# Nagaland

land engulfed in mystery, inhabited by vibrant people zealously guarding their culture - dancers, warriors, head-hunters; mountains, valleys, forests all these forms the portrait of Nagaland the moment the word is uttered. But, from extreme mystery to hosting a globally famous cultural festival, Nagaland has come a long way over the years and etched a name for itself in the world's tourist destination map.



Nagaland came into being on 1st December, 1963 as the sixteenth state of the Indian Union with Kohima as her capital. With a geographical area of about 16,579 so km, she shares her borders with Assam in the North and West, Myanmar and Arunachal Pradesh in the East and Manipur in the South. The topography of the state is nearly all hilly, the highest peak being Saramati (3841m) in the district of Kiphire. Many rivers cut through this mountainous terrain, like sharp swords slicing through rocks, the main ones being Dhansiri, Doyang, Dikhu, Milak, Tizu and Zungki.

The climate of Nagaland is nothing but perfect. With pleasant summers when temperatures do not average above 31° C and winters when they don't average below 4°C, the place is a 'perpetual holiday destination'.





























The best months to visit Nagaland are between October and May, when the landscape wears a green carpet and the flowers light up the skies with their bright hue. Rhododendrons and Orchids cover the landscape of Nagaland and one cannot miss them even as he is driving or trekking the challenging terrain. Traditionally the Naga people have been hardcore hunters, but awareness in conservation has resulted in common sighting of endangered birds and animals. The rare Blyth's tragopan (Tragopan blythii) is a resident of Nagaland and can be observed in plenty. In 2012, mass trapping and capture of migrating Amur falcons (Falco amurensis) was discovered in Nagaland and a successful campaign was initiated to prevent their killing. As part of this campaign, three birds were fitted with 5 gm satellite transmitters that allowed them to be tracked during their migration.

A 21st century creation of Nagaland is the Hornbill festival, an event which is now getting known globally. During Hornbill, which takes place from 1st December to 10th December, the entire Naga culture is showcased in full splendor in the Kisama village of Kohima district. The Government of Nagaland welcomes one and all to this mega event for a preview of what the state has to offer in terms of culture, traditions, tourism interest and industry.

## A dash of colour: people, life and culture

A population of only about 1.9 million, the numbers may sound meagre when compared with the vast population of the Indian peninsula; but these few people









































are composed of 17 different major tribes, each representing a unique cultural system. With a population density of 120 persons per sq km, generally one major or minor tribe enjoys predominance across each of the 16 administrative districts.



Spirits, fertility, social bonding and purification are the key elements that form the essence of the Naga festivals - the custom that each tribe follows, translates into a festival. These traditional events, combined with life in the rural areas, are exceptionally engaging and distinctive. All of them are annual events with fixed dates; hence, before visiting Nagaland, the interested traveller can arrange his or her calendar accordingly. The first festival takes place in January and the last (or is it the last recorded?) in December - no matter what the season is, some festival is always round the corner.







































District: Kohima

Main Tentional Sekrenyi

The Sekrenyi festival of the Angami tribe falls on the 25th day of the Angami month of Kezei. It is a celebration of purification accompanied with feasting and singing. A highlight of Sekrenyi is the Thekra Hie, when the village youths gather and croon traditional songs throughout the day.





District : Kohima Date : November 27-28

Main Festival: Ngada

The Rengmas commemorate the Ngada festival for eight days just after the harvest. It is the festival of thanksgiving and rejoicing. Ngada also underscores the end of the agricultural year. The village high priest (Phensengu) heralds the beginning of the festival at the top of his voice, so that the villagers can prepare themselves for it.











































District : Peren

Main Featural Hoga

The Zeliangrong are formed of three tribes, namely, the ZEmei, the LIANGmei and the RONGmei and the name Zeliangrong is derived from the first few syllables of these three individual tribes. Hega, their matrimonial festival, is dedicated to the almighty. Besides seeking his protection and guidance, during Hega the Zeliangs invoke God to bless his people with wealth, luck and courage. This is considered as an auspicious time for young couples to tie the nuptial knot. The festival begins with a variety of programmes and merrymaking.







District : Peren Date : January 17

Many Festival: Wimket

The Kukis are one of the tribes who followed a southerly migration route and were known as Aishen when they migrated from Manipur. Later some of them also migrated to Meluri sub-division towards the Indo-Myanmar border. Kukis celebrate Mimkut, a harvest festival, for a week from the 17th day of the Kuki month of Tolbol. It is said that Mimkut and other festivals started in order to appear Thilha the demon. The village medicine man (Thempu) sacrifices fowls and performs a series of rituals to propitiate the spirit of the demon-god during this festival.











































District : Dimagur Date : Last week of January Main Testwal Bushii

The Bushu (or Bushu liba) is a post harvest festival which usually falls in the month of January after the paddy is harvested, threshed and stored. Although the exact date is not fixed, people generally celebrate it around a full moon night in January because it is believed to be auspicious.



# The Charhesang

District : Plus Date : May 05 & January 15 respective

A new year of activities begins with the arrival of spring; all activities related to sports and entertainment that began after the harvest, cease along with the Tsukhenye festival. The festival lasts for four days - on the first morning, the village priest sacrifices the first rooster that crows. The men folk purify themselves by bathing in a designated well where no women are allowed. After bathing, they invoke the Almighty for strength, long life, good harvest etc

During Sukrenye, considered as the most important Chakhesang festival, the boys and girls are consecrated through religious ceremonies and rituals. Sükrunyi is celebrated over a total of eleven days.













































District: Phek Date : October 05

Main Festional Yearsho

Yemshe is the festival for blessing the upcoming harvest. All the Pochuries celebrate this festival with great pomp and galety anticipating a good harvest. Yemshe is observed only on October 05 in tune with the traditional days of the event.







District : Tuensung Date : July 31

Man Festival Naknyulom

The Chang share an affinity with the Sema, Lotha, Ao, Yimchungrü, Phom, Sangtam and some Southern Naga tribes, as can be deduced from old legends. Naknyulem is a festival of bonding through the exchange of gifts and delicacies amongst friends and relatives – meat, wine and freshly packed bread are abundantly used. Festivities

run throughout the day through games like top spinning. tug-of-war. high jump, long jump, climbing of oiled poles and grabbing big lumps of cooked meat hung in rows along a bamboo rope strung at a height. The womenfolk play and compete with the instrument Kongkhim.









































District : Mokokchun Date : May 01 – 03

Man Festival Modisi

A bonding festival, Moatsü Mong is celebrated by the Ao after the season of sowing is over - the festival, celebrated with vigorous singing and dancing continues the customary practices of making the best rice beer and rearing the best pigs and cows for slaughtering during the festival. The womenfolk, dressed in their traditional fineries. join the men folk in composing warrior songs. Villagers sing songs to eulogize the lovers and the village folk as a whole. The elders encourage the youth to be bold and heroic for defending the villages from enemies, a custom continued from the head-hunting days.







District: Mon

Man Tesaval Acleang

The forefathers of the Konyak believed they were direct descendents of Noah and they have biblical names like Mosa, Kaisa, Aron etc. It is also believed that they crossed a mythical gate called Alemkaphan which the Konyaks interpret as gate of the sun. The village heads still use the word Wang (Angh) for themselves, meaning 'the beginning of everything'. Aoleang Monyü is an ancient spring festival celebrated by all Konyaks in the first week of Aolegng lee (April) since time immemorial. Asleang is observed to mark the end of the old year and to welcome the new-year beginning with spring. Prayers are offered to God for a bountiful harvest.













































District : Longleng Date : April 01-02

Main Textinal Monya

A new-year festival, the arrival of Monyū is announced by the beating of log drums with a distinct tune traditionally called Lan Nyangshem. A feature of this festival is the men folk showing respect to their married daughters or sisters by offering them specially prepared food and rice beer - this custom reflects the high status of women in a Phom household.





# The Khiamniungan

District: Noklak

Moun Festional Min.

A bonding festival, a main purpose of Miu is to build and reinforce relations between a maternal uncle and his nephews and nieces. The maternal uncle offers special prayers to deities for granting prosperity and power over enemies to his nephews and nieces.











































District : Tuensang/Kiphire Date : August 4–8

Main Festival - Matumnia

The Yimkhiung celebrate Metumniu after the harvest of millet. It is an emotional event, for it is combined with prayers for the departed near and dear ones. An elder, known as Kheanpuru, inaugurates the festival after due prayers. The festival is spread over 5 days known distinctly as Shito, Zhihto, Zumto, Khehresuk and Sheresuk.







District : Tuensang/Kiphire Date : Soptember 03

Mun Testical Mongmong

The Sangtams have about twelve festivals spread over the calendar year including some special functions. Except a few types, all the festivals are connected to food production, blessings and prosperity. Mongmong is one of the most important festivals of the Sangtam. The predominant theme of the festival is the worship of the deity of the house and the three cooking stones in the fireplace.













































District : Wokha Date : November 07

Main Testival. Tokhu Emong

Tokhū Emong is the harvest festival of the Lothas and the entire village participates in the celebrations. Every household prepares food & drink for friends, families, neighbours that are invited to each other's house and this continues for days. The main features of the feast are community songs, dances, feast, fun and frolic.







District : Zunheboto Date : July 08

Main Testion! Tuluni

Tuluni is the festival celebrating the season of abundance and plentiful, it is observed to seek protection of crops where prayers are offered to the deity "LITSABA" who is considered the giver of fruitfulness. The event is also called "Anni" which means the season of plentiful crops. Another main feature of this festival is the exchange of gifts and hosting of feasts between betrothed couples and their families. The festival is also associated with peace -making and reconcialiation.











































District : Shamalor, Kiphire and Noklak
Date : October 11

Date : October 11

"Tsonglaknyi" the main festival of Tikhir is observed from 9th - 12th October every year. Tsonglaknyi basically is a festival of the sanctification of shield. It also means sanctification of the weapons as well as the purification of the men folk before going out for hunting animals and head hunting (during earlier days). In short, it is a festival of purification, Some of the main features of Tsonglaknyi are folk dance, folk songs and community feast.



The Garo

District : Dimapus

Main Testion! Wangala

Wangala is a post harvest festival celebrated by the Garo tribe of Nagaland. In this post harvest festival, they give thanks to misi Saljongu (also known as Pattigipa Ra'rongipa), the sun God of fertility, for blessing the people with a rich harvest. Competition such as Budu sala (Tug of War), Reong dea (stone lifting), Makal Pala (Wrestling), wapong sika (Bamboo pole pushing) etc. are also organized.











































#### In Nature's cradle: destinations extraordinaire

By virtue of her natural beauty, the whole of Nagaland can be called a tourist hotspot: certain exceptionally charming places have been identified and developed by the government to promote tourism in Nagaland. Since this exotic state is still developing in terms of infrastructure, many more places remain 'unmarketed, making them even more exclusive and fascinating to explore.



#### KOHIMA - The First District

Housing the capital city of Nagaland, Kohima district has many villages that tourists can visit. All these villages are 'communitised' i.e. managed by village communities under the state's Village Tourism Board. Although originally an Angami Naga homeland, Kohima is now a tapestry of all Naga tribes because of its administrative status.









































During the Second World War, the allied forces fought a bitter but victorious battle against the Japanese in Kohima. A picturesque war cemetery, in the heart of the city, commemorates the British and Indian soldiers.



#### Mary Help of Christians Cathedral

The Cathedral is located at Aradura Hill in Kohima. Its splendid architecture makes it one of the important landmarks of Kohima. The 16 feet high carved wood crucifix is one of Asia's largest crosses.



#### Dzukou Valley

Dzukou is the lesser known (but no less beautiful and bio-diverse) valley of flowers in India after Nandan Kanan in Uttarakhand at an altitude of 2438.4m. Rivulets, flowers, herbs and shrubs constitute the vibrancy of this valley. Dzukou offers some of the best trekking circuits in the country, while housing 'communitised' villages along the way.









































#### Jostoma Village.

Jotsoma Conserved Forest Area is a vast area of virgin forest with rich bioresources providing an invaluable environmental and ecological services for the people living downstream, the main source of spring water supply to the capital city, Kohima, the place is well connected by road, trekking paths through the woods and Rhododendron groves with beautiful quotes welcome visitors to this unique place. The area consists of a good numbers of places of interest such as: Alwan Snow Trout: Large head with obtuse snout, studded with pores, mouth inferior, lips thick, body coloured with steel grey, becomes gradually lighter below, found in the River Dzuna, Dzülakie, Chokla, Tepuiki, Tesuru, Tizu and Zungki two New Species of Frogs namely; Rana Nagalandsis, Megophrys Dzünarü. The Wonderful Swallow's Home: A home for Swallow bird's which is found in plenty. The Invisible underground water sounds: An incredible place where one can hear the gentle sounds of water flowing underneath the rock cave.



# Nagi's Resort

A good picnic and meeting spot, located on a hilltop with a magnificent view and neighbouring Villages and part of Kohima City.

#### Lover's Paradise

An excellent place where couple's spend quality time candidly, enjoying the serenity of nature, watching the birds chirping. The place is set on solid giant rock, moreover Rhododendron flower add more beauty to its spot. Variety of Wild Fruits such an upcoming preferred research location various medicinal plants etc.




































# Pulie Badze Wildlife Sanctuary



The Majestic Mt. Puliebadze- Pulie is the legendary ancestor of lotsoma Village after whom Puliebadze is named. One best view point to see the DC Bungalow, Tennis Court, Summer House Hill, Kuki Picquet, FSD Ridge, DIS Spur, Jail Hill, Pimple Hill, Congress Hill and also the capital city Kohima. A home for Tragopan Bird, the State Bird. Located just a few kilometers from Kohima, in Jotsoma Village, Pulie Badze Wildlife Sanctuary is known for its wide variety of birds like Tragopan Blythii and white- naped Yuhina. It covers an area of 9.23 sq. km. Mt. Puliebadze has a height of 7532 ft . It is surrounded by green pastures, hills and streams. This Sanctuary is rich in floral species and contains many medicinal plants and varieties of bamboo. Pulie Badze is a very appealing place for sightseeing. The motor-able approach is from near Sazolie College beyond Science College, Jotsoma, and fascinating vistas can be seen as one drives through thick forested areas. Before the start of the trekking route, there is a spot with a rest house where one can take a breather or have picnics. Here, the view of the Japfu range is simply breathtaking and highly recommended for people who want a short get-away from Kohima. The walking trails to Pulie Badze peak starts from here and it takes about 30-60 minutes of trekking to reach it. This trek is never dull due to the varieties of plants, orchids and trees that can be seen on the way.





































Located 20 km west of Kohima, in west Angami country, Khonoma was a vanguard village of the Angami Nagas a tribe known for its fierce resistance against British dominance during colonial period. Khonoma houses nature's pristine beauty in the form of its



alder trees, terraces carved out of its hilly slopes and the Khonoma Nature Conservation Tragopan Sanctuary (KNCTS). KNCTS conserves a large and rare variety of plants and animals within its 25 sq km area.

#### Dzuleke

Dzulekie is a picturesque village situated relatively close to Kohima, but yet untouched by the rigors of modern civilization. Dzulekie, with its small population

of Angamis presents an ideal location for visitors to get a feel of rural life in Nagaland, With its quaint houses and beautifully laid out stone walkways and surrounded by forests and rice fields. Dzulekie provides opportunity experience to: village life and also enjoy nature in its



relatively pristine form. The village itself is small enough to walk around. It offers opportunities to observe firsthand Angami culture through the making of bamboo and cane baskets, weaving of cloth, traditional games and tasting local cuisine. The semi evergreen forests offer opportunities for bird and butterfly watching; nature walks and trekking.





































# **Tuophema Tourist Village**

Located 41 km from Kohima, the Tuophema Tourist Village is modeled around ethnic tourism and visitors are offered modern and hygienic accommodation in the traditional huts. Served everything from rice beer to local food, tourists experience fine local culture in these pretty settings.





# Japfü Peak

The jewel of this 3048m high peak is the tallest (over 109 ft) Rhododendron tree in the world (as recorded by the Guinness Book of Records), besides it being the second highest peak of Nagaland. Located only 15 km south of Kohima, Japfü offers a tough yet scenic climb for the adventurous.





#### DIMAPUR - Commercial District

Dimapur is the commercial capital of Nagaland, sharing its borders with Assam. Dimapur takes pride in its historical monuments that are now in a state of ruin, but having immense archaeological value.










































Dimapur is the ancient capital of the Kachari tribe, whose rule existed before the 13th century Remnants of this kingdom are found in the





scattered ruins across the town - they reflect a culture that probably had a touch of Hinduism, but were predominantly Non-Aryan. Besides monoliths, Dimapur contains other ruins of temples, embankments and baths.

#### Rangapahar Reserve Forest

Rangapahar Reserve forest (20.20 hectares) is home to many animals and birds like the myna, sparrow, cuckoo, sunbird, parrot, parakeet, robin, quail, woodpecker, hornbill, swift hawk etc besides other colourful wrens. Varieties of animals like monkey, tiger, deer, porcupine, squirrel etc. also thrive in this reserve.

#### KIPHIRE - Mineral District



Kiphire is home to the Yimchungrü, Sangtam and Sumi Naga tribes. It has a strong historical significance because of the stories about the movements of these tribes from and within this district, when they were settling in Nagaland hundreds of years back.







































#### Saramati Peak



Saramati (3841m) is the highest peak in Nagaland. Snow clad throughout winter and located on the Nagaland- Myanmar border, it traces a beautiful climb dotted with Rhododendrons along its path. Saramati is a three day trek from either Pungro or Salumi, both towns housing visual natural delights and hospitable village people.





# Cavers' delight

As one travels east from Pungro Town, a big cave can be seen near Salumi Village. Besides the unexplored adventures that lie within, this cave has a multipoint entry and exit. A hole measuring approximately 4ft in diameter can be seen inside the cave. It has been proved through the garbage dumping habits of villagers that there is a link between the cave and the Likimro River. About an hour's walk from Mimi, are another four unexplored caves.







































# Sukhayap or Lover's Paradise - the cliff of no return

North of Mimi is a cliff that can be climbed only with the help of ladders. This cliff is supposed to be so treacherous that even wild animals cannot take shelter there. It got its name from a local legend which states that two lovers, separated by society, gave their lives from here.

#### Wawade

Between Mimi and Khonga villages lies this breathtaking waterfall approximately 200 ft high. It can be viewed from Laluri village in Phek district and it takes an hour and a half to reach the place from Mimi. Three other waterfalls, each about 100 ft high, are also located here.



#### Thanamir

Known as the "Apple Village", Thanamir has become a popular tourist spot lately. An Apple Festival is celebrated here in the month of September. It is also the base for Mt.Saramati Trek.





#### Fakim Wildlife Sanctuary

This small sanctuary in the eastern hills close to the Myanmar border was established in 1983 covering an area of 642 hectares. The park rises to almost 3000 meters and houses various flora-fauna, avifauna and plants, many of which contain medicinal value. The reserve is situated near Fakim village.









































Chang Nagas are the major residents of Tuensang and the relics of the district are steeped in legends and myths; for example Changsangmonko is regarded by legend as the place where all living organisms first appeared on earth and Chilso is recorded as the place where the last headhunting took place in March 1964.





#### The Living Stones of Tuensang

Legends of Chungliyimti (also known as Tsongliyangti or Chungliyangti)

Replete with legends of the exploits and stories of the Nagas when they lived as one big family, Chungliyimti is scattered with vestiges of the past. LongthUroh (Longtrok) or the legendary six stones, lie here in the midst of other ancient relics of the Chungliyangti civilisations. The Sangtams consider the stones as personifications of their ancient gods that gave birth to other stones and moved from one place to another. On the west of the village Tsadang are located two stones, known locally as Long Akang Threla; according to legend, these two living stones, who were friends, used to visit LongthÜroh. They were worshipped by the villagers and neighbouring enemies went weak when they came across them while headhunting. Tsadang is 4 km away from Chungliyangti.






































#### Lochüm - Bone House

Lochum is located in Nakshou Village under Tuensang district of Nagaland which is 32 kms from Tuensang Town.

Lochüm of Nakshou, literally means 'Bone House' in Chang (Naga) dialect. Story behind the Lochum (Lo-Bone, Chum-House) is that, the people of Nakshou had a tradition of placing the skulls of their dead relatives in a small grotto by following the rituals, a place which later came to be known as Lochüm. In those days, whenever a person dies, the body was laid out on a

raised platform and lit a fire under the platform to smoke the body. When the body was properly smoked and dried. the village elders (males) dug a hole and the dead body was buried. About a week later, they removed the head from the body using



a sharp blade made out of bamboo and took the head to the aunts of the deceased for its cleaning. After it was cleaned, the men took the skull and carefully placed it inside the Lochüm. It is also learnt that the heads of the dead caused due to unnatural circumstances were not kept in Lochüm.

Although, this tradition was carried only till 1965, but the skulls are still kept inside the Lochüm formed out of a large rock which is open for people to visit.

#### MOKOKCHUNG - Land of Pioneers

Mokokchung is the land of the Ao Nagas. Although almost all Aos have converted to Christianity, they still maintain their old customs and traditions and their hospitality can be seen during Christmas. This is the time when everyone, irrespective of their financial or social status, welcomes each other warmly in their homes.





































# Longkhum

Rhododendrons adorn the hillocks and the precipices surrounding it, providing an astounding sight during full bloom in the village of Longkhum. Ethnic handlooms and handicrafts by the expert craftsmen are also found in plenty here. An animist religion called Limapur still exists in this village, where a few families worship a God called Longlanpa Tsungrem.

#### Longlangpa - Stone Bridge

This mystified place'Longlangpa' (Stone Bridge) is situated in the village of Longkhum Mokokchung district, which approximately 500 meters away from a Tourist



Lodge in the village. Before the coming of Christianity, itis believed that people worshipped spirits here. One can also catch a glimpse of Mongzu-Ki' (Eagle's nest) where eagles have been nesting there for centuries. This place also stands as a witness to the wonderful and tragic love story of Jina and Etiben (also known as the Romeo and Juliet of Ao Tribe) where one can still see their footprints embedded on the rocks.

#### Ungma

Ungma is the second largest village in Nagaland, next only to Bara-Basti of Kohima and located about 3 km from Mokokchung Town. It is said that the entire Ao tribe founded this village when they first entered the land from their ancestral home at Chungliyimti (now within the Sangtam Naga Territory). The rich Ao traditions are zealously guarded and practiced by the villagers here even today.









































# Chuchuyimlang

Chuchuyimlang is the village of festivals for the Ao Nagas. The Moatsu festival is seen in full glory here. During this period, the villagers express their friendship towards other villagers by exchanging gifts, making new friendships, renewing old ties and sharing a spirit of camaraderie. The tourist village established here is a showcase of this tradition in the most natural and uncontaminated manner.

# Suteplenden

This is a perennial waterfall at a height of around 200 feet near Longkong village around 27 km from Mokokchung district. This misty waterfall is a sight to behold due to the serene and gentle landscape around it. The sight has become a favourite for many nature lovers and domestic visitors who come to seek the freshness and tranquillity of nature.









































# LONGLENG -Land Of Handicrafts

The 34 km stretch that leads to Longleng from Changtongya is a perfect rural road for adventurous motorists. Using an SUV or a two wheel cruiser. the driver can experience a rural dirt track, while driving through villages and interacting with the villagers. The open markets are almost frozen in time, the barter system still prevalent. The Phom Nagas, who are the majority of this district, preserve their ancient culture through their festivals and artefacts like the log drums - the festival of Monyú is celebrated with full splendour here.



## Aubak dung (stone cave)

Aubak Dung (Stone Cave) is a man-made cave located 5.8 kms (via NH 702) away from Longleng Town in Aubak forest, a vicinity of Bhumnyû Village. The cave has a historical background which dates back to 16th Century and is recognised as a Heritage Site in Longleng District under the Heritage Conservation and Protection through the implementation by Nagaland Art and Culture Department in the year 2008.

The Ahom king, Rura Raja made this cave when he fled from Godabani, the other Ahom King, known as Aubak Dung (meaning Aubak Cave in Phom dialect). The cave has four chambers. The king, Rura Raja along with his father, Singh Phoman and two soldiers, Hurman and Heingo took shelter in that cave. On hearing of his queen's ill health, the king returned to Shivasagar, Assam and could never return to his cave. It is said that during their stay, they discovered salt water (Shemteinyaipa in Phom dialect), lime stone (Longthon Yak), crude oil (Phongshian) and some precious stones (Shengsheng Yak). The remains of their stone gate (Onglao Yong), bed (Jainyū Yong), Chairs and Tables (Yimbū Yong) are found in Bhumnyū





































village.

At present it instils awe and wonder on the onlookers on how this powerful and wise Ahom king came to such a remote forest and made this monumental cave along with the massive stone gate, bed, tables and chairs. It is really intriguing to know if all of their claims of discovery are true. Could this abandoned place



have a treasure buried and hidden? The answer remains inscrutable, a fact enshrouded in mystery.

The cave is surrounded by virgin forest and one can enjoy listen to the enchanting melodies of birds, insects, animals and soft rustle of the wind beneath the cave. In the evening colony of bats fills their roosting chambers in the cave.

#### MON - Land of Anghs





Mon is the land of the captivating Konyak Naga. Konyaks are known for their tattooed faces, blackened teeth and head hunting prowess, the last thankfully being in the past. When they appear in the markets to sell their agricultural produce, the Konyaks cut an impressive figure among the uninitiated. The village head, Angh, enjoys considerable power over his people – his house is a reflection of tribal power and glory and flashes both human and animal skulls alike on the porch.





































#### Longwa

The 'trans-boundary village' of Longwa is an interesting sight to behold - it straddles the international boundary of India and Myanmar; one half of the house of the powerful Angh falls within India whereas the other half lies in Myanmar. Although some village vouths serve under the Myanmarese army, the village itself is governed by the Angh and the Village Council Chairman. There are both Indian and Myanmarese schools in this village. In the past, the Angh had sixty wives and his jurisdiction extended up to Myanmar and Arunachal Pradesh (India).



## Shangnyu

Ruled by the chief Angh, Shangnyu is a prominent village in Mon. A massive wood carving originally placed at the entrance of the Angh's house is believed to have been constructed by two brothers with the help of a spirit during the metallic age. This carving is now preserved in a museum facing the Angh's house. Some stone monoliths are also seen in front of the Angh's 'palace'.












































Peren is the traditional home of the Zeliangrong and Kuki tribes. Mt.Pauna, the third highest peak in Nagaland stands majestically along the Benreu range. It offers breathtaking views (of rhododendrons, orchids, mithuns, birds etc) and treks along three escalating ranges leading to the peak. These ranges are about 6 km away from the Benreu village – ideal time for trekking is during the clear month of November.

Around Mt. Pauna and the villages, are numerous spots containing articles of the past, both man-made and natural. Monoliths, curiously shaped stones

and rocks, water springs, Morungs and other enclosures for traditional social bonding are scattered around this area. The hospitality of the villagers is the star attraction for visitors, who can pamper their taste buds with traditional F & B. besides being witness to the striking traditions of the people.



#### Benreu

Situated in the district of Peren, this little village perched at 1950m houses a unique community where 20 per cent of an animist population dictates the customs and social rules of the majority Christians. Now a tourist village, Benreu is a living showcase of the endangered culture of these highlanders. With a dense wildlife sanctuary around it, a visitor can embark upon a jungle safari by staving comfortably in this authentic animist village. If you are in Benreu, then do not forget to have *Kennie Nku*, the local bread made from sticky rice and prepared over a heated stone kiln.





































# Mt. Pauna Tourist village

This village resort is an extension of Benreu village (separated from it by about 300m) towards the south along the Pauna Mountain range. It has 8 double bedded cottages (built under trees of different varieties) with attached bathrooms fitted with running hot and cold water. The village has one Morung for the visitors and a three storied restaurant-cum-dormitory.

#### PHEK - Land of Traditions

Phek is the home district of the Chakhesang and the Pochuries. The Chakhesang consists of three sub-tribes, the CHAkhru, the KHeza and the SANgtam. The people here are known for their wrestling prowess and robust health. They live off agriculture and are known for their adeptness in terrace cultivation - the carved fields for such cultivation are a sight to behold.

# Pfutsero and Glory Peak

This little township at an altitude of 2233.60m is like a gateway to Southeast Asia with reasonably good surface transport available from Kohima via a 70 km border road. The place is known for its vegetable and fruit products.

Glory Peak, at 2600m is only 3 km away from Pfutsero. It offers views of Mt. Everest in the West and Mt. Saramati in the East. An Eco lodge has been constructed by the government at the base of the peak and potentials lie for identifying trekking routes from here to Kapamadzu peak, which is the highest table top mountain in Nagaland. The more adventurous can take on the challenge of discovering these trekking routes themselves.





































Kapamudzu: If anyone has been to the famed Dzukou valley, Kapamudzu is fittingly termed as second Dzukou by the locals. Adventurers can trek from the Glory Peak to the Kapamadzu peak which is the highest table top

mountain in the entire Nagaland.Further, being a virgin forest, preserved the communities with total prohibition of logging and hunting, one can explore trekking ro utes randomly in order to make it more exciting and challenging-Trekkers delight.





# Khezhakeno Village

Khezhakeno is a village in the Phek District of Nagaland, India. It is a historical village of the Nagas. It is located in the region 25,30'N and 94,12'E at an elevation of 1660 meters (5,450 ft) above sea level and shares its border with the Manipur state in the south. The village is 48 km from the state capital Kohima via NEC Viswema-Kidima-Zuketsa road and is 23 km away from its sub-divisional headquarter Pfutsero.



































# Tso-Tawo(Spirit Stone)



A magnificent spirited flat stone upon which if a basket of paddy is parched in the sun; it generates double-fold in the evening. This is also the significant first settlement site of 'KOZA'. foremost the ancestral forefather and from where various Naga tribes migrated later on. Although, the charm of the stone is

said to have gone as it was burned and destroyed, the remnants of this legendary Khezhakeno stone is still preserved in its original location even today.

Another legend of this Village consists of a pond called the Zhi-Nhaka Nose of the ancient lake). A perennial source spring water pond which remains constant in summer as well as in winter. It is said that the whole village was once covered by a large water body which



originated from Zhi-Nhaka, from where the significant meaning of the term 'Zhiphemi' (Guardian of the Lake) is derived. It attracts a lot of students from all over the country and awes the people with its unique existence.








































The serenely calm natural lake placing face-to-face with the sky (Chida) is another important destination which travellers must attend to in their visit to this village. It is located on top of the high hills drawing its water source from the springs of Kapamedzü Range. The lake is beautifully and naturally situated in the middle of a scenic and gently curved valley also popularly known for its lush green landscapes and is an ideal picnic spot.





# Phüsachodü Village

Located 8 Kms from Pfutsero and about 80 kms from the state Capital, Phüsachodü is the biggest village under Phek District. Phüsachodü is believed to be the pathway for the warriors and therefore only the brave had settled over this ridge, for sporting of Headhunting.

The simplicity and hospitality of the natives, rightly fulfils the requirement as host of a tourists. Village elders are not less enthusiast than the Tourists to guide and accompany them to various places of interest, giving answers to the queries. The Cultural troupe equally pleased to enlighten and cheer the visitors through cultural items and folk tunes,



































to break the loneliness of being in a strange land. These rich culture and traditions gets revived through each seasonal festival.

The famous Rhododendron Trail is a famous/popular trekking route for the adventurers.





# Chesezu Village

Located 57 kms away from Kohima via Chakabama road, Chesezu is a historic village where it is believed that Netaji (Subhash Chandra Bose) had temporarily stationed and camped at the quite hills of the Chakhesang Tribe, Chesezu Village. It is here that imprints of a patriot can be witnessed. Places of Interest are: Netaji Peak (Suthoka), Footpath leading to Netaji's Camp.

#### Meluri

The headquarters of the Pochury tribe lies halfway to Mt. Saramati, Being on the way to the Indo-Myanmar Trade Centre at Avankhung, one can see many Myanmarese Nagas shopping in this township for their basic necessities. The place is famous for its locally manufactured brine salt and cane furniture from Reguri village. The Wazeho mini cement plant is located in this sub division and one can see interesting rock formations here.

# Dzudu Lake/ Zanibu Peak

Dzudu Lake is considered as a habitat of spirits and supernatural elements and avoided by the locals to such an extent that they would not even dare to dump any garbage here. The Zanibu range and peak, next to the lake, houses around ten Chakhesang villages around it - it offers views of Mt. Everest, besides the whole of Nagaland.







































Locals call it Latsam, the British called her Shiloh but now it is officially known as Shilloi. Shilloi Lake lies on the lower slopes of the hill ranges running along the Myanmar ridges, Meluri. Located 275 km away from Kohima, one has to travel east through roads lined with oak tree dressed in fresh foliage. The serpentine road spiraling downwards guarded by Rocky Mountains presents a mysterious and majestic sight. Surrounded by tall, striking and attractive hills, Shilloi Lake spreads over 0.25 to 0.30 sq. km., in the shape of a footprint.





# WOKHA - Land of Plenty

This district of the Lotha Nagas is a land of beautiful mountain ranges and rivers. Wokha town, the headquarters of the district, is itself located at the Wokha Mountain. Some other noteworthy hills here are Mount Tivi and Totsu Cliff. No matter which hill you are on or which valley you are trekking, you are sure to experience the vibrant landscapes carpeted with colourful flowers and orchards.





































#### Rivers

Doyang is the largest river in the district. Several hill streams fall into the river from the central and western parts and give it the most fascinating look. Terrace cultivation is carried out on the valleys surrounding Doyang River





#### Mt.Totsu

Mt. Totsu is located at Phiro Village, wozhuro town under Wokha District. It is called Totsu as it is the highest peak in Phiro village. Mt.Totsu is also called as "the Grand Canyon of Nagaland". It is a twin craggy vertical peak with a deep narrow cliff in between where an arroyo flows and feed a cluster of small ponds beneath the peak where locals go for fishing and angling.

# Legend of Mt. Totsu

According to mythological sources passed down through oral tradition from generation to generation, Mt. Totsu is believed to be guarded by a

crab couple as big as a yaying (a type of rectangular hollow strainer made of bamboo used for fishing in ponds by sieving for small fishes, snails and tadpoles and et al) and a python couple as big as a phukshu (a rooled up bamboo mat used for drying food grains) at Mt. Totsu







































#### Amur Falcon

Every year from October to November, a large number of Amur Falcons arrive in the northeast, especially in Doyang Reservoir, Nagaland for roosting, from South Eastern Siberia and Northern China en route to their final destinations. Amur falcons travel upto 22,000 kms km/year- one of the longest distances of migration among migratory birds. International scientists declared Doyang as one of the biggest congregation of nearly one million Amur Falcon and have declared Nagaland as the 'Amur Falcon Capital of the World."



#### ZUNHEBOTO -

#### Land of Warriors

Zunheboto is the land of the Sumi Nagas, who are known for their colourful war dance and folk songs. A very hardy and strong race, the Sumis can also be dubbed as the pioneers of the Naga martial arts.





































# Sumi Baptist Church Zunheboto

Standing tall and Majestic at 1864.9m above the sea level on the hilltop over Zunheboto Standing tall, the Sumi Baptist Church has created history by becoming one of the largest church in Nagaland. The egg-shaped church has a sitting capacity of 8500 people with 27 rooms. The blue dome and white turrets of the Sumi Baptist Church can be seen by around 20 villages in Zunheboto district alone.



# Keltomi Village

Keltomi Village in Zunheboto district is an idvllic hamlet along the newly paved Longsa-Aghunato road for travelers and tourists alike. The village was declared a Model Village in the year 1988 for its cleanliness and organic produce of vegetables and fruits such as plum, kiwi, cardamom and honey-bee farming.

# **Ghosu Bird Sanctuary**

Located 8 km away from the Zunheboto district headquarters; this bird sanctuary is maintained by the village community. Providing habitat to more than twenty species of endangered avifauna, migratory birds can also be sighted here between the months of June and September. In order to make up for uncontrolled hunting in the past, the surrounding village communities of this sanctuary have now strictly prohibited hunting and poaching in the area.







































# Satoi Range

A habitat of the Blyth's Tragopan, Satol Range is a pristine natural heritage of the district. Rhododendrons embellish the place during April and May and trekking is quite popular here.

# Tizu Valley Biodiversity Conservation

Kivikhu, Sukhai and Ghukhuyi Villages under Satakha circle of Zunheboto started a joint venture in conserving the area and develop nature based ecotourism. This area lies in the heart of Nagaland at an altitude of 1900 m and has sub-tropical wet hill forest primarily overlapping with the sub-tropical pine forest and practice traditional conservation and folkloric ritual to sustain the environment. This area harbors many endangered and threatened species. Faunal surveys in the three villages of Zunheboto district by the TERI team in association with Titli Trust and many volunteers has led to a checklist of 222 species of birds, 200 species of butterflies and more than 200 species of moths so far. This area has become a popular tourist hotspot for bird and butterfly watching activity.



# NUILAND - Land of Diversity

Niuland is the headquarters of the Niuland District of the Indian state of Nagaland. It includes several villages including Niuland, it is mainly inhabited by the Sümi Nagas.





























# ECO-ADVENTURE & CULTURAL HUB, AKITO VILLAGE.

It is located in Akito Village under Niuland district. It is 5 Kms away from Dimapur town and is accessible from both Dimapur and Niuland. Eco-

Adventure & Cultural hub has several 6 (Six) well furnished cottages for tourist, a conference hall, an open air amphitheatre, a watch tower. kitchen attached with dining hall. It has ample scope for organising cultural programs, hosting tourist and various other events.







### TOURIST RECEPTION CENTRE HOKHEZHE VILLAGE.

It is located in Dimapur-Niuland road (1Km away from the main road) Tourist reception centre hosts a variety of cultural program, camping sites and various other events. It has a conference hall, an open air Amphithetre, and 4 (four) cottages with dormitory facility. It has a kitchen attached with dining area.







































#### NOKLAK - The Frontier District

Noklak is the newest District of Nagaland located in the easternmost part of the Country bordering Myanmar. Carved out from parent District Tuensang, the District covers a geographical area of approximately 1152 So Km. The District Ho Noklak is nestled at the altitude of 1524 meters above sea level. The District enjoys a sub-tropical climate and hilly region with broad leaved forests. The District shares boundary with Tuensang in the West, Kiphire District in the South, Mon District in the North, whereas the whole eastern boundary of the district stretching nearly 92 KM from the Boundary Pillar Numbers ranging from BP 139 to BP 146 form the

Indo-Myanmar Border the a stretch of through forest and hills. The District exclusively falls within the Free Regime Movement belt.

There are 44 inhabitations including Noklak Town and 3 other Administrative Hgs.



#### IN TSE

"IIN" means "cliff" & "TSE" means "White"

JIN TSE is a local name by the settlers of Choklangan village which is located at the foothill of Khelia King Niu. It is measured to 300 meters in height and 500 meters in breadth. Adjoining to the cliff, the mountain ranges, given a conserved area known as biodiversity Peace Corridor II which gives enough of wild animals like, Monkeys and mountain goat into that particular cliff. one may enjoy the beauty of the cliff by coming close to it or be in the border

of Myanmar and have a far view. One can experience the power of the cliff to see its glowing whiteness even at night also like the name given Tse which mean white. On winter days, the cliff appears giving its true potentials and identity.







































# Pio Ling Kaa (Cave)

Pio Ling Kaa is a natural cave located in the forest of Thsoiphu Village, under Noklak district..The hollow is completely dark even in broad daylight and a haven for a colony of bats that's why the villages name it Pio Ling Kaa as Bats dwelling cave. As



per locals, the cave is measured to 300 feet in lenth, 30 feet in breath and 70 feet in height. The inside of the cave is a stalactite and stalagmite formation with sparkling stones formed by dripping down droplets for centuries and the locals considered it drinkable. The inside of the cave is clean in nature and the entrance to the giant hollow is like a human throat formation. The distance to the cave takes about 4-5 hrs trek with moderate and high elevated terrain through the wild tense forest.

# King She Niu. (Natural Lake)

King She Niu is a natural lake at the top of a mountain with an altitude 3000mts above sea level approx. Accurate measurement cannot be given because it is "Wild and Untouched" It is located in the forest of Choklangan Village, Noklak which takes 5-6 hrs trek with moderate terrain. Crossing tense virgin forest, one may enjoy the beauty of the Creepy Rhododendron trees and rare fruits which is called "LONGZONG LASA" which are only found at higher altitudes. The month of June till October -November first week it gives crystal clear water

with few hundreds feet in circumference. The area is a low grassland variety with LONGZONG LASA and many wild herbs. The month of Decembers last week begins the experience of snow fall and the whole area





























of the lake will be covered with snow lasting till February. A resting place is constructed by the villagers at LUNGPOI SHET, a source of water for the Mithuns which takes 3 hrs trek from the village which ultimately turns out to be the base camp for visitors. A giant rock like a tree which stands above the tree known as LUNG PAINIU is also another amazing elements which boost the trekkers or hold their breath for the next move.

#### Mount Khelia

Mt. Khelia Kingniu, the highest mountain of the district of Noklak, Nagaland stand at an elevation of 3462 mts above sea level. It is an untouch and wild which was recently explored during the peak of the snowfall by the youth of the native Choklangan. When we look into the potentials of the mountain, it is a whole year activity as any visitors can be amazed any season. The time of December till first week of March can be of snow clads where temperature drops down to freezing point. It sheds its skin and turn into an aromatic flowery mountain from April till September. Century old caverns, breathtaking waterfalls, nightmarish cliffs, rare and exotic birds and animals to open your eyes. From the summit, one can have the opportunity to witness the great Chinwin river (Myanmar) and hamlets of both India and MyanmarThe sprouting season of wild spring onion which locally known as "King Mouseh" (mountain medicine) where the locals considered it medicine and it does in treating insomnia begins right after the snow melts and surprisingly, the

spring onion can be found only where the snow covers during December and January. The blooming season of red and white Rhododendron, the natural cave known as NETA PO KEN which visitors use for base camp, the stream that never runs dry for drinking water, the snowy season, the sprouting of the mountain



spring onion, the "Khelia Haothe" (wild garlic), the creepy trees and the opportunity that one can set its foot inside Myanmar are the little things to add up here as dignity of surprise always awaits once you set your foot into the lands of the far east.



































# CHUMUKEDIMA - Land Of Opportunity

Chumukedima is a government notified town of Dimapur district in the state of Nagaland. The town is located 14 Km away from Dimapur, on National Highway - 29, situated in the foothills of Naga Hills. Chumukedima served as the first district headquarters to the then Naga Hills District of Assam during 19th century of British rule. A tourist village on the top of a hill projects a birds

eve view of the whole district of Dimapur and even of Karbi-Anglong, District of Assam. Many waterfalls are also located in and around this tourist attraction. Chumukedima is touted as the fastest growing urban landscape today.



# Diezephe Craft Village:

This village under Dhansiripar block is located 13 km from Dimapur; most inhabitants subsist on handloom and handicraft products. They are experts in wood carving, bamboo and cane works and weaving. Nagaland Handloom and Handicrafts Development Corporation limited has played a significant role in the promotion of this village. Diezephe Craft Village is home of skilled weavers and craftsmen. You will also find various artefacts with exquisite wood carvings done on them. The skills are passed on from generations of these weaving families.












































Located in Seithekima Village, these three beautiful and glistening streams cascade from a height of 280 ft into a natural pool making the entire view stunning. The heart warming waterfalls are not only for sightseeing but they also offer trekking opportunity as well. The triple falls give a wonderful view to the tourists and it is indeed one of the best places to visit in Dimapur. Nagaland. #### TSEMINYU - Historical District

An ancient migration route of many Naga tribes heading northwards looking for new settlements and cultivation grounds, Tseminyu is the home of the Rengma. Old sites of abandoned villages with remains of gravestones, broken pottery etc. tell tales of its ancient inhabitants. These offer perfect sites for archaeological tourism and preservation, but time is short for such activities because every cycle of the scenic Jhum (terrace) cultivation deletes a slice of this heritage.

#### SHAMATOR - Brotherhood District

Shamator District is the 16th district of the Indian state of Nagaland. It was created on 19 January 2022 and was officially inaugurated on 4 March 2022. The district headquarter is located in the town of Shamator. The majority of the inhabitants are the Tikhir and Yimkhiung Nagas.









































### SOTOKUSAM CAVE

It is a natural cave measuring some 100 sq.ft that has been known right from the creation of Leangkonger Village and it falls under "Alotsuh" jurisdiction which is 3-5 kms away from Shamator district Hq. This name has been given by forefathers when they first noticed the cave while hunting and as the cave looks like an elephant head from a distance, they named it "SOTOKUSAM" which means elephant head like cave.

#### FIRST INDO-NAGA INDEPENDENCE WAR AT HUKER VILLAGE

To commemorate the first war of Naga independence that broke out on 24th March 1955 at Huker Village, it was declared as a historical site for the Nagas honouring the beginning of the quest for Naga sovereignty and for the same a monolith was erected and inaugurated on 24th March 2012.



### YIMKHIUNG HERITAGE VILLAGE MÜNDÜN.

It is 4 kms away from Sotokur EAC Hg. where big events like Mini Hornbill festival, General Sessions of NGO'S and Social gathering are held. This vast land is the property of Yimkhiung Tribal Council donated by Sotokur and Y.Awünrü villages during 2014.









































# Gifts of Gaia: orchids, rhododendrons, bamboo & exotic fruits

If William Wordsworth had the good fortune of visiting Nagaland, he would unquestionably have written a full collection of poems on the flowers that dance to the tune of spring here. Just as the people colour the terrain with their bright attire and vibrant dances, so does the sky adorn itself with the flowers of the Orchids and Rhododendrons. The varieties of the native flowering flora are countless in Nagaland. Be it a valley, a hill or a mountain top - in Nagaland, Orchids, Rhododendrons and the people, welcome you everywhere.





The traditional ceremonial attire of each tribe is in itself, an awe-inspiring sight to behold; the multicoloured spears and daos decorated with dyed goats' hair, the headgear made of finely woven bamboo interlaced with orchid stems, adorned with boar's teeth and hornbill's feathers, elephant tusk armlets. In days of yore every warrior had to earn each of these items through acts of valour, to wear them.





























Nagaland Offroad is an initiative by the Government of Nagaland that aims to spread tourism in the state beyond conventional destinations like Dimapur and Kohima and capture its vibrant landscape and unique culture. With this, Nagaland is all set to become the perfect destination for travellers looking for adventure and the unadulterated truth of remote travel. Interested travellers have the facility to hire 4×4 self-drive vehicles

for the complete duration of their travel. It will be the experience of a lifetime for them since it will provide a unique window into the lifestyle of people across the state. This self curated expedition will give new opportunities for travellers to explore and experience the people



of Nagaland, its land, and its lifestyle.Offroading or Extreme Overlanding (XOL) are self-drive expeditions through remote lands that are inherently expeditionary in nature and pegged around self-reliance, adaptability, resilience and resolve. Historically, this domain evolved from the overland

journeys from Europe to Asia and Africa, where adventurers intrepid travelled the globe on terrain they did not know, mingling with cultures they had no idea about, while taking uncertainty and ambiguity in their stride. Over time, the tribe has increased.







































developing into category in itself. These expeditions are different from mere road trips or overland drives on highways. They are offroad trips rooted in the unknown and involve terrain that is remote, extreme, bereft of creature comforts and luxury.



Given the sheer nature of such journeys, they are premised on the fact that vulnerability, being out of comfort, seeds the beginnings of self-growth wherein learning, unlearning and relearning is part of a never-ending loop that makes you not just a better driver but a more balanced individual.

Bamboo not only create an ambience of enchanting wilderness, it is also a product of great economic and cultural value. In Nagaland, bamboo provides the body and the soul for traditional architecture, crafts and tools, besides being the state's major commercial produce for paper and textile industries. The merits of this wonder grass can be seen in Asia's largest bamboo pavilion that the Govt, of Nagaland has built in Kisama (the site of the hornbill festival in Kohima district).





























Successful experiments in the cultivation of exotic fruits, generally grown in other countries, are slowly showing potential of a new sustainable industry. Many private growers have successfully planted passion fruit, dragon fruit, mangosteen etc and such farms can be visited in Dimapur. Whereas Naga pineapples come in many fragrant varieties, the Raja (king) chilli is the global icon of pungency.











































# Dream crafts: handicrafts, handlooms & fashion

Handicrafts come naturally to the Nagas - master craftsmen can create anything from a small paper knife to large and trendy pieces of furniture using cane and bamboo.







The Naga Heritage Complex is a permanent site built at Kisama - the purpose of this complex is to serve as a 'Window to Nagaland' (WTN), aiming at providing a preview of the entire state on a single platform. The WTN showcases the traditional houses or Morungs, representing the 17 recognised tribes Nagaland. Each of these units



display the unique offerings of each tribe in terms of crafts, cuisine, cultural activities etc. besides providing points of sale for the local products. An added attraction is the Flower Garden for the display, sale and exhibition of flowers, plants and fruits. The WTN also house the World War II Museum.









































The colours of the Naga people have been showcased internationally through their handloom products. The red and black Naga shawls and throw-overs have become a familiar sight in many countries because of the master weavers and marketing efforts by government and private stakeholders.

The traditional art of handloom products has also made space for the modern 21st century fashion apparels and the two are now complementing

each other perfectly through the fusion of traditional and modern designs; products created from this concept have caught the eye of the international fashion world. A number of young Naga designers have graduated from the best fashion schools in India and the west and they hold promises of carrying traditional Naga fashion across borders in a contemporary manner













































#### Muses & Athletes

Music, for the Nagas, is a necessity not just an amusement. Ancient Naga songs that formed the souls of the traditional festivals have been handed down across the generations. Indigenous musical instruments are bamboo mouth organs, cup violins, bamboo flutes, trumpets, cattle skin drums and log drums. The tribes have unique traditional instruments influenced by their customs and available materials. The young generation has also taken to gospel and modern western music very naturally and many of these performers have made an impact in the mainstream musical world through their talent.







Possessing tough and flexible bodies, the Nagas are 'Natural Born Warriors'. Across the centuries, they have perfected their traditional martial arts like Ki-Ti-Do.



































The Hornbill Festival, a yearly feature taking place on the first week of December is a modern-day cultural extravaganza of all Naga tribes. The Festival was conceptualized to showcase Naga culture, traditional and contemporary, in the spirit of unity in diversity. This Festival is held at the heritage village of Kisama, about 12 km from Kohima. The goal of creating this heritage village is the protection and preservation of the ethnic cultural heritage through a common management approach and comprehensive data base for the perpetuation of tourism promotion - since its inception in the year 2000, it has brought about radical changes in the tourism scenario of the state. A visitor gets the opportunity to catch a ring side view of all the Naga tribes, their culture and distinctiveness at one place. The Heritage complex consists of a cluster of seventeen indigenously designed houses (also called Morung meaning Youth Dormitory), each representative of a different tribe.

























































# GETTING THERE

### HOW TO GO

### AIR



Dimapur is the only airport in Nagaland - direct flights connect this airport to Kolkata and connections can be made from all other airports in India including Delhi.

### RAIL



Dimapur has a railway station on the main line of the North East Frontier Railway. It is well connected to Guwahati which has direct train lines with most major Indian cities.

#### ROAD



A number of taxis ply from Dimapur to Kohima. Night buses connect Dimapur and Kohima to Guwahati and Shillong (Meghalava). A very convenient way for reaching Kohima is to take the train or flight to Dimapur and then a taxi to Kohima. The Dimapur taxi stand is adjacent to the Railway Station. Yellow Taxis can be hired with other passengers (shared taxis) or exclusively (full taxis) - a 'full taxi' can cost anything between ₹ 1500 -₹ 2000 for a one-way trip to Kohima, Travellers can also opt to rent a car from Guwahati (through tour operators) and drive all the way to Kohima. This pleasant drive, lasting about 8-9 hours, takes the tourist past beautiful stretches of forests, greenery and hills - one should try to start and end the journey before nightfall.


#### Day 1: Dimapur - Kohima (74 km. 3 hrs)




#### DAY 1: DIMAPUR- KOHIMA (74 kms/ 3 HRS)
