioned that the targeted beneficiaries are children in the age group of 0-6 years, pregnant and lactating women and adolescent girls. The National Nutrition Mission is focussing to prevent and reduce under-nutrition and stunting in children and to reduce the prevalence of anaemia among young children, women and adolescent girls.

This initiative is a first of its kind in the state to create community level awareness and participation on the evils of sex selection and abortion.

Under this, an exclusive helpline number '6009150274' has been set up so that cases of illegal sex determination can be reported. Other key features of this initiative includes that informers

will be rewarded and his/her identity will be kept confidential.

The Pre Conception and Pre Natal Diagnostic Techniques (PCPNDT) Act gives this initiative its legal tooth as offences under this act are cognizable, non-bailable and non-compoundable.

Mon district has the second worst child sex ratio in the State and hence improving the Sex Ratio at Birth (SRB) remains the primary goal of BBBP Mon.

## DC TUENSANG CONVENES MEETING WITH TTAWU

A meeting on issues regarding sanitation, dumping ground and laying of optical fibre cables along the main roads was held on 7<sup>th</sup> August 2019 with the Deputy Commissioner Tuensang, Mohammad Ali IAS as the chairman and attended by the representatives of Tuensang Town All Wards Union (TTAWU).

Digging of roads on account of the ongoing laying of optic fibre cables have compounded the woes of the citizens especially due to the slush created by the loose soil during the monsoon rains and in the absence of footpaths. be executed starting in the first week of October 2019 after the monsoon season is over. He asserted that it is a major district road and the existing 3 meter road will be extended with additional 7 meter surface along

with both black topping and cementing in 5 meter, and the NEC will maintain the road for 4 years after completion of the project.

During his 4 years in NEC, he cited various

development projects executed under NEC projects within Eastern Nagaland such as 46 Km road from Nokzang to Longding under Mon district and another 30 Km road from Mon to Konnubari will also be taken up soon. Also providing computer facilities to GHS under Kiphire district and piggery feed meat project in Longkhim and Ginger project under Tuensang district.

In his speech, S. Pangnyu Phom Minister for H&FW informed the gathering that unlike other projects, Longleng – Tuensang road project will be 100% funded by the NEC and it would not benefit only the people of two districts but also the entire Eastern Nagas. He therefore, appealed to the people to come together, to work together, to progress together and clarified that no compensation shall be given to the

landowners. He also appealed to the Village Councils to fully take the responsibility of the road under their respective jurisdiction for quality and speedy completion of the project as desired by all.

Anjo Keikung; John Tsulise Sangtam, Deputy Commissioner, Longleng and the Additional Deputy Commissioner Tuensang also spoke and exhorted the gathering. The DC mentioned that the citizens can verify their electoral details through NVPS Portal, 'Voter Helpline' Mobile app or submitting a hard copy of filled up forms through BLOs to EROs by giving supporting document of one of the following - Indian Passport, Driving License, Aadhaar, Ration card and any other documents as approved by the Election Commission. Further, he requested all the political parties to appoint the Booth Level Assistant (BLA) in all the polling stations under Mon district and submit it.

Merapani road, the board decided that as the road was officially handed over by the State Government to the National Highway & Infrastructure Development Corporation Ltd (NHIDCL) on 13<sup>th</sup> July 2017, the board urged the NHIDCL to take up the case on priority basis and to expedite the work at the earliest since the said road is the economic lifeline of Wokha and its neighboring district.

The farmer has to voluntarily contribute certain amount starting from Rs. 55 to Rs. 200 according to their age on the date of registration. He also mentioned that the farmers may contact concerned DAOs/SDAOs for details. It was also informed that small and marginal farmers of 18-40 years group were eligible for registration in the scheme.

After the seminar, Anaemia Detection Camp was held for the participants with assistance from the medical doctors and staff of CHC Medziphema. Out of the 150 girl students, 27 girls were found to be anaemic. Adequate treatment and

medicines were given to the anaemic students.

On 30<sup>th</sup> August 2019, the Department of Social Welfare, Dimapur District in convergence with School Education and Health & Family Welfare also conducted Anaemia Screening Camp with the theme 'Prevention of anaemia in adolescent girls and women in reproductive age group' at Urban Primary Health Center, Burma Camp, Dimapur. About 70 girl students and 4 teachers from GHS Burma Camp participated and underwent the screening tests. Lactating and pregnant women also attended the camp. About 20 students were found to be moderately anaemic after the test and free Iron and Folic Acid (IFA) tablets were distributed to those who attended the camp.

## TRAINING ON MAKING ECO-FRIENDLY PRODUCTS AT PUGHOBOTO


## MID DAY MEAL MELA-2019 HELD IN PEREN TOWN
