## NBSE INFORMS ON PM-USP CSSS

In pursuant of Ministry of Education, Department of Higher Education, Letter No. 1-42/2020-NS-I dated the 24<sup>th</sup> August 2022, the Nagaland Board of School Education (NBSE) has notified for information of all concerned that the portal for renewal of Pradhan Mantri Uchchatar Shiksha Protsahan Central Sector of Scholarship for College and University Students (PM-USP CSSS) for the Academic Year 2022-23 is open from 20<sup>th</sup> July 2022.

It may be noted that students who wish to renew, can apply through the National Scholarship Portal (<https://scholarships.gov.in>). Therefore, Heads of the concerned colleges/institutions have been requested to inform the nodal officers to look into the entire process of application renewal and verifications so that it gets completed at the earliest, which will help the students to get their scholarship at an early date.

## COMPLAINT COMMITTEE OF SEXUAL HARASSMENT OF WOMEN AT WORKPLACE

In supersession of Personnel and Administrative Reforms Department Notification of even number dated 19.11.2016, the Government of Nagaland has constituted the Complaint Committee for the State Level Committee as per the provisions of the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act 2013 consisting of the following for redress of complaints relating to sexual harassment of women employees of the State Government at their workplaces:

### Terms and Conditions of the Complaint Committee:

1. The Committee shall receive a complaint from any woman who is a victim of sexual harassment at her workplace and cause an inquiry into the complaint and suggest measures to redress the complaint.
2. The Committee will take measures to create awareness of the right of female employees in this regard by suitably notifying the guidelines with awareness campaigns.
3. Complaint Committee will be deemed to be an inquiry authority for Central/State Civil Service (Conduct) Rules and the report of the Complaint Committee shall be deemed to be an inquiry report under the Rules. Thereafter, the disciplinary authority will act on the report following the rules.
4. The Complaint Committee shall submit an annual report to the Department of Personnel and Administrative Reforms with details of the complaints, if any, made to it and the action thereof.

## NAGALAND CONSUMER PROTECTION COUNCIL CONSTITUTED

In exercise of Power conferred by Section 6 & 7 of the Consumer Protection Act, 2019, the Government of Nagaland has constituted the Nagaland Consumer Protection Council for the State of Nagaland with the following Members:

The objective of the State Council shall be to render advice on the promotion and protection of Consumer Rights under the Act within the State.

1. The State Council shall meet as and when necessary, but not less than two meetings shall be held every year.

## NBSE INFORMS ON ISSUE OF DUPLICATE DOCUMENTS

In the interest of the public, the Nagaland Board of School Education (NBSE) has notified for general information that the following measures are being taken for issue of duplicate documents of the Board with effect from June 2022. Documents have been made uniform with a common design/format for the issue of duplicates with required features:

1. A common format/design of document for issue of duplicate Admit Card from HSLC 1997 till date and HSSLC 1998 till date.
2. A common format/design of document for issue of HSLC Marksheet from 1997 till 2013.
3. A common format/design of document for issue of HSLC Pass Certificate from 1997 till 2013.

4. A common format/design of document for issue of HSLC Marksheet-cum-Certificate from 2014 till date.
5. A common format/design of document for issue of duplicate Marksheet from HSSLC 1998 till date.
6. A common format/design of document for issue of duplicate Pass Certificate from HSSLC 1998 till date.

Further, duplicate Registration Cards of Secondary and Higher Secondary and Pass Certificates of Class VIII, IX & XI will be issued with a common design/format.

## CLARIFICATIONS ON ISSUES RELATING TO SHARING OF AADHAAR AND RELATED DATA AMONGST GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS

Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology has issued an Office Memorandum stating that in order to leverage Aadhaar i.e. the Unique Identity as a tool of good governance to promote ease of living of residents and enable better access to services for them and facilitate a smooth, seamless, efficient, transparent, and error-free targeted delivery of benefits, services and subsidies to residents, several references were received from various government entities to clarify on the possibilities and modalities of sharing of Aadhaar related data amongst various government entities. Accordingly, Office Memorandums dated 27.10.2021, 06.12.2021, and 10.12.2021 have been issued by UIDAI providing necessary clarifications in this regard.

Though these Office Memorandums have addressed broader issues related to sharing of Aadhaar related data between various Central/State Government entities, UIDAI has been receiving references seeking further clarifications on specific issues pertaining to the enquiring departments which have since been duly provided to the concerned departments from time to time. It has been felt that the clarifications would be equally relevant to other departments. Therefore, the queries and clarifications thereto have been compiled and given below for the convenience of user government departments:

Query: Vide UIDAI OM dated 27.10.2021, it has been clarified that different Ministries and Departments of the Government of India can be treated as a single entity, i.e. the 'Central Government' for effective formulation of various government schemes and selection of beneficiaries. Can different departments of State Government be treated as a single entity on similar lines?

Clarification: As per the provisions of Article 166(3) of the Constitution of India, different departments of a State Government can be treated as a single entity, i.e. the 'State Government' for effective formulation of various government schemes and selection of beneficiaries. However, a separate consent of the beneficiary must be taken by the implementing State Government department at the time of final delivery of subsidy, benefit, and service. Further, attention is invited to Para 5 of the UIDAI OM dated 27.10.2021 which shall apply to various departments of a particular State Government also.

Query: Whether Aadhaar and related data pertaining to schemes/purposes notified under Section 4(4)(b)(ii) of the Aadhaar Act, read with the Aadhaar Authentication for Good Governance (Social Welfare, Innovation, Knowledge) Rules, 2020, can be shared by Central or State Government departments, as the case may be, amongst themselves and also between Central Government and State Governments.

Clarification: Aadhaar and related data can be shared amongst different departments of the Central Government, or State Government, as the case may be, considering that these are to be treated as a single entity.

Further, demographic information (name, date of birth, gender and address of residence) and photograph of beneficiaries, along with partially masked Aadhaar can be shared between Centre and State

Governments and States inter-se. However, in case the consent as per Annexure to OM dated 06.12.2021 has been taken, the full Aadhaar number can be shared between Centre and State or States inter-se.

## FINANCE DEPARTMENT NOTIFIES ON MORTGAGE RELATING TO CROP LOANS

Finance Department Nagaland has issued a notification dated 9<sup>th</sup> September 2022 stating that in exercise of the powers conferred by Clause (a) of Sub-Section (1) of Section 9 of the Indian Stamp Act, 1899, the Government of Nagaland has remitted with effect from the date of publication of this notification in the Gazette, the whole amount of stamp duty chargeable on all instruments of mortgage relating to crop loans.

## NBSE NOTIFIES SCHOOLS NOT TO CONDUCT SELECTION TEST AT CLASS X AND XII LEVEL

Nagaland Board of School Education (NBSE) has notified the following for information of all the Heads of Institutions registered under NBSE for strict compliance:

In spite of the fact that Selection Test was done away with in 2014 as notified on 10.3.2014 and stated in the rules under Management of Examination 2014, many institutions are still conducting Selection Test to screen out or drop the poor learners from appearing the HSLC/HSSLC Examinations.

Therefore, NBSE has once again reminded all Heads of Institutions not to conduct Selection Test at Class X or XII level to screen out the poor learners. Schools should assure that the course/syllabus of the academic year is covered and the learning gaps among the students identified and the varied needs of the students are addressed. All possible efforts should be taken to give remedial measures, special classes etc. for the weak students to improve their performance.

Further, all schools must conduct Model Test at the end of completion of the course based on the design of the Board's question paper to orient the students to sit for the Board's examinations.

## DoSE INFORMS ON ATTENDANCE OF TEACHERS AND STAFF

The Directorate of School Education has informed that Heads of all Government Schools functioning within the State of Nagaland have been directed to ensure the following:

1. No teachers serving under their establishments engage proxies against them under any circumstances.
2. Photographs of all Teaching Staff along with names imprinted/affixed are displayed prominently in the Staff Room/School premises.
3. All Teachers/Staff sign in the Attendance Register in the same manner as they have appended their signature in the Service Book/Joining Report.

All DEOs/Senior SDEOs/SDEOs are directed to conduct surprise checking at schools under their jurisdiction and to ensure that no proxies are engaged by any staff.

Further, attention of all School Heads and DEOs/Senior SDEOs/SDEOs is drawn to Rule 4 (2) (i) of the Nagaland Government Servants Conduct Rules, 1968. It is reiterated that in the event of detection of engagement of proxies by any school staff during the surprise checks conducted by Officials of District

Administration and Directorate of School Education, in addition to initiating disciplinary action against those teachers engaging proxies, disciplinary action will also be initiated against the concerned School Heads and DEOs/Senior SDEOs/SDEOs for violation of the aforesaid Rule.

## NIULAND DISTRICT COMES UNDER ILP PURVIEW

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section (4) of the Bengal Eastern Frontier Regulation, 1873 and in continuation to Home Department, Political Branch, Notification dated Kohima, 9<sup>th</sup> December 2019 and in the interest of public, the entire District of Niuland will come under the preview of ILP with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> October 2022 with the following conditions:

1. Every Non-Indigenous Person henceforth entering the area of District of Niuland shall be required to obtain an ILP in the same mode and manner as presently required for entering the ILP area of Nagaland State and under the same condition as provided in Notification of even number dated 3/5/2018.
2. Every Non-Indigenous Person who is settled or has entered the area of District of Niuland which was hitherto not covered under ILP, before the date of issue of this notification and on or after 21/11/1979, the day the aforesaid area of Niuland was constituted as Tribal belt vide Land Revenue Department Notification No.LR/2-118/76 dated 21/11/1979, shall be required to obtain ILP in the same mode and manner and under the same condition as mentioned in Para 1 above within ninety (90 days) from the date of issue of this notification. 2022/9/21 18:57
3. Every Non-Indigenous Person who has settled or has entered the area of District of Niuland which was hitherto not covered under ILP prior to 21/11/1979, and has been continuously, will be exempted along with his/her direct descendants, from the requirements of having an ILP subject to him/her producing evidence of the same, in the form of documents like entry of name in the e-roll, land/property documents, house tax, entry of name in the e-Roll of Town Committee, school records, trade licenses etc. to the DC Niuland, who on the basis of the submitted documents and after holding such enquiry which he thinks fit and necessary, certify that the person in question has been staying continuously from before 21/11/1979, the concerned person on the strength of the certificate issued by the DC Niuland will not be required to obtain the ILP.
4. Any Non-Indigenous Person passing through the District of Niuland to other state as transit passenger and having a valid ticket will not be required to obtain ILP.

## STATE GOVERNMENT NOTIFIES ON NSSAA

The Government of Nagaland has designated the 'Nagaland State Social Audit Agency,' a society registered under Societies Registration Act, 1860 as amended vide Societies Registration (Nagaland Third Amendment) Act, 2008 (Act No. 1 of 2009) bearing Certificate of Registration NO.HOME/SRC-7607 dated 08-08-2022, as an independent Social Audit Unit (SAU) headed by an independent Director. The Social Audit will be responsible for the following:

- A. Build capacities of Gram Sabhas for conducting social audit and towards this purpose, identify, train and deploy suitable resource persons at village, block, district and state level, drawing from primary stakeholders and other civil society organizations having knowledge and experience of working for the rights of the people.
- B. Prepare social audit reporting formats, resource material, guidelines and manuals for the social audit

process.

- C. Create awareness amongst the labourers about their rights and entitlements under the Act.
- D. Facilitate verification of records with primary stakeholders and work sites.
- E. Facilitate smooth conduct of social audit Gram Sabhas for reading out and finalizing decisions after due discussion.
- F. Host the social audit reports including action taken reports in the public domain.

## GOVERNMENT DECLARES ASSOCIATIONS UNLAWFUL

Chief Secretary, Nagaland, J. Alam has issued an order on behalf of the Governor of Nagaland stating that the Central Government, in the exercise of powers conferred by section 3(1) of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967 (37 of 1967), has declared the Popular Front of India (PFI) and its associates or affiliates or fronts, including Rehab India Foundation (RIF), Campus Front of India (CFI), All India Imams Council (AIC), National Confederation of Human Rights Organisation (NCHRO), National Women's Front, Junior Front, Empower India Foundation and Rehab Foundation, Kerala as unlawful associations vide notification vide number S.O. 4560(E) dated 28<sup>th</sup> September 2022;

And in the exercise of the powers conferred by Section 42 of the said Act, the Central Government has directed vide Notification No. S.O. 4560(E) dated 28<sup>th</sup> September 2022 that all the States and Union Territory Administrations shall exercise the powers exercisable by the Central Government under Sections 7 and Section 8 of the said Act;

And whereas, vide Order No, 14017/4/2022-NI-MFO dated 28<sup>th</sup> September 2022, it has been conveyed that the State Governments and Union Territory Administrations may, by order in writing, direct that any power which has been directed to be exercised by it, shall, in such circumstances and under such conditions, as may be specified in the direction, be exercised by the Commissioners of Police, the District Magistrates or the Deputy Commissioners of Districts under the State Governments and Union Territory Administrations;

Therefore, in the exercise of the aforesaid delegated powers, the State Government has directed that the Commissioner of Police, the District Magistrates, and the Deputy Commissioners shall exercise the powers accordingly.

## HOME DEPARTMENT ISSUES OFFICE MEMORANDUM ON AGITATIONS

Home Commissioner, Abhijit Sinha, IAS through an office memorandum, has stated that certain individuals, organizations and associations have been calling for bandhs, strikes, agitations involving blocking National Highways and public roads in the State as a mode of agitation to press for their grievances. In this regard, he stated that blocking National Highways and public roads is a punishable offence under relevant sections of National Highway Act 1956, the Prevention of Damage to Public Property Act 1984 and Indian Penal Code. Further, in various judgements of the Supreme Court and High Courts, it has also been held that bandhs and road blockades are illegal and unconstitutional and organizers must be prosecuted.

J. Alam further stated that in some cases, as a part of agitation to press for certain local demands, calls are given for disturbing celebrations of National Days or forcefully preventing law abiding citizens from participating in such celebrations and functions. It may be stated here that any forceful act with intent to disturb the celebrations of the National Days is illegal and a serious offence and the culprits are liable to be prosecuted

under relevant sections of law.

Any purported grievances for any agitation should be brought to the notice of, and pursued with, the concerned government authority for appropriate action. Any public gathering, meant to express views/grievances or otherwise, without prior permission of the competent district authorities is illegal. Further, district authorities are also empowered under law to firmly deal with those indulging in actions which violate the law or create law and order problem, or disturb the existing atmosphere of peace and public tranquility, or cause nuisance and obstruction to general public.

The Home Commissioner said that the District Administration and Police officials should appropriately sensitize the organizations, groups concerned which have any pending grievance or have given a call for disruptive agitation. Further, in case of any violations as mentioned above on the part of any individual/group/association, the authorities concerned should initiate appropriate action under the relevant provisions of Indian Penal Code, the Prevention of Damage to Public Property Act 1984, the National Highway Act 1956 and such other appropriate Laws depending upon the violations, disruptions, disturbances caused.

An illustrative list of provisions which may be invoked depending on the situation is annexed. This list is not exhaustive and other laws as applicable may also be invoked by the law enforcing agencies.

## **Actions under different acts that can be invoked (depending upon the specific incidents):**

### **1. Indian Penal Code:**

- a. Section 143: Whoever is a member of an unlawful assembly shall be punished with imprisonment of either description for a term which may extend to six months, or with fine, or with both.
- b. Section 147: Whoever is guilty of rioting shall be punished with imprisonment of either description for a term which may extend to two years, or with fine, or with both
- c. Section 153: Wantonly giving provocation with intent to cause riot
- d. Section 153A: Promoting enmity between different groups on ground of religion, race, place of birth, residence, language, etc. and doing acts prejudicial to maintenance of harmony
- e. Section 153B: Imputations, assertions prejudicial to national integration.
- f. Section 188: Disobedience to order duly promulgated by public servant
- g. Section 341: Punishment for wrongful restraint
- h. Section 342: Punishment for wrongful confinement
- i. Section 426: Punishment for mischief

### **2. The Prevention of Damage to Public Property Act 1984:**

- a. Section 3: Mischief causing damage to public property

### **3. The National Highway Act 1956:**

- a. Section 8B: Punishment for mischief by injury to national highway

## POSHAN MAAH 2022 LAUNCHED

### DIMAPUR:

Rashtriya Poshan Abhiyaan on the theme 'Traditional foods for woman and children in tribal areas' programme was held at Kuda Youth Hall, Kuda village, Dimapur on 20<sup>th</sup> September 2022.

CDPO, Dimapur (U), Renchano Odyuo in her briefing said the campaign has been functioning for the past five years to give information on how to improve nutrition of kids and adults. She said the focus of Abhiyaan is to emphasize the nutritional status of adolescent girls, pregnant women, lactating mothers, and children from 0-6 years of age. She added that Poshan 2.0 seeks to address the challenges of malnutrition in children, adolescent girls, pregnant women, and lactating mothers through a strategic shift in nutrition content and delivery and by the creation of a convergent ecosystem to develop and promote practices that nurture health, wellness, and immunity.

Other highlights of the programme included local food shops by 12 SHGs under RD-NSRLM, on-the-spot distribution of IEC materials of fortified rice, demonstration of fortified rice, and video streaming of an online cooking competition on nutritious food for women and children.

### MON:

Deputy Commissioner, Mon, Ajit Kumar Verma, IAS on 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2022, launched the Rashtriya Poshan Abhiyaan, Poshan Maah at DRDA Hall, Mon with the theme, 'Mahila and Swaasthya (Women and Health).' The DC stated that the main objective of the campaign is to spread awareness about proper nutrition for women and children. DPO (ICDS) Mon, T. Yanlem gave an introduction on Poshan Maah,

## TEACHERS' DAY CELEBRATED ACROSS THE STATE

### KOHIMA:

State Level Teachers' Day was celebrated at Capital Cultural Hall, Kohima on 5<sup>th</sup> September 2022. The programme was graced by Chief Minister, Nagaland, Neiphiu Rio as the special guest, who presented the State Teacher's Award 2022 to twenty (20) teachers and also awarded the Chief Minister's Meritorious Student's

Fellowship to the Top 50 students in order of merit, of the HSLC Examinations 2020 and 2021.

Greeting the teachers on the occasion, Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio stated that teaching is a very noble profession, it is not limited to providing only academic knowledge but students look up to their teachers to find their ethical and moral compass, and learn values that will guide them

throughout their lifetime. Rio informed that the Digital Teacher's Diary is being initiated to enable government teachers to record their progress in classroom teaching learning transactions, and expressed hope that through this there will be improvement in their performance. Condemning the practice of proxy teaching, he said that to stop these practices, the Government will be launching Teachers Attendance Monitoring System in days to come, to help address proxy teaching and improve the attendance of teachers in their respective postings.

Sharing some concerns regarding the School Education Department, Rio stated that the Department has the second largest number of employees in the State. He emphasized the role of teachers, especially government teachers in reaching the remotest villages where few private schools are present, citing that the teacher-student ratio in the State is 1:12, while the national average is 1:27, and in government schools, the ratio is better at 1:7. While stating that government schools have not come upto expectation, Rio called on the government teachers and the Department to introspect and see how they can match or perform better than the private schools. He stated that the State Government is also working towards strengthening the teacher recruitment process by making it more transparent by giving equal opportunity to all candidates desiring to take up teaching.

Advisor, School Education, K. T. Sukhalu called out those teachers who have been keeping proxies, and said that they not only are bad role models but also compromise the future of students, of generations and of the future of the State. He strongly condemned such practices and said that if there are teachers who do not want to serve, they should immediately resign

rather than sacrifice the future of the students. He appealed to all the Deputy Commissioners to take strict action, and engage the administrative offices to visit the schools, and submit the report of proxy teachers to the Department so that action can be taken. He also informed that under various initiatives of State Government, Samagra Shiksha, Government of India and World Bank funded NECTAR project, efforts are being made to reform the education sector in the State. He stated that professional development, improving and strengthening capacities of educators/ teachers/ school administrators to deliver better in classroom transaction/ work place are regular activities now, and that new areas will be explored to build complementary skills for personal and professional growth of teachers.

State level programme on MCCD & Affordable Cancer Care Project was launched at Hotel Vivor, Kohima by Chief Secretary, J. Alam, IAS on 7<sup>th</sup> September 2022.

State level programme on Medical Certification Cause of Death (MCCD) & Affordable Cancer Care Project was launched at Hotel Vivor, Kohima by Chief Secretary, J. Alam, IAS on 7<sup>th</sup> September 2022. The programme was jointly organised by Tata Memorial Center, Department of Health & Family Welfare and Department of Economics & Statistics.

The Chief Secretary, while speaking on

affordable healthcare, said that in many places, since high out-of-pocket expenditure is incurred by families, people are pushed to poverty while getting treatment for major diseases and this problem is also relevant in Nagaland. Through various insurance based schemes, there is a

gradual movement towards Universal Health Care system and he hoped that Nagaland would be one of the first states to have this system. Alam also mentioned that affordability becomes a major issue, therefore, facilities with low cost health care and cancer care should be made available for the benefit of the citizens. He further said that since Nagaland has a high number of

cancer patients, it is necessary that cancer care facilities be set up in the State, and he requested the Tata Memorial Center to set up a unit which could be a part of a District Hospital or a part of the upcoming medical college.

In terms of MCCD, the Chief Secretary hoped that the programme would help in sensitising people about the importance of issuing death certificates which will help analyse the health trends of the State and will lead to evidence based decision making. The Chief Secretary also highlighted the major steps taken by the State Government in improving health facilities in the State in the last few years and the support provided by the Central Government in this regard.

Dr. Ravikant Singh, Officer in Charge HBCH & RC, in his keynote address said that Tata Memorial Center is under the Department of Atomic Energy and is financially supported by CDC Foundation, USA. Singh mentioned that the basic importance of MCCD are information through death certificates and is of considerable

use to public health planners, administrators, medical professionals and research workers, MCCD is made use of in the assessment of the effectiveness of public health programme. On affordable cancer care project, Dr. Singh mentioned that their aim is to take cancer care services nearer to district levels and, for the first phase, they have identified Kohima and Mokokchung districts as their targeted intervention where they will be training all the medical staff on cancer screening process, and along with the Health & Family Welfare Department, he said that they will be setting up some chemotherapy centres in the State.

Secretary, Health & Family Welfare Department, Asangla Imti, Dr. V. Khamo, Consultant, Naga Hospital and Commissioner & Secretary, Economics & Statistics, Kevileno Angami also spoke on the occasion.

She also pointed out that the Department has been functioning with inadequate manpower hampering the smooth flow of affairs and also the department budget allotment constraint.

Chief Secretary, J. Alam while addressing the issues said that the talent hunt for good

sports players is a must and that it is important for the department to have connections with the youths to carry out projects and also maintain a system to facilitate them after completion of their course for job maintenance. He also asked the department to maintain transparency, equality and not have nepotism among the sports players, and maintain a database. He mentioned that the distribution of sports equipments in villages is another way of promoting and encouraging sports to the youths and also said that the department's financial issues have been noted.

Commissioner & Secretary of Tourism, Kitto Zhimomi pointed out that the strategies of the department are to identify and export all key tourism products, develop quality tourism infrastructure and facilitation services, provide human resources development, develop marketing plans and create enabling environment

for local tourism stakeholders. He also explained that the upcoming projects and initiatives are the state institute of hotel management, ropeways, investment opportunities, IRCTC, off-road capital of the country, CSR opportunities, and Homestay and capacity building/skill development. ## NBSE ORGANIZES COMPETENCY-BASED EDUCATION WORKSHOP

The Nagaland Board of School Education (NBSE), in collaboration with Dream a Dream, organized a two-day online workshop on Competency-Based Education for the principals and teachers on 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> September 2022. Over 500 teachers participated in this interactive workshop.

The focus of the workshop was on competency-based assessment which is an important component of National Education Policy 2020. The workshop provided an overview of Competency-Based Education highlighting core principles of CBE, key elements in curriculum design and teacher learning process, and hands-on experience with core assessments education policy, 2020.

The resource persons from Dream a Dream shared the framework for developing a Competency-Based curriculum and how to provide hands on experience on various

assessments in CBE.

Speakers for the sessions were Bhavani Arumugam and Puneet Balamurugan from the Design and development team of Dream a Dream, and Dr. Swetha Bhushan, Dr. Joseph Thomas and Dr. Sreehari Ravindranath from the Research and impact team at Dream a Dream.

The speakers emphasized how competency-based learning will foster a culture of equity and inclusivity in the classroom and how to re-imagine education beyond academic performance and relook at the curriculum for enabling children to prepare for life.

In her address, Asano Sekhose, Chairman, NBSE commented that it is clear that we need to embrace change and we are on the way.

Teachers and principals from various schools in Nagaland shared their practical challenges and invited suggestions for implementing CBE.

Sharing a success story of Naga Mircha cultivation, Organizing Committee Convenor, Lhoulalie Zumu said that last year, this village reported a total income of Rs. 27 lakh through Naga Mircha cultivation and are expecting nearly Rs. 1 crore this year which acts as an engine of boosting the village economy. Stating that one good thing is that many graduate and post graduate students have also taken up Naga Mircha cultivation, and are doing a brisk business. There are 361 total households in the village, out of which, 200

He added that each household is expected to earn a minimum income of Rs. 60,000 to Rs 70,000 and the larger scale cultivators are expected to get nearly Rs. 4 to Rs. 5 lakh this year, the income through Naga Mircha cultivation helps support the children's education and sustainable livelihood. He thanked the State Government, particularly, Horticulture and Agriculture Departments for assisting the Naga Mircha growers and enabling the villagers to land a significant milestone thus far.

Seiyhama Village Council awarded certificate of appreciation to Duolhoulie Zumi for contributing highest product of Naga Mircha at the festival, Zasiituo Thevo for highest production of Naga Mircha, Atu Thevo for cultivating largest area of Naga Mircha, and Mengubeio Metha for harvesting the largest.

Gracing the occasion as the special guest, Vibeilietuo Kets, President, Nationalist Democratic Progressive Party (NDPP), 11<sup>th</sup> Northern Angami-

II Assembly Constituency called upon the Naga Mircha growers to focus on value-added products and also sell the produces at affordable price as far as possible, to sustain the business. He encouraged the villagers to come forward and apply the scheme of Chief Minister's Micro Finance Initiative, which was launched by Government of Nagaland to encourage credit for carrying out economic activities.

S. Senka Jamir, District Horticulture Officer, Kohima encouraged the villagers to vigorously pursue their innovative way of cultivation, assuring that the department will extend trainings and technical support to take the production to a larger scale. While addressing the newly inducted CHOs, Mission Director, National Health Mission, Nagaland, Dr. Thorhusie Katiry mentioned that

CHOs are the caregivers to the community under their jurisdiction and so their first goal is to provide quality health care to the people. He also requested them to live in harmony with the village people wherever they are posted and create an enabling environment in and around their Health & Wellness Center.

The State Program Officer, Dr. Mereninla

Senlem, NHM, Nagaland stated that the CHOs have a great responsibility toward the people in the villages in providing access to equitable, affordable and quality health care services that are accountable and responsive to people's needs. She also mentioned that the CHOs in their HWC should not only provide Reproductive Child Health and Non-Communicable Disease services but also all the vertical programmes under National Health Mission.

The training comprised sessions on Maternal

Health, Child Health, Non-Communicable Diseases, TB, Palliative Care, Blindness Control Programme, Oral Health, Mental Health, Adolescents Health Etc.

The Community Health Officers will be appointed against different Ayushman Bharat-Health & Wellness-Sub Centers across the State. Till now including the recent 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, and 6<sup>th</sup> batches, there are 298 Community Health Officers appointed for Health & Wellness Centers across the State of Nagaland.

### CAPACITY BUILDING TRAINING CONDUCTED FOR OFFICERS AND STAFF OF WRD

A two-day capacity-building training on service and accounts matters for officers and staff of the Water Resources Department (WRD) was held at the Conference Hall of the Chief Engineer Office, WRD, Kohima on 15<sup>th</sup> September 2022.

Under Secretary, Department of Economics & Statistics, Andreas Ezung, and Retired Senior Accounts Officer, Treasuries & Accounts Department, Khinyi Woch were the resource persons for the training.

Superintending Engineer, WRD, Er. K. Hutoi Sema addressing the trainees, stated that the training is being conducted to enhance the knowledge and skills of the employees and to provide information and instructions on how to better perform their tasks. Highlighting the importance of service and account matters for

the functioning of the office, he appealed to the staff and officers of the department to clarify their doubts and learn through the opportunity provided.

Executive Engineer, Er. Wapangnaro Imchen who chaired the programme, informed that the Department has been conducting the training for the past three years, and this has proven to be successful in imparting knowledge to many officers and staff.

The training will be imparted on matters such as Government Servant Conduct Rule 1968, Disciplinary and Appeal Rules 1967, APAR, filing system, noting and drafting, maintenance of service book, personal file, pay and allowances, seniority, and promotion, budgeting management, auditing of government accounts, etc.

The IAS Association, Nagaland discussed pertinent administrative challenges and deliberated on the way forward to improve the public service delivery mechanism in the State

of Nagaland. The Association also discussed service-related issues of the IAS and pledged to

re-dedicate themselves to the welfare of society and the nation.

### WORKSHOP ON RECENT INITIATIVES FOR SIMPLIFYING AADHAAR USAGE CONDUCTED AT KOHIMA

As part of efforts to promote Aadhaar usage by states, Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI), Regional Office (RO) Guwahati organized a state level workshop on 'Recent initiatives for simplifying aadhaar usage' at Administrative Training Institute, Kohima on 19<sup>th</sup> September 2022.

Addressing the participants and officials as the special guest of the workshop, Chief Secretary, Jan E Alam, IAS said that Aadhaar is very essential in availing various social welfare schemes and urged the residents to get registered for Aadhaar to receive benefits under Direct Benefit Transfer. He also mentioned that special efforts shall be undertaken to cover the left out population.

CEO, UIDAI, Dr. Saurabh Garg elaborated on the progress made by Aadhaar in the past decade. He highlighted in his speech that Aadhaar authentication provides an instant mechanism to prove one's identity through online authentication. He also emphasized that UIDAI will continue its efforts for improving the Ease of Living for residents and urged the Government of Nagaland to implement DBT in every service delivery schemes to bring transparency.

Speaking on the occasion, Deputy Director General, UIDAI, RO Guwahati, Devajit Khound explained how Aadhaar has become the core

of India's digital public infrastructure. He said Aadhaar with its inherent features of Uniqueness, Authentication, Financial Address and e-KYC has helped the government authorities to directly reach residents for delivery of various subsidies, benefits and services. He emphasized that Aadhaar is verifiable anytime, anywhere both online as well as off-line in a cost-effective way.

The various sessions of the workshop deliberated on Aadhaar features, key developments on usage of aadhaar, data privacy and information security. Deputy Secretary, DBT Mission, Devendra Kumar highlighted the various features on DBT and its implementation procedures for the State Government. Officials from UIDAI highlighted the importance of DBT and the issuance of Section 7 gazetted notifications for the schemes and benefits disbursed from the State Consolidated Fund. Discussions pertaining to Section 4(4)(b)(ii) was also held for issuance of notification under good governance.

Progress of Aadhaar enrolment and initiatives taken to implement DBT were shared. Best practices adopted by the State were also explained. It may be added that in spite of challenges/network issues, the Government of Nagaland is making rigorous efforts to ramp up Aadhaar enrolment.

The first day of the Twelfth Session of the Thirteenth Nagaland Legislative Assembly (NLA) was held on 20<sup>th</sup> September 2020 at the NLA Secretariat, Kohima.

### OBITUARY REFERENCES:

Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio made the obituary reference on the passing away of Late K. Sankaranarayanan, former Governor of

Nagaland who expired on 24.04.2022. Leader of NPF Legislature Party, Kuzholuzo Nienu made the obituary reference on the passing away of Late Vejoi Vero, former Member of Nagaland Legislative Assembly who expired on 22.07.2022. The House observed a minute silence and paid homage to the former Governor and MLA.

### STARRED QUESTIONS:

MLA, Yitachu enquired on the status of waterways in Nagaland to which, Minister, Transport, Civil Aviation & Railways, Paiwang Konyak replied that the State Government has been pursuing with the Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways, Government of India for the development of Tizu-Zungki river (National Waterway No. 101) as an Inland Waterway Corridor.

As per the advice of the Ministry of Ports, Shipping & Waterways, Government of India, Nagaland Inland Waterways Board (NIWB) has been constituted, headed by Minister, Transport as the Chairperson and Chief Secretary as the Co-opted Chairperson. There are four rivers identified by IWAI as National Waterways viz. 1) National Waterway - 30: Dhansiri/Chate River 2) National Waterway - 31: Dikhu River 3) National Waterway - 32: Doyang River and 4) National Waterway - 101: Tizu-Zungki River.

On being asked by MLA, Dr. Chotisu Sazo on the status of construction on Training Institute Building under SIRD at Chozuba Sub-Division, Minister, Rural Development, Metsubo Jamir replied that the work is in good progress with Administrative, Training and Classroom Block - 90%, Boys Hostel - 65 % and Girls Hostel - 1 %.

MLA Kuzholuzo Neinu asked on the works

taken up by Tribal Affairs Department under Article 275 (1) within Phek district, to which Minister in-charge of Tribal Affairs Department, Temjen Imna Along replied that the following works were carried out, such as, 1) Digitization of Library & Classrooms in Phek Government College and Pfutsero Government College 2) Digitization and upgradation of office utilities at Tsunazho Polytechnic 3) Construction of Community Council Court at Zavema (DPR @ Rs. 100 lakh is under finalization and work order yet to be issued (2021-2022); and 4) Construction of Guest House at Thipuzu (@ Rs. 50.00 lakh). Works allotted to the Directorate of Higher Education @ Rs. 26.26 lakh per unit (Rs. 26.26 x 2) for implementation (2020-2021) and works allotted to the Directorate of Technical Education @Rs. 41.66 per unit (Rs. 41.66 x 1) for implementation (2020-2021).

MLA Yitachu asked on the policy of the Government to resolve the Adhoc and Contingency employees attaining retirement age, to which Chief Minister and Minister-in-charge of P&AR, Neiphiu Rio said that Adhoc and Contingency employees by their very nature, are temporary, and no policy is required to provide on their attaining retirement age.

MLA Kuzholuzo Nienu enquired on the land encroachment problem in Dimapur Airport, to which Minister-in-charge of Transport, Civil Aviation & Railways, P. Paiwang Konyak furnished the names of the encroachers - Inato Yeptho, Kughalu Sema, Hekevi Yeptho, Sheloka Yeptho, Linovi H. Zhimo, Tito Yeptho, Tokihe Chishi, Vinoka Chishi, Akaho Zhimo, Kakheho Yeptho, H. Inoto Murru, Shikai Tuccu, Toshili Sumi, C. Yang Khamniungan, Kivikhu Kiho, Suhuto Chishi, Asuho Albert Sumi, Heito Sumi,

M. Sensotemjen, Phushito, Hoshito Shohe and Hokashe. The State Government is putting a concerted effort to complete the formalities of handing over the land occupied by Assam Rifles and C.R.P.F. to Airports Authority of India, so as to enable the AAI to take up Airport Development work in time bound manner. A series of meetings had been held with the various stakeholders. Assam Rifles and CRPF authorities had agreed in principle to hand over the land to AAI. The final meeting for the handing and taking over of the land from the Assam Rifles and CRPF would be conducted upon submission of the final joint survey report from the appropriate authority.

On a query on how much funds were sanctioned under Smart City so far, the Chief Minister stated that the total amount sanctioned are, Government of India share - Rs. 245 Crore, State Share - Rs. 30 Crore, and the total amount utilized is Rs. 234.42 Crore.

On a query of whether the State has a policy on child adoption, Minister, Metsubo Jamir informed that rules for adoption is provided under Nagaland Juvenile Justice Rule 2017.

Minister-in-Charge, PWD (NH) replying to a query on whether any MoU has been signed between the Government and the company/NHIDCL/ contractors for maintenance of the existing road till the completion of the four lane road, stated that there is no such MoU signed between the Government of Nagaland and NHIDCL, and the main reasons for the delay given by NHIDCL were unprecedented/unseasonal adverse, weather condition, shortage of bitumen, unprecedented rain, extremely adverse weather condition, landslides due to frequent rain, working constraints due to disturbance of locals/land issues/hindrances, COVID-19 restrictions, etc.

On being asked about the work status of State Capital Kohima Railway Line by MLA Yitachu, Minister-in-charge of Transport, Civil Aviation & Railways, Paiwang Konyak stated that the Dimapur-Dhansiripar to Kohima-Sechu Broad Gauge rail line is being taken up in three phases: Phase - 1 (from 0 to 17 Km): 100% progress; Phase - 2 (from 17 to 44%): 65% progress and Phase - 3 (from 44 to 82.50 %): 12% progress, with the total progress made being 48%. The 1<sup>st</sup> Phase of the Dimapur-Dhansiripar to Kohima-Sechu rail line has been completed and the final phase is targeted to be completed by 2026. The Shokhuvi Station, the 2<sup>nd</sup> Rail Station in Nagaland was inaugurated by Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio on 26<sup>th</sup> August 2022. The Chief Minister also flagged off the Donyi Polo Express during the day. Delay in acquisition of land, heavy and long monsoon season and short working season, non-existence of approach road to the project site, and the COVID-19 lockdown caused delay in the completion of the works.

Replying to the starred question put up by MLA Yitachu regarding the status of the State Capital Kohima Airport, Minister Transport, Civil Aviation and Railways, P. Paiwang Konyak said that in line with the AAI policy of 'Purchase and Transfer,' the State Government has already purchased a suitable land for the proposed airport measuring an area of 1013.72 acres and is ready to be transferred to the AAI for the construction of the proposed Greenfield Airport at Ciethu for the State Capital, Kohima. He further mentioned that the construction work shall start after getting approval from the Ministry of Civil Aviation, GoI and subsequent sanctioning of the requisite fund for the project by Union Cabinet.

Minister, PWD (Housing & Mechanical), Tongpang Ozukum, replying to the starred

question by MLA Kuzholuzo regarding the status of the Mini Secretariat Complex at Phek District said that the construction of the Mini Secretariat Complex is being undertaken at Pfutsero ADC Hq. in Phek district and 95 per cent of the work has been completed and is expected to be fully completed by October/November 2022.

Replying to a starred question on the status of the Mini Secretariat Complex construction at Phek district, Minister Tongpang Ozükum said the construction is 95% completed and the payment made is Rs. 4 crore and Rs. 76 lakh is yet to be released. He added that the construction would be completed by October or November 2022.

On the issue of the nomenclature raised by MLA Imkong L. Imchen, Minister Tongpang replied that the Department is taking up the issue of renaming 'Mini Secretariat Complex.' Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio said the concept of the mini secretariat is to bring all the departments together instead of functioning like separate entities. He suggested renaming the Complex as 'DC Office Complex.' The concept was also brought up to improve the attendance of district government officials, and better security coordination.

Regarding the funds sanctioned for maintenance of roads for Mokokchung town, Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio said Rs. 1.07 crore was sanctioned and the maintenance work would start as soon as working season starts.

On the question of ILP registration and renewal, Deputy Chief Minister, Y. Patton replied that the total number of ILP Registration (Fresh) issued in all the authorised offices w.e.f. 1<sup>st</sup> January 2022 till date is 11,718. out of which, 6173 are tourist ILPs (both domestic and foreign) issued by Commissioner's Office Kohima. The total number of ILP renewals w.e.f. 1<sup>st</sup> January

2022 till 16<sup>th</sup> September 2022 is 15,851. He added that the Commissioner Nagaland, Deputy Commissioners, ADCs, the Nagaland Houses at New Delhi, Kolkata, Guwahati and Shillong are authorised to issue offline/online ILP for the various categories.

Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio while reminding the procedure of indigenous inhabitant registration in Nagaland, said the Village Chairman has the authority to determine the native inhabitant subject to verification by the district administration, however, the misuse of the authority is liable to punishment. He stressed on streamlining of the registration procedure and cautioned against the harassment of Indian citizens working in Nagaland.

On total number of approved industrial estates, sawmill and timber units, MLA and Leader NPF Legislature Party, Kuzholuzo Nienu enquired on the total number of industrial estates approved by High powered Committee that exist in Nagaland, particularly in Phek district, to which Minister of Environment, Forests & Climate Change, Y. M. Yollow replied that the total number of industrial estates approved is 17. Also, there is no HPC approved industrial estate in Phek district.

On funds sanctioned for maintenance of Chizami town road, MLA Kezhienyi Khalo inquired on whether the maintenance funds have been awarded to Chizami Town and if so, the amount to be mentioned against each road. The CM replied that the funds have been awarded and for the year 2020-2021, the amount is Rs. 10 lakh for road from old British road to Chizami old town and Rs. 5 lakh from Chizami-Khomi road upto Bridge Point.

On being asked on details of the road project

for Lephori to Molhe 26 Km by MLA Kuzholuzo Nienu, Chief Minister replied that the work order amount is Rs. 30 crore, the date of commencement of works is 12.12.2011 and completion of works was on 08.01.2014. The name of the contractor is M\ S Rhino Construction, NPW/CI-/236.

### **KUZHOLUZO HARPS ON RESUMPTION OF OIL EXPLORATION:**

There is an urgent need to resume exploration and mining petroleum in the Nagaland, stated the Leader of NPF Party, Kuzholuzo Nienu while calling attention to matter of urgent public importance under Rule-54 during the 12<sup>th</sup> Session of the 13<sup>th</sup> Assembly on 20<sup>th</sup> September 2022.

Stating that oil is no longer considered to be primary source of energy for the future owing to climate change and advancement in technology, the world is shifting towards cleaner and sustainable & renewable energy. He also added that core oil companies like OIL, ONGC now shifting heavily towards production of clean energy, it is high time the state government take concrete steps to resume the oil and gas exploration and production in Nagaland before the 'golden liquid' becomes redundant and loses its utility and thereby its market value. He further added that the use of the 'golden liquid' is expected to drastically come down by the year 2035 throughout the world including India. There are even projections that by the year 2050 the use of fossil fuels like coal, oil and gas would completely stop, Azo added.

To find a way for resuming oil and gas exploration activities in the State, Azo stated that the Union Minister for Petroleum initiated a bipartite agreement with the State Government, the MoU of which is expected to be finalized and signed very soon. Since Exploration activities may take an average of five to seven years, the mindset of the stakeholders including the State Government should be on monetizing the existing oilfields and get immediate return. It will be pertinent for the State Government, to formulate policies wherein it can have a Participating Interest (PI) of 10% to 15% in the already existing oilfields like Champang and Tssori.

Minister, Geology & Mining, Kashiho Sangtam also gave a brief status on petroleum & natural gas affairs in the Nagaland. He stated that petroleum exploration commenced in Nagaland during 1971 and oil was first struck in

Changpang- Tssori in 1973. He further added that in Changpang 29 oil wells were drilled, however was suspended during May 1994.

The Minister stated that the Chief Minister of Nagaland, Neiphiu Rio held a meeting with Union Minister of State for Petroleum & Natural Gas and subsequent meetings were held with Secretary Ministry of Petroleum & Natural Gas and Union Minister for PNG, GoI, at New Delhi. The Union Minister suggested the Government of Nagaland and the Ministry of Petroleum & Natural Gas to come up with a Bipartite MoU to facilitate resumption of exploration and production of petroleum and natural gas in the state pending resolution of the matter in the High Court.

Minister Kashiho apprised the House that MoPNG has shared the Draft Bipartite MoU between MoPNG, GoI and Government of Nagaland, and accordingly, the State Government has forwarded the matter to the Advocate General Nagaland and is awaiting the reply.

### CM SPEAKS ON NAGA POLITICAL ISSUE:

On the second day (20<sup>th</sup> September 2022) of the 12<sup>th</sup> Session of the 13<sup>th</sup> Assembly, Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio said that the Indo-Naga political imbroglio has been at the core of Naga society for several decades and remains central in our concerns even today. The present State Government in Nagaland has formed an opposition-less United Democratic Front (UDA) Government with the singular motive to facilitate the peace process so that the aspiration of achieving genuine peace through a negotiated political solution that is honourable, acceptable and inclusive is realised.

Rio said that the Parliamentary Committee

on Naga Political Issue and the Core Committee were formed on 10<sup>th</sup> June 2021 comprising of representatives from all political parties represented in the Nagaland Legislative Assembly. The Parliamentary Committee and the Core Committee has held several rounds of discussions, deliberations and consultative meetings with various stakeholders including the Naga national political groups and the representatives of the Government of India.

The signing of the Framework Agreement on 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2015 after over 80 rounds of talks in the presence of the Prime Minister of India and other high officials and dignitaries of the Union Government was indeed a historic occasion. The Agreed Position signed on 17<sup>th</sup> November 2017 was greatly significant and further strengthened the progress of the negotiations. On October 15<sup>th</sup> 2020, the Naga Consultative Meeting on the Naga Political Issue held at the State Banquet Hall, Kohima unanimously resolved to relentlessly work in a collective and unified manner with one voice so as to facilitate the peace process and strengthen the negotiations

for early realisation of the desired One Solution in a transparent manner which is acceptable and honourable. On September 2022, the national political groups signed the September Joint Accordant under the initiative of the Forum for Naga Reconciliation. The NSCN-IM and the NNPG while acknowledging the "Covenant of Reconciliation (CoR) signed on 13<sup>th</sup> June 2009 committed to move forward through dialogue and live together in peace.

Rio said that on 16<sup>th</sup> July 2022, the Parliamentary Committee on Naga Political Issue, in its meeting held at Kohima, adopted a resolution appealing to the negotiating parties to refer to the competencies of the talks and resolve the contentious issues. reiterate our appeal to the negotiating parties and the Government of India to address the contentious issues and undertake discussions on the competencies so that the talks can be expedited and a solution can be reached at the earliest possible.

Chief Minister Rio appealed to all sections of Naga society and to the negotiating parties of the political dialogue to rise above all else, so that we work in unison for the common good of all Nagas.

### **SESSION DELIBERATES ON FOOTHILL ROAD CONSTRUCTION:**

On Matters of Urgent Public Importance under Rule 54 pertaining to 'Foothill Road Construction,' MLA, Imkong L. Imchen said that the construction of the Foothill Road would help ease the Assam-Nagaland border issue. He also said that it is not for the benefit of one tribe but for everyone in Nagaland. This route would bring expected and unexpected development in the State and the demand for construction of the

road is genuine and urgent.

On Foothill Road construction, Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio mentioned that the matter has been taken up on several occasions with the MoRTH. He also said that the importance of the road highlights many economic potentials and opportunities for the people living in the hills and it would bring all kinds of economic activities. While concluding the discussion, the House unanimously passed that the Foothill Road would be completed with NEC funds.

### **MEMBERS HOLD DISCUSSIONS ON MEDICAL NEGLIGENCE:**

Kuzholuzo Nienu, Leader of NPF Legislature Party emphasised on the need to pass the Medical Negligence Act in Nagaland considering the fact that negligence and malpractices have been noticeable ever since the establishment of Health Care Facilities in the State. He added that the medical profession, long regarded as the noblest profession, is not immune to negligence, which often results in the death of the patient or complete/partial impairment or any other misery which has adverse effects on patient's health. He urged the house to pass the Nagaland Medical Negligence Bill in order to check medical negligence and malpractices and restore the lost trust and respect in the noble profession, and also provide the best possible health care delivery in the State.

Pangnyu Phom, Minister Health & Family Welfare joining in the discussion, said that Medicine is a noble profession and the doctors regulate their conduct though a Code of Ethics which is enforced by their self-regulatory body, the Nagaland Medical Council. He further mentioned that the Council, on receipt of complaints against

its members from public, including patients and their relatives, is expected to conduct enquiries on these and depending on the seriousness of the complaints, the Council has the power to reprimand a practitioner, or suspend or remove his name from its register. Pangnyu also said that there are other legal options also available to aggrieved patients, which include filing a case for civil negligence where he can seek for compensation for the injury caused due to the negligence, filing a case for criminal negligence where the doctor shows a gross absence of skill or care, or an illegal act, filing a case for damages as a consumer of services under the Consumer Protection Act, 1986, and patient safety should be the cornerstone of the standard operating procedures, protocols and processes that are put in place within a hospital. These should also be ensured by the Department along with the Nagaland Medical Council and other stakeholders.

Pangnyu however expressed that it is also important that the Nagaland Medical Council (NMC) conducts sufficient training and capacity building of the medical practitioners through Continuing Medical Education and other means. This is important so that they are fully updated on the various medical advancements, as well as to refresh that ethical practice, and high standards, should be the cornerstone of medical professionals in the State.

Minister, Yollow Konyak and MLA, Dr. Ngangshi both highlighted some of the reforms

and measures required to be taken in order to ensure quality medical facilities to the citizens of the State.

Advisor, Nicky Kire said that Public Health Diploma is necessary amongst doctors who are transferred to the Directorate. He also said that all doctors should continue to follow CME-Continuing Medical Education which is important for health care providers to prosper by allowing them to learn and improve effectively. He further said that there is a need superannuation age for doctors which will give the older doctors a chance when they are being referred.

Advisor, Dr. Chumben Murry through his observations, said that there is an increasing number of litigations of medical negligence and this may be partly due to increasing awareness among health care recipients. He said that there should be more efforts placed on awareness of legal avenues and also of doctor-patient relationship to enable more rational approach towards problems such as violence against doctors. Murry added there is a need to strengthen rules and regulations of the medical council and also strengthen penal laws dealing with medical negligence.

Speaker NLA, Sharingain Longkumer, in his concluding remark, said the Thirteenth House started from 1<sup>st</sup> session to 12<sup>th</sup> Session, had 38 days of sittings, took 151 hours and 50 minutes. The 13<sup>th</sup> House passed 26 Reports, 26 Bills, and adopted 8 Resolutions and 14 Discussions on Matters of Urgent Public Importance.

### **K. T. SUKHALU RELEASES 12 NAGALAND HERITAGE BASED FILMS**

Twelve Nagaland Heritage-based films were released by Advisor for School Education and SCERT, K. T. Sukhalu, IAS (Retd.) at the Capital Convention Centre, Kohima on 21<sup>st</sup> September 2022.

Sukhalu said many aspects of our heritage, culture, and traditions are not being fully documented and asked the SCERT Department to document those for the students. He said

students are often not fully aware of their culture and tradition, therefore, screening of these short films to the students should be done to infuse the feeling of pride in one's identity. He stressed on the need of counselors for students to mainstream the students into the right line of thinking and overall development. He also mentioned that teachers also play an important role to take responsibility for molding the students into leaders for the future generation.

Commissioner & Secretary, School Education and SCERT, Kevileno Angami said SCERT has come up with the Nagaland Heritage textbook which helps children to learn the dialect and language, cultural practices, and poems of different tribes, and with the release of the Nagaland Heritage-based films, it would supplement what is in the textbook.

Director, SCERT, N. Chumchanbeni Kikon said the Nagas' rich cultural heritage can

be successfully preserved if only they value it, document it, and transmit it to the next generation. She added that SCERT Nagaland has documented a total of 15 Naga heritage-based short films, out of which three were released in the year 2020. The 12 Nagaland Heritage-based short films are based on customs, practices, values, and different aspects of Naga culture which are drawn from the school subject 'Nagaland Heritage Studies.' She also said that SCERT Nagaland is the first SCERT in the country to introduce the course for Diploma in School Counselling on 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2018.

A total of 38 trainees from the 3<sup>rd</sup> batch were conferred the Diploma Degree and oath-taking was administered by the Advisor who also released the 12 Nagaland Heritage-based films. A total of 31 candidates were also inducted into the course as the 4<sup>th</sup> batch during the programme.

### E&S DEPARTMENT RELEASES GSDP NAGALAND 2021-2022

The Department of Economics & Statistics released the Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) of Nagaland, 2021-2022 during a press conference held at the Directorate of Economics & Statistics, Kohima on 21<sup>st</sup> August 2022.

Director, Economics & Statistics, Neidilhou Angami addressing the media persons informed that the GSDP, Nagaland, as of 30<sup>th</sup> July 2021-22, has picked up from a negative growth of -2.63 percent, witnessed in 2020-21 to 8.98 percent in 2021-22. The advanced estimates suggest that the growth of the State economy has surpassed the pre-pandemic average growth of 5.38 percent (i.e. 2011-12 to 2019-20), despite the second wave of the pandemic that plagues the economy during the first quarter of 2021-22.

In absolute numbers, the real growth of

the economy is estimated to increase from Rs. 17991.61 crore in 2020-21 (Provisional) to Rs. 19607.83 crore in 2021-22 (Advanced Estimates). Correspondingly, the nominal growth of the economy is estimated to have increased from Rs. 30425.11 crore in 2020-21 to Rs. 33705.84 crore in 2021-22 (A.E).

The sectoral contribution indicated that the structural change of the economy is slowly shifting towards the tertiary sector of the economy. The primary sector contribution to GSVA overtime has declined from 31.4 percent in 2011-12 to 26.88 percent in 2021-22(A.E). On the other hand, the contribution of the secondary sector has been hovering around 9 percent to 12 percent since 2011-12, reaching a peak of 12.90 percent in 2017-18. The share of the tertiary

sector which has contributed 56.17 percent to the GSVA in 2011-12 has steadily increased to 62.77 percent in 2021-22 (A.E).

The sub-sector secondary sector comprising manufacturing, electricity, gas, water supply & other utility services, and construction, during 2021-22, is estimated to pick up from a negative of -9.12 percent in 2020-21 to 9.36 percent in 2021-22. The contribution from the manufacturing sector to GSVA was estimated at 1.62 percent only in 2021-22.

The sub-sector of electricity, gas, water supply, and other utility services is the least affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. During 2021-22 (A.E), the sub-sector is estimated to grow by 9.43 percent. The growth in the construction sector is estimated to pick up from -14.26 percent in 2020-21 to 8.15 percent in 2021-22 (A.E), with the construction sector share in GSVA estimated at 6.04 percent in 2021-22.

The Department informed that over the years, the tertiary sector has become the most robust sector contributing 62.77 percent of GSVA in 2021-22 and that the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic was felt the most in the trade & repairs and hotel & restaurant sectors with a growth rate from the sector falling to a negative of -7.57 percent in 2020-21. With the normalization of the economy, the growth of the sub-sector is

estimated to bounce back to positive growth of 6.80 percent in 2021-22 (A.E).

During 2021-22, the financial services are estimated to grow at 9.21 percent with a share of 3.89 percent in the overall GSVA is one of the sub-sector which is assumed to be least affected by the covid-19 pandemic. This is because the number of dwellings during the year is expected to remain the same. During 2020-21, the gross value added by real estate and ownership of the dwelling sector is estimated to have negative growth of -2.75 percent.

During 2021-22, as per the Budget Estimates of Government, the allocation for public administration has increased from Rs. 6015.90 crore in 2020-21 to Rs. 6764.28 crore.

The Department also revealed that over ten years, the Per Capita Income of the State has increased from Rs. 53,010 in 2011-12 to Rs. 1,35,701 in 2021-22 (A.E), achieving a Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) of 9.86 percent. It also highlighted that the borrowing limit of the State Government is determined by the amount of the GSDP of the State, and as per the Finance Commission of India recommendation for budgetary measures, beginning from XIII FC State Government is permitted to borrow only three percent of the GSDP from financial institutions.

### CAPACITY BUILDING ON 15<sup>th</sup> FINANCE COMMISSION GRANTS FOR ULBS HELD

Organized by the Municipal Affairs Department under the initiatives of the Regional Centre for Urban & Environmental Studies (Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, GoI), a capacity building on the 15<sup>th</sup> Finance Commission Grants for ULBs was held on 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2022 at Don Bosco Training Institute, Dimapur.

During the valedictory function, Advisor, Urban Development and Municipal Affairs Department, GoN, Dr. Neikiesalie Kire distributed the certificates and computer to the district administrators. He assured them of support and said such trainings will continue in the coming days. He hoped that the trainees would play lead roles and put their

knowledge to good use in their respective towns in dealing with the issues and undertakings.

During the training report presentation, Dr. K Srinivas, Programme Coordinator & FIC Saksham informed that the function of MHUA is to understand the needs of Municipal Affairs, gaps in the implementation, and study flagship programmes. He said the hands-on training is practically designed to include theory and background on 15<sup>th</sup> FC in allocation to the Government of Nagaland in 39 ULBs. He informed that the officers were made to understand the preconditions of the funds, how to improve the

service level benchmark, and tied and untied grants. Also, each municipality has gone through the city finance portal, and 10 city town plans were made. He hoped that the activities during the training will help them to work according to the needs of their Councils.

Sasipriya, PMU, O/o CDMA, GoT, Hyderabad, Prof. Kumar Molugaran, Director RCUES, OU and Prof. M. Chenna Basavaiah, Adjunct Prof. Osmania University were the other resource persons. Altogether 73 participants from 39 ULBs attended the programme.

### NSRLM ORGANISES FIRST CXO MEET AT DIMAPUR

Nagaland State Rural Livelihood Mission (NSRLM) organised the first CXO meeting at Dimapur on 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> September 2022, with the vision to transform the rural poor youths into an economically independent and global workforce.

Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDUGKY), a centrally sponsored scheme, is a placement linked skill development programme of Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India, which is also part of National Rural Livelihood Mission with a dual objective of adding diversity to the income of rural poor families and to cater to the aspirations of the rural youths. The main objective of the

DDUGKY is to train the rural youths and provide placement opportunities to those who have successfully completed the course.

Guest speaker, Minister, Rural Development, Metsubo Jamir stated that during the recently held CSR Conclave, over 100 companies have assured to invest in our State. Since workforce will be needed in any investment, he hoped that the trainees under the DDUGKY and various training institutes in the State will fill the gap of workforce.

Tenzing Choesang, North-East Regional Representative, MoRD, Dean Clyde Cooper, Learning & Development Manager - The Den, Bengaluru and Anil Makwana, M.D, Talent Acquaintance also spoke on the occasion.

### IRCS 35<sup>th</sup> ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD

The ceremonial function of the 35<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting (2021-2022) of the Indian Red Cross Society, Nagaland (IRCSN) was held at Dr. Imkongliba Hall, Raj Bhavan, Kohima on 27<sup>th</sup> September 2022.

While delivering the presidential address, Governor of Nagaland & President, IRCSN Prof. Jagdish Mukhi said appealed to the Nagas to work hard to help their fellowmen, particularly the weaker section of the society during times of disaster. The Governor further said that the annual membership last year including Patron, Vice-patron, and Life members were 112 members only. In this regard, he said that membership drives should be scaled up as this will strengthen the organization physically and economically. The branches should strive to register youth leaders, teachers, church leaders, doctors, and nurses who can take a proactive role in carrying out the mission of the Red Cross. He urged the Red Cross Society to involve the medical fraternity, particularly doctors and nurses who can become a great asset to the society, especially in organizing health programmes and during emergencies. He also said that First Aid and Blood Donation training programmes by the IRCS Nagaland are crucial and these services must be continued with greater interest to help people in times of emergency.

The Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW) is implementing a national strategic plan to eliminate TB by 2025, five years ahead of the global SDG target of 2030. Since the challenge of TB requires a multisectoral response to address social determinants like nutritional support, vocational support, more access to diagnostic and treatment services, etc. the community and institutions play a critical role in filling the gaps in addressing the social determinants, thereby contributing to the national goal. Prof. Mukhi asked the society to participate in the nutritional support component and contribute to the elimination of TB in the country and urged the Red Cross to play its part in eliminating TB by 2025 as envisaged. He concluded by saying that the emergence of social media must be utilized to our advantage. The setting up of Video Conference facilities at the Red Cross office, Kohima, is encouraging. Information technology and digitalization procedures should be incorporated into society to modernize and enhance its functioning.

Dr. R. Rose Chakhesang while presenting minutes of the 35<sup>th</sup> Annual General Body Meeting (Business session) which was held on 26<sup>th</sup> September 2022, mentioned the resolutions which were adopted - all Deputy Commissioners & Presidents of IRCS district branches were

requested to make more initiative and interest in Red Cross activities, District Red Cross Units that do not have office or store facilities for example Zunheboto, Mon, Tuensang, etc, DCs were requested to allot or spare office rooms for the society needs. Further, the district branches are encouraged to form more JRC/YEC societies.

All units are urged to increase the enrollment of Patrons, Vice-Patrons, and life members. The Board also decided to write to Deputy Commissioners of the newly created districts to initiate the setting up of Red Cross Societies in their districts. Eleven Patrons and five Vice Patrons were decorated at the function for the year 2022.

Speaking at the programme as a special guest, Advisor, Urban Development and Municipal Affairs, Dr. Neikiesalie Kire said Nagas have close attachment with their grandparents but practically, the elders are left all alone at home while they are out for work, especially in the villages. In this regard, he urged the agency to spread the message of dropping the elders off at Old Age Homes and to pick them by evening, to let them enjoy life with their friends.

Lotha, while delivering the keynote address, spoke about rabies and its preventive measures, she said that rabies has no treatment but is

preventable through vaccination, therefore, the annual vaccination of pets is very important. Later after the programme, around 250 pet dogs were administered free Anti-Rabies Vaccination.

In Kiphire the event was held at District Veterinary Hospital, Kiphire where free anti-rabies vaccination were given to 50 dogs.

In Tuensang, free vaccination drive for pet dogs was conducted at Old Medical Ward B, Tuensang. Dr. Aojongshi, Veterinary Assistant Surgeon explained briefly the importance of vaccinating pet dogs and its safety for human beings. He also told all the dog owners gathered to vaccinate their dogs, above three years of age, on yearly basis.

In Chümoukedima the World Rabies Day was held at Chümoukedima Town Council (CTC) Hall. Chief Veterinary Officer, Chümoukedima, Dr. E. Kepfoh informed that there is no specific treatment for rabies once symptoms appear and therefore emphasized the importance of giving timely anti-rabies vaccination to the pets. Altogether, 150 pets got vaccinated on the day.

In Peren, as part of the celebration of 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Peren Township, World Rabies Day 2022 was celebrated at Peren Town Hall. Chief Veterinary, Dr. Namsui Thou, in his keynote

address, spoke on the importance of how to avoid rabies and its precautionary measures and steps to prevent the disease. He also stressed the careless attitude of the community and advised the gathering to be cautious with their pets to lessen rabies infections.

The department of Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services, Longleng observed World Rabies Day in Longleng on 28<sup>th</sup> September 2022 on the theme 'One Health, Zero Death' at DPDB Conference Hall, Longleng with the Longleng Town Council (LTC) and All Ward Union Longleng Town. The meeting was followed by the presentation of the draft regarding the adoption of the 'Dog Registration & Proper Control of Dogs: Rules and Regulations 2022' by Dr. Aoyimsen Jamir, VS, and Longleng. The house unanimously agreed to adopt the draft proposal in principle put forward by the Department of AH&VS. Controlling the misuse of Tobacco is a serious business that has to follow strict and correct measures and policies to bring change since it involves human lives. He encouraged the members to uphold the resolutions made.

To make the Tobacco Control Programme more effective, Shanavas said that more awareness programmes, publicity, and activities on the ill effects of Tobacco have to be made.

Further in the meeting, it was decided to suggest to the School Education Department for inclusion of a Tobacco Control Topic in the NBSE

syllabus. It was also decided 'No tobacco use' pledge will be initiated starting in the next DPDB meeting. On the occasion, 10th NAP (IR) Bn. Cantonment, Zadima, St. John Bosco School, Khonoma, GMS Chedema, and Christian School, Chedema were awarded certificates and certified as Tobacco Free Zone.

Earlier a PowerPoint on activities of District Tobacco Control Cell Kohima was presented by District Nodal Officer (NTCP), Kohima, Dr. Arenla Walling, and a Tobacco Free Declaration was initiated by Additional Director (Dental), State Nodal Officer (NTCP) Directorate of Health & Family Welfare, Kohima.

The present data and status of a Tobacco Free till date is School - 78 %, Colleges - 12%, Village - 13%, Teaching Institutes - 2%, Orphanage & Rehabilitation Centre - 1+2%, Dental Clinic - 32%, Hospitals/Clinic/Nursing Homes - 7% and Police Stations - 12%.

### GOVERNOR VISITS NOKLAK

Governor of Nagaland, Prof. Jagdish Mukhi visited Noklak district and held a series of meetings with organizations on 28<sup>th</sup> September 2022.

The Governor visited Assam Rifles COB at ITC Dan and interacted with the Assam Rifles officers and jawans. The Governor also interacted

with the Heads of Offices under Noklak district.

The Governor held a brief interaction with Khamniungan Tribal Council, Khamniungan Menyiu Hoikam, Khamniungan Students Union, Pangsha Public Organization, and Village Council Chairmen of Dan village, New Pangsha village, Old Pangsha village, and Wonthoi

Prof. Jagdish Mukhi held a separate meeting

with the political parties of NDPP, BJP, NPF, and INC. He also held a meeting with the Noklak Chamber of Commerce & Industries.

### TRAINING ON SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS HELD AT WOKHA

Project for creating model GP clusters in collaboration with Wokha District Administration, District Skill Committee (DSC), District Rural Development Agency (DRDA), and Nagaland State Rural Livelihood Mission, Wokha organized a one-day training programme on localization of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), GPDS, PRI-SHGs convergence, on 29<sup>th</sup> September 2022 at Deputy Commissioner's Conference Hall, Wokha.

BNO-GPDP, Tushmanen said Gram Panchayat Development Plan (GPDP) is the development plan of the village prepared through a participatory process involving all stakeholders matching people's needs and priorities with available resources. He added under Article 243G, the Constitution mandates a plan at the village level for economic development and social justice and the implementation of schemes to fulfill those goals.

On the collection of data, Manen said the primary objective of preparation of GPDP is to identify and formulate ways of addressing the development needs of the GP, getting first-hand information about the issues related to health, education, livelihoods, availability of amenities, services and fulfillment of rights and entitlements of marginalized sections, local infrastructure, etc., are very important.

Area Co-ordinator SISD, NRLM, H. Wophyomo while sharing on the topic of Panchayati Raj Institute - Self Help Group (PRI-SHG) convergence and Village Poverty Reduction Plan (VPRP) said that VPRP guarantees the representation of demands from different

sections of the community, including demands from SHG households and of other vulnerable sections outside the SHG fold, fair, transparent, and participatory plan, and serves as a sub-plan for preparing GPDP. Further, he stated that VPRP is the bottom-up plan preparation for addressing the needs of the community.

Giving an introduction to Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), Markose said the SDGs were set up in 2015 by the United Nations General Assembly and are intended to be achieved by 2030, adding the 2030 Agenda is 'a plan of action for people, planet and prosperity.' The 2030 Agenda contains 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and 169 targets and 193 countries, including India.

MGNF, Ministry of Skill Development, Anuranjan Singh said that the main objective of SDG is for creating an economy that is sustainable and growing in the right direction. This objective focuses on a contribution by humans towards protecting and enhancing the natural environment, by minimizing pollution, and waste and also working towards reducing the global carbon footprint. Sharing on 'Social Inclusion,' he said this objective focuses on providing the facility of housing for future generations and assisting in creating healthy, strong, and vibrant global communities.

The one-day training programme is focused on creating model GP clusters for the five village functionaries under Wokha district namely, Wokha village, Longsa, Longsachung, Riphym Old, and Humtso village.

### TOVIHOTO AYEMI LAUNCHES UNIFIED ROOFTOP SOLAR WEB PORTAL

Launching programme of Unified Rooftop Solar (RTS) web portal in Nagaland was held at the Office Chamber of Advisor, Power at Nagaland Civil Secretariat, Kohima on 5<sup>th</sup> September 2022.

Advisor, Power, Tovihoto Ayemi in his speech has said that towards the implementation of the Rooftop Solar Scheme, the department should reach out to all the citizens and ensure to provide quality facility. He also urged the department to create awareness that such facilities are available and the opportunity should be given to the people. He also appreciated the Power department for strengthening the department from different angles of work. Tovihoto encouraged the department to coordinate with the Department of New & Renewable Energy in order to materialize the system.

Principal Secretary Power, K. D. Vizo appreciated the Power department for the success of Unified Rooftop Solar web portal which is very important for the residential sector for reduction in electricity bill for the users.

Er. Atoho Jakhalu, Nodal Officer (RTS) presented a brief description of the scheme and stated that the Rooftop Solar (RTS) is a system consisting of solar photovoltaic power plants installed mainly on the roof of a building where valid and live electricity connection has been provided by the concerned power utilities (DISCOMS). Typically 1 KWp TRS plants requires about 10 sq.m area. He also said that power generated can then be used either for captive consumption of the premises or can be fed into the grid and be adjusted in the electricity bill. RTS plants help DISCOMs in reducing transmission and distribution losses of power consumption and generation are co-located and the quantum of energy generated by the RTS systems shall be accounted towards the DISCOMs Renewable Purchase Obligation (RPO) compliance, he stated.

Chief Engineer (D&R), Er. Tiameren Walling said applicants must have electricity bill in their own name for applying with necessary supporting documents like ID card or latest electricity bill.

### IMNATIBA INAUGURATES SCHOOL OF EXCELLENCE IN SKILL DEVELOPMENT AT GHSS, SECHU-ZUBZA

The first School of Excellence in Skill Development in Nagaland was inaugurated by Advisor, Labour & Employment, Skill Development & Entrepreneurship and Industries & Commerce, Imnatiba on 12<sup>th</sup> September 2022 at Government Higher Secondary School, Sechu-Zubza.

The certification will be done by NIELIT, Government of India.

For the forecast period of 2021 – 2026, the trend in the organic food market is expected to grow at a CAGR of about 20.5% to reach about USD 2601 million by 2026. Thus, looking at these statistics, one can safely say that the Naturally Nagaland brand can only grow and our local indigenously produced organic products will definitely be in demand not just in the country but also across the globe.

An overview of the activities and programmes of the various departments under Agri and allied sector of the state in the last couple of years clearly reflects the importance and effort put in by the State Government in developing the Agriculture and farming industry as more than 60 per cent of the State's population is engaged in this sector and the State's economy is primarily dependent on Agriculture. The Department of Land Resource has been promoting Nagaland Coffee and helping farmers from across the State not just in production but also in marketing and today, our coffee has been rated as one of the best in the country and is in great demand internationally as well.

The Department of Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services has also contributed a lot and has been working tirelessly to promote the poultry and dairy industry in the State. Horticulture Department has also been working hand in hand with the farmers by imparting technical knowledge and also providing logistics in terms of high yielding seeds and saplings as well as financial assistance.

The Department of Soil & Water conservation has also been making efforts in creating awareness regarding soil conservation and soil quality maintenance through scientific research and application and in recent years, have successfully managed to educate most farmers on the importance of sustenance farming. The Department has set up 13 Soil Testing Labs in 11 Districts and 74 Mini Soil Testing Labs in all 74 blocks and has also acquired 3 Mobile Soil Testing Labs. The other allied departments like the Department of Fisheries & Aquatic Resources, Department of Co-operation, Department of Sericulture, Nagaland Bio Resource Mission, Nagaland Bee Keeping and Honey Mission, Nagaland Rural Livelihood Mission and NEPED (Nagaland Empowerment of People through Economic Development) have all been working tirelessly and implementing projects including centrally sponsored schemes with the sole aim of uplifting the agriculture and farming community and creating economic self-reliance among the people of the State.

However, despite all the efforts put in by the Government, the end result and the success of the project depends solely on the work culture of the people of the State. The State Government can only do so much and the people need to realise that they also need to put in a lot of hard work and dedication to make the dream of making 'Naturally Nagaland' an internationally renowned brand a reality and becoming economically self-reliant through the brand.

Nagaland, known for its rich biodiversity, is gradually making its entry into the organic farming market and towards efforts are being made to promote organic farming in the State. Nagaland has potential

Naga farmers adopt an age-old traditional cultivation system called shifting cultivation. ### NSS 75<sup>th</sup> ROUND REPORT (JULY 2017 - JUNE 2018) (A DIPR feature)

National Sample Surveys (NSS) are large scale sample surveys on various socio-economic subjects conducted perennially by the National Statistical Office (NSO) since its inception in 1950. The Directorate of Economics & Statistics (DES), Nagaland has been participating in this nationwide survey since 1972. The present NSS 75<sup>th</sup> Round Report presents key state level parameters on Health and Education in Nagaland pertaining to the period July 2017-June 2018.

#### 1. Household Social Consumption on Health in Nagaland:

The National Sample Survey on Household Social Consumption related to Health forms a vital source of primary data on the subject for the State and the country as a whole. The survey gathers basic information on the health sector like morbidity, profile of ailments including treatment, role of government and private facilities in providing health care, expenditure on medicines, medical consultation, investigation, hospitalization and expenditure thereon, maternity and childbirth, the condition of the aged, etc. Some of the key findings of the survey are:

- About 6% of the rural population and nearly 5% of the urban population reported as ailing during a 15 day reference period.
- 'Infection' was the most prevalent ailment among both genders in both rural (48 per 1000 persons) and urban (29 per 1000 persons) sectors.
- 83% of ailments in rural areas and 66% in urban areas were treated at Government/Public hospitals.

- 85% of women received pre-natal care and 76% received post-natal care in both rural and urban areas.
- 55% of the aged population (60 years & above) in rural areas and 72% in urban areas were economically independent.
- 100% of children aged 0-5 years in rural areas and 99% in urban areas had received some vaccination.

#### 2. Household Social Consumption on Education in Nagaland:

The National Sample Survey on Household Social Consumption related to Education is the primary source of data for generating various indicators on education like level of education, attendance, incentives received by the students, expenditure on education, etc. These are used in decision support, policy inferences and analysis. Some of the key findings of the survey are:

- Estimated male population between age 3 to 35 years was 401000 (304000 in rural & 97000 in urban) while that of female was 331000 (251000 in rural & 80000 in urban)
- Nearly 87% of households in rural areas and 73% of households in urban areas reported availability of primary school within 1 Km from the house.
- 5.4% of persons aged 15 years and above were 'not literate' while 14.2% were literate up to Primary level and 15.2% were Graduate and above.
- Nearly 64% of males and 54% of females in the age group 3-35 years were currently attending education.




